#### Schedule.

Schedule I to the Proclamation dated September 12, 1935, and published in the *Supplement to Gazette* No. 8,146 of September 20, 1935, is hereby amended, by the addition, under the heading "Kalutara District", immediately after the definition of the limits of "Horana Town", of the following definition of the limits of the Town of Wadduwa:—

"Wadduwa Town comprising the area within the following boundaries—

North: By a line drawn from a point at the low water mark of the sea eastwards along the village limit between Nalluruwa and Pinwatta which forms the southern limit of the Panadura Urban Council area to a point 5 chains to the east of the eastern boundary of the Colombo-Galle road as shown in P. P. 17,058.

East: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-eastwards along the landmarked boundary shown in P. P. 17,058 as running parallel to and at a distance of 5 chains east of the eastern boundary of the Colombo-Galle road to the centre of Talpitiya canal, thence by a line drawn eastwards and south-eastwards along the centre of the said canal as far as the point where the said canal takes a north-easterly direction north of T. P. No. 52,552, thence by a line drawn south-eastwards along the landmarked boundary shown in P. P. 17,058 till it meets the village limit between Kuda Wadduwa and Nelegama at the south-eastern corner of T. P. No. 67,172, thence by a line drawn southwards along the said village limit and south-westwards along the village limit between Kuda Wadduwa and Molligoda to a point on the

southern boundary of T. P. No. 62,947, 5 chains to the east of the eastern boundary of the Colombo-Galle road, thence by a line drawn southwards along the landmarked boundary shown in P. P. 17,058 as running parallel to and at a distance of 5 chains east of the said road as far as a point east of the 21½ milepost on the said road.

South: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point westwards to the 21½ milepost on the Colombo-Galle road, thence by a line drawn westwards along the landmarked boundary shown in P. P. 17,058 and crossing the railway line to the low water mark of the sea.

West: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-westwards along the low water mark of the sea to the starting point of the northern limit of the area".

(d) at least one member of the teaching staff shall carry out such investigations as may be specified by the Director for the purposes of research into an educational topic selected by the Director;

(e) each room for lectures or criticism lesson shall be properly equipped and shall contain accommodation of not less than 20 square feet for each person attending the lectures or lessons;

(f) there shall be at least one science laboratory, and each such laboratory shall be capable of accommodating not less than 35 students at a time;

(g) there shall be at least one psychology laboratory: Provided, however, that the fulfilment of this condition may be deferred for such time as the Director may in his discretion allow;

(h) separate rooms shall be provided for the teaching of art and music;

(i) a suitable hostel shall be maintained for the students, and for each student in the hostel the dining-room accommodation shall be not less than 16 square feet and the dormitory accommodation shall not be less than 48 square feet;

*Report.*

As members of the Conciliation Board appointed by the Commissioner of Labour to inquire into the dispute between the Ceylon Cold Stores, Limited, and the Ceylon General Workers Union on behalf of certain employees of the Company, we have the honour to report as follows:

The parties represented by their Lawyers appeared before us on Saturday 8th and Sunday 9th March, 1947. The following were the issues submitted to us which arose for consideration:

- (1) (a) Were the workers paid a very low war allowance during the period from 1st January, 1942, to 1st April, 1946?
- (b) Are the workers entitled now to claim war allowance retrospectively?
- (c) If the answers to (a) and (b) above are in the affirmative what additional payment on account of war allowance should now be paid to the workers and to which workers?
- (2) Should all workers to be employed by the Company receive on employment a minimum wage of Re. 1.50?
- (3) Whilst the necessity for discontinuing workers owing to the contraction of business continues, should the Company give no work on contract?
- (4) Should no workers be discontinued by the Company?
- (5) Should watchmen and/or Engine Drivers be paid on a monthly basis?
- (6) Should workers in the Gas Plant and the Engine room be:
  - (a) graded;
  - (b) if so, on what basis and by whom;
  - (c) entitled to increments according to length of service.
  - (d) if so, what increments.
- (7) Should the employees of the Company engaged in the delivery of goods be supplied with uniforms?
- (8) Should workers who have met with accidents not be ordered to appear before the check roll clerk daily during the period of accident leave?

If not, what other suitable arrangements should be made in that regard?

- (9) Should the workers be paid war allowance at Government rates?

The parties had previously agreed that the award made by us should take effect from 1st January, 1947, and that it should be binding on both parties up to 31st December, 1947. Advocate Nadarasa appearing on behalf of the Union informed us that the Union withdrew its demands as set out in Issues 2, 3 and 4 in view of the fact that a satisfactory formula had been agreed upon between the parties for dealing with cases of retrenchment. He also withdrew the demand with regard to Issues 5, 6, 7 and 8 as the matters arising thereon had been satisfactorily adjusted between the parties.

With regard to issues 1 (a), (b) and (c) the Union restricted its claim for retrospective payment of war allowance to the period commencing 1st November, 1946.

The main question which arises for our consideration is Issue 9 in which the Union demands that the workers be paid war allowance at Government rates. We are satisfied that the Company has for many years paid its labour on a scale which compares very favourably with that of other employers and which was more favourable than the rate applicable to Government workers until Government recently introduced revised rates of pay. The Company has admittedly made large profits during the war years and we are satisfied that during these years the Company has made generous payments to its staff by way of bonuses and contributions to the Provident Fund and Superannuation Fund. In these circumstances, it is a matter for surprise that the workers should have thought it necessary to go out on strike without due notice in December, 1946, and without any attempt being made to arrive at a settlement of outstanding disputes by negotiation or arbitration. This strike was, apart from other considerations, illegal.

Admittedly, the present Government rate of war allowance is higher than that prescribed by various decisions of the Wages Board. On the other hand the Company provides all labourers with a midday meal for a nominal charge of 10 cts. per day at a cost of about 40 cts. per day.

On 22nd March, 1946, the Union accepted a war allowance of 95 cts. per day for all workers. At this date the cost of living index stood at 220. The cost of living index now stands at over 250 and we feel that it is desirable in the interests of the Company and the labourers that a sliding scale should be introduced for the payment of war allowance. This scale should be worked on the basis that the agreed figure of 95 cts. was a fair allowance when the cost of living index stood at 220. We recommend that the scale for payment of war allowance should be as follows:

If the cost of living index falls below 200 there will be a corresponding reduction of 3 cts. for every 5 points. Similarly if the cost of living index exceeds 250 there will be an increase of 3 cts. for every 5 points. The cost of living index applicable for the purpose of this award will be in accordance with the cost of living index prepared by the Government for working classes in the city of Colombo.

It remains only to consider the Union's demand that payment of war allowance should be operative as from 1st November, 1946. We do not recommend that this demand should be allowed. Our award is that the payment of additional war allowance should take effect from 1st January, 1947.

In terms of section 6 (5) of the Industrial Disputes Ordinance Cap. 110, we nominate Mr. L. J. Montgomerie to represent the Ceylon Cold Stores and Mr. M. G. Mendis to represent the Union.

**Internal Purchase Scheme—Harvesting of Paddy in the Province of Uva.**

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulation 37, the Defence (Purchase of Foodstuffs) Regulations, 1942, the Defence (Paddy Cultivation) Regulations, 1943, and the Defence (Food Rationing Special Provisions) Regulations, 1944, I, William Holmes, Government Agent, Province of Uva, a competent and a proper authority, do by this order direct that every person whether owner or cultivator of any land, which is situated within the Province of Uva, and which is expected to be harvested after the date of this Order during any season of any year, until such time as this Order is rescinded by a proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, shall forward in writing, the following information to the Village Headman or the Vel-Vidane of the area in which the paddy land is situated:—

- the name, situation and extent of the land;
- the names and addresses of the person or persons entitled to take or receive any part of the produce of the land under any contract or agreement or otherwise;
- the details of the share or shares of the produce to which such person or persons referred to at (b) above may be entitled; and
- the dates on which it is proposed to reap and thresh the crop on the land.

The particulars for (a), (b) and (c) should be notified within fourteen clear days of sowing. The particulars for (d) should be notified at least ten clear days before the proposed date of reaping and threshing.

2. I do further direct that—

(1) No paddy shall be removed or caused or permitted to be removed by any person or persons from a field or threshing-floor to a barn or any other place of storage, until the Village Headman or Vel-Vidane of the area or any other person authorised by me shall have assessed and recorded the total harvest and the shares, and except on a written permit obtained from the proper authority in terms of paragraph 3 of this Order.

(2) The Government levy of two bushels of cleaned and winnowed paddy in good condition for the main Cultivation Season and one bushel for the smaller Cultivation Season per acre, which is a first charge on the crop shall be handed over at the threshing-floor to the Village Headman or the Vel-Vidane of the area, or any other person deputed by me; and a levy of 2 bushels per acre shall be handed over where fields are cultivated once a year.

(3) No part of the paddy removed on permits in pursuance of paragraph 3 of this Order shall without prior authority be disposed of in any manner, except so much as is allowable at the following approved rates for consumption and other purposes, and except in pursuance of sub-clause (5) below.

Approved rates:—

- Customary cultivation allowance of one cut bushel per acre;
- An allowance not exceeding 4 cut bushels per acre for seed purposes;
- A consumption allowance of 6 cut measures per head per week in the case of cultivators and owner-cultivators and their *bona fide* dependants and 4 cut measures per head per week in the case of non-cultivating owners and their *bona fide* dependants subject to the proviso that the maximum quantity allowable to any producer during any single cultivating season for consumption shall not exceed 50 cut bushels.

(4) No paddy shall be utilised for consumption by an owner or cultivator, or his/her dependants, possessing a Rice Ration Book, until he/she has surrendered the coupons for the paddy allowed to him/her for consumption under sub-clause (3) (c) on the following basis:—

- One rice coupon for every six cut measures of paddy received per head by cultivators and owner-cultivators and their dependants.
- One rice coupon for every 4 cut measures of paddy received per head by non-cultivating owners and their dependants;

(5) Re Transport permit in form I.P.S. 33, referred to in para 3 (3) below, will not be issued, until coupons liable to be surrendered in terms of sub-para. (4) above have been duly surrendered.

(6) Any quantity of paddy in excess of the requirements until the following harvest for consumption and other allowances as prescribed in sub-clause (3) above, or such quantity of paddy as I may order, shall be sold to the Village Headman and delivered at the nearest purchasing centre or the Village Headman's Office, and payment be obtained at Government rates prevailing from time to time, the rates prevailing at the date of this order being Rs. 6 per Bushel.

3. The levy is described as being the first charge on the crop; owing to crop failure, however, or to other reasonable causes the yield from a field may be very much reduced through no fault of the producer; in such cases it is clear that Food Production must not be allowed to suffer by removing paddy as a levy. In such cases the levy may be waived. The question has been raised as to the exact figure of the yield below which the levy should not be imposed; a hard and fast rule is difficult to lay down, but in general there would be reasonable grounds for waiving the levy if the yield per acre was five bushels or under. Every effort must of course be taken to see that false claims for the waiving of the levy are not made.

If for any reasons a producer anticipates the yield of any one or more of his fields to be less than 5 bushels per acre, he should inform the D. R. O. of the Division, one month before the harvest, by Registered Post giving the name of the field, extent, village where situated, anticipated yield, reason for low yield.

Subsequent applications of producers who fail to do this for waiver of the levy will not be entertained.

4. Permits for transport of paddy should be obtained in the following manner:—

- Transport within the Village Headman's Wasama: The application for the permit should be made to the Village Headman in whose wasama the field is situated, and he will issue a permit on form No. I.P.S. 33.
- Transport from one Village Headman's Wasama to another Village Headman's Wasama within the same D. R. O.'s Division a permit should be obtained from the Village Headman in the same manner as in (a) above and such permit must be endorsed by the D. R. O. of the area, before, it becomes valid.
- Transport from one D. R. O.'s Division to another D. R. O.'s Division within the Province of Uva; the application should be made in duplicate on form No. D. F. S. & C 34 to the D. R. O. of the area in which the applicant resides, and the permit will be issued at the Kachcheri. The application must be supported by a report from the Village Headman of the Wasama in which the field or fields are situated.
- Transport from one emergency area to another, or from one district to another: Applications should be made on form D. F. S. & C 34 in Duplicate to the Government Agent, Assistant Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent (E) in which the applicant is resident.

5. To expedite the issue of permits, the applicants are requested to produce reports from the Village Headman or any other authorised person of the area in which the paddy lands are situated, and of the area of their residence giving particulars of the shares of paddy from the various fields and the number of dependants in the household of the applicant and other particulars as requested in form D. 6. If no application is made in the manner described above within six weeks of the date of harvesting, all stocks of paddy are liable to be requisitioned under the Internal Purchase Scheme.

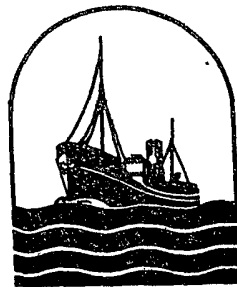

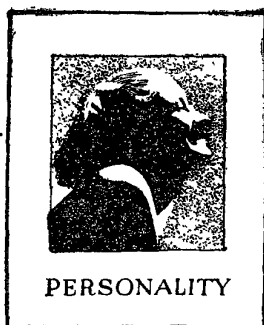
