Present :

THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

Whereas by the Ceylon (Parliamentary Elections) Order in Council, 1946 (hereinafter called "the Principal Order"), provision is made for the election of Members to serve in the House of Representatives established by the Ceylon (Constitution) Order in Council, 1946 :

And whereas it is expedient to make further provision with regard to the election of such Members :

And whereas His Majesty has power, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to make laws for the Island of Ceylon and

to amend the Principal Order: Now, Therefore, it is hereby ordered by His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, as follows:—

1.-(1) This Order may be cited as the Ceylon (Parliamentary Elections) (Special Provisions) Order in Council, 1947, and shall be construed as one with the Principal Order

(2) This Order shall be published in the Government Gazette and shall come into operation on the date of such publication.

-(1) Every person who was incapable of being registered as a voter under the provisions of the Ceylon (State Council Elections) Order in Council, 1931, by reason only of the report of an election judge in accordance with the provisions of section 79 of that Order, may, notwithstanding any-thing in sections 11 and 12 of the Principal Order, apply to the registering officer to have his name inserted in the register of electors prepared in accordance with the provisions of those sections; and, where any such person so applies, the registering officer shall, notwithstanding that such register may have been certified under section 14 of the Principal Order, insert the name of that person

in such register. (2) The provisions of section 12 of the Principal Order shall have effect in relation to any claim made by any person in pursu-ance of the provisions of sub-section (1) of this section (subject to the modification thereof made by that sub-section): Provided that, if the publication of notice of completion of the register referred to in

sub-section (2) of the said section 12 shall Government Gazette, the provisions of that section shall have effect subject to the further modification that the reference in sub-section (2) thereof to the date of the publication of such notice shall be deemed to be a reference to the date of the publication of this Order.

RULES under section 11 of the Irrigation Ordinance No. 32 of 1946, made by the prescribed majority of the proprietors within each of the irrigation districts set out in of Agriculture and Lands by virtue of the powers vested in it by section 14 of the Ordinance.

Rules.

Special rules relating to the maintenance of irrigation works, within the irrigation district which are in charge of the Government Agent, Province of Sabaragamuwa, and for which no irrigation rate is recovered.

1. (1) In distributing water from the tank to the fields in a tract, the water shall first be taken to the fields on the higher level and thence to those on the lower level.

(2) No person shall in any way interfere to the prejudice of others with the distribution of water.

2. No person other than the proprietor or lessee of any land under the tank shall be entitled to the use of water from the

tank for agricultural purposes. 3. It shall not be lawful for any person to issue the water of the tank for the cultivation of any land under any other tank, or for the shareholders of lands cultivated under the tank to utilize for their cultivation the water of any other thank without first containing the sanction of the Government

Agent. 4. No person shall cut the bund, or do any act likely to 4. NO person shall cut the bund, or do any act likely to damage the bund, or block up the spill of the tank, without the permission of the Government Agent or Cultivation Officer or Irrigation Superintendent or Supervising Officer, or carry out any work upon the bund, spill, or channels contrary to the orders of any of these officers: Provided that in any case where such action is necessary to that in any case where such action is necessary to prevent otherwise inevitable damage to the tank, and it is impossible to communicate with any of the above-mentioned officers in time, permission may be dispensed with, but the burden of proving such special circumstances shall lie upon the persons

taking such action. 5. No fence shall be put on any part of the tank bund without the authority of the Government Agent or Cultivation Officer or Irrigation Superintendent or Supervising Officer.

6. For the repair of the improvement of the tank and the o. For the repair of the improvement of the tank and the dams, minor channels of water courses, and for such other minor works, as the Government Agent may consider necessary, each proprietor shall be liable to contribute labour in proportion to the extent of his land which is to be benefited by the work in question. 7. The bund of the tank shall be divided among the

proprietors of the lands under it in proportion to the extent of land owned by each proprietor, and each proprietor shall keep the portion assigned to him properly turfed and free at all times from jungle, brushwood, and overgrowth of every description, and from white ants nests.

(1) The full amount of labour which each proprietor shall be liable under rule 6 to contribute shall not exceed :-

(i) 2 cubes of earthwork per acre, or

(ii) 4 days' labour per acre, or

(ii) a money payment in commutation of such labour, at such rate per acre, in accordance with the rate prevailing in the district at the time, as may be specified by notice in that behalf each year.

(2) A day's labour shall for purposes of this rule be taken to mean a day of six hours at any time between sunrise and sunset.

9. In addition to the ordinary work of the year as above provided for, whenever the Government Agent, or any person authorised by him to supervise the work, gives notice of the need of labour for any urgent work of repair or of prevention of impending damage, every proprietor shall at once contribute at his own expense: Provided that double the ordinary amount of labour prescribed under rule 8 shall not be exceeded in any year under this rule.

10. No person other than the Irrigation Superintendent 10. No person other than the Irrigation Superintendent or Supervising Officer, or a person duly authorised by either of these officers in that behalf shall in any way interfere with or alter the level of the spill or sluice of the tank. 11. The tank bed shall not be cultivated, unless the majority of the proprietors under the tank decide to cultivate the bed, and the permission of the Government Agent is

obtained

12. If any proprietor fails to perform his share of any work required under these rules, the Irrigation Superintendent or Cultivation Officer or Supervising Officer may cause the work to be done and the cost thereof may be recovered in the manner described by section 30 of the Irrigation Ordinance, No. 32 of 1946.

13. In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires :-

- "Irrigation Superintendent" means the officer seconded from service in the Irrigation Department to superintend the major irrigation works and the construction and maintenance of minor irrigation works under the supervision of the Government Agent ;
- "Cultivation Officer" means the officer appointed by the Government Agent to supervise cultivation in all irrigable lands, and may or may not be identical with the Irrigation Superintendent; "Supervising Officer" means the officer appointed by the Government Agent under section 113 of the Irrigation

Harvesting of Paddy in Anuradhapura District, Maha 1946-47.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations, the Defence (Purchase of Foodstuffs) Regulations, 1942, and the Defence (Paddy Cultivation) Regulations, 1945, I do hereby direct that :---

- (1) No cultivator, shareholder or other person shall remove from the threshing floor any paddy harvested in the 1946-47 Maha Season from any field in the Nuwarakalawiya District, until a record of the paddy gathered has been taken by the Village Headman or any other person authorised by me in writing.
- (2) Removal thereafter to the barn or other place of storage within Nuwarakalawiya District shall only be on permits on form I.P.S. 33 or I.P.S. 33A issued by the Vel Vidane, the Village Headman or other authorised person of the area in which the threshing floor is situated.
- (3) Removal to places outside the District shall only be on permits issued by me. Non-residents who desire to^o remove their shares of paddy allowed for consumption to places outside Nuwarakalawiya should make their applications on form D.F.C. 34 in duplicate to the Revenue Officer or the Assistant Government Agent (E), of the area in which they reside
- (4) The Paddy due to Government as acreage levy, i.e. TWO bushels per acre during the Maha season, shall be delivered at the threshing floor to the Vel Vidane, Village Headman or other person authorised to purchase paddy under the Internal Purchase Scheme.
- (5) Owners and cultivators shall give three clear days' notice of their intention to harvest and to thresh any paddy to the Vel Vidane, Village Headman or other person appointed by me to assess the crop.
- (6) If no application is made in the manner described above within 6 weeks from the date of harvesting, all stocks of paddy are liable to be requisitioned under the Internal Purchase Scheme.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations 37, the Defence (Purchase of Foodstuffs) Regulations 1942, the Defence (Paddy Cultivation) Regulations 1943 and the Defence (Food Rationing) (Special Rationing) Regulations 1944; as later amended, I, Walwin Arnold de Silva, Assistant Government Agent, Puttalam and Chilaw Districts, a competent and a proper authority, do hereby direct that every person whether owner or cultivator of any land which is situated in the Puttalam and Chilaw Districts and which is expected to be harvested during the Maha 1946–47 Season, shall furnish in writing the following information at least 10 days before the harvest to the Village Headman, Vel Vidane of the area or any other person authorised by me :-

(a) The date on which it is proposed to reap the harvest;

(b) the name, situation and the extent of the land;

- (c) the names and addresses of the person or persons entitled to take or receive any part of the produce of the land;
- (d) the details of the share or the share basis of the produce to which such person or persons may be entitled to.
- 2. I do further direct that-
- (a) No cultivator, shareholder or other person having interests in any paddy land situated in the Puttalam and Chilaw Districts shall remove any paddy harvested in Maha 1946-47, from a threshing floor to a barn or any other place of storage until the total harvest has been checked and recorded by the Village Headman, Vel Vidane or any other person authorised by me;
- (b) removal thereafter to the barn or other place of storage within the Village Headman's Division should only be on permits on form I.P.S. 33 issued by the Village Headman, Vel Vidane of the area or any other person authorised by me;
- (c) for transport from one Divisional Revenue Officer's Division to another, application should be made to me on form D.F.C. 34 supported by the reports from the Village Headman of the area in which the fields are situated;
- (d) for transport from these Districts to another, applications should be made in duplicate on form D.F.C. 34 to the Government Agent, Assistant Government Agent or the Assistant Government Agent (Emergency) of the area in which the applicant is resident and the application must be supported by the Village Headman of the areas in which the fields are situated;

- (h) No paddy shall be utilised for consumption by an owner of paddy or his dependants possessing rice ration books, until the surrender of the appropriate number of rice coupons;
- (i) All paddy in excess of seed and consumption allowances must be surrendered to the Village Headman or any other person authorised by me in writing, at the threshing-floor, for which payment will be made at the rate of Rs. 6 per bushel of paddy free from chaff and grit;
- (j) Every shareholder, whether owner or cultivator, who is entitled to any paddy from fields situated in the Puttalam and Chilaw Districts must inform the Village Headman, the Vel Vidane or any other officer authorised by me in writing, of the area of his residence, ten or more days before threshing, particulars of the field or fields from which he proposes to draw his consumption allowance.

"New or improved means for colour lighting apparatus". *Abstract.*—The invention relates to apparatus for controlling individually the intensities of light from a number of primary sources in such a way that the combination produces light of any desired colour. According to the invention, a disc is provided which is rotatable into a number of positions to preselect the colours required, and is displaceable in an axial direction to bring about the required change in colour. The desired variation in the intensities is obtained by means of pegs mounted on the periphery of the disc, two of which are provided per light source for each position of the preselector. When the preselector is moved into the operative position these two pegs act in pull-push fashion on a transmitter which varies the intensity of the associated light by either varying a resistance or moving a graduated filter. It is thereby possible when a certain colour is being produced

It is thereby possible when a certain colour is being produced by the apparatus, to withdraw the preselector into inoperative position, rotate it so as to preselect another colour, and then to move it forward so that the desired change in colour is brought about. The latter movement can be effected at any desired speed.

Suitable modifications of the apparatus are described.

THE WAGES BOARDS ORDINANCE, NO. 27 OF 1941.

Notification.

IT is hereby notified, under section 27 (3) of the Wages Boards Ordinance, No. 27 of 1941, that the Minister for Labour, Industry and Commerce has approved the decisions of the Wages Board for the *Motor Transport Trade* made under sections 20, 24, 25 and 26 of that Ordinance and specified in the Schedule hereto.

The decisions shall come into force on 1st March, 1947.

Part I.

Directions under Section 20 (2) (b).

The special allowance shall be computed and published once a month by the Commissioner of Labour.

The special allowance for each month or for a normal working day in any month, as the case may be, shall be computed on the cost of living index number for the month immediately preceding that month in respect of which such allowance is to be computed.

Definition of a normal working day (Section 24).

The number of hours constituting a normal working day (inclusive of one hour for a meal) shall be 9.

Part II. (Sections 20 and 26).

1. Wages for the Motor Transport Trade shall be paid on a monthly basis to permanent workers and on a daily basis to temporary workers.

2. The minimum rate of wages for time work shall consist of a basic rate and a special allowance as set out below.

3. Where a permanent worker has worked for 26 days or more in any month he shall be paid the minimum monthly rate specified in this Part.

4. Where a permanent worker has commenced employment in the course of a month, he shall be paid as wages an amount which bears to the minimum monthly rate the proportion which the period of employment bears to 26 days in the month.

5. Where by reason of any unauthorised absence a permanent worker has not worked for the 26 days specified in paragraph 3 above, he shall be paid as wages for that month an amount which bears to the minimum monthly rate the proportion which the difference between 26 and the number of days of unauthorised absence bears to 26.

6. Absence from work on holidays, on days on which the employer fails to provide work, and on days for which leave with full pay is allowed to a permanent worker, shall not be deemed to be unauthorised absence.

7. For the purposes of computing the wages of a worker paid on a monthly basis, a holiday referred to in Part IV. shall be deemed to be a day on which the worker has worked.

Part III.

Overtime Rate.

In respect of each hour of work in excess of the normal working day the minimum overtime rate shall be one and a half times the minimum hourly rate, ascertained by dividing the minimum daily rate by 8 in the case of workers paid on a daily basis and by dividing the minimum monthly rate by 200 in the case of workers paid on a monthly basis.

Part IV.

Annual Holidays (Section 25).

1. If a worker has been in continuous employment and has worked under the same employer for more than 248 days in any year, he shall be allowed in the next succeeding year a holiday or holidays calculated at the rate of one holiday for each unit of 4 days by which the number of days on which the worker has worked exceeds 248 : Provided, however, that it shall not be obligatory on an employer to allow any such holiday in respect of any period of work in excess of 288 days.

In this paragraph "days on which a worker has worked " includes

- (a) every holiday allowed by the employer to the worker under section 25;
- (b) every day of absence on any grounds approved by the employer ;
- (c) every day of absence due to any injury to the worker caused by an accident arising out of and in the course of his employment;
- (d) every day of absence due to anthrax or any occupational disease specified in Schedule III. of the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance (Chapter 117);
 (e) every day on which the employer fails to provide work for the worker;
- (f) every day of absence due to a strike or lockout that is not illegal, in case such days do not in the aggregate exceed 30 days a year; and
- (g) every holiday or day of absence from work to which a worker is entitled by or under the provisions of any written law other than the Wages Boards Ordinance.

· 2. (1) If a worker is entitled in any year to 6 holidays he shall be allowed, and he shall take, those 6 holidays on consecutive days.

(2) If a worker is entitled in any year to more than 6 holidays he shall be allowed, and he shall take, 6 holidays on consecutive days.

3. Subject to the provisions of paragraphs 2 and 6, a worker shall be allowed his holiday or holidays on a day or days to be mutually agreed upon between him and his employer.

(1) The remuneration of a worker paid on a monthly basis in respect of a holiday taken in any month shall be included in, and paid out of, his wages for that month, such wages being computed in accordance with the provisions of Part II. (2) The remuneration of a worker paid on a daily basis in respect of a holiday shall be not less than his

wages for a day.

The remuneration due to a worker paid on a daily basis in respect of his holiday or holidays shall be paid to him before 5. such holiday or holidays but not earlier than 7 days before such holiday or holidays.

Where a worker intends to leave his employment of his own accord or is to be discontinued or dismissed from employment, such worker shall be entitled to take and shall take, during the period immediately preceding such leaving, discontinuance or dismissal-

(a) every holiday that he was entitled to in respect of the previous year which he has not already taken; and
(b) in case the worker has during the current year complied with the provisions relating to employment and work set out in paragraph 1, every holiday that he would have otherwise been entitled to in the next succeeding year;

and he shall be remunerated for such holidays in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 4: Provided, however, that the total number of holidays that such a worker might take in any year shall not exceed 21.

In these paragraphs, "year" means a continuous period of 12 months.

8. The foregoing decisions shall not apply in respect of employment at any time more than 12 months prior to the date on which the decisions come into force.
