PRICE ORDERS.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Assistant Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles) by section 3 (read with section 2 (3), of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, as amended by the Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No. 2) Regulations, I, Charles Samson Ranasooriya, Assistant Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles), Nuwara Eliya District, do, by this Order—

- (1) revoke with effect from this date the Order made by the Assistant Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles), Nuwara Eliya District, published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,474 of October 19, 1945;
- (2) fix the prices specified in Columns 2 and 3 of the schedule hereto, to be the maximum price per gallon and the maximum price per bottle above which the kerosene oil of the description specified in the schedule hereto shall not be sold (by wholesale or by retail) within the areas specified in the corresponding entry in Column 1 of the schedule hereto;
- (3) direct that every trader who exhibits for sale kerosene oil at any premises within the areas specified in Column 1 of the schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which shall be set out the maximum price of kerosene oil fixed by this Order;
- (4) direct that no such trader shall sell any kerosene oil which is adulterated with any other article or with any oil of any description or quality;
- (5) direct that every person who sells kerosene oil, shall give the purchaser of that oil, a receipt on which shall be set out—
 - (a) the quantity of the kerosene oil sold;
 - (b) the price paid; and
 - (c) the date of sale;
- (6) direct that for the purpose of this Order a "bottle" shall be deemed to be one-sixth (1/6th) of an imperial gallon;
- (7) direct that the sales of any quantity of kerosene oil below one bottle shall be restricted to half bottle and quarter bottle only, and sale of any intermediate quantity shall be prohibited;
- (8) direct that prices be calculated on the gallon rate in the case of sales of half-gallon and above, and on bottle rate in the case of all sales of less than half-gallon.

virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles) by section 3 read with section 4 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, as amended by the Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions) Ordinance, No. 1, Hottiarachchige Jinadasa, Deputy Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles) for the Island of Ceylon,

do hereby make with effect from this date—

- (a) Order dated July 18, 1946, published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,588 of August 2, 1946, in so far as it relates to the maximum prices in respect of the following motor tyres and tubes:—

- (2) fix the prices specified in Schedules I. to V. hereto as the maximum retail prices above which tyres (other than retreaded tyres) or tubes of the descriptions and sizes specified therein shall not be sold in any part of Ceylon;
- (3) declare that for the purposes of this Order any sale of such tyres or tubes for the purpose of use by the purchaser shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
- (4) direct that every trader shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at every place at which such tyres or tubes are sold or delivered by him a notice on which shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of such tyres and tubes.

WHOLE WHEAT.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices (Food) by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Murugeysen Rajendra, Deputy Controller of Prices (Food), Matara, do, by this Order—

- (1) revoke with effect from this date the order of the Assistant Controller of Prices (Food), Matara District, dated February 1, 1945, published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,373 of February 23, 1945, prescribing the maximum prices for whole wheat within the Revenue District of Matara;
- (2) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 respectively of Schedule hereto as the maximum wholesale price of a bag of 80 measures whole wheat and the maximum retail price per measure of whole wheat above which whole wheat shall not be sold in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule;
- (3) direct that every trader who sells whole wheat in the area mentioned in column 1 shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at his premises, store or boutique a notice in which shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order for whole wheat;
- (4) direct that no trader shall sell whole wheat which is adulterated with any other article;
- (5) direct that every person who sells whole wheat by wholesale and every person who sells whole wheat by retail shall, on demand give to the purchaser of the whole wheat a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the date of sale,
 - (b) the quantity of whole wheat sold,
 - (c) the price paid for the quantity of whole wheat sold, and
 - (d) the nature of the transaction whether the sale was by wholesale or retail, and
- (6) direct that for the purpose of this order—
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of whole wheat for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be sale by wholesale,
 - (b) any sale of any quantity of whole wheat for the purpose of consumption or use by the purchaser shall be deemed to be sale by retail,
 - (c) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart dry measure, and
 - (d) the maximum wholesale price which may be demanded for any quantity of whole wheat which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum wholesale price per bag of 80 measures fixed by this order.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, as amended by Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No. 2) Regulations, I, Reginald Sydney Vernon Poulter, Controller of Prices (Food), do, by this Order—

- (i) revoke with effect from this date my Food Price Order No. C-63, published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,435 of July 20, 1945, in so far as it relates to the maximum prices fixed for the milk food of the description and brand specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto;
- (ii) fix the prices specified in columns 3 and 4 of the Schedule hereto to be, respectively, the maximum wholesale price per case, and the maximum retail price per tin above which the brand of milk food specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of that Schedule and of the standard pack specified in the corresponding entry in column 2 of that Schedule shall not be sold by wholesale or by retail, as the case may be, in any part of Ceylon;
- (iii) direct that paragraphs (iii) to (v.) of my Food Price Order No. C-63 relating to preserved milk and milk foods, published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,435 of July 20, 1945, shall apply in the case of the milk-
