(a) Successful candidates will be appointed to Grade II. of the Executive Clerical Class of the General Clerical Service on the scale Rs. 1,440 per annum rising by annual increments of Rs. 120 to Rs. 3,480 per annum. In this scale an efficiency bar operates before Rs. 2,640 per annum. Rent allowance will be payable.

(b) All successful candidates will be appointed on 2 years' probation. They will be liable to transfer and may be posted to any station in Ceylon. They will be required to pass a test in typewriting within one year of their appointment to Grade II. of the Executive Clerical Class. They will be subject to the Public Service, Financial and other standing Regulations of the Government.

3. There will be approximately 324 vacancies. Ten per cent. of these vacancies will be filled by merit promotions. The remaining vacancies will be filled on the results of this examination provided the candidates attain the minimum qualifying standard set out in para. 10.

The names of the successful candidates will be published in the *Government Gazette*.

##### Applications.—

4. Applications for admission to the examination must be addressed to the Director of Education on forms which may be obtained from his office up to January 18, 1947.

5. Applications must be sent by registered post to reach the Director of Education not later than 12 noon on January 25, 1947. Any applications received after that hour will be rejected.

6. The Director of Education will return those applications which are approved to the candidates concerned. Such applications will constitute the candidates' tickets of admission to the examination. Candidates presenting themselves for the examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination their forms of application approved by the Director of Education. A candidate not producing such a form will be refused admittance to the examination.

(b) \* Clerks who were in Government service or in the Rubber or Tea Control Departments prior to August 1, 1935 (other than members of the Customs, Postal, Survey, Harbour Engineer's or Railway Departments) from whatever funds they may have been paid, who were at that time clerks in Government service as defined by section 11 of Appendix A to the Public Service Regulations (since cancelled), *who have*

\* "Clerks in Government service" as defined by section 11 of Appendix A to the Public Service Regulations include—

(a) temporary clerks and bookbinders and storekeepers whose duties are mainly clerical, who are employed in a temporary or permanent Government Department and paid from votes in the Government Estimates. Provided that where such temporary officers are daily paid they must be continuously and not sporadically employed;

(b) clerks and bookbinders and storekeepers whose duties are mainly clerical employed in any Government Department and paid from recognized and approved fees;

(c) clerks paid from Village Committee, Village Tribunals, Sanitary Board, District School Committee and Education District Committee funds.

retained the same status, and whose services during the last three years have been satisfactory. The paper will be designed to test an officer's usefulness and competence as a clerk. He may be required to make a précis of an actual series of official letters, to submit a draft letter in terms of an order, to show a knowledge of index system, filing, &c., and to have the ability to express himself clearly on paper.

(3) *Viva voce* test . . . . . 70 marks

10. The examination will be held in two parts. The written examination will be held in all Kachecheri stations. Any candidate who fails to obtain a minimum of 50 per cent. of the marks in each subject will not be considered for the *viva voce* test which will be held in Colombo. The number to be called for the *viva voce* test will be fixed by the Deputy Chief Secretary in consultation with the Director of Education. In all written papers marks will be deducted for bad writing and mistakes in spelling. Candidates whose writing is illegible are liable to be disqualified.

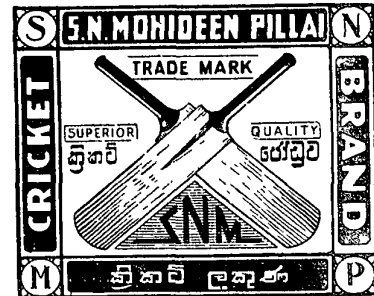

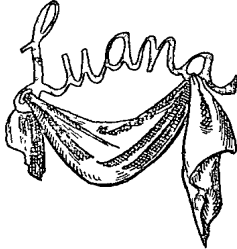
