*Abstract.*—The invention relates to the lopped cone of specification No. 3,246. The inventor states that slight variations in the lower part produce desirable improvement in the "dhools" produced. One such change is the provision of a step of a few inches; another a sloped extension; yet another is a curved or radial extension. New cones with these variations in shape can be fitted, or existing cones provided with ring fitment to produce the necessary changes in shape. In any case the height of the extension will not exceed six inches.

"Method of machines for manufacturing black tea".

*Abstract.*—The inventor states that in existing processes of withering, rolling and fermenting workers had paid much attention to the temperature and dryness of the conditioning medium, but little attention to the temperature of the leaf itself. These he characterises the passive method.

In the "active method" he propose: imparting heat directly to the leaf in any of these processes in such a way that the temperature of the leaf is maintained above the dew-point temperature of the drying medium and below the temperature at which the fermenting enzymes are inactive, while the temperature and relative humidity of the air supplied to the leaf are regulated in relation to the temperature of the leaf.

A practical embodiment of this idea is a withering drum which is partly immersed and rotated in a water bath, while conditioned air is passed through it. The inner wall of the drum is provided with hollow blades shaped as pockets to take up liquid from the bath. This effectively heats the leaf to the require temperature.

Another embodiment is a fermenting drum, which is partly immersed and rotated in a water bath. The ends of the drum are open and the rotation takes place under a roof or shield in a conditioned atmosphere.

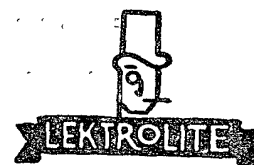
