

Section 9 (2) of the Village Communities
 Ordinance (Chapter 198) relating to the Mannar East Village
 and other Village Committees and published in
 the Gazette of July 5, 1946, is hereby amended, in the
 heading, by the substitution, for the heading "Put-
 talam", of the heading "Puttalam-Chilaw District".

Appointment of the Local Government Service Commission.

APPLICATIONS are invited for the following posts in
 the office of the Local Government Service Commission.
 Seven Clerks, Grade III—Rs. 840 rising by annual incre-
 ments of Rs. 72 to Rs. 2,424 per annum. Efficiency Bars
 before Rs. 1,488 and Rs. 2,064. Rent allowance and war
 allowance will be paid in accordance with the Government
 schemes.

2. Only those possessing the following qualifications

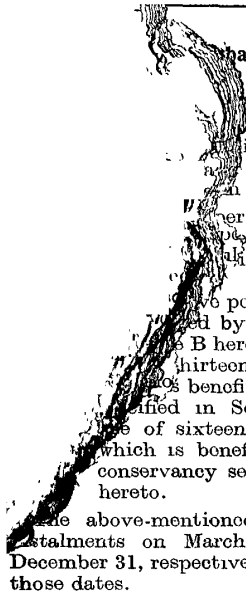

 Two per centum in respect of the area which is occupied by the water service and is specified in Schedule B hereto; and
 Three per centum in respect of the area which is occupied by the conservancy service and is specified in Schedule C hereto; and
 Four per centum in respect of the area which is occupied by the water service and the conservancy service and is specified in Schedule D hereto.

The above-mentioned rates are payable in four equal instalments on March 31, June 30, September 30, and December 31, respectively, in respect of the quarters ending those dates.
