An Ordinance to amend the Customs Ordinance.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Customs (Amendment) Ordinance, No. 43 of 1946.

2. (1) Section 21 of the Customs Ordinance (hereinafter

Short title.

- 2. (1) Section 21 of the Customs Ordinance (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Ordinance"), is hereby amended as follows:—
- Amendment of section 21 of Chapter 185.
- (a) by the re-numbering of sub-section (3) as sub-section (4); and
- (b) by the insertion, immediately after sub-section (2), of the following new sub-section:—
 - "(3) The powers conferred on the Governor by the preceding provisions of this section may be exercised in relation to the Representative in Ceylon of the Government of any part of His Majesty's dominions, to the Trade Commissioner in Ceylon of any such Government, and to persons on the staff of any such Representative or Commissioner, in like manner as they are exercisable in relation to consular officers or clerks of foreign states.".
- (2) An Order under section 21 of the principal Ordinance (as amended by sub-section (1) of this section) made in relation to the Representative in Ceylon of the Government of India or to the Trade Commissioner in Ceylon of that Government or to persons on the staff of such Representative or Commissioner, shall, if so expressed, be deemed to have had effect from such date prior to the commencement of this Ordinance as may be specified by the Governor in the Order.

An Ordinance to amend the Estate Duty Ordinance.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof, as follows:

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Estate Duty (Amendment) Ordinance, No. 44 of 1946.

Amendment of etion 45A of Chapter 187.

- 2. Section 45A of the Estate Duty Ordinance is hereby amended as follows:-
 - (1) in sub-section (3) of that section, by the substitution, for the words "an amount equal to the face value of such stock.", of the following:-

"an amount equal to the aggregate of-

- (a) the face value of such stock, and
- (b) the accrued interest on such stock. ";
- (2) in sub-section (4) of that section, by the substitution, for the words "an amount which bears the prescribed proportion to the face value of such stock." of the following:-

"an amount equal to the aggregate of-

- (a) a sum bearing the prescribed proportion to the face value of such stock, and
- (b) the accrued interest on such stock.";

and

- (3) by the addition, immediately after sub-section (4) of that section, of the following new sub-section:-
 - "(5) Where the surrender of stock by any person under this section is deemed under sub-section (3) or sub-section (4) to be equivalent to the payment in cash of an amount which exceeds the estate duty payable by him, the excess shall be disposed of in the following manner:-
 - (a) where the amount of the excess is not less than one hundred rupees
 - (i) each complete sum of one hundred rupees comprised therein shall be reckoned as a unit and each unit or each group of two or more units, as the Financial Secretary may determine, shall be returned in the form of stock of the same issue as the surrendered stock; and
 - (ii) any outstanding fraction of a unit shall be returned in cash; and
 - (b) where the amount of the excess is less than one hundred rupees, such amount shall be returned in cash.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information:

An Ordinance to amend the Rent Restriction Ordinance, No. 60 of 1942.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof, as follows:

Short title

This Ordinance may be cited as the Rent Restriction (Amendment) Ordinance, No. of 1946.

2. Section 18 of the Rent Restriction Ordinance, No. 60 of 1942, is hereby repealed and the following section substituted therefor:—

18. This Ordinance shall cease to be in operation on the thirty-first day of December, 1947."

Objects and Reasons.

The Rent Restriction Ordinance, No. 60 of 1942, as amended by Ordinance No. 2 of 1946, will, under section 18, cease to be in operation on December 31, 1946, or on such earlier date as may be appointed by the Governor. It is now proposed that the principal Ordinance should be kept in force until December 31, 1947. The object of this Bıll is to give effect to this proposal.
