GREETING.

WHEREAS it is expedient to issue a Commission to inquire into and report upon the state of the rubber industry in Ceylon and to make recommendations as to the ways and means of improving that industry, and, in particular, recommendations as to—

(1) the maximum acreage in Ceylon which can be cultivated with rubber profitably or economically; the

reduction of the acreage now cultivated with rubber if such acreage exceeds such maximum, and the manner in which the excess acreage should be dealt with;

(2) the policy to be adopted in respect of—

(a) the replanting of rubber on existing rubber lands; and
(b) the planting of rubber on lands which have hitherto not carried any rubber plants;

(3) the processing of rubber prior to exportation or sale;
(4) the measures to be adopted for the establishment in Ceylon of industries for the manufacture of products out of rubber and for increasing the consumption of the products of such industries;
(5) the development of the export trade in rubber and in products made of rubber; and
(6) the assistance, if any, which rubber growers and manufacturers should receive from the Government.

Now, therefore, I, HENRY MONCK-MASON MOORE, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon with the Territories and Dependencies thereof, reposing great trust and confidence in your prudence, ability and fidelity, do by these presents nominate, constitute and appoint you, the said ERIC WATSON WHITELAW, and SIMON FRANCIS HEREWARD PERERA to be my Commissioners for the purposes aforesaid:

THE PRISONS ORDINANCE.

RULE made by the Executive Committee of Home Affairs in pursuance of the powers vested in that Committee by section 83 of the Prisons Ordinance (Chapter 44), approved by the State Council and ratified by the Governor.

Rule.

The general rules published by Notification dated August 12, 1926, in *Gazette* No. 7,542 of August 20, 1926, are hereby amended as follows :—

(1) by the addition, at the end of rule 20, of the following :—

“ Provided, however, that no letter which a prisoner is entitled to write under these rules shall be withheld if it is written to a member of the State Council.” ;

(2) by the substitution, for rule 119, of the following new rule :—

“ The subordinate officers of the prison shall be the following :—

Overseers, Vocational Instructors, Technicians, Male Nurses, Guards, Hospital Orderlies and Motor Drivers.” ;

(3) by the substitution, for rule 169, of the following new rule :—

“ 169. For the purposes of section 41A (3) of the Prisons Ordinance, the following shall be non-working days :—

Good Friday, Christmas Day, Wesak Day and Hindu New Year's Day.” ;

(4) by the substitution, for rule 174 of the following new rule :—

“ 174. (1) The rate of batta shall be such sum as the Commissioner of Prison and Probation Services shall from time to time fix in consultation with the Treasury.

(2) In the case of any prisoner who is not domiciled in Ceylon, the Superintendent shall, if he considers that a special allowance will be necessary to enable such prisoner to reach his home, report the full circumstances of the case

to the Commissioner of Prison and Probation Services within, as far as practicable, one month of the date of discharge of such prisoner.” ;

(5) in rule 176, by the substitution, for all the words from “ to the vote ” to the end of that rule, of the following :—

“ to the appropriate vote provided from public funds.” ;

(6) in rule 219—

(a) by the substitution, in paragraph (1) thereof, for all the words and figures from “ on Sunday ” to “ 11 A.M. ” of the words and figures “ on Sunday, Good Friday, Christmas Day, Wesak Day, Hindu New Year's Day, and on Saturday after 11 A.M., and, where the prisoner is a Muslim, on Hadji Festival Day.” ; and

(b) by the omission of paragraph (2) thereof ;

(7) by the substitution, for rules 227 to 235, respectively, of the following new rules :—

“ 227. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in these rules—

(1) every newly convicted prisoner shall, during the period provided for preferring an appeal against his conviction, be afforded reasonable facilities for receiving visits from, or communicating with, any of his relations or friends for purposes connected with preferring an appeal or providing bail. He shall be allowed to receive visits, or communicate with his relations or friends as often as the Superintendent considers it necessary to enable him to arrange for the management of his property or other family affairs ;

(2) every prisoner committed to prison in default of paying a fine, or of giving security under Chapter VII. of the Criminal Procedure Code, shall be allowed to communicate with his relations or friends to arrange for the payment of the fine or for furnishing security.

228. Every convicted prisoner shall, during the term of his imprisonment, be permitted to receive visitors once every month, and to send one letter every month, and to receive such number of letters (not less than one in each month) as the Superintendent may consider reasonable :

Provided, however, that if any prisoner is guilty of misconduct, the Superintendent may prohibit such prisoner either for the duration of his imprisonment, or for such specified period as the Superintendent may think fit, from sending or receiving letters, or from receiving visitors.

229. (1) Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained the Superintendent may in special circumstances permit a prisoner to receive visitors on more than one day in a month or to send more than one letter in a month.

(2) The special circumstances referred to in paragraph (1) are the following :—

- (a) the serious illness of the prisoner ;
- (b) the death or serious illness of a near relation of the prisoner ;
- (c) where the refusal of permission to visit a prisoner would be an undue hardship to a relation or friend who had come from a distance to visit such prisoner ; or
- (d) any other sufficient cause.

(3) Matters of importance, such as the death of a relation, may also be communicated at any time by the friends of a prisoner to the Superintendent who will, if he thinks it expedient, inform the prisoner of the substance of the communication.

230. (1) The Superintendent shall fix the days on, and the hours at, which prisoners shall be permitted to receive visitors. A notice specifying such days and hours shall be posted outside the prison. No person shall be allowed to visit a prisoner on Sundays except for special reasons.

(2) Except with the special permission of the Superintendent a prisoner shall not be permitted to receive visitors on any day or time other than that fixed by the Superintendent under paragraph (1).

(3) Every application to visit a prisoner may, at the discretion of the Superintendent, be made orally or in writing. If the prisoner is not entitled to receive visitors the applicant shall be informed at once.

(4) Prisoners shall be allowed to receive visitors in a special room set apart for the purpose in the prison. Such room shall, as far as possible, be near the main entrance :

Provided, however, that—

- (a) in the case of a female prisoner, such prisoner shall, as far as possible be allowed to receive visitors in the enclosure provided for female prisoners and in the presence of a female prison officer ;
- (b) if a prisoner is seriously ill, the Superintendent may permit such prisoner to receive visitors in the hospital ;
- (c) in the case of a condemned prisoner, such prisoner shall ordinarily be allowed to receive visitors in his cell ; and

(d) the Superintendent may, for special reasons to be recorded in writing, permit prisoners to receive visitors in any other place within the prison.

(5) A jailor or other officer shall be present whenever a prisoner receives visitors. Every such interview shall, subject to the provisions of rule 201 (2), be within the hearing of the jailor or other officer.

(6) It shall be the duty of the jailor or other officer in whose presence a prisoner receives visitors to terminate the conversation between the prisoner and the visitor if the jailor or other officer considers that sufficient cause exists. In every such case the reason for terminating the conversation shall be reported forthwith to the Superintendent or the next senior officer present in the prison who shall make such order as he may think fit.

(7) No prisoner shall, unless the Superintendent otherwise directs, be allowed to speak to the visitor or visitors for more than thirty minutes and not more than three persons shall be permitted to visit a prisoner at a time.

231. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained it shall be lawful for a Superintendent to prohibit a prisoner from receiving visits from his relations or friends if the Superintendent is satisfied that such prohibition is desirable in the public interests, or in the interests of prison discipline, or for other sufficient cause. In every such case the Superintendent shall record the reasons for his prohibition.

232. A Police officer may, with the permission of the Commissioner of Prison and Probation Services, visit any prisoner if the prisoner is willing to receive a visit from such officer.

233. (1) Every letter, which a prisoner is entitled under these rules or is permitted by the Superintendent to send, shall be written at such time or place as the Superintendent may specify, and such stationery as the Superintendent considers necessary for the purpose shall be supplied to the prisoner.

(2) The Superintendent shall set apart a particular day of the week, preferably Sunday, for prisoners to write letters.

234. A prisoner may, with the permission of the Superintendent, retain any letter which has been delivered to him, or may request the Superintendent to preserve such letter for him.

235. (1) Every prisoner shall be entitled to send, shortly after his conviction, one petition to the Governor on matters connected with his trial or conviction. A prisoner shall be permitted to send an additional petition if in the opinion of the Superintendent there are special circumstances, or if the prisoner was not aware of certain facts at the time of the first petition, or if the prisoner has been more than one year in prison and not less than one year has elapsed since the date of his last petition.

(2) Every such petition shall be accompanied by Prisons form 26 duly filled up and shall be despatched to the Commissioner of Prison and Probation Services for transmission to the Secretary to the Governor. Petitions for release on medical grounds shall be forwarded through the Minister for Home Affairs."

TENDERS are hereby invited for the supply of Railway Sleepers, logs, sawn timber, &c., from Crown Forests as detailed in the schedule annexed. It should be clearly understood that tenders required are for contracts to supply specified quantities of sleepers, logs, sawn timber, &c., from each area, and *not* for the exclusive right of exploitation of the area. Tenderers should quote rates as follows :—

- (a) *Sleepers*—per B.G. per N.G. delivered stacked at the nearest point on the Railway approved by the Railway Department.
- (b) *Logs*—per cubic foot, delivered loaded into (a) trucks at the nearest Railway Station, (b) lorries at roadside.
- (c) *Sawn Timber*—Scantlings, boards and planks per cubic foot for all sizes.
Reepers 2" × 1"—per 1,000 foot run.
Reepers 2" × ½"—per 1,000 foot run for delivery loaded into (a) trucks at the nearest Railway Station, (b) lorries at roadside.
- (d) *Firewood*—per cubic yard/hundred weight, (a) delivered stacked at the nearest Railway lineside, and (b) delivered loaded into trucks at the nearest Railway Station.

Specification, sizes, &c., of logs, sleepers, sawn material and firewood are fully described in the special conditions.

2. All tenders should be in sealed cover and should be addressed to the Chairman, Tender Board, General Treasury, P. O. Box 500, Colombo.

3. Tenders should be marked (Tender for supply of Sleepers, Logs and Sawn Timber, &c.) in the left-hand top corner of the envelope and should reach the General Treasury not later than midday on Tuesday April 1, 1947. Each area shown separately in the annexed schedule should be tendered for separately.

4. Tenders should either be deposited in the tender box in the General Treasury, Room No. 223, Second Floor, Galle Face Secretariat, Colombo, or be sent through the post preferably under registered cover.

5. Tenders are to be made upon forms which will be supplied upon application at any of the Divisional Forest Offices in Colombo, Jaffna, Batticaloa and Kurunegala, or the Head Office, and no tender will be considered unless it is on the recognized form. One form should be used for each area.

6. All alteration and erasures in tenders must be initialed by the tenderers.

7. A deposit of Rs. 50 must be made for every form either in the office of the Conservator of Forest or in a Kachcheri, and a receipt produced for the same before any form of tender is issued. If a person to whom a tender form has been issued fails for no satisfactory reason to submit his tender within the time fixed in Condition 3 above, his tender form deposit of Rs. 50 will be liable to be forfeited at the discretion of the Conservator of Forests.

8. A tenderer shall before making his tender, examine in the office at which he obtains the tender form a copy of the contract he will be required to execute in the event of his tender being accepted and shall sign and deliver a statement at the time of applying for a tender form to the effect that he has fully acquainted himself with the terms of such contract and that in the event of his tender being accepted he will, within the time fixed by the Conservator of Forests, *vide* Condition 11 below, execute a contract in terms of the specimen contract. As evidence of his having examined the specimen contract the tenderer shall sign his name on it in the space provided for the purpose.

9. A tenderer who *has not previously held a Forest Department contract*, when applying for tender forms, should furnish the officer issuing the forms with a written statement giving his full name and permanent address, stating in which district or districts he owns landed property or other interests. The extent of landed property and the nature and extent of other interests should also be given.

A tenderer who has carried out contracts with the Department, but not in the Division or Districts concerned in the notice calling for tenders, should state in which Division or District or Divisions or Districts he has held contracts.

A tenderer who has carried out Government contracts with any other department should state the name of such department and the District in which the service was rendered, as well as the other information required.

No tender form will be issued to any person or on behalf of any person whose name appears in the list of defaulting contractors.

10. Tenderers should state in their tenders whether they have at their disposal motor vehicles and petrol allotments sufficient to carry out the contract; if not, what permits they will require for (a) vehicles, and (b) petrol, if the contract is awarded to them.

10A. No tenderer will be permitted to work in more than two areas. The selection of such areas will be at the discretion of the Conservator of Forests, whose decision will be final and binding on the successful tenderer.

11. No tender will be considered unless the conditions laid down have been complied with.

The Government reserves to itself the right without question to reject any or all offers and to accept any portion of an offer. No offers will be entertained from persons whose names appear on the list of defaulting contractors.

12. The successful tenderer for each area shall within such time as may be fixed by the Conservator of Forests of being informed in writing that his tender has been accepted enter into the necessary contract supplying at his own cost a stamp of the required value to be affixed to the contract and depositing as security 2½ per cent. of the value of the contract. Should he fail to comply with these requirements his tender form deposit may be forfeited to the Crown; he may render himself liable to be included in the list of defaulting contractors precluded from having any concern in a Government contract in future, and to make good any resultant loss; further the service may be offered to another tenderer in which case no claim for any profit that may accrue to Government by such offer will be entertained. Notice of acceptance of the tender will be deemed to have been received by the tenderer if it has been sent by post addressed to, or left, at the address given by the tenderer. All tender form deposits will be returned upon signature of the contracts.

13. The contract shall be entered into by the successful tenderer (hereinafter called the contractor) with the Divisional Forest Officer within whose jurisdiction the area of operation lies, acting for and on behalf of the Government of Ceylon, and the designation of such officer shall mean and include the officer for the time-being holding such office and his successors in office for the time being under the Government of Ceylon.

14. The contract may not be assigned or sublet without the authority of the Tender Board. The Tender Board reserves to itself the right to refuse to recognize a power of attorney issued by the contractor to any person authorising him to carry on the contract on the contractor's behalf.

15. The contractor shall not employ any person whose name is on the list of defaulting contractors. The Divisional Forest Officer may, for reasons which appear to him sufficient, give notice in writing of his objection to the employment by the contractor of any person specified in such notice, and no such person shall be employed by the contractor.

16. The successful tenderer will be required to employ only Ceylonese labourers in carrying out the work tendered for. The employment of only Ceylonese labourers in carrying out the work tendered for will be made a condition of the contract and the failure on the part of the successful tenderer to fulfil this condition will be treated as a breach of the terms of the contract and will render the contract liable to cancellation. Provided, however, that in exceptional circumstances the Head of the Department with whom the contract is entered into may permit the contractor to employ any non-Ceylonese labourers previously approved by him in writing with the concurrence of the Treasury. The employment of non-Ceylonese labourers without such approval in writing and concurrence will be deemed a breach of contract.

The term "Ceylonese" shall mean and include all persons born in Ceylon and no others.

17. Special rules for felling, conversion and removal of material which are to be observed by the contractor are more fully outlined in the Special Conditions given below. Nothing in these Special Conditions will exempt the contractor from liability under the Forest Ordinance, Cap. 311, should be responsible for the commission of a Forest Offence.

Any contractor who personally or through the actions of his agents or workmen becomes responsible for any offence against the provisions of the Forest Ordinance (Cap. 311), or for the contravention of any of the conditions of this contract on more than one occasion during the currency of his contract will be liable to have his name included in the list of persons who are debarred from holding Government contracts.

18. The contractor shall indemnify the Crown against any claim by or in respect of any employee of the contractor under the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance, Cap. 117.

19. The payments to which the contractor may render himself liable under the contract may be deducted by the Divisional Forest Officer concerned from all moneys then due or that may become due to the contractor under this or any other contract he may hold under Government and/or from the security deposited by the contractor and hypothecated to the Crown or be recovered from him by action at law.

20. The Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of ejecting the contractor's employees and of rescinding the contract if the above conditions are not adhered to.

21. In case of any disagreement arising between parties to the contract except where the right of final decision is reserved to the Conservator of Forests, it shall be referred to the Tender Board whose decision in every such case shall be final and binding on the parties to the contract.

22. The contract shall be current for a period of one year from the date it is signed. Extension of time will not be granted under any circumstances whatsoever.

23. All wayside depots should be accessible to lorries and carts and should be established by contractors at their own expense and with the approval of the Divisional Forest Officer.

24. No lorry over 1½ tons can be used on a road not specifically included in the P. W. D. road schedule.

25. For any further information, application should be made to the officer issuing tender forms.

Special Conditions.

1. (a) Sufficient trees will be made available for the conversion of the specified quantities of sleepers, logs and sawn timber from each area. Only trees marked by the Forest Department for felling shall be felled. Control of all such fellings and the Compartments in which such fellings shall take place will be at the discretion of the Divisional Forest Officer and he may issue directions from time to time as regards fellings.

(b) Climbers on trees to be felled interfering with other growth should be cut according to directions of a Forest Officer, prior to the felling of such trees.

(c) Extraction paths shall be opened by the contractor as directed by the Forest Officer.

(d) The contractors should satisfy themselves before tendering by inspecting the area personally, the quantity the area would yield as representations made later regarding insufficiency of trees, &c., will not be considered.

2. Only trees marked by a forest officer may be felled for conversion. Should the contractor or any of his agents or workmen be responsible for the felling or damaging of any trees not so marked, the contractor shall be liable to pay a fine not exceeding double royalty for each tree so felled or damaged.

If the contractor persists in such unauthorised fellings and/or does unnecessary damage to regeneration and the Forest crop he shall be liable to have his agreement terminated.

3. The supply shall be in the proportion specified against each area in the Schedule to the Agreement and each delivery shall be regarded as complete for purposes of making payment only when the delivery consists of the various categories of supplies—logs, sleepers, sawn timber—strictly in the proportions laid down. Payment will be withheld for any particular delivery not conforming to these conditions.

Payment will be made only on accepted quantities and measurements. No payment will be made for rejections but the contractor will be given the option of purchasing rejected material at full royalty rates. Should he not choose to exercise this option such material will be sold from time to time by public auction.

4. It may be possible to supply more than the quantities shown against each area in the schedule to the Agreement but no such excess will be paid for until delivery of such excess supplies too is effected in the same proportions laid down for the original quantities in the said Schedule.

5. At any time during the currency of the contract the Conservator of Forests may in his discretion call upon the contractor to concentrate on any particular category of supply or even to cease conversion of any other category of supply and the contractor shall carry out the work accordingly.

6. Conversion of logs, sleepers and sawn timber and firewood may take place at the site where trees are felled or at a wayside depot chosen by the contractor with the approval of the Divisional Forest Officer. Converted material or logs for conversion shall not be removed from the felling site to the wayside depot until they are stamped by a Forest Officer with such distinctive hammer work as are approved for the area.

The removal of material from the forest to the delivery point shall be covered by removal permits or cart-notes issued by the Range Forest Officer in charge of the Forest. The contractor shall be responsible for the safety of the material whether at felling site, or in transit or at delivery point and the contractor shall make good the value of any timber lost or damaged.

7. The contractor shall effect the first delivery not later than three months from the date of his signing the Agreement. In the case of delay the Conservator of Forests shall be entitled to recover from the contractor as liquidated damages a sum of Rs. 50 for every month or part of a month of such delay, until the first delivery is made. Subsequent deliveries should be at intervals of not longer duration than one month and in the case of default the Conservator of Forests shall be entitled to recover from the contractor as liquidated damages a sum of Rs. 100 for each month's delay.

8. The concession of advance payment will be granted to contractors who make regular supplies, keep a steady average and maintain a high standard of production. Should any advance payment represent on final acceptance of material an overpayment such overpayment shall be recovered from sums that subsequently become due to the contractor. The concession will be withdrawn from contractors who fall behind supplies. The grant and withdrawal of the concession will be at the discretion of the Conservator of Forests.

9. The contractor shall at his own cost and charges furnish labour, transport, implements, tools, and any material whatsoever required for carrying on the work under the contract. He shall also supply labour, tools, &c., for enumerating trees, demarcating boundaries and for any other work connected with the contract deemed necessary by the Divisional Forest Officer.

10. If the contractor shall fail to make fair and reasonable progress towards completing the work within the time here in before specified, it shall be lawful for the Divisional Forest Officer (if it shall appear to him expedient to do so), to take the work into his own hands, after giving one week's notice in writing to the contractor that the said work will be completed by the Divisional Forest Officer and thereupon to employ sufficient workmen, overseers and materials to furnish and complete the same and the contractor shall be liable to pay and make good such sum or sums of money, if any, as may be spent by the Divisional Forest Officer in the completion as aforesaid of the said work over and above what may have been payable to the contractor if he had completed the work within the time specified.

11. The contractor shall not in any manner, do, cause, or procure to be done any act, matter, or thing whatsoever to delay or impede the completion of the said work by the Divisional Forest Officer, under preceding condition (10) or to obstruct the person or persons so employed by the Divisional Forest Officer or to prevent them from using the plant, implement, tools, wire-shoots, and other materials which shall have been or shall be provided for the execution of the said work; and shall not in any way molest, or cause to be molested, the Divisional Forest Officer or any person or persons employed by him.

12. The contractor or his agent or agents, whose names shall be given to the Divisional Forest Officer and the Range Forest Officer in charge of the work, in writing at the commencement of work under the contract and who shall hold a written authority from the contractor shall at all times and without fail be at the working centres to supervise and control workmen and to take orders from inspecting Forest Officers. Should this condition not be complied with the inspecting officer shall have the power to eject such workmen. Further the Divisional Forest Officer shall have the power to reject without question any of the contractor's agents or employees. The contractor will be at liberty to change his agents provided the changes are duly communicated to the Divisional Forest Officer and the Range Forest Officer in writing and provided that each new agent holds a written authority from the contractor to act on his behalf.

13. Damages not exceeding Rs. 100 for any breach of the conditions or for any delinquencies on the part of the contractor in carrying out this contract may be recovered from the contractor with the approval of the Conservator of Forests whose decision shall be final.

14. The supplies of the logs, sleepers and sawn timber should be strictly according to specifications shown in conditions 15-25 below.

15. Logs shall be converted from Satin, Palu, Milla, Ranai, Hulanhik, Halmilla, Mi, Kumbuk, Suriyamara, Dawu and also from such other species as may be acceptable from time to time as required by the Divisional Forest Officer. The absolute minimum dimensions of the logs should be 3 ft. mid-girth under bark and 9 ft. in length. It should be noted that these are only minimum dimensions and that all logs should be as long as possible and of as large girths as available.

Logs of minimum dimensions should not however exceed 10 per cent. of the total supplies.

All logs should be trimmed and barked. Logs of Satin should be carefully barked as soon as they are felled. Logs of other species should be barked up to width of 8 in. at the centre. Logs should be straight and sound and should be free from knots and all forms of decay and other defects. Logs that do not conform to the above specifications will be rejected.

16. Sleepers shall be converted only from trees of Satinwood, Palu, Milla, Ranai and Na.

17. Sleepers shall conform to the Railway Department's specification which is reproduced below—

(a) The broad gauge sleepers are for the 5 ft. 6 in. gauge lines and are to be 9 ft. long, 10 in. wide and 5 in. deep, subject to a variation in length of 1 in. The narrow gauge sleepers are for the 2 ft. 6 in. gauge lines and are to be 5 ft. long, 9 in. wide and 4½ in. deep subject to a similar variation in length.

(b) All sleepers shall be cut from well matured trees of the true species of timber. Sleepers must be sawn, and shall be of good sound timber free from heartshake, sapwood (except as provided in (c) dry rot and knot holes and shall be cut square out of winding and straight.

(c) Allowance may be made for small surface sunshakes, endshakes up to 6 in. a few pinholes, but not in groups, sound and firm knots up to 2 in. in diameter, sap or wane must not exceed 2 in. on either face and not come under the rail seat.

(d) The sleepers shall not be cut on full quarter and shall be cut with an allowance of $\frac{1}{4}$ in. in width and $\frac{1}{2}$ in. in thickness to allow for shrinkage and no further allowance on account of size, except as provided above for length, shall be made.

18. Sleepers that do not conform to the specifications will be rejected but where the contractor is agreeable the Railway Department will accept as 2nd grade those sleepers that just fail to come up to standard. Payment for 2nd grade sleepers will be at $\frac{1}{2}$ the accepted rates. Rejected B. G. sleepers other than those accepted as 2nd grade sleepers should be converted into N.G. sleepers and offered for inspection if in the opinion of the Railway Department such rejections are suitable for conversion into N.G. All other rejected sleepers suitable for conversion into scantlings should be so converted and delivered to the Forest Department.

19. Sleepers shall be delivered stacked at an agreed point on the Railway lineside or station yard in batches of not less than 100 and as sufficient quantities become available for handing over, the Forest Department will advise the Railway Department to this effect. Each batch of sleepers shall contain a minimum of 25 per cent. N.G. sleepers until the stipulated number of N.G. sleepers has been supplied. A Forest Department representative will pass sleepers for species at the same time that the Railway Department inspecting officer passes them for specification and payment.

20. *Sawn Timber* shall be converted from trees of species approved for sleepers and log supplies.

21. Scantlings and boards shall be as long as possible but not less than 10 ft. Boards should not be less than 6" in width.

22. The supply shall be subject to the grading rules below—

- (i.) Material shall be flat sawn with sides parallel.
- (ii.) Payment will be made on volume in cubic feet calculated by multiplying the length by the cross section or on length in cubits for scantlings or area in square feet for boards as the case may be, subject to the following limitations :—
 - (a) Length will be taken to the nearest and lower half foot, e.g., 10 ft. 4 in., being taken as 10 feet.
 - (b) In width and thickness a tolerance of $\frac{1}{8}$ " scant and $\frac{1}{4}$ " full will be accepted. For example, the extreme acceptable limits for a scantling 4" by 4" are 3 $\frac{7}{8}$ " by 3 $\frac{7}{8}$ " and 4 $\frac{1}{4}$ " by 4 $\frac{1}{4}$ " and any of the possible variations between these limits will be acceptable. Measurements for payment in each case will be 4" by 4".
- (iii.) Timber showing groups of pinhole borer attack, whether active or old, which in the opinion of the Inspecting Officer will reduce the strength of the timber by 5 per cent. or more will be rejected.
- (iv.) All the timber showing signs of active " Powder Post " beetle attack will be rejected.
- (v.) Material showing obvious fungal attack, excepting casual blue stain or other superficial discoloration, will be rejected. Severe blue stain will count as a defect under rule viii. below.
- (vi.) A maximum total length of all end splits of $\frac{1}{12}$ th of the total length of the board or scantling will be allowed.
- (vii.) Not more than 1" of sap either on one side or in total on both sides in boards up to 8" and not more than 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " boards exceeding 8" in width will be rejected. This is applicable to all species except certain selected dry zone hardwoods. A list of which is available for inspection at any of the Divisional Forest Offices or at the office of the Conservator of Forests.
- (viii.) *Knots.*—No piece of timber may contain more than 3 defects in the form of knots. These are graded as follows :—

1 knot $\frac{5}{8}$ " to 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ " diameter	=	1 defect
1 knot 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ " to 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ "	=	2 defects
1 knot 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " to 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ "	=	3 defects
2 knots under $\frac{5}{8}$ "	=	1 defect
3 knots under $\frac{5}{8}$ "	=	2 defects

This applies for tight knots only. If decayed or with signs of decay around them the defects are doubled.

- (ix.) *Wane.*—With otherwise clear specimens a limited amount is permissible but if combined with other defects the presence of wane is a serious defect as the combination results in an appreciable reduction in strength and timber showing such defect will be rejected.

23. The supply shall be in such quantities and in such sizes as may be laid down from time to time by the Divisional Forest Officer concerned.

Each delivery shall be strictly in the proportions so stipulated and if this condition is not satisfied payments for supplies delivered shall be liable to be withheld with forfeiture of security.

24. Sawn timber must be properly stacked at all times whether in the forest, wayside depot or railway yard. The necessary strickers (2" by $\frac{3}{4}$ " reapers) shall be supplied by the contractor. All stacking shall be as directed by the Divisional Forest Officer or an officer duly authorised by him.

25. *Firewood.*—(a) Only trees which are not of accepted timber species should be felled for firewood but trees which emit a milky exudation such as *Ficus* species, Kaduru, Lunumidella, Rulkattana, Kapu, Kottan, Erabadu, Dadap, Etemata, Kekuna, Amba, Gedumba, Walkaduru, Imbul, Del and Pulun shall not be felled for conversion of firewood.

(b) Firewood shall be cut and split into billets 3 ft. in length and not less than 2 in. or more than 9 in. in diameter. Firewood shall be stacked leaving sufficient space between the stacks for inspecting officers to walk round each stack. Stacks should be either 3 ft. 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ ft. or 6 ft. in height.

(c) The contractor will be liable to pay a sum of Rs. 25 as liquidated damages to the Conservator of Forests should a check stack in re-stacking show a decrease of over 10 per cent.

(d) Provided his work is satisfactory the successful tenderer will at the sole discretion of the Conservator of Forests be granted permission to retail firewood at consuming centres at prices to be approved by the Conservator of Forests.

26. All notices to be served on the contractor shall be deemed to have been served if given to him or his agent personally or left at the address given in the tender.

The Ceylon Chamber of Commerce Ordinance, 1895 as amended by the Ceylon Chamber of Commerce Amendment Ordinance, 1932

WITH reference to the Rules of the Ceylon Chamber of Commerce and relative appendices published on pages 1932 and 1933 of Part I of the Ceylon Government Gazette No. 8,024 dated December 22, 1933, it is hereby notified that at an Ordinary General Meeting of the Chamber duly convened and held at their rooms on Friday, January 24, 1947:—

1. BYE-LAWS AND CONDITIONS OF SALE OF TEA BY AUCTION—Appendix B.

(i) Bye-law No 5 was deleted and the following substituted therefor:—

“ 5. 12 chests or 18 half chests of Tea and upwards shall constitute a large break, a smaller number being regarded as a small break, but no lot of less than 6 packages shall be catalogued ”.

(ii) The following new Bye-law was inserted after Bye-law No. 5 and numbered 6:—

“ 6. Lot Money at 85 cents per lot shall be payable by the Seller to the Selling Broker and the Selling Broker shall pay 40 cents per lot to the Ceylon Chamber of Commerce for use of the Sale Room ”.

(iii.) The first sentence of Condition of Sale No. 2 was amended to read:—

“ 2. All teas shall be sold by the lot at so much per lb.; all export duty and cesses, if any, shall be for and on account of and be payable by the Buyer.”

(iv.) The first part of Condition of Sale No. 4 was amended to read:—

“ 4. All Teas shall be paid for on catalogued weights (less 6 lbs. sample allowance) on or before prompt day, which shall be five days from date of sale, Sundays and Bank Holidays excepted. On receipt of payment by the Seller or the Selling Broker there shall be issued to the Buyer a delivery order on the Seller and the Buyer shall thereupon take delivery at Seller's Stores ”.

(v.) The first part of Condition of Sale No. 6 was amended to read:—

“ 6. The Selling Broker shall open, inspect and sample the Tea. The sample shall consist of 6 lbs. of each break. Six packages shall be sampled, 1 lb. exactly being drawn from each package.”

(vi.) The first sentence of Condition of Sale No. 7 was amended to read:—

“ 7. All Teas offered for sale shall be packed in good merchantable packages and the Selling Broker shall declare in his catalogue whether such packages are ‘patent’, ‘mom’ or ‘Ceylon wood’ and if made of Ceylon wood the same shall be manufactured from well seasoned timber of varieties approved by the Association ”.

(vii.) Condition of Sale 8(a) was amended to read:—

“ 8 (a) All packages shall have the gross and nett weights marked thereon previous to being offered for sale, and in the event of a shortage in weight being proved, the Seller shall be liable for such shortage and also for the cost of weighing. In the event of any dispute Condition of Sale No 10 will apply ”.

2. *RULES APPLYING TO THE DIMENSIONS, CONSTRUCTION AND STOWAGE OF COCONUT OIL IN STEEL CYLINDRICAL PACKAGES. Appendix X.

The whole of this Appendix was deleted and the following substituted therefor:—

“ Size and Gauge.—The package should not exceed 2 ft. 7 ins. diameter by 4 ft. length and the gauges should be as follows:—

5 cwt. packages corrugated	..	18 gauge throughout
5 cwt. packages plain	..	18 gauge throughout
10 cwt. packages corrugated	..	18 gauge throughout
10 cwt. packages plain	..	16 gauge throughout

Construction.—Welding should be in accordance with the following practice, viz., Thermoacetylene or other system rendering the connections a homogeneous whole.

Stowage.—1. A solid level to be laid in ship's hold for ground tier. This tier must be well chocked and wedged off to prevent shifting, and a strict cantline must be observed. No packages to be stowed athwartship.

2. 10 cwt. packages to be stowed bilge to cantline and not more than 4 tiers high.

5 cwt. packages to be stowed bilge to cantline and not more than 5 tiers high.

CEYLON GOVERNMENT RAILWAY.

Recruitment of Candidates to Service of Station Masters and Officers-in-Charge of Stations and Goods Sheds.

2. 6. (i.) A certificate of registration of the candidate's birth, showing him to be not less than 17 nor more than 23 years of age on May 31, 1947, must be attached to the Form of Application. Services Personnel, including full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions, and Civil Defence Services, may deduct the period of their continuous service in the recent war from their age, if necessary.

(ii.) Certificates of birth issued for the purpose of the Code for Assisted Schools will not be accepted for this examination.

* For the purpose of this examination, a Ceylonese is:—

(a) A British subject who is born in Ceylon, one of whose parents was born in Ceylon; or

(b) A British subject, who is a descendant of a person falling within category (a); or

(c) A British subject deemed by the Governor with the advice of the Board of Ministers, in view of special circumstances, to be a Ceylonese.

(iii.) Affidavits will, in no circumstances, be accepted as substitutes for Birth Certificates.

(iv.) In the case of candidates who submit certificates of registration in the register of past births, the certificates will only be accepted after consideration of the evidence by which the dates of birth were established. If the name appearing in the birth register differs, either by alteration or addition from the name by which a candidate is known—(a) the parent or guardian, in the case of a candidate under the age of 21 years should, before obtaining a certificate, apply to the Registrar-General or his Assistant for such alteration in the manner set forth in section 19 of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance (Chapter 94) and (b) in the case of a candidate over the age of 21 years, he should produce evidence to the satisfaction of the General Manager, Ceylon Government Railway, that the certificate of birth forwarded applies to him.

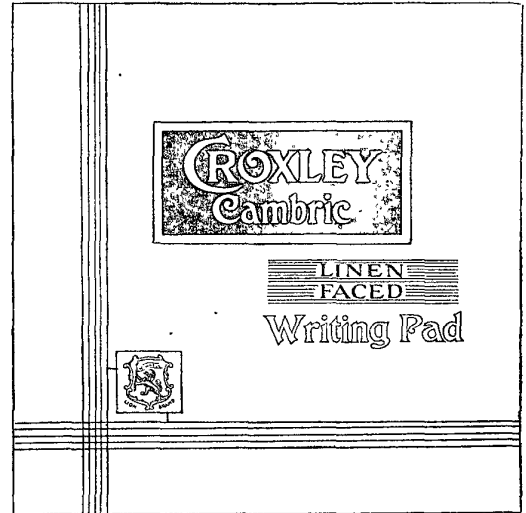

"Apparatus for and method of geophysical exploration".

Abstract.—The inventor describes and claims methods of carrying out geophysical exploration of the earth's surface for the location of hidden ore deposits characterized by the use of aircraft flying repeatedly over the area carrying instruments which are sensitive to the pressure of anomalies in the earth's crust; the instruments are automatically stabilised in the aircraft e.g. by means of a gyroscopic stabiliser. Preferably the aircraft is of the helicopter type.

The instruments and apparatus for the detection of irregularities may be (a) earth inductor compass (b) permeability bridge using nichrome stool (c) magnetrons arranged with axes mutually at right angles (d) ultra high frequency transmitters for directing pulses of energy vertically into the earth, and a cathode ray indicator for recording the reflected waves.

The inventor states that with these means the approximate length, width, thickness, outline and depth below surface of the deposit can be ascertained.
