EXAMINATION FOR STENOGRAPHERS, MARCH, 1947.

APPLICATIONS are invited from male candidates for filling such vacancies in the posts of Stenographers as may occur.

2. Salary and Conditions of Service.—

(i.) Salary. Rs. 1,440 per annum rising by annual increments of Rs. 120 to Rs. 3,480 per annum.

(ii.) The posts are pensionable but confirmation after two years' service is dependent on the passing of an Efficiency Bar, for which a test is prescribed. There will also be an Efficiency Bar before Rs. 2,640 per annum, the passing of which is dependent on satisfactory work and conduct and the passing of a test.

(iii.) The grant of leave will in the case of a new entrant to the Public Service be governed by the Financial Regulations relating to the grant of leave to new entrants. Rent allowance will be payable.

(iv.) Successful candidates will be subject to the Public Service, Financial and other Standing Regulations of the Government.

(v.) Successful candidates who may have previous pensionable, non-pensionable or quasi-Government Service will not be given incremental credit in respect of such service.

3. The names of successful candidates will be published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* and they will be given appointments as suitable vacancies occur.

4. *Examination and Selection.*—A competitive examination will be held in Colombo by the Director of Education on March 15, 1947, and the selection will be made on the results of the examination.

5. *Subjects of Examination.*—The subjects of the examination will be as follows and marks will be assigned as indicated against each:—

(1) English Essay	50
(2) Shorthand—	
Taking down in Shorthand passages dictated at 100 words a minute for 5 minutes and the transcription of the record in longhand at eight words a minute	150
(3) Typewriting—	
Making a correct copy of a passage of about 600 words on the typewriter in 20 minutes, i.e., 30 words per minute	50
(4) <i>Viva voce</i>	50

(5) (a) Successful candidates who are Sinhalese or Tamil will be required to satisfy the Chief Secretary before appointment that they possess an elementary working knowledge of Sinhalese in the case of Sinhalese candidates, of Tamil in the case of Tamil candidates. They should be able to write a short letter, to read aloud a short passage from a newspaper, and answer oral questions on the passage read.

(b) Successful candidates who are neither Sinhalese nor Tamil will be required to pass the test in Sinhalese or Tamil, as set out in (a) above or pass a special test in English of a higher standard. The test in English will be a written one.

(c) Successful candidates of mixed parentage will be required to pass a test in the language of either of their parents, i.e., Sinhalese or Tamil or (Special) English.

*Candidates should bring their own typewriters if possible otherwise they will be expected to type on the machine provided, irrespective of make or model.

Touch typewriting will be regarded as essential.

Neatness and accuracy will be taken into account in marking the scripts.

6. The examination will be held in two parts. Part I. comprising subjects (1), (2) and (3) will be held first in accordance with the following Time Table:—

9.0 A.M. to 10.0 A.M.	..	English Essay
10.15 A.M. to 12.30 P.M.	..	Shorthand
Commencing at 2.0 P.M.	..	Typewriting

Candidates who have attained a sufficiently high standard in Part I. will be summoned for Part II. the *viva voce*, on a date to be notified to them later.

7. *Method of Application.*—Applications for admission to the examination must be made on forms obtainable from the Education Office, Colombo. These forms must be filled up and returned to reach that Office not later than 1 P.M. on February 18, 1947. Any applications received after that hour will be rejected. Stamps to the value of Rs. 10 must be affixed to each application and cancelled by the applicant's signature over them. All candidates should forward a copy of their birth certificate (which will be returned) with their application. Certificates of birth issued for the purposes of the Code of Assisted Schools will not be accepted for this examination. Affidavits will not be accepted as substitutes or birth certificates. Candidates who are not in Government Service should also attach copies of two testimonials of good character.

8. *Eligibility.*—

- (1) Candidates must be of good character.
- (2) Candidates must be Ceylonese. For the purpose of this examination, a Ceylonese is—
 - (a) a British subject who is born in Ceylon, one of whose parents was born in Ceylon; or
 - (b) a British subject who is a decedent of a person falling within category (a); or
 - (c) a British subject deemed by the Governor with the advice of the Board of Ministers, in view of special circumstances, to be a Ceylonese.
- (3) Candidates must furnish proof when forwarding their applications that they have previously passed at least one of the following examinations:—

The Junior School Certificate (English) Examination of the Education Department, Ceylon; the Cambridge Junior; the Commercial Certificate Examination, either Certificate or Higher Stage, (either Section) of the London Chamber of Commerce or Ceylon Chamber of Commerce, or

The Junior School Certificate (English) Examination held by a School approved by the Education Department for the Senior School Certificate (English) Examination.

N.B.—The minimum educational qualification required in future examinations for recruitment to the Stenographers' Service will be a pass in the Ceylon Senior School Certificate (English) Examination or equivalent examination.

(4) Candidates must be within the age limits laid down in paragraph 9.

9. *Age Limits.*—Candidates, who are not already on the permanent establishment of a Government Department, must be between the ages of 17 and 35 years on August 1, 1947.

N.B.—The maximum age limit in future examinations for recruitment to the Stenographers' Service will be thirty years.

10. *Refunds of value of Stamps.*—

(a) If a candidate is rejected owing to his not satisfying the conditions for admission to the examination a refund will be made of 3/5ths the value of stamps affixed to his application.

(b) If a candidate, who has been admitted to the examination, gives notice of his withdrawal to the Director of Education at least 7 days before the date of the examination, a refund will be made of 1/2 the value of stamps affixed to his application. His form of admission to the examination should be returned to the Director of Education for the refund to be made.

(c) A candidate who has been admitted to the examination and wishes to withdraw on account of illness, should forward notice of his withdrawal to reach the Director of Education at least one day before the examination. A refund of the full value of stamps affixed to his application will then be made, provided his notice of withdrawal is accompanied by a certificate from a qualified medical officer to the effect that he is unfit to sit for the examination.

(d) In no other case will a refund be granted.

11. *Medical Examination.*—The selected candidates will be required to pass a medical examination as to their physical fitness for service in any part of the Island.

FOOD CONTROL ORDINANCE.

Notice—Change of Ration.

IT is hereby notified in terms of Regulation 5 of Part II. of Head E and Regulation 4 (1) of Part III. of Head E of the Food Control Regulations, 1938, that as from Monday, January 20, 1947 (Sunday, January 19, 1947, in the case of the Colombo Municipal area) (32nd week of rationing of 6th series), until further notice the weekly ration of rice or paddy and wheat flour—

- (i.) which may be sold or issued by way of sale or otherwise, to any person of any class specified in column I of the Schedule hereto who is over one year of age and is resident on an estate as defined in the Food Control Regulation, 1938, or
- (ii.) which may be sold to any person of any class specified in column I of the Schedule hereto who is over one year of age and is resident in any area, whether urban or non-urban (other than an estate) in which rationing is in force, and who is the holder of a ration book for a person of that class,

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulation 37, the Defence (Purchase of Foodstuffs) Regulations, 1942, the Defence (Paddy Cultivation) Regulations, 1943, and the Defence (Food Rationing) (Special Provisions) Regulations, 1944, I, Kathiraveloo Kanagasur-dram, Assistant Government Agent, Kegalla District, a competent and proper authority do hereby direct—

(1) That every person whether owner or cultivator of any paddy land which is situated in Kegalla District, and which is expected to be harvested during the Maha 1946/1947 season shall forward the following informations in writing to the Village Headman or Vel-Vidane of the area in which the fields are situated so as to reach him at least ten days before the proposed date of reaping—

- the date on which it is proposed to reap and thresh the crop on the land;
- the name, situation, and extent of the paddy land;
- the names and addresses of the person or persons entitled to take or receive any part of the produce of the land under any contract or agreement or otherwise; and
- the details of the share or shares of the produce to which such person or persons may be entitled.

(2) That no paddy shall be removed from the threshing floor or field until an assessment of the crop has been made by the Village Headman or Vel-Vidane of the area in which the paddy land is situated, the levy of two bushels paddy per acre delivered to the Village Headman or Vel-Vidane of the area and permit obtained in the manner specified below—

- Transport within a Village Headman's Division:—

The application for a permit must be made to the Village Headman of the area in which the paddy field is situated and he will issue a permit on Form I. P. S. 33.

- Transport from one Village Headman's division to another within the same Chief Headman's division:—

A permit must be obtained under (a) but it must be endorsed by the D. R. O. or R. M. of the area before it is valid.

- Transport from one Chief Headman's Division to another within Kegalla District:—

The application should be made in duplicate on Form D. F. C. 34 to the D. R. O. or R. M. of the area in which the applicant resides. The application must be supported by reports from the Village Headmen or Vel-Vidanes of the areas in which the fields are situated. Copies of Form D. F. C. 34 are obtainable at the Office of the Chief Headmen and from this Office.

- Transport from Kegalla District to places outside:—

The application should be made in duplicate on Form D. F. C. 34 to the Government Agent, Assistant Government Agent, or the Assistant Government Agent (Emergency) of the area in which the applicant is resident. The application must be supported by reports from the Village Headmen or Vel-Vidanes of the area in which the fields are situated. Applicants resident in Kegalla District should send their applications through the D. R. O. or R. M. of the area in which the applicant resides.

(3) That no paddy shall, without prior authority, be disposed of in any manner other than by way of consumption at approved rates (*i.e.* six measures per person per week in the case of cultivators and owner-cultivators and their dependents and four measures per person per week in the case of non-cultivating owners and their dependents) by the owner and his *bona fide* dependents subject to a maximum of fifty bushels or such lower quantity as they may be entitled to until the following harvest.

(4) That no paddy shall be utilized for consumption by an owner or his dependents possessing a ration book until the surrender of the appropriate number of rice coupons at the rate of—

- (a) five coupons for every bushel of paddy allowed for consumption to owner-cultivators or cultivators; or
- (b) eight coupons for every bushel of paddy allowed for consumption to non-cultivating owners.

(5) That any paddy in excess of the requirements for consumption until the following harvest as laid down in Clause (3) or such paddy as I may order shall be sold to Government.

(6) Applicants are advised to make their applications as early as possible. If no application for the removal of any paddy is received within six weeks of the date of threshing in the manner specified above such stocks of paddy will be requisitioned under the Internal Purchase Scheme.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulation 37, the Defence (Purchase of Foodstuffs) Regulations, 1942, the Defence (Paddy Cultivation) Regulations, 1943, and the Defence (Food Rationing) (Special Provisions) Regulations, 1944, I, Cecil Theodore Perera, Assistant Government Agent (Emergency), Alutkuru, Hapitigam and Siyane korales, a competent and proper authority, do, by this order, direct that every owner or cultivator of any land which is cultivated with paddy during the 1946/47 Maha season and which is situated within the Chief Headmen's Divisions of Alutkuru korale South, Alutkuru korale North A, Alutkuru korale North B, Hapitigam korale, Siyane korale East, Siyane korale West (Adikari pattu), and Siyane korale West (Meda pattu) shall—

- (1) inform the Village Headman of the area in which the paddy land is situated of the date on which it is proposed to reap the harvest on that land, not less than 10 clear days ahead;
- (2) give the Village Headman or other person authorized by me, at his request, the following information relating to the land:—
 - (a) the name, situation and extent of the land;
 - (b) the names and addresses of the person or persons entitled to take or receive any part of the produce of the land, under any contract or agreement or otherwise; and
 - (c) the share or shares of the produce to which such person or persons may be entitled.

2. I do further direct that—

- (1) no paddy shall be removed or caused or permitted to be removed by any person from a field or threshing floor to a barn or any other place of storage, until the Village Headman or other person authorized by me shall have assessed and recorded the total harvest and the shares; and except on a permit on due form obtained from the proper authority in terms of paragraph 4 of this Order;
- (2) the Government levy of two bushels per acre on every paddy field cultivated for the Maha season on every field cultivated shall be handed over to the Village Headman at the threshing floor;
- (3) no paddy shall, without prior authority, be disposed of in any manner other than by way of consumption at approved rates by the owner and his *bona fide* dependants subject to a maximum of 50 bushels or such lower quantity as they may be entitled to until the following harvest;
- (4) no paddy shall be utilized for consumption by an owner or his dependant possessing a rice ration book until the surrender of the appropriate number of rice coupons;
- (5) any paddy in excess of the requirements for consumption as laid down in clause (3) and in the case of those who normally supply seed paddy and customarily feed labourers during cultivation operations, any paddy in excess of the requirements for consumption, seed paddy at the rate of two bushels of paddy per acre and feeding allowance at the rate of one bushel of paddy per acre, or such other quantity of paddy as I may order shall be sold to the Village Headman on behalf of Government.

3. The approved rates of consumption of paddy by producers at present are six measures of paddy per person per week in the case of cultivators and owner-cultivators and their dependants, and four measures of paddy per person per week in the case of non-cultivating owners and their dependants. Coupons in respect of paddy shall be surrendered at the rate of one rice coupon for every six measures of paddy received by a cultivator or any owner-cultivator and one rice coupon for every four measures of paddy received by a non-cultivating owner. In this connection the attention of all paddy producers is drawn to the Defence (Food Rationing) (Special Provisions) Regulations, 1944, by which the onus of surrender of coupons equivalent to the quantity of paddy obtained is laid on the producers themselves.

4. Permits for transport of paddy from the field or threshing floor to a barn situated within the same Chief Headman's or Divisional Revenue Officer's Division shall be obtained from the Village Headman concerned who will obtain the signature of the remover on the triplicate of the permit on Form D.F.S. and C. 12 or I.P.S. 33 in proof of removal and detach the requisite number of coupons from the rice ration books of the members of the producer's household. It is important that these permits should be surrendered to the Village Headman of the area to which the paddy is transported within three days of such removal thereto.  - (d) the details of the shares of the produce to which such persons may be entitled.
- (2) I do further direct that—
- (a) no cultivator, shareholder or any other person having interest in any paddy land situated within the above-mentioned Divisions shall remove any paddy harvested in Maha 1946-47 from a threshing floor to a barn or any other place of storage until the harvest has been checked and recorded by the Village Headman or any other person authorised by me ;
 - (b) removal thereafter to the barn or other place of storage within a Village Headman's area should be on permits on Form I. P. S. 33 (a) issued by the Village Headman of the area in which the paddy fields are situated, or by any other person authorised by me ;
 - (c) for transport from one D. R. O's Division to another, application must be made to me on Form D. F. C. 34 supported by the reports of the Village Headman of the area in which the fields are situated and of the area in which the applicant is resident ;
 - (d) for transport from this district to another, application should be made to the Assistant Government Agent of the area in which the applicant is resident, giving full particulars asked for in Form D. F. C. 34 (in duplicate), copies of which can be obtained from me. To expedite the issue of permits the applicants are requested to produce reports from the Village Headmen or any other authorised persons of the area of their residence and of the areas in which the paddy fields are situated, giving full particulars of their household and of the shares of paddy from the various fields.
 - (e) the Government levy of two bushels of well winnowed and dried paddy per acre from fields cultivated for Maha must be delivered at the threshing floor to the Village Headman of the area or any other officer authorised by me in writing ;
 - (f) no paddy shall, without prior authority, be disposed of in any manner other than those by way of consumption at the approved rates (i.e., at 6 cut measures per head per week in the case of cultivators, owner-cultivators and their dependents, and 4 cut measures per head per week in the case of owners and their dependents) by any shareholder or his/her dependents subject to the maximum of 50 bushels or lower quantity as they may be entitled to until the following season ;
 - (g) allowances for seed will be made subject to a maximum of two bushels per acre ;
 - (h) allowances as working expenses at the rate of one bushel per acre for the fields from which the paddy is harvested will be made ;

(i) no paddy shall be utilized for consumption by an owner of paddy or his/her dependents possessing rice ration books until the surrender of the appropriate number of rice coupons at the rate of—

- (1) five coupons for every bushel of paddy allowed for consumption to owner-cultivators and cultivators ; or

(l) any person acting in contravention of the above orders will be liable to prosecution.

Harvesting Paddy in Kurunegala District.

IN terms of Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulation 37, Defence (Paddy Cultivation) Regulations, 1943, and Defence (Food Rationing) (Special Provisions) Regulations, 1944, it is hereby ordered that—

1. (a) No persons harvesting paddy produced in fields or high lands during the season Maha 1946/47 within the Kurunegala District shall proceed to thrash same unless, ten clear days notice is given of the said person's intention of doing so to the Irrigation Headman or to any other person by name of office authorised by me in writing.

(b) No person harvesting paddy as aforesaid shall remove same from the customary threshing floor to a barn or other customary place of storage situated within the same Chief Headman's Division until—

- (1) an account of paddy threshed has been taken by the Irrigation Headman (Velmuladeniya) or any other person by name or office authorised by me in writing.
- (2) permitted to do so in writing by the officers referred to above.
- (3) the Government levy of 2 bushels per acre which is first charge on the crop and any other surplus due to Government has been surrendered to the Irrigation Headman (Velmuladeniya) or any other person by name or office authorised by me in writing.

2. No person who has threshed paddy during Maha 1946-47 and removed for storage in accordance with paragraph 1 of this order, shall dispose of such paddy on any account except on written directions issued by me or any other officer authorised by me to do so. This order however, does not apply to use of such paddy for—

- (1) normal consumption by a shareholder and his *bona fide* dependents subject to a maximum rate of 6 cut measures per head per week in the case of owner cultivators and the cultivators who are actually engaged in the work of cultivation and in the case of others a maximum rate of 4 cut measures per head per week for all dependents above the age of 3 years subject further to a maximum of 50 bushels per family.
- (2) sowing as seed in the field or fields from which the paddy was harvested subject to a maximum of 3 bushels per acre.

3. All paddy received from fields which are held on mortgages should not be disposed of on any account and proviso to order 2 above does not apply to such paddy.

4. All paddy stacks not threshed and accounted for as aforesaid within one month of their reaping are liable to be requisitioned to Government.

5. For removal of any such paddy to any other place situated outside the same Chief Headman's Division as the field from which the paddy is obtained, permission should be obtained from me or any officer authorised by me.

6. Rice coupons must be surrendered at the rate of—

- (a) 5 coupons for every bushel of paddy allowed for consumption to owner-cultivators and cultivators or

(b) 8 coupons for every bushel of paddy allowed for consumption to non-cultivating owners (no substitute coupons need be surrendered) in the case of producers resident within the area the necessary coupons must be surrendered to the Village Headman concerned, immediately on receipt of paddy for consumption.

7. Any producer acting in contravention of any of the above orders will be liable to prosecution.

Both the facings and the honey comb structure are made of plaster reinforced with serum. Suitable methods for making the units are described in the specification.

The units may be used in juxta position to form walls, roofs, ceilings, &c. Where additional strength is required the space between the adjacent units may be filled with concrete reinforced if necessary, portions of the honey comb structure being cut away to provide filling space for the concrete; the facings are used as permanent shuttering for the concrete. Alternatively, the space between facings can house a load bearing stanchion or column.

This method of construction ensures the least sacrifice of perforated area. Suitable forms are described.

"Improvements in machines for drying tea leaf or the like".

According to the invention the baffle consists of one element extending over the width of the chamber in a position where it is adapted to contact a layer of tea a short distance preceding the point where it is tilted on to the travelling trays beneath, and a second element which is placed close to the underside of the next preceding run of the conveyor, having a hinged and extension portion adapted to make contact with the first element throughout the whole width of the chamber. Preferably the first baffle element is a smooth or fluted roller rotating in the same direction as that of the moving band of tea. The underside of the second baffle element is made of elastic material such as hair felt. Provision is made for the removal of dust accumulating on the baffle.
