All that area known as the Sanitary Board Town of Erukkalampiddi situated in the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Mannar in the Mannar District of the Northern Province, and bounded as follows:—

The Village Committee of Mannar East village area shall be entitled to collect or recover in respect of the year 1946, any tax or licence duty which has been imposed by that Committee before 1st January, 1947 and which may be due from any person resident or owing or possessing property in the villages of Thoddakadu, Tharakankoddai, South Bar and Painter's street which form part of the Village Headman's division of Thoddakadu.

#### Order.

WHEREAS by Proclamation the area now known as the town of Kalpitiya in the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Kalpitiya, in the Puttalam District of the North-Western Province, has, with effect from the first day of January, 1947, been excluded from the operation of the Small Towns Sanitary Ordinance (Chapter 197), and brought within the operation of the Village Communities Ordinance (Chapter 198), and added to the Kalpitiya village area of the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Kalpitiya, defined by Proclamation dated September 20, 1905, and published in Gazette No. 6,076 of September 22, 1905, as amended by Proclamation dated November 27, 1934, and published in Gazette No. 8,093 of November 30, 1934;

Now, therefore, by virtue of the powers vested in the Governor by section 41 of the Village Communities Ordinance (Chapter 198), I, John Curtois Howard, Officer Administering the Government of Ceylon, do by this Order, with effect from the first day of January, 1947—

- (a) transfer to the Village Committee of the aforesaid village area the whole of the property and the funds acquired or received by or vested in the Sanitary. Board of the Puttalam District for the use and benefit of the town of Kalpitiya and specified in Schedule A heroto;
- (b) declare that such funds and the revenue derived from the part of the village area which is now known as the town of Kalpitiya shall be employed by the Village Committee for the use and benefit of the aforesaid part of that area;
  (c) direct the Village Committee to keep separate books

(c) direct the Village Committee to keep separate books of accounts in repsect of the aforesaid part of that

village area;

(d) apportion and assign to the Village Committee the whole of the rights, liabilities, debts or obligations of the Sanitary Board of the Puttalam District under any contract entered into by the said Board for the benefit of the town of Kalpitiya;

- (e) prescribe the terms and conditions set out in Schedule B hereto as the terms and conditions on which the officers or servants specified in that Schedule and employed by the Sanitary Board for the purposes relating to the town of Kalpitiya may be transferred to the service of the aforesaid Village Committee; and
- (f) direct the Assistant Government Agent of the Puttalam and Chilaw Districts—
  - to collect all moneys due to the Samtary Board of the Puttalam District (whether as rates, taxes, licence duties or otherwise), from the inhabitants of the area now known as the town of Kalpitiya;
  - (2) to recover such moneys in the manner in which they would have been recovered if that town had not been excluded from the operation of Small Towns Sanitary Ordinance; and

    (3) to pay such moneys when so collected and recovered to the Village Committee of the aforesaid village area.'


