KEROSENE OIL.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Assistant Controller of Prices (Miscollaneous Articles), by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, as amended by paragraph 2 of the Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No. 2) Regulations published in the Ceylon Government Gazette Extraordinary No. 9,054 of December 21, 1942, I, Hector Wilfred Abeyewardene, Assistant Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles), Galle District, do, by this Order-

(1) revoke with effect from this date the Order dated December 20, 1945, published in the Government Gazette No. 9,505 of January 18, 1946;

(2) fix the prices for areas specified in column 1 of the First, Second, Third, Fourth and Fifth Schedules to be respectively, the maximum price per Gallon bulk and the maximum price per bottle specified in columns 3 and 4 of the First, Second, Third and Fourth Schedules and column 4 of the Fifth Schedule referred to, above which kerosene oil of the brands specified in column 2 of the Schedules hereto shall not be sold wholesale or by rotail within the areas specified in column 1 of the First, Second, Third, Fourth and Fifth Schedules respectively;

(3) direct that every trader who exposes for sale kerosene oil of the brands specified in column 2 of the First, Second, Third, Fourth and Fifth Schedules to this Order, at any premises or from a tank cart that hawks kerosene oil for sale within the Galle District shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises or on the tank cart, that hawks kerosene oil, for sale a notice in which shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this order in respect of that article;
(4) direct that no such trader or tank carter shall sell any kerosene oil of any brand specified in column 2 of the

Schedules hereto which is adulterated with any other article or any oil of an inferior description or quality;

- (5) direct that every person who sells by wholesale kerosene oil of any brand specified in column 2 of the Schedule hereto shall, and any person who sells by retail shall, on demand, give the purchaser of that article a receipt in which there shall be set out-
  - (a) the brand of kerosene oil sold;
  - (b) the quantity of kerosene oil sold;
  - (c) the price paid;
  - (d) the date of sale;
- (6) direct that for the purpose of this Order a bottle shall be deemed to be one sixth (1/6) of an Imperial Gallon;
- (7) direct that sale of any quantity below one bottle shall be restricted to half bottle, three-quarter bottle, and quarter bottles only, and sale of any intermediate quantity shall be prohibited;
- (8) direct that the price shall be calculated on the bottle rate in the case of sale by three-quarter, half or quarter

(2) fix the prices for areas specified in column 1 of the first and the second schedules respectively;

(3) direct that every trader who exposes for sale korosene oil of the brands specified in column 2 of the First and the Second Schedules to this order at any premises or from a tank cart that hawks kerosene oil, for sale, within the Trincomalee District, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises or on the tank cart that hawks kerosene oil, for sale a notice in which shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this Order in respect of that article;

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Aritcles), by section 3 (read with section 2 (3), of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, as amended by paragraph (2) of the Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No. 2) Regulations, I, Samson Felix Amerasinghe, Deputy Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles), Anuradhapura District, do by this Order—

- (1) revoke with effect from this date, the Order dated December 1, 1945, and published in Government Gazette No. 9,493 of December 14, 1945, in so far as it relates to the maximum prices of kerosene oil;
- (ii.) fix the prices specified in columns 2, 3 and 4 of the Schedule hereto, to be respectively the Agent's maximum price to the wholesale dealer per gallon bulk, the maximum wholesale price to a retail dealer per gallon bulk, and the maximum retail price per bottle above which kerosene oil of any brand shall not be sold wholesale or by retail, within the areas specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto;

(vi.) direct that for the purpose of this order a bottle shall be deemed to be one-sixth of an imperial gallon;

(vii.) direct that the sale of any quantity below one bottle shall be restricted to half bottle, three quarter bottle and quarter bottle only, and the sale of any intermediate quantity shall be prohibited;

(viii.) direct that the price shall be calculated on the bottle rate in the case of sale by three quarter, half or

quarter bottle.

# WHOLE WHEAT (WHOLESALE AND RETAIL).

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THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

#### Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Assistant Controller of Prices (Food), by section 3 (read with 2, (3) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, as amended by Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary (Provisions No. 2) Regulations, I, John Philip Ascrappa, Assistant Controller of Prices (Food), Batticaloa District, do, by this Order—

- (1) revoke with effect from this date the Order of the Assistant Controller of Prices (Food), Batticaloa District, dated March 1, 1945, published in the Government Gazette No. 9,380 of March 16, 1945, fixing the maximum wholesale and retail prices of whole wheat;
- (2) fix the prices specified in column 2 of the First Schedule hereto, to be the maximum wholesale price per bag of 80 measures whole wheat, above which whole wheat

shall not be sold by wholesale at the places mentioned in the corresponding entries in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto;

- (3) fix the prices specified in column 2 of the Second Schedule hereto, to be the maximum retail price per measure above which whole wheat shall not be sold by retail in the areas mentioned in the corresponding entries in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto;
- (4) direct that every trader who sells whole wheat in the places and in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the First and Second Schedules hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at his premises (store or boutique) a notice in which shall be set out the maximum prices for whole wheat fixed by this Order;
- (5) direct that no person shall sell whole wheat which is adulterated with any other article;
- (6) direct that every person who sells whole wheat by wholesale or retail shall on demand, give the purchaser of that article a receipt in which there shall beset out—
  - (a) the date of sale,
  - (b) the quantity of whole wheat sold,
  - (c) the price paid for the quantity of whole wheat sold, and
  - (d) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail;

#### ~ ~ (7) direct that for the purpose of this Order-

- (a) any sale of any quantity of whole wheat for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale,
- (b) any sale of any quantity of whole wheat for the purpose of consumption or use by the purchaser shall be deemed to be a sale by retail, and
- (c) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart dry measure.
