PRICE ORDERS.

THREAD.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, as amended by paragraph (2) of the Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No. 2) Regulations, I, Codric Francis Ingledow, Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles), do, by this Order—

(i.) revoke with effect from this date my Order on thread dated September 29, 1945, published in Government Gazette No. 9,468 of October 5, 1945, in so far as they relate to the maximum prices fixed in respect of the articles mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule heroto;

(ii.) fix the prices specified in columns 2, 3 and 4 of the Schedule hereto to be, respectively, the importers maximum price (to a wholesale dealer), the maximum wholesale price and the maximum rotall price above which thread of the description and grade specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Schedule shall not be

sold in any part of Ceylon;
(iii.) direct that for the purpose of this Order—

(a) any sale of thread for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
(b) any sale of thread for the purpose of use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;

- (iv.) direct that every person who sells any thread of any description and grade shall give to the purchaser of such thread, on demand, a receipt in which there shall be set out-
 - (a) the quantity, description and grade of the thread sold;

the prices paid;

(c) the date and place of sale; and

- (d) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail;
- (v.) direct that any trader, who, at any premises, sells any thread of any description and grade specified in the Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at these premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of thread of that description and grade.

BONE MEAL.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 of 1939.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Doputy Controller of Prices by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, John William Hamilton O'Regan, Doputy Controller of Prices, Nuwara Eliya District, do by this Order-

- (1) fix the prices specified in columns 4 and 5 of the Schedule hereto to be respectively the maximum wholesale price and maximum retail price above which bone meal shall not be sold by wholesale or by retail, as the case may be within the areas specified in the corresponding entries in column 3 of the Schedule hereto:-
- (2) direct that for the purpose of this Order-
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of any bone meal of the description and grade specified in the First Schedule hereto for the purpose of resale, or any sale of any bone meal of the description and grade specified in the First Schedule hereto in a quantity of one cwt. or more at a time, shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale; and
 - (b) any sale of any quantity less than one ewt. of any bone meal of the description and grade specified in the First Schedule hereto for the purpose of consumption or use by the purchaser shall be deemed to be a sale by retail:
- (3) direct that no treder shall sell bone meal of the description of the First Schedule hereto which is adulterated
- with any article or with bone meal of any inferior description or grade or quality;

 (4) direct that any trader who, at any promises within the respective areas in column 3 of the Schedule hereto, sells any bone meal of the description specified in the First Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which there shall be set the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of that bone meal of that description and grade;

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- (5) direct that every person who sells by wholesale any bone meal of the description specified in the First Schedule hereto shall, and every person who sells by retail any bone meal of the description specified in the First Schedule hereto shall on demand give the purchaser a receipt on which there shall be set out—]
 - the date of sale;

the description and the grade of bone meal sold;

the quantity sold and the price paid for the quantity sold; and

(d) the nature of the transaction, that is to say whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail.

"J & G Meakin" and "Alfred Meakin" and not White Commercial Selection Johnson & Meakins.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices, (Miscellaneous Articles) by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance No. 39 of 1939, as amended by paragraph 2 of the Defence (Control of Pricos) (Supplementary Provisions No. 2) Regulations, published in the Government Gazette Extraordinary No. 9,054 of December 21, 1942, I, Walwin Arnold de Silva, Deputy Controller of Prices, (Miscellaneous Articles), Puttalam and Chilaw Districts, do, by this Order—

(i.) revoke with effect from this date my Order dated August 18, 1942, on Coment, published in Government Gazette No. 9,001 of September 4, 1942;

- (ii.) fix the prices specified in column 2 of the Schedule hereto to be the maximum prices above which Cement of the description mentioned in the corresponding entries in column 1 shall not be sold anywhere in the districts of Puttalam and Chilaw;
- (iii.) direct that every trader who at any premises in Puttalam and Chilaw Districts, exhibit for sale any Cement of the description specified in the Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of Cement of that description;
- (iv.) direct that every person who sells Coment of the description in the Schedule hereto, shall give the purchaser of that Cement, a receipt on demand, in which there shall be set out-

(a) the quantity of the Cement sold (by weight);
(b) description of Cement sold;
(c) the price paid for the quantity of Cement sold;
(d) the data of sole.

(d) the date of sale.
