- (2) authorise any person in Ceylon, unless otherwise directed by me, to trade, after the aforesaid time, within the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics with any individual or body of persons (whether corporate or unincorporate) carrying on business therein, notwithstanding anything contained in regulation 1 of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939; and
- (3) declare that, for the purposes of the preceding paragraphs "Union of Soviet Socialist Republics" means all the territory of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics excluding any territory which has come under the administration of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics since the thirty-first day of December, 1938.

## A PROCLAMATION.

J. C. HOWARD.

KNOW Ye that by virtue of the powers vested in the Governor by section 3 of the Masters Attendant Ordinance (Chapter 262), I, John Curtois Howard, Officer Administering the Government of Ceylon, do by this Proclamation.—

- (a) frame and establish for the Port of Colombo the rule set out hereunder ; and  
 (b) direct that that rule shall take effect on the fifteenth day of January, 1947.

*Rule.*

The Colombo Port Rules, 1936, published in the *Supplement to the Gazette* No. 8,251 of October 16, 1936 (as amended by any subsequent rule) are hereby further amended as follows :—

- (1) in rule 2, by the insertion, immediately after the definition of " Customs Officer " and " Officer of Customs ", of the following new definition :—

" Dangerous cargo " means cargo consisting of ammunition, explosives, packed petroleum, bulk petroleum, or any other inflammable substance whatever ;

- (2) by the substitution, for rule 5, of the following new rule :—

" 5. The master of every vessel which enters the port and which is liable to pay pilotage shall perfect and sign the form set out in Appendix A, and shall deliver the form so perfected and signed to the Pilot boarding such vessel."

- (3) by the insertion, immediately after rule 8, of the following new rules :—

" 8A. It shall be lawful for the Master Attendant for the preservation of the port to order—

- (a) the master of any vessel which is in the port and which carries dangerous cargo to have his main engines in readiness for the movement of his vessel within one-half of an hour ;  
 (b) the master of any vessel which is in the port and which carries any other cargo to have his main engines in readiness for the movement of his vessel—

- (i) where such vessel is alongside any wharf or jetty, within one hour ; and  
 (ii) where such vessel is anywhere else in the port, within twelve hours ;

and it shall be the duty of the master of such vessel to comply with such order :

Provided, however, that the master of any vessel may take a longer period than the period required under the preceding provisions of this rule to have his main engines in readiness for the movement of his vessel, if he has previously obtained the written consent of the Master Attendant.

8B. The master of every vessel within the port shall be responsible for seeing that the vessel is provided with such number of officers and other members of the crew, and with such equipment, as may reasonably be necessary, to enable the movement of the vessel forthwith from its berth.

8c. The master of every merchant vessel within the port shall be responsible for seeing that to each end of such vessel there is fastened at least one mooring rope in a serviceable condition which can be attached to a tug or a buoy and the vessel is provided with such number of heaving lines as may reasonably be necessary for mooring such vessel forthwith."

- (4) by the insertion, immediately of rule 26A, of the following new rules :—

" 26B. Upon the outbreak of a fire on board a vessel in the port, the master of such vessel shall be responsible for seeing that—

- (a) the main engines of the vessel are brought into readiness forthwith, for the movement of the vessel from its berth without delay, notwithstanding anything to the contrary in rule 8A ;  
 (b) a warning to other vessels and persons in the port is given by sounding a siren or blowing a whistle ;  
 and  
 (c) the signal " I am on fire " (NQ) is given by day and three red lights are displayed by night.

26c. (1) Upon the outbreak of any fire in the port, the Master Attendant shall give to the master of any vessel which is for the time being in the port (not being a vessel belonging to or in the service of His Majesty) and which is likely to endanger the safety of the port or of any vessel therein, all such directions as may appear to the Master Attendant to be necessary or expedient for the purpose of securing the safety of the port or of the vessels therein and for preventing the spread of fire.

(2) The master of the vessel shall forthwith obey and carry out every direction or order given to him by the Master Attendant under the preceding provisions of this rule.”;

(5) by the insertion, immediately after rule 31, of the following new rule :—

“ 31A. The master of any vessel who observes within the port any object suspected to be dangerous shall report the fact forthwith to the Master Attendant.”;

(6) by the substitution, for rule 38, of the following new rule :—

“ 38. The master of every vessel which is in the port and which contains or conveys dangerous cargo or which is used for loading or unloading such cargo shall carry on the mast-head of such vessel or, if such vessel has no mast, on a staff, a red flag by day and a red light at night, in addition to any other flags or navigation lights which such vessel is required to carry under any other of these rules.”;

(7) by the insertion, immediately after rule 44A, of the following new rules :—

“ 44B. The master of every vessel within the port shall be responsible for seeing that—

(a) before dangerous cargo in the vessel is moved, loaded, unloaded, stowed, or handled—

(i) all ventilators are covered ; and

(ii) the vessel's wireless telegraphic apparatus is either sealed or disconnected ;

(b) during the handling of dangerous cargo, all fire-fighting appliances, including hoses, are ready for immediate use ;

(c) the vessel's tackle for the handling of dangerous cargo is in a serviceable condition ;

(d) electric lamps for a pattern approved by the Master Attendant are the only lights used in any hold containing dangerous cargo ;

(e) all wires and leads connected to such lamps are in a serviceable condition ; and

(f) welding and cutting operations involving the use of an open flame or arc are not undertaken in such vessel, if the vessel contains dangerous cargo, without the written permission of the Master Attendant being previously obtained.

44c. No hold containing dangerous cargo shall be opened within the port until permission to do so has been granted by a person authorised in writing by the Principal Collector of Customs.

44d. No dangerous cargo shall be loaded within the port into any lighter, or be discharged from any merchant vessel into any lighter, or be loaded into any merchant vessel from any lighter, unless a police officer is on board such lighter when such cargo is so loaded or discharged.

44E. No person shall smoke, or take any fire, matches, cigarette lighters or any article of an inflammable nature, or light any fire, or light or strike any match, or cause ignition by any other means—

(i) on any lighter which is in the port and which carries dangerous cargo ;

(ii) on any vessel in the port within fifty feet of any hatch where such cargo is being received or loaded ;

or

(iii) within fifty feet of a place on any land (situated in the area specified in Appendix B) where such cargo is landed, loaded or stacked.

44f. No cotton waste or other inflammable article shall be allowed within the port in any hold of a vessel or in any lighter while such hold or lighter is being used for the conveyance, loading or unloading of dangerous cargo.

44g. No petroleum, coal, or other inflammable article shall, within the port, be handled in the vicinity of other dangerous cargo or be stowed in any vessel's hold into which other dangerous cargo is being loaded or from which such cargo is being unloaded.

44h. No person under the influence of alcohol or drugs shall, within the port, be on board that part of a vessel in which dangerous cargo is being handled.” ;

(8) in paragraph (1) of rule 93, by the substitution, for the table of fees relating to motor or steam launches, of the following new table :—

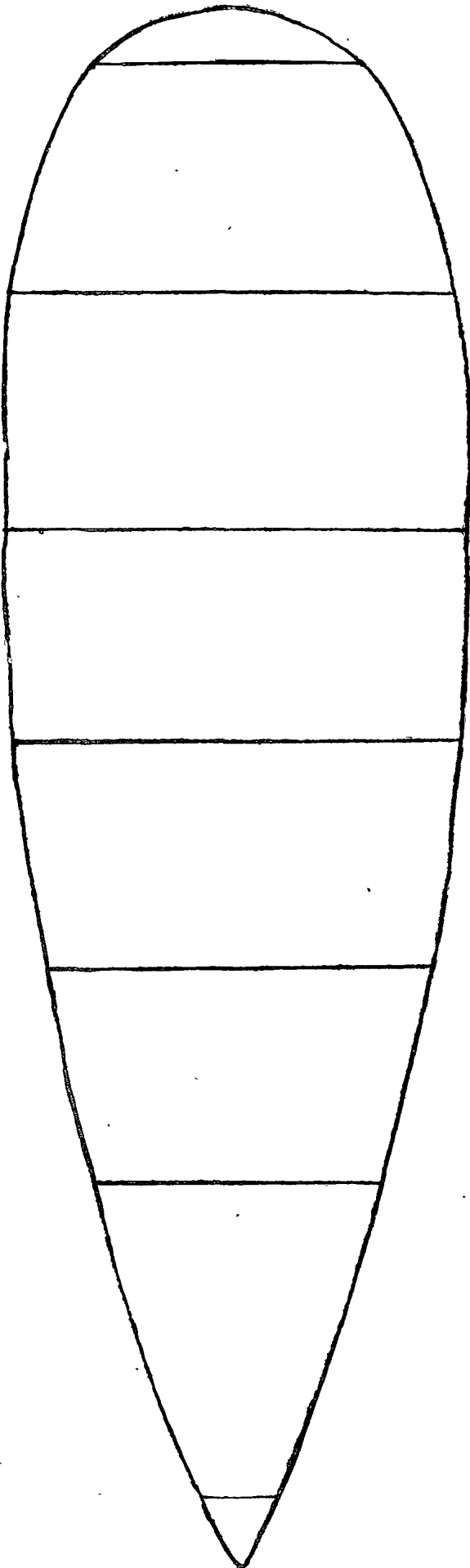

  - (c) the signal " I am on fire " (NQ) is given by day and three red lights are displayed by night. (rule 26B†).
3. The master of every vessel which is in the port and which contains or conveys dangerous cargo or which is used for loading or unloading such cargo shall carry on the mast-head of such vessel or, if such vessel has no mast, on a staff a red flag by day and a red light at night, in addition to any other flags or navigation lights which such vessel is required to carry under any other of these rules. 5. No dangerous cargo shall be loaded within the port into any lighter, or be discharged from any merchant vessel into any lighter, or be loaded into any merchant vessel from any lighter, unless a police officer is on board such lighter when such cargo is so loaded or discharged. (rule 44D†).
6. No person shall smoke, or take any fire, matches, cigarette lighters or any article of an inflammable nature, or light any fire, or light or strike any match, or cause ignition by any other means—
  - (i) on any lighter which is in the port and which carries dangerous cargo ;
  - (ii) on any vessel in the port within fifty feet of any hatch where such cargo is being received or loaded ; or
  - (iii) within fifty feet of a place on any land (situated in the area specified in Appendix B) where such cargo is landed, loaded or stacked. (rule 44E†).
7. No cotton waste or other inflammable article shall be allowed within the port in any hold of a vessel or in any lighter while such hold or lighter is being used for the conveyance, loading or unloading of dangerous cargo. (rule 44F†)}}
8. No petroleum, coal, or other inflammable article shall, within the port, be handled in the vicinity of other dangerous cargo or be stowed in any vessel's hold into which other dangerous cargo is being loaded or from which such cargo is being unloaded. (rule 44G†).
9. No person under the influence of alcohol or drugs shall, within the port, be on board that part of a vessel in which dangerous cargo is being handled. (rule 44H†).

*Note.*—1. Masters of vessels should note that the duties cast on them by the rules specified in this Form are to be performed in addition to the duties cast on them by any of the other Colombo Port Rules.

**Scholarships for Educational Research.**

FOUR Scholarships tenable for a period of two years at a University in the United Kingdom approved by His Excellency the Governor, will be awarded to graduates of distinction, preferably to those possessing a good Honours Degree and satisfactory teaching experience, to enable them to pursue a course of study and research approved by the Director of Education and specially designed to fit them for work in Government Training Colleges.

2. The duration of a scholarship may be extended to a further period of one year in cases where the scholarship-holder is engaged in a course of approved study which lasts for more than two years, provided the Director of Education is satisfied that he or she has shown marked promise and ability during the first two years of the tenure of scholarship.

3. The annual value of a scholarship will be £360 (including fees) when held in Collegiate residence at Oxford or Cambridge, £325 (including fees) when held in a non-Collegiate residence at Oxford or Cambridge, and £240 (with fees) if held at any other University in the United Kingdom together with an outfit allowance of Rs. 950 and a second class passage to the United Kingdom and back. A temporary increase of £60 will be paid per annum.

The medical expenses of the scholarship-holders will be paid by Government in cases recommended by the Director of Colonial Scholars or any other approved authority, but the total sum which will be paid for any one scholar on this account is limited to £50.
