Property Rate for 1947.*The Urban Councils Ordinance.*

IT is hereby notified that the following resolution under section 173 (3) of the Urban Councils Ordinance, No. 61 of 1939, was passed by the Kadugannawa Urban Council on July 20, 1946:—

“By virtue of the powers conferred by section 173 (3) of the Urban Councils Ordinance, No. 61 of 1939, this Council hereby—

- (1) imposes for the year 1947 a rate of twelve per centum on the annual value of all immovable property situated within the town of Kadugannawa;
- (2) declares that of the said rate a portion equal to six per centum of the annual value is levied for the purpose of providing the conservancy service; and
- (3) declares that the said rate, which is the same as was in force during the preceding year, shall be payable in four equal instalments on March 31, June 30, September 30, and December 31, respectively.”
