Regulations applicable to Pilgrimages to Munnessaram.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Governor by section 2 of the Pilgrimages Ordinance (Chapter 133), I, John Curtois Howard, Officer Administering the Government of Ceylon, do by this Notification make the regulations set out hereunder applicable to every pilgrimage to Munnessaram.

Regulations.

1. In these regulations the expression " camp area " means the space within the boundaries specified in the Schedule hereto, and "Assistant Government Agent" means the Assistant Government Agent of the Puttalam and Chilaw Districts.

2. No person shall camp in any place within the camp area where camping is prohibited by special or general order of the Assistant Governemnt Agent.

3. 'No person shall ease himself within the camp area,

No person shall deposit any liquid or solid refuse or any rubbish within the camp area, except in the places or receptacles provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of, the Assistant Government Agent. the Assistant Government Agent.

5. (a) No cattle shall be kept in the camp area, and no cattle shall be kept in the vicinity of the camp area except at a place specially appointed as a cattle gala or at a place approved for such use by the Assistant Government Agent.

(b) The person in charge of cattle shall cause their droppings within the camp area to be removed to a place provided therefor, and he shall at all times keep clean the place occupied by his cattle.

6. All prepared foods sold within the camp area shall be protected from flies and dust by being (a) wrapped in or covered with clean paper or cloth, or (b) kept in closed glass cases, or (c) kept in other covered containers approved by the Medical Officer, or by the Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area.

7. No person who is likely to affect prejudicially the cleanliness of the camp area and no person who is suffering from an infectious disease shall be permitted to enter the camp area.

8. In the event of an epidemic breaking out in the camp area during a pilgrimage, the Assistant Government Agent may direct the pilgrims to leave the place of pilgrimage and may prescribe the routes and methods for their conveyance.

9. (a) Every person within the camp area who is suffering from an infectious or a contagious disease, and (b) every person who resides with him knowing that he is so suffering shall report the case to the Medical or Sanitary Officer in

charge of the camp area. 10. When any tank or well within the camp area is set apart for any particular purpose and a notice to that effect is

apart for any particular purpose and a notice to that effect is exhibited on the spot, no person shall use the tank or well for any purpose other than that for which it is set apart. 11. No person shall keep any bakery, ærated water manufactory, tea or coffee boutique, eating house or any boutique where prepared food is exposed for sale or any gala within the camp area without previously obtaining a licence from the Assistant Government Agent permitting him to do so. The licence shall be issued free of charge.

12. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, construct any booth, or extend any building within the camp area so as to encroach on the main or other streets of the camp.

13. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, discharge fireworks and firearms within the camp area, or within a radius of one mile from the boundaries of such area.

14. No person shall slaughter any animal within the camp area except in the place provided for the purpose by, or with the approval of, the Assistant Government Agent, and every person slaughtering any animal in such a place shall be responsible for the cleanliness of that place.

TRADE DISPUTE-South WESTERN BUS Co., LTD., RATMALANA.

THE West Ceylon Motor Workers' Union, Colombo presented a petition to me under section 6 of the Essential Services (Avoidance of Strikes and Lockouts) Order, 1942, with regard to a trade dispute that had arisen between the said Union and the South Western Bus Co., Ltd., Ratmalana. This petition was referred to a Special Tribunal appointed by H. E. the Governor under the proviso to section 5 of the said Order, for adjudication.

The following findings and award dated December 21, 1946, made by the Special Tribunal is published for general information in terms of section 8 (4) of the above-mentioned Order :-

"The petitioner Union has presented this petition for the reinstatement of twenty workmen, whose services were terminated by the respondent company who was their employer.

Of these men, G. D. Poiris who was employed as a driver was dismissed on a charge of rash and negligent driving in October, 1945. The services of the remaining nineteen workmen were terminated on various dates after November 21, 1945, from which date the workmen employed by the respondent company numbering more than a thousand went out on a general strike.

It is not now the case of the petitioner-Union that these nineteen men were dismissed because they wont on strike. As a matter of fact when the workmen returned to work after the strike was called off, they were all re-employed.

The case of the Union, however, is that the grounds upon which the services of these men were terminated were not such as to have justified their dismissal the union therefore takes up the position that the dismissal of these men is tantamount to a victimization of the employees. Alternatively, the position taken up is that even if the employer found it necessary to discontinue the services of these men, the work-men are entitled to claim compensation from the employer by payment of their wages or salary during the period when they

by payment of their wages of satary during the period when they were kept out of employment by the company. No evidence has been placed before the Tribunal with regard to the facts or circumstances relating to the discon-tinuance from service of the following workmen, namely, D. William, B. Wijesinha, W. B. Podi Appuhamy, G. D. Martin, U. K. D. John Singho, D. I. Munasinghe, K. D. Setan, K. W. Dias Singho and Piyadasa Munasinghe.

The burden of proving that these men were dismissed without any valid reason or without any reasonable cause has not been discharged by the petitioner and the petition and demand for their reinstatement must therefore be rejected and I award that these men be not reinstated.

Evidence has however been adduced by both parties with regard to the discontinuance from service of the remaining persons referred to in the petition. I shall now proceed to examine the facts relating to the circumstances under which the services of these men were terminated.

I note that the respondent company which employed a very large body of workmen also employed a very large body of workmen also employes a large number of Inspectors, Traffic Superintendents, Branch Managers all of whom work under the general supervision and control of the General Manager. The Managing Director, Mr. Cyril Zoysa, makes the final decision with regard to all dismissals when papers are referred to him. He has given evidence which satisfied me that such inquiries as were necessary and advantation in the supervision of a stars had here made adequate in the circumstances of each case had been made before a final decision was taken regarding the termination of the services of each of these workmen—

1) G. D. Peiris.

He was a bus driver. According to the evidence of Dissa-nayake, who was then the Branch Manager at Kalutara, the bus driven by Peiris went off the road into a paddy field as a result of rash and negligent driving. I am inclined to accept the view that this accident resulted from the inability of the driver to exercise control over the movement of the bus

of the driver to exercise control over the movement of the bus in consequence of the excessive speed at which he was driving. In view of the evidence, I am not prepared to accept the explanation given by the driver that the accident resulter from the steering-lock giving way. This driver had be suspended from work on a previous occasion for driving to bus recklessly. An employee is in duty bound to protect the bus passengers against damage or injury caused to the in consequence of the negligent or reckless acts of the driver damages. The employer has the undoubted right to terminate the services of a driver who is found to be unsatisfactory or the services of a driver who is found to be unsatisfactory or undesirable.

I find that there was good ground for terminating the services of Peiris and I make award that he be not reinstated. (2) M. D. Edwin.

He was a clerk, employed in one of these buses. He was He was a clerk, employed in one of these buses. He was dismissed on December 7, 1945, because he had failed to issue tickets to two passengers. This workman had been fined previous to this for not issuing tickets to four passengers. The non-issue of tickets to passengers is not due to any genero-sity towards them but to a desire of a workman to misappro-priate the fare collected from them. The evidence of Saralis Silve and the record made of Edwards statement (D. 2015) Silva and the record made of Edwin's statement (D 2_A)*

proves that the fare from these passengers had been collected. Sarahs Silva the Chief Traffic Inspector who boarded this bus detected the fraud committed by Edwin. I am satisfied that there was good ground for terminating the services of Edwin and I award that he be not reinstated.

(3) Salabdeen.

This workman was the conductor along with Edwin on the occasion when Edwin had failed to issue those two tickets. A conductor and a clerk act together in the matter of the issue of tickets and the collection of the money. This arrangement is intended to operate as a check one upon the other.

They can however act in concert and defraud the Company. I find that Salabdeen was equally guilty as Edwin and that his dismissal was therefore justified.

I award that he too be not reinstated.

(4) Solomon Silva.

This workman was a clork-conductor. He failed to deposit the day's collections. On being questioned his plea was that some pickpocket had robbed the money from his pocket. At an inquiry held it transpired that he had actually lost the money by gambling. He was asked to replace the amount and was also fined Rs. 50, for the offence. He chose not to pay the fine and left the employment. This workman appears to have been fined on a previous occasion for a similar offence, as would appear from his record sheet D6*. In the circumstances in which this workman gave up his employment his demand for reinstatement presents no merits and I therefore reject his demand.

(5) and (6) Rathenis and B. M. Martin.

These two men who were employed as clerk-conductors were discontinued because they had failed to issue tickets to four passengers and for overloading the bus contrary to instructions. The plea put forward by them for their default is contradictory and inconsistent with the previous statements made by them. It seems to be the fact that these men had failed to issue tickets to some passengers and had probably misappropriated the fare collected from them. Rathenis appears to have been fined previously for a similar offence. An employer is entitled to discontinue the services of his workmen who misappropriate moneys collected by them. The dismissal of these men is justifiable and I reject the demand for their reinstatement.

(7) A. P. Veerasamy.

This workman was discontinued when he was unwilling to work as a driver. Veerasamy appears to have had a bad foot which incapacitated him from performing the duties of a driver. He has, however, now recovered from his injury and the respondent company had re-employed him as a driver on a permanent basis, subject to the condition that he should be provided with other work if his continuous work as a driver is found to be really injurious to his foot. I accordingly award that he be reinstated (as he had already been) subject to the conditions set out above.

(8) Kuruman.

This workman was employed as a driver. He was charged in the Magistrate's Court with the offence of rashly and negligently driving a bus belonging to the respondent clompany. Pending the result of this case he was suspended. Having been acquitted by the Magistrate, the company was willing to re-employ him. The company through its Branch Manager Meegahawatte, informed him that he would be given work. Kuruman did not turn up for work. There is therefore no case for his reinstatement.

(9) Kirinelis.

He was a clerk-conductor. It was found on inspection that he had failed to issue four tickets. His previous record was not to his credit. His services had been discontinued on a previous occasion but he was re-employed. The respondent therefore decided to transfer him to some other section where he would have less opportunities of misappropriation. He declined to work on any other section and terminated his services. The company has in my opinion the right to transfer its employees to work on any route as decided by Mrts management. No case has been made out for reinstate-

thent of Kirinelis and I reject the demand.

(10) D. D. Carolis.

He was a checking inspector and therefore held a position of trust. According to the evidence of Saralis Silva who questioned the passengers when he boarded the bus the correct fares had been collected from all of them. Carolis appears to have written out four tickets and marked on each of them ten cents without filling in the other details, obviously with the intention of creating a defence for himself. The fares that should have been collected on each of these four tickets is much more than ten cents. I accept Saralis Silva's evidence and find that Carolis who had been employed to detect any fraud committed by the minor employees had himself become a participant in that fraud. His dismissal was therefore justified and I see no reason for his reinstatement.

With regard to the alternative claim for compensation to these workmen the question really does not arise in view of my findings that there were lawful grounds for the discontinuance of their services. If a workman chooses not to find other employment while an inquiry is pending, in the expectation that he will be reinstated and ultimately finds that his reinstatement is not ordered, he has only himself to blame.

In the result my award is that the demand for the reinstatement of and/or compensation to the workmen referred to in the petition, except Veerasamy, be rejected ".

Harvesting of Paddy in Kuruwiti, Nawadun and Kukul Korales of Ratnapura District for the Maha, 1946–47 Season.

1946-47 Season. BY virtue of the powers vested in me by the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulation 37, the Defence (Purchase of Foodstuffs) Regulations, 1942, the Defence (Paddy Cultivation) Regulations, 1943, and the Defence (Food Rationing) (Special Provisions) Regulations 1944, I, Melvill Keverne Trelawny Sandys, Government Agent, Province of Sabaragamuwa, a competent and a proper authority do, by this Order, direct that every owner or cultivator of any land which is cultivated with paddy during the Maha Season, 1946-47, and which is situated within the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Kuruwiti, Nawadun and Kukul korales of the Ratnapura District shall—

- inform the Village Headman of the area in which the paddy land is situated of the date on which it is proposed to reap the harvest on that land, not less than 10 clear days ahead;
 give the Village Headman or other person authorised by
- (2) give the Village Headman or other person authorised by me, at his request, the following information relating to the land :---
 - (a) the name, situation and extent of the land;

 - (c) the share or shares of the produce to which such such person or persons may be entitled.

2. I do further direct that-


(1) no paddy shall be removed or caused or permitted to be removed by any person from a field or threshing floor to a barn or any other place of storage until the Village Headman or other person authorised by me shall have assessed and recorded the total harvest and the shares; and except on a permit obtained from the proper authority on terms of paragraph 4 of this Order;

- (2) the Government levy of 2 bushels of well-winnowed and cleaned paddy per acre for all wasamas in Kuruwiti korale (except Karadana wasama where the levy is 1 bushel for Maha 1946-47) and all the wasamas in Nawadun korale (except Bopetta, Nivitigala, Karawita, Doloswala and Delwala in Meda pattu and all the wasamas in Uda pattu where the levy is 1 bushel for Maha 1946-47) and 1 bushel of wellwinnowed and cleaned paddy per acre for all the wasamas in Kukul korale (except Dumbara and Galature where the levy is 2 bushels for Maha 1946-47) shall be handed to the Village Headman;
- (3) no paddy shall, without prior authority be disposed of in any manner other than by way of consumption at approved rates by the owners and his *bona fide* dependants subject to a maximum of 50 bushels or such lower quantity as they may be entitled to, until the following harvest;
- (4) no paddy shall be utilised for consumption by an owner, or his dependants possessing a Rice Ration Book until the surrender of the appropriate number of rice coupons;
- rice coupons;
 (5) any paddy in excess of the requirements for consumption as laid down in clause (3) and, in the case of those who normally supply seed paddy and customerily
 feed labourers during cultivation operations any paddy in excess of the requirements for consumption, seed paddy at the rate of 2 bushels of paddy per acre, and feeding allowance at the rate of 1 bushel of paddy per acre or such other quantity of paddy as I may order, shall be sold to the Village Headman on behalf of Government.
- (6) any person on whom forms I. P. S. 4 or 4A and 6 or 6A have been served shall return these forms correctly completed either to the Kachcheri, Village Headman, Purchase Officer or I. P. S. Overseer of the area within 10 days of receipt of the forms. (Separate I. P. S. 6 or 6A forms should be used to furnish particulars of fields situated in each D. R. O's Division).

3. The approved rates of consumption of paddy by producers at present are 6 measures of paddy per person per week, in the case of cultivators and owner-cultivators and their dependants and 4 measures of paddy per person per week, in the case of non-cultivating owners and their dependants. Coupons in respect of paddy shall be surrendered at the rate of 1 rice coupon for every six measures of paddy received by a cultivator or an owner-cultivator and one rice coupon for every four measures of paddy received by a noncultivating owner.

4. Permits on forms I.P.S. 33 (a) for transport of paddy from the field, or threshing floor to a barn situated within the same Village Headman's Division or from one Village Headman's Division to another within the same Divisional Revenue Officer's Division shall be obtained from the Village Headman concerned, who will obtain the signature of the remover on the copy of the permit on form I. P. S. 33 (a) as proof of removal. For transport from one Divisional Revenue Officer's Division to another or from one Emergency A. G. A's area to another, or from one District to another, applications should be made to the Government Agent, Assistant Government Agent or the Assistant Government Agent (Emergency) of the area in which the applicant is resident giving all particulars asked for in from D. F. C. 34 (Duplicate) copies of which can be obtained from any of the above officers. To expedite the issue of permits, the appleants are requested to produce reports from the Village Headman or any other authorised person of the areas of their residence and of the areas in which the paddy lands are situated, giving particulars of their households and of their shares of paddy from the various fields respectively.

BY virtue of powers vested in me by the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulation 37, the Defence (Purchase of Foodstuffs) Regulations, 1942, the Defence (Paddy Cultivation) Regulations, 1943, and the Defence (Food Rationing) (Special Provisions) Regulations, 1944, I, Chandana Aelian Coorey, Assistant Government Agent (Emergency), Homagama, a competent and proper authority, do by this order, direct that every owner or cultivator of any paddy land which is cultivated with paddy during 1946-47 Maha Season and which is situated within the Divisional Revenue Officers' Divisions of Hewagam korale and Salpiti korale shall-

- (1) inform the Village Headman of the area in which the paddy land 1s situated or any other person duly authorised by me, of the date on which it is proposed to reap the harvest on that land not less than 10 clear days ahead :
- (2) not remove or cause or permit to be removed by any person the harvested paddy from the threshing floor to a barn or other customary place of storage until :--
 - (a) the Village Headman or any other person authorised by me shall have assessed and recorded the total harvest and the shares; and except on a permit on the proper form
 - and except on a permit on the proper form obtained from an officer authorised by me.
 (b) the Government levy of 1 bushel per acre for those fields which are cultivated for both Maha and Yala or 2 bushels per acre in the case of those fields which are cultivated for Maha only, which is to be regarded as a first charge on the crop, and any other surplus due to Government have been surrendered to the Village Headman or any surrendered to the Village Headman or any other person authorised by me.
- It should be noted that any person found in possession of paddy, the acquisition of which cannot be substantiated with a valid permit or permits, as mentioned above, is liable to have the paddy so found immediately requisitioned.
- (3) No person who has threshed paddy during Maha, 1946-47, and removed same for storage in accordance with paragraph 2 of thus order shall dispose of such paddy on any account except on written directions issued by me or by an officer authorised by me in this behalf. This order, however, does not apply to the use of such paddy for-
 - (a) normal consumption by the shareholder and his or her bona fide dependants subject to a maximum rate of six cut measures per head per, week in the case of owner cultivators and cultivators actually engaged in paddy cultivation, and in the case of others a maximum of four cut measures per head per week for all dependants above the age of three years subject further to a maximum of fifty bushels per family.
 - (b) sowing as seed paddy in the field or fields from which paddy was harvested subject to a maximum of 2 bushels per scre.
 - (c) allowance as working expenses at the rate of one bushel per acre for the field from which the paddy was harvested.
- (4) All paddy received from fields which are held on mortgages should not be disposed of on any account; and the proviso to order (3) above does not apply to such paddy.
- (5) All paddy stocks not threshed and accounted for as aforesaid within one month of their reaping are liable to be requisitioned.
- (6) For removal of any such paddy to any other place situated outside the same D. R. O's division as the field from which the paddy is obtained, permission should be obtained from me or an officer authorised by me.

"Improvements in or relating to methods of blending bituminous compositions, to bituminous products, and to surface active agents used on bituminous materials, aggregates and the like ".

Abstract.—The invention relates to the methods of coating aggregate so as to improve the holding properties of bituminous material on aggregate when used for road paving and similar uses. According to the invention, either the bituminous material is mixed with or the aggregate treated with a surface active agent derived from the interaction of a higher fatty acid with an amine. This surface active agent contains a monoor polyamine soap with an admixture of acylamide or acylamidoamine soap, and an excess of free fatty acid.

The preferred method of forming the active agent is by mixing a surface active polyamine, e.g., ethylene diamine, propylene diamine, dethylene triamine, &c., with an excess of fatty acid containing not less than eight and not more than twenty carbon atoms to the molecule suitably at an elevated temperature to form a soap, subjecting part of this soap to further heat treatment to drive off the water and to form a soap of an acylamindoamine, then cooling the product and mixing with the remainder of the original soap. In another embodiment the polyamine is first reacted with weak acidic substance such as  $CO_2$  or  $SO_2$  and the resulting product is reacted with a higher fatty acid and heated to expel the  $CO_2$ or  $SO_2$  and form a soap. Small quantities of the treating material are used, e.g., 0.2 to 2.5 parts to 100 parts of bituminous material.

The inventors state that when a treating agent is added to bituminous compounds as described, a number of advantages accrue. The bituminous material then acquires the property of completely coating wet or dry aggregate. Permanent adhesion is obtained under all traffic conditions and stability, ductility and aging qualities are much improved.

The invention is illustrated by 5 examples, and there are 17 claims.




"Improvements in or relating to the production of metanilamidodiazines and intermediates thereof".

Abstract.—The inventors state that whereas sulfonamides such as sulfadiazine, sulfaguanidine, &c., have remarkable bacteriostatic and bacteriocedal properties, they have little effect on protozoam diseases, such as malaria, filariasis, &c. They state that compounds of their invention having the formula




where Dz is a substituted or unsubstituted diazine radical, and Z is hydrogen or an alkyl radical or a cationic salt-forming radical are very effective both prophylactically and curatively against protozoal organisms which cause avian malaria.

In accordance with the invention, the above compounds are prepared by treating an intermediate compound having the formula



wherein X is any group convertible to an amino group, by converting X to  $NH_2$ . The intermediate compounds also he within the scope of the invention since it has been found that these can be converted in the body into those having a free amino group. In accordance with a modified procedure the compoundsare prepared by reacting a compound having the formula



with a compound having the formula

A-Dz

wherein A is any radical reactable with the sulphonomido group, to effect elimination of the HA.

The invention is illustrated by 74 examples and there are 17 claims.
