ACETIC ACID AND FORMIC ACID.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, as amended by paragraph (2) of the Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No. 2) Regulations, I, Cedric Francis Ingledow, Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles), do, by this Order—

revoke with effect from this date Order on Acetic Acid and Formic Acid dated April 9, 1942, published in *Government Gazette* No. 8,908 of April 10, 1942.

SOAP (INDIAN).

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, as amended by paragraph (2) of the Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No. 2) Regulations, I, Cedric Francis Ingledow, Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles), do, by this Order—

(i.) fix the prices specified in columns 2, 3 and 4 of the Schedule hereto to be respectively the importer's maximum price to a wholesale dealer, the maximum wholesale price and the maximum retail price above which soap of the description specified in column 1 of the Schedule shall not be sold in any part of Ceylon;

(ii.) direct that for the purpose of this Order—

(a) any sale of the soap specified in the Schedule hereto, for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;

(b) any sale of the soap specified in the Schedule hereto other than a sale by wholesale as defined above shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;

(c) "importer's maximum price" shall apply to any sale by an importer to a wholesale dealer;

(d) "maximum wholesale price" shall apply to all sales by wholesale except sales by an importer to a wholesale dealer;

(e) "maximum retail price" shall apply to all sales by retail;

(iii.) direct that every person who sells any soap specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto, shall give to every purchaser of such soap on demand a receipt in which there shall be set out—

(a) the quantity and description of the soap sold;

(b) the price paid;

(c) the date of the sale; and

(d) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the transaction was by wholesale or by retail;

(iv.) direct that every trader, who, at any premises in Ceylon sells any soap of the description specified in the Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of soap of that description.

CEMENT (COLOMBO DISTRICT).

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles) by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, as amended by paragraph 2 of the Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No. 2) Regulations, I, Velupillai

Coomaraswamy, Deputy Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles), Colombo District, do, by this Order—

fix the prices specified in Column 2 of the Schedule hereto to be the maximum prices above which cement of the description mentioned in the corresponding entries in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall not be sold within the Colombo District (excluding the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo);

that every trader who at any premises within Colombo District (excluding the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo) exhibits for sale any cement of the description specified in the Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of each of that description;

that every person who sells cement of the description mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall give the purchaser of that cement a receipt, on demand, in which there shall be set out—

(a) the quantity of the cement sold (by weight),

(b) description of cement sold,
(c) the price paid for the quantity of cement sold, and
(d) the date of sale.
