Food Price Order Ku—13 of 1946.

WHOLE WHEAT (WHOLESALE AND RETAIL).

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 3, read with section 2 (3) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, as amended by Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No. 2) Regulations, I, Don Cornelis Perera Beneragama, Assistant Controller of Prices (Food), Kurunegala Revenue District, do, by this Order—

- (1) revoke my Food Price Order Ku 8 of 1944, in so far as it relates to the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto ;
- (2) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto to be respectively the maximum wholesale price per bag and the maximum retail price per measure above which whole wheat shall not be sold in the areas mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Schedule hereto ;
- (3) direct that every trader who sells whole wheat in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at his premises (store or boutique) a notice in which shall be set out the maximum prices for whole wheat fixed by this Order ;
- (4) direct that no person shall sell whole wheat which is adulterated with any other article ;
- (5) direct that every person who sells whole wheat by wholesale shall, and every person who sells whole wheat by retail shall, on demand, give the purchaser of that whole wheat a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the date of sale ;
 - (b) the quantity of whole wheat sold ;
 - (c) the price paid for the quantity of whole wheat sold ; and
 - (d) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail, and
- (6) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of whole wheat for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale ;
 - (b) any sale of any quantity of whole wheat for the purpose of consumption or use by the purchaser shall be deemed to be a sale by retail ;
 - (c) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure ; and
 - (d) the maximum wholesale price which may be demanded for any quantity of whole wheat which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum wholesale price per bag fixed by this Order.

KEROSENE OIL.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles) by section 3 read with section 2 (3) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, as amended by paragraph (2) of the Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No. 2) Regulations published in the Ceylon Government Gazette Extraordinary No. 9,054 of December 21, 1942, I, Cedric James Oorloff, Deputy Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles), Hambantota District, do, by this Order—

- (i) revoke with effect from this date Order on Kerosene Oil dated December 1, 1945, published in Government Gazette No. 9,492 of December 7, 1945 ;

fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the second schedule hereto, to be respectively the maximum price per gallon and the maximum price per bottle above which kerosene oil of the brand specified in the first schedule hereto, shall not be sold within the area mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the second schedule hereto;

that every trader who at any premises within the limits of any area mentioned in column 1 of the first schedule hereto, exposes for sale any kerosene oil of any brand specified in the first schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice in which shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this Order, for kerosene oil of the brand specified in the first schedule hereto;

that no trader shall sell any kerosene oil of any brand specified in the first schedule hereto which is adulterated with any other article or with any oil of an inferior description or quality;

that every trader who sells kerosene oil of any brand specified in the first schedule hereto, shall give to the purchaser of that kerosene oil, on demand, a receipt on which shall be set out—

- (a) the brand of the kerosene oil sold,
- (b) the quantity of kerosene oil sold,
- (c) the price paid, and
- (d) the date and place of sale;

(vi.) direct that for the purposes of this Order a bottle shall be deemed to be one-sixth ($\frac{1}{6}$ th) of an imperial gallon;

(vii.) direct that any quantity below one bottle shall be restricted to half bottle and quarter bottle only, and sale of any intermediate quantity shall be prohibited

(viii.) direct that the price shall be calculated on the bottle rate in the case of sale by half or quarter bottles.

(1) revoke with effect from this date, the Order dated December 22, 1945, of the Assistant Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles), Kegalla, and published in the *Government Gazette* No. 9,513 of February 1, 1946, in so far as it relates to the maximum prices of kerosene oil;

(2) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto to be respectively the maximum price per gallon and the maximum price per bottle above which kerosene oil shall not be sold within the area mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the schedule hereto;

(3) direct that every trader who at any premises within the limits of any area mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous place at those premises a notice in which shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this order for kerosene oil;

- a "bottle" shall be deemed to be one-sixth ($\frac{1}{6}$) of an Imperial gallon,
 - "Bazaar area of Warakapola" means all that area within half ($\frac{1}{2}$) mile of the Police station at Warakapola,
 - "Bazaar area of Mawanela" means all that area within half ($\frac{1}{2}$) mile of the Police station at Mawanela;
- (7) direct that sale of any quantity below one-fourth ($\frac{1}{4}$) of a bottle shall be prohibited;
- (8) direct that the price shall be calculated on the bottle rate in the case of sales by a fraction of a bottle.

- (5) direct that no such trader shall sell any kerosene oil of any brand specified in column 2 of the Schedu^l which is adulterated with any other article or with any oil of an inferior description or quality;
- (6) direct that every trader who sells kerosene oil of any brand specified in column 2 of the Schedule hereto s^h give to the purchaser of that kerosene oil, on demand, a receipt on which shall be set out—
 - (a) the brand of the kerosene oil sold;
 - (b) the quantity of kerosene oil sold;
 - (c) the price paid; and
 - (d) the date of sale;
- (7) direct that for the purposes of this Order a "bottle" shall be deemed to be one-sixth ($\frac{1}{6}$) of an Imperial gallon;
- (8) direct that the sale of any quantity below one bottle shall be restricted to half bottle and quarter bottle only and of any intermediate quantity, shall be prohibited;
- (9) direct that the price shall be calculated on the bottle rate in the case of sale by half or quarter bottle.

PRESERVED MILK.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 3, read with section 2 (3), of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, as amended by Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No. 2) Regulations, I, Allan Basil Samuel Nesarajah Pullenayegum, Assistant Controller of Prices (Food) for the Island, do by this Order—

- (i) revoke with effect from this date Food Price Order No. C-100 published in *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 9,570 of June 21, 1946;

- (ii) fix the prices specified in columns (4), (5), (6), (7), and (8) of Schedule hereto to be, respectively, the importer's maximum price per case, the Colombo maximum wholesale price per case, the Colombo maximum retail price per tin, the outstation maximum wholesale price per case and the outstation maximum retail price per tin above which the brand of the preserved milk specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Schedule hereto and of the net contents or size specified in the corresponding entry in column 2 of the Schedule hereto shall not be sold by wholesale or by retail as the case may be ;
- direct that for the purposes of this Order—
- "preserved milk" shall mean full cream milk imported into Ceylon which is preserved by some process, and shall include powdered milk ;
 - any sale of any quantity of preserved milk for the purpose of resale or any sale of preserved milk in a quantity of one case or more at a time shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale ;
 - any sale of preserved milk in a quantity less than one case for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail ;
 - the "importer's maximum price" shall apply to all sales by wholesale made by an importer ;
 - the "Colombo maximum wholesale price" shall apply to all sales by wholesale made within the Municipal limits of Colombo except wholesale sales by importers ;
 - the "Colombo maximum retail price" shall apply to all sales by retail made within the Municipal limits of Colombo ;
 - the "outstation maximum wholesale price" shall apply to all sales by wholesale made outside the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo except wholesale sales by importers ;
 - the "outstation maximum retail price" shall apply to all retail sales made outside the Municipal limits of Colombo ;
 - an "importer" of any brand of preserved milk shall mean any person to whom an exporter from abroad has consigned a quantity of that brand of preserved milk ;
 - a "case" of any preserved milk shall mean the quantity specified in the corresponding entry in column 3 of the Schedule hereto, irrespective of whether this quantity is enclosed in a container or not ;
- (iv.) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order every trader, who has in his possession or under his control at any place any preserved milk of the brands specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto, shall exhibit conspicuously at that place a notice in which there shall be set out the description of that brand of preserved milk and the maximum prices therefor fixed by this Order in that area ;
- (v.) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order every person who sells any preserved milk by wholesale shall, and every person who sells any preserved milk by retail shall on demand, give the purchaser thereof a receipt in which there shall be set out—
- the date of sale ;
 - the quantity sold ;
 - the description and brand of the preserved milk sold ;
 - the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail ; and
 - the price paid for the quantity sold.
