Special Water Rate for 1947. . . ,

IT is hereby notified that, subject to such exemptions as may be prescribed by by-laws made under the Urban Councils Ordinance, No. 61 of 1939, the Kurunegala Urban Council has, under section 143 of that Ordinance, and with the sanction of the Executive Committee of Local Administration, imposed for the year 1947, a special water rate of six per centum on the annual value of all immovable property situated within the town of Kurunegala, such rate being payable in four equal instalments on March 31, June 30, September 30, and December 31, respectively, in respect of the quarters ending on those dates.
