PRICE ORDERS.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

BONE MEAL.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, John William Hamilton O'Regan, Doputy Controller of Prices, Nuwara Eliya District, do by this Order-

(1) fix the prices specified in columns 4 and 5 of the Schedule hereto to be respectively the maximum wholesale price and maximum retail price above which bone meal shall not be sold by wholesale or by retail, as the case may be within the areas specified in the corresponding entries in column 3 of the Schedule heroto:-

(2) direct that for the purpose of this Order-

(a) any sale of any quantity of any bone meal of the description and grade specified in the First Schedule hereto for the purpose of resale, or any sale of any bone meal of the description and grade specified in the First Schedule hereto in a quantity of one cwt. or more at a time, shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale; and

(b) any sale of any quantity less than one cwt. of any bone meal of the description and grade specified in the First Schedule hereto for the purpose of consumption or use by the purchaser shall be deemed

to be a sale by retail;

(3) dureet that no trader shall sell bone meal of the description of the First Schedule herete which is adulterated with any article or with bone meal of any inferior description or grade or quality;

(4) direct that any trader who, at any premises within the respective areas in column 3 of the Schedule hereto, sells any bone meal of the description specified in the First Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which there shall be set the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of that bone meal of that description and grado;

(5) direct that every person who sells by wholesale any bone meal of the description specified in the First Schedule hereto shall, and every person who sells by retail any bone meal of the description specified in the First Schedule hereto shall on demand give the purchaser a receipt on which there shall be set out—

(b) the description and the grade of bone meal sold;

(c) the quantity sold and the price paid for the quantity sold; and (d) the nature of the transaction, that is to say whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail.

CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

Revocation Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices (Food), by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, as amended by Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No. 2) Regulations, I, Reginald Sydney Vernon Poulier, Controller of Prices (Food), do by this Order revoke with effect from this date my Food Price Order No. C-83 published in Government Gazette No. 9,517 of February 8, 1946, and my Food Price Order No. C-97 published in Government Gazette No. 9,562 of May 31, 1946, in so far as they fix maximum prices for CORIANDER in all parts of Coylon.

CROCKERY.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939. Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, as amended by paragraph (2) of the Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No. 2) Regulations, I, Cedric Francis Ingledow, Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles), do, by this Order—

(i) fix the prices specified in the First and Second Schedules hereto to be the maximum wholesale and the maximum retail prices above which crockery of the description and size specified therein shall not be sold in any part of Ceylon;

(ii) direct that every person who at any premises in Ceylon exhibits for sale crockery of the description and size specified in the First or Second Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises, a notice in which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed for such crockery by this Order;

(iii) direct that any person, who at any premises, deals or has at any time during the three months prior to this date, dealt in crockery of the description and size specified in the First or Second Schedule hereto and has for the time being no stocks of such crockery available for sale, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice to the effect that he has no stocks available for sale for the time being:

(iv) direct that every person whether carrying on business as an importer or dealer in crockery who has in his possession a stock of crockery of the description specified in the First or Second Schedule hereto shall furnish to me within seven days of publication of this Order in the Government Gazette, a return stating—

> (a) the address of every premises in which are contained crockery in his possession or under his control;

> (b) the quantity and description of crockery in each store, and a monthly return of stocks on or before the 5th of each month;

(v) direct that every person who sells crockery of the doscription specified in the First and Second Schedules hereto shall give to every purchaser of such crockery, on demand, a receipt in which there shall be set out—

(a) the date of sale,

(b) the description of the crockery sold,

(c) the quantity of the crockery sold; and

(d) the price paid.
