KEROSENE OIL.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Assistant Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, as amended by paragraph (2) of the Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No. 2) Regulations, I, James Albert Arijunan Bartlett, Assistant Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles), Kalutara District, do by this Order—

revoke the Order dated December 1, 1945, published in Government Gazette No. 9,493 of December 14, 1945, in so far as it relates to the maximum prices of kerosene oil fixed therein for the Kalutara District;
 fix the prices in columns 2, 3, 4 and 5 of the Schedule hereto to be respectively the agent's maximum price per

(2) fix the prices in columns 2, 3, 4 and 5 of the Schedule hereto to be respectively the agent's maximum price per gallon to a wholesale dealer, the agent's maximum price per gallon to an authorised distributor, the wholesale dealer's maximum price per gallon to an authorised distributor, and the maximum retail price per bottle, above which kerosene oil of any brand shall not be sold within the corresponding areas specified in column 1;

(3) direct that the maximum price which may be demanded by any person for any quantity of kerosene oil which is more or less than one gallon or one bottle, as the case may be, shall be determined by reference to the

appropriate maximum price per gallon or per bottle fixed by this Order;

(4) direct that any person who exposes for sale any kerosene oil of any brand at any premises within the corresponding areas specified in column 1 shall exhibit in a conspicuous place at those premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of that brand of kerosene oil;

(5) direct that no person shall sell any kerosene oil of any brand which is adulterated with any other article or with

any oil of an inferior description or quality;
(6) direct that any person who sells any kerosene oil of any brand shall, on demand, give the purchaser of that kerosene oil a receipt on which there shall be set out—

(a) the brand of kerosene oil sold;

(b) the quantity of kerosene oil sold

(c) the price paid for the quantity of kerosene oil sold;

(d) the date of sale.

(7) direct that for the purpose of this Order a bottle shall be deemed to be one-sixth part of an imperial gallon.

 (d) the date of sale;

- (7) direct that for the purpose of this Order a "bottle" shall be deemed to be one-sixth (th) of an Imperial gallon;

(i.) revoke with effect from this date my Order dated September 4, 1944, published in *Government Gazette*No. 9,309 of September 8, 1944, fixing the maximum wholesale price per bag of 80 measures rice;
