2. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires-

- "Controller" means the Tyre Controller;
 "retreading" includes remoulding, recapping, resoling and any other similar method of reconditioning a partly worn tyre by the addition to it of rubber or rubber compound;
 "type, "means the more type of a pneumatic rubber tyre.
- "tube" means the inner tube of a pneumatic rubber tyre
- intended for use on the wheel of a vehicle; "tyre" means the outer cover of a pneumatic rubber tyre intended for use on the wheel of a vehicle.

Used types and used tubes are hereby declared to be controlled articles within the meaning of Regulation 43D of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations for the purposes of the application of the provisions of that regulation to such articles

4. (1) The Controller may, by notification published in the *Gazette* fix the maximum prices which may be charged for the retreading of used tyres. The Controller may in any such notification fix different prices determined according to different sizes or descriptions of such tyres or to the

different processes employed in the retreading of tyres. (2) No person carrying on the business of retreading used tyres shall charge any other person for the retreading of any tyre any price exceeding such of the maximum prices fixed by notification under sub-section (1) as may be appropriate to the case.

(1) The Controller may by notification published in the Gazette fix the maximum price at which any description,

the Gazette fix the maximum price at which any description, grade, or class of used tyre or used tubes may be sold. (2) No person shall sell a used tyre or used tube, for which an appropriate maximum price has been fixed under sub-paragraph (1), at any price exceeding such maximum price. 6. 

Amendment to the Minutes on Pensions.

HIS Excellency the Governor has been pleased, with the approval of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, to direct that the rules regulating the pensions to be granted to public servants of Ceylon, set out in the Minute on Pensions dated February 5, 1934, as amended by any subsequent Minute. be further amended, by the substitution, for section 48 of those rules, of the following new section :---

'48. (1) Save as provided by sections 18 and 19 of the Public Service Provident Fund Ordinance, No. 18 of 1942, and by sub-sections (2), (3) and (4) of this section of these rules—

- (a) the service in any non-pensionable post or office of a contributor to the Public Service Provident Fund or any approved Provident Fund shall not be reckoned for any of the purposes of these rules; and
- (b) no benefit in respect of such service shall be granted to any person under these rules.

(2) The provisions of sections 30, 31 and 31A of these rules shall, subject to the provisions of section 29A thereof, apply in the case of a contributor to the Public Service Provident Fund or any approved Provident Fund.

(3) Where a contributor to any approved Provident Fund is appointed to a pensionable office in the public service and enters on the duties of such office, the period commencing on the day on which such contributor became liable to contribute to the Fund and ending on the day on which his account in the Fund is closed, shall—

- (a) in any case where only the amount of his own contributions to the Fund together with interest thereon is paid to such contributor out of the Fund, count as service for the purpose of the grant of any pension, gratuity or other benefit under these rules; or
- (b) in any case where, in addation to his own contributions together with interest thereon, an award is paid out of the Fund to such contributor, be reckoned for the purpose of section 20 of these rules.

(4) Where a contributor to any approved Provident Fund has, before the date on which he became a contributor, held any post or office, service in which has qualified or would qualify him for an award under these rules, such contributor may retain any benefit or qualification that may have accrued to him under these rules, and accordingly---

- (a) in the event of his leaving the public service in any of the following circumstances, that is to say-
 - (i) retirement on account of age or on the ground of ill-health ; or
 - (ii) abolition of office,

the following award may be granted to such contributor, namely, such award as might have been granted to hum under these rules if he had been retired from the public service on the ground of ill-health on the date on which he became a contributor to the Fund; or

(b) in the event of his death while he is in the public service, the following award under these rules may be granted to the person or persons to whom such award is payable under these rules, namely, such award as might have been granted under these rules to such person or persons, if such contributor had died on the date on which he became a contributor to the Fund:

Provided however, that, where such contributor leaves the public service in consequence of the abolition of office, such award shall be granted to him on the date on which he leaves the public service or on the date on which he attains the age of fifty-five years, whichever is later.

- (5) For the purposes of this section—
- " approved Provident Fund " means-
 - (a) the Electrical Department Provident Fund and
 - (b) any Provident Fund (other than the Public Service, Provident Fund) approved, for the purposes of these rules, by the Governor by notification published in the Gazette;
- "Public Service Provident Fund " means the Public Service Provident Fund established by the Public Service Provident Fund Ordinance, No. 18 of 1942.".

"Child worker " means a male worker under 16 years of age or a female worker under 15 years of age.

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the preceding provisions of this Part, the minimum rate of wages for time work for any worker engaged in watching (field) and cattle keeping on a Sunday shall be one and a half times the minimum rate of wages for time work fixed for such worker in respect of a normal working day.

Part III.

Overtime Rates.

In respect of each hour of work in excess of the normal working day, the minimum overtime rate shall be the minimum hourly rate (ascertained by dividing the deily minimum rate of wages for time work by 8) increased by

- (a) 25 per cent. of such minimum hourly rate, in case such work is performed between the hours 7 A.M. and 7 P.M.; and
- (b) 50 per cent. of such minimum hourly rate, in case such work is performed between the hours 7 p.M. and 7 A.M.

In the computation of the overtime rate-

- 1) a fraction of a cent which is less than one-half of a cent shall not be taken into account;
- (2) one-half of a cent shall be calculated according to the even number rule, that is, to the nearest even number ; and (3) a fraction of a cent which is greater than one-half of a cent shall be counted as one cont.

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the preceding provisions of this Part, the minimum overtime rate for any worker engaged in watching (field) and cattle keeping on a Sunday shall, in respect of each hour of work in excess of the normal working day, be twice the minimum hourly rate applicable to him (such hourly rate being ascertained by dividing the daily minimum rate of wages for time work applicable to him by 8).

Part IV.

Weekly holiday (section 24).

Every employer shall allow each Sunday as the weekly holiday to all workers employed under him : Provided, however, that an employer may employ any worker on a Sunday, subject to the conditions-

(1) that a day within the six days next succeeding such Sunday shall be allowed to that worker as a holiday;

(2) that in respect of work done on such Sunday

- (a) a worker who has worked for 9 hours (inclusive of one hour for a meal) or for any period that falls short of nine hours by reason of the failure of the employer to provide him with work shall be remunerated at 1¹/₂ times the minimum rate of wages for a normal working day, (b) a worker who has worked for less than 9 hours (inclusive of one hour for a meal) by reason of his unwilling-
- ness to work, shall for each hour that he has worked, be paid $1\frac{1}{2}$ times the hourly rate (ascertained by dividing the minimum rate of wages for a normal working day by 8),
- (c) a worker who has worked for more than 9 hours (inclusive of one hour for a meal) shall be remunerated day by 8) for each hour of work in excess of 9 hours; and
- (3) that the remuneration due to a worker for work done on the weekly holiday during any period shall be paid within the time prescribed for the payment of wages for such period by section 2 (b) of the Wages Boards Ordinance.

The precedung provisions of this paragraph shall not apply to workers engaged in watching (field) and cattle keeping.

Annual holidays (section 25).

1. (a) If a male worker of not less than 16 years of age has been in continuous employment under the same employer and has worked for more than 228 days in any year (hereinafter called the "qualifying year"), he shall be allowed in the next succeeding year a holiday or holidays calculated at the rate of 1 holiday for each unit of 5 days by which the number of days on which the worker has worked exceeds 228 : Provided, however, that it shall not be obligatory on an employer to allow any such holiday in respect of any period of work in excess of 288 days.

(b) If a female worker or a child worker has been in continuous employment under the same employer and has worked for more than 204 days in any year (hereinafter called the "qualifying year"), such worker shall be allowed in the next succeeding year a holiday or holidays calculated at the rate of 1 holiday for each unit of 5 days by which the number of days on which the worker has worked exceeds 204: Provided, however, that it shall not be obligatory on an employer to allow any such holiday in respect of any period of work in excess of 264 days.

2. (i.) If a worker is entitled in any year to seven holidays he shall be allowed, and he shall take those seven holidays on consecutive days.

(ii.) If a worker is entitled in any year to more than seven holidays he shall be allowed, and he shall take, at least seven of those holidays on consecutive days.

3. Subject to the provisions of paragraph 2, a worker shall be allowed his holiday or holidays on a day or days to be mutually agreed upon between him and his employer, but he shall not be allowed such holiday or holidays during the period April to June.

(1) The remuneration payable in respect of each holiday which a worker is entitled to under paragraph 1 (including a holiday which such worker is entitled to under that paragraph read with paragraph 6 (a)), by reason of work performed during the preceding year, shall be his average daily wages ascertained by dividing his total wages (exclusive of overtime and bonuses)

earned by him during that year by the number of days on which the worker has actually worked during that year. (2) The remuneration payable in respect of each holiday which a worker is entitled to under paragraph 6 (b), by reason of work performed during the current year, shall be his average daily wages ascertained by dividing his total wages (exclusive of overtime and bonuses) earned by him duting the current year by the number of days on which the worker has actually worked during that year.

The remuneration due to a worker in respect of his holiday or holidays shall be paid to him before such holiday or , holidays, but not earlier than 10 days before such holiday or holidays.

Where a worker intends to leave his employment of his own accord or is to be discontinued or dismissed from employ-6 ment, such worker shall be entitled to take and shall take, during the period immediately preceding such leaving, discontinuance or dismissal-

- (a) every holiday that he was entitled to in respect of the previous year which he has not already taken; and
 (b) in case the worker has during the current year, complied with the provisions relating to employment and work set out in paragraph 1, every holiday that he would have otherwise been entitled to in the next succeeding year;

and he shall be remunerated for such holidays in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 4 :

Provided, however, that the total number of holidays that such a worker might take in any year shall not exceed twenty-one.

For the purposes of the foregoing provisions-7.

- "child worker" means a male worker under 16 years of age or a female worker under 15 years of age; "days on which the worker has worked" shall be deemed to include—
 - - (i.) every holiday allowed by the employer to the worker under section 25;
 - (ii.) every holiday or day of absence from work to which a worker is entitled by or under the provisions of any written law other than the Wages Boards Ordinance;
 - (iii.) every day of absence on any grounds approved by the employer other than absence from the Island except on a holiday allowed by the employer under section 25;
 (iv.) every day of absence due to any injury to the worker caused by an accident arising out of and in the
 - course of his employment, provided such injury had been notified to the employer;
 - (v.) every day of absence due to the disease of anthrax or due to any occupational disease specified in Schedule III. of the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance (Chapter 117);

(vi.) every day on which the employer fails to provide work for the worker ; and

(vii.) every day of absence due to a strike or lockout that is not illegal, in case such days do not in the aggregate exceed 30 days a year;

but shall not include the day fixed as the weekly holiday under section 24.

"year" means a continuous period of 12 months.

8. The foregoing decisions shall not apply in respect of employment at any time more than 12 months prior to the date on which the decisions come into force.

TRADE DISPUTE-KANDY TOWN BUS CO., LTD., KANDY.

THE Lanka Motor Workers' Union, Kandy, presented a petition to me under section 6 (1) of the Essential Services (Avoidance of Strikes and Lockouts) Order, 1942, in connection with a trade dispute that had arisen between the said Union and Messrs. Kandy Town Bus Co., Ltd., Kandy. This petition was referred by me in terms of section 6 (2) of the aforesaid Order to the District Judge, Kandy, for adjudication.

The following Order dated October 18, 1946, made by the District Judge, Kandy, 18 published for general information in terms of section 8 (4) of the same Order.

"The Petitioner Union presented a petition to the Commissioner of Labour regarding the dismissal of two employees of the Respondent Bus Company, which is a limited liability company.

The two employees are B. M. K. Banda and M. James. They both belong to the Petitioner Union. They were admittedly employees of this Bus Company. The Assistant Commissioner of Labour, it is stated, has tried to bring about an adjustment of their differences without being successful. Accordingly the matter has been referred to Court by the Commissioner of Labour by his letter dated July 17, 1946. The Commissioner of Labour has under section 6, sub-section 2 of the Essential Services (Avoidance of Strikes and Lockouts) Order, 1942, referred this matter to Court.

I shall first deal with the question of the dismissal of Banda. Admittedly Banda was driving a very new bus belonging to this Company on April 11, 1946, from Katugastota to Kandy Town. The Respondent Company has been given the exclusive right to run buses in Kandy town. They have got three routes; one is from Peradeniya to Ampitiya, another is from Katugastota to Tennekumbura and the other is from Peradeniya to Katugastota.

One cannot deny the fact that this Company, which has to serve the Kandy town, has to have a very efficient service and to have a very efficient service, apart from other personnel, the drivers driving these vehicles have got to be careful and competent.

On April 11, 1946, this bus in question, which was in perfect condition mechanically, was driven from Katugastota to Kandy town by Banda. Banda's evidence is that on a stretch of road which was straight he met an oncoming military lorry driven very fast. He took the bus on to his left hand side and halted it as there was no room for him to pass the lorry that was coming from the opposite direction. The engine was working and when he wanted to move the bus, the bus would not move but, on the other hand, the wheel sank in the earth and the bus toppled over into the paddy field which is about six feet below the road.

There were four passengers in the bus and one Gunasekera, Inspector of this Company. The driver himself went and informed the office. Appuhamy, Managing Director, came with an injured passenger, Leelawathie, and informed the Katugastota Police. The Police came for inquiry and recorded the statements of the Inspector and of the driver. The Police do not seem to have taken any action in the matter. The bus was lying for three days in this paddy field and it was taken out with the kind assistance rendered by the Military. The bus was a new one at the time, having been in use only a couple of months. It had cost the Company more than Rs. 17,000. The bus had to be repaired in the Company's own garage at a cost of about Rs. 1,500 and it could not be used on the road for about one and a half months.

The Managing Director states that the road at this point is very broad and that two vehicles however big could cross quite easily without any one of those vehicles getting on to the turf portion of the road. In other words, the tarred portion of the road is broad enough for two buses or lorries to pass each other without any one of them getting on to the turf portion of the road. All careful drivers of heavy vehicles like laorries and Nelson type buses always avoid getting on to fhe turf portion of the road. It is one's experience that they always try to keep within the tarred portion of the road for the very good reason that the earth away from the tarred portion of the road, especially on a rainy day, may not be sufficiently hard to withstand the weight of a heavy vehicle like a lorry or a bus, but in this particular instance, Banda has taken the bus undoubtedly far too much to the edge of the road. Banda has been driving buses for this Company for some time. On a previous occasion he collided with a motor car belonging to Advocate Mr. A. Ratnayake, and the Company paid the damages to Mr. Ratnayake but it did not dismiss Banda. The Managing Director has stated to Court that the Company run buses for the benefit of school children. He says young girls from Mahamaya College and Girls High School are entrusted to their care by their parents to be taken from home to school and from the schools back to their homes. They also run a bus service for the children of Trinity College. Children are taken to school in the morning and taken back to their respective homes in the evening.

According to a letter written by the Petitioner Union dated May 22, 1946, to the Managing Director of the Respondent Company, the Union says that the Respondent Compnay is a well organized transport service. That they are a well organized transport service cannot be gainsaid judging from the fact that they are supplying the town with as efficient a service as could under the present circumstances be expected. That being so, the question for consideration is whether, apart from all other considerations, Banda is fit to be kopt in the service of this Company and do this very responsible work.

This accident happened on the night of April 11, 1946. According to the Managing Director the man came to the office after the bus was taken back to the road, about April 14, or 15, on which date the Managing Director asked the man to leave their service and offered him salary for one month in lieu of notice. The man had worked only for four days in that month and he had taken the salary for those four days on May 5, 1946. The Managing Director is still prepared to pay Banda the one month's salary in lieu of notice. According to the Managing Director they have got 23 buses belonging to this Company. He has got 40 drivers working under him, in addition to the other employees such as conductors and inspectors. Judging from the activities of the Respondent Company, they are trying to give the best service to the public

It is stated by the Petitioner Union that the dismissal of Banda is not justified by what had happened on this day. On this particular evening there was rain. It has been admitted by all parties to be so. Appuhamy, the Managing Director, says that he has had experience of buses from 1929. He has been a bus driver himself from 1929 to 1946. He has run buses. It is really his buses largely that were contributed by him that went to form the limited liability company which was incorporated in 1938. He says in all his experience he has never had a case where a bus has gone off the road under such circumstances as has been related by Banda. No doubt buses run on rainy days on the roads and buses also run on very dangerous roads in the sense of narrow, winding, steep roads, but this section of the road where this alleged accident took place is, on Banda's own showing, a perfectly broad straight patch of road. That being so the question for consideration is whether the Respondent Company are justified in dismissing this man. I am of opinion that the dismissal of Banda for the reasons given by the Managing Director is justified. They feel that heavy buses are not safe in the hands of Banda. It is not possible to pick and choose buses for each driver. They have to be competent to handle any bus in the Company for each man has to work only eight hours. When that man's shift of eight hours is over another man has to take his place. That being so Banda will have to take his turn with other drivers in driving any bus of this particular Company.

I hold that the dismissal of Banda is justified. The Managing Director has offered to pay Banda one month's salary in lieu of notice. Banda will receive from the Respondent Company one month's salary.

On this point I would like to draw attention to one matter. Although Banda was dismissed on his own showing about April 12, he took no action till May 22, 1946, to report this matter to the Union. He appears to have reported this matter to the Union, in my opinion, at the instance of James, whose case I shall presently consider. Banda admitted that he and James went to the office together to make this complaint. James was dismissed on May 15, 1946. But for James' intervention I am of opinion that Bánda would never have made this complaint to the Petitioner Union.

As regards James' case. The complaint against James is really one of discipline more than anything else. James had been in the employ of this Company for a few months in 1938. Thereafter for about three years he was not in the omployment of this Company. James says that he took ten days leave for some purpose of his but it took him three years to attend to that matter. Of course, that is obviously false. He had been during that period of three years driving buses of various persons. Anyway he was taken back by the Respondent Compnay in 1941. From 1941 he has been working under this Company. The Managing Director says that they used to receive various complaints from passengers against the conduct of James. James appears to be, from all that was revealed in this case, a very active member of this Petitioner Union. Probably James. In Decemebr, 1945, when James wanted an advance of Rs. 400 for his daughter's wedding, the Company gave him Rs. 200, and various deductions were made from his salary to cover up these advances, but James, even after that, had kept on taking various advances like Rs. 30 and Rs. 40 a month.

On May 15, 1946, there was the Vesak Festival. As is well known on the Vesak Day large crowds of people congregate in Kandy. The Respondent Company was successful in obtaining from the Petrol Controller a hundred gallons of petrol extra, in order to run their service during the Vesak Season. On Vesak Day all time tables had been suspended and the buses were not run according to time. It was a non-stop service that day to meet the very urgent demand from the public for transport.

James himself recognizes the fact that on the Sinhalese New Year Day and Vesak Day he does not expect the buses to be run as on the Ordinary days. He does not find fault with the management for having given instructions to him and the other srivers that the bus service should be run on that day without reference to any time.

According to the rules of the Motor Car Ordinance, a bus driver has got to work for only eight hours a day to earn his salary. It is also provided that at the end of every four hours a driver has to be given a rest or an interval of half an hour. The Respondent Bus Company has been observing these rules and giving its employees half an hour after a period of four hours of work, but the bus drivers in a body, including James, have requested by letter dated January I, -D1*-that they be not given the interval of half an 1945, hour after every four hours but that they be permitted to work the eight hours continuously and stop work for the day. The eight hours would be calculated without taking into consideration the half an hour interval at the end of the first period of four hours. When that procedure is adopted the drivers would be leaving their work $8\frac{1}{2}$ hours after they really start to work, half an hour having been taken for their interval, but if the eight hours are worked all at a stretch, then they will be able to leave for their homes half an hour earlier. That mode of work appears to have appealed to the body of drivers and they by D1 have requested the Company to give them that concession, which the Company conceded to them. So that, if a bus driver had to work eight hours continuously, it was not in the mouth of the bus drivers to complain, because it is their own seeking.

On this particular day, James said that he worked from about 5.30 A.M. and about 11 A.M. he had taken the bus to the stand at Peradeniya. He was expected to turn back at once after setting down the passengers, which he does not seem to have done.

A man called Gunawardena is the Timekeeper employed at the Peradeniya bus stand. He has given evidence. On this day after the bus was taken at about 11 A.M. or so to this bus stand, James, instead of driving his bus back, appears to have gone into a boutique. Anyway, he was not in his seat or near the bus. James says he went to a tea boutique opposite the bus stand with a view to drinking a cup of tea, whereas the Managing Director, who happened to come there, and Gunawardena, Timekeeper, say that the man was seen coming out of a textle boutique with some piece of paper in his hand. The tailor working in that textile boutique has also stated in evidence that the man came into his textile shop, took a pair of scissors and he cut some paper. James' evidence on that point is contradicted by the Managing Director, the Timekeeper and the tailor.

The evidence led by the Respondent Company shows that the man had been delaying at least twenty minutes at the bus stand. Every other employee on that day carried out the instructions to the letter and maintained an efficient service. James alone had delayed a little longer than the others. He appears to have gone to cut some paper with a view to decorating his bus. I think the conduct of James certainly merits disapproval. It is very necessary that the employees should carry out the instructions of their masters which are lawful. In this particular instance James, whilst adhering to the instructions up to a point, has in his last trip about 11 A.M. delayed a little longer than he should have in retruning with the bus.

This man James appears to have been warned serveral times by this Bus Company. Of course, some of those warnings may have been justified or may not have been justified. Nothing really turns on those warnings because those are not warnings as a result of any decision arrived at by the Rospondent Company after inquiry. The people who had made complaints against James do not appear to have appeared at the inquiry. No doubt James has failed to carry out the instructions of May 15, 1946, to the strict letter, but taking all circumstances into consideration, I think perhaps a strict warning might have met the justice of James' case.

The Company is prepared to pay James one month's salary from May 15, in lieu of notice, although James is indebted to the Company. They are also prepared to pay James' salary up to May 15, although he is indebted to the Company.

My order as regards Jamos is as follows :-

James should be re-instated with a very severe warning. It must be understood that James runs the risk of losing his employment if he hereafter fails to carry out strictly the lawful instructions given to him by the Respondent Company. His salary will be paid to him as from May I, 1946, but he will have to pay the Company all the advances he has taken. In other words, the Company will have to pay James his salary after deducting the advances he has taken."

TRADE DISPUTE-MESSRS. S. MEERA SAIBO & SONS, MATALE

THE Lanka Motor Workers' Union, Kandy, presented a petition to me under Section 6 (1) of the Essential Services (Avoidance of Strikes and Lockouts) Order, 1942, with regard to a trade dispute that had arisen between the said Union and Messrs. S. Meera Saibo & Sons, Matale. This petition was referred to a Specal Tribunal appointed by H. E. the Governor under the proviso to Section 5 of the same Order for adjudication.

The following findings and award dated October 25, 1946, made by the Special Tribunal are published for general information in terms of Section 8 (4) of the same Order :— \bullet

"The Petitioner Union demands the reinstatement by the respondent of two drivers who were dismissed from service by the respondent, who is a proprietor of motor lorries.

The driver Heen Banda was dismissed on or about July 17, 1946, and driver Abeyakoon was dismissed on or about July 29, 1946.

Heen Banda, while employed by the respondent appears in violation of the law to have carried passengers in a lorry. For this he was fined by the Magistrate. He appears also to have disobeyed an order by the employer to transport perishable vegetables to Colombo. Moera Saibo, the employer has given evidence that both Heen Banda and Abeyakoon have been guilty of disobedience of lawful orders and insubordination.

As regards driver Abeyakoon, I am satisfied upon the evidence that he absented himself from work without any lawful excuse from July 23, 1946. Complaint regarding his absence without leave or excuse was made to the Assistant Commissioner of Labour on July 23, 1946. I attach no value to the certificate from the Vederala regarding Abeyakoon's illness which was obtained from the Vedarala on July 28, 1946, apparently after he was given notice of the termin-ation of his services. The question to be considered is whether these two workmen have by their conduct forfeited their claim to be reinstated. An employer has the right to terminate the services of such of his employees as are not willing to carry out his lawful orders and act generally in a spirit of insubordination. I therefore award that these two drivers need not be reinstated. Counsel for the petitioner has submitted to me that it is competent to the Tribunal to award compendsation in the event of the Tribunal finding that no case has been made out for the reinstatement of two drivers. I am of opinion that in view of my findings, an award for payment of compensation cannot be made. However, the respondent has stated that he stands by the offer made by him at a conference with the A. C. L. to pay each of these drivers 3 months wages. I therefore make a note of this agreement which I feel confident will be carried out.'

Harvesting of Paddy in Kalmunai Emergency Area.

BY virtue of the powers vested in mo by the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulation 37, the Defence (Purchase of Foodstuffs) Regulation, 1942, and the Defence (Paddy Cultivation) Regulation, 1943, I do hereby direct that :---

Every person whother owner or cultivator in charge of the reaping of the harvest of any paddy or kurakkan land situated within the Kalmunai Emergency Arca and which is expected to be harvested during Idapokam 1946, shall inform the Purchasing Officer of the area in which the land is situated of the date on which it is proposed to reap and thresh the harvest on the land, not less than ten clear days ahead in each case.

2. No cultivator, shareholder or other person having interest in any land (which term includes reapers, threshers and others who receive payment in kind for service rendered in the cultivation) cultivated with paddy or kurakkan situated within the Kalmunai Emergency Area shall remove any paddy, harvested for Idapokam 1946, from the threshing floor until the harvets has been checked and verified by the Purchasing Officer or any other officer authorised by me in writing and the paddy ordered by such officer to be given to Government has been surrendered to him or to his agent.

Removal thereafter to the Barn or other places of storage within the Kalmunai Emergency Area should only be on permit in Form I. P. S. 33 issued by the Purchasing Officer of the area in which the threshing floor is situated or by any other officer authorised by me in writing.

4. Removal to places outside the Kalmunai Emergency Area should only be on permit issued by me or by any other officer authorised by me in writing. Non-residents who desire to remove their share outside the Kalmunai Emergency Area should make their application on Form D. F. C. 34 in duplicate through the Revenue Officer or A.G.A. (E) of the area in which they reside.

If no application for removal of any share is received within six weeks of harvesting, the paddy in question will be taken over by me and payment made at the rate prescribed by Government for well dried paddy free from chaff, &c.
