The Rules for Passenger and Goods Train Traffic and Rates and Classification of Goods, published in the *Supplement to Gazette* No. 7,514 of February 26, 1926, as last amended by Rule published in *Gazette* No. 9,620 of October 25, 1946, are hereby further amended as follows:—

I. Under the heading "Conveyance of Traffic by Passenger Trains"—

(1) by the substitution, for rule 3, of the following new rule:—

"3. *Hours of Business at Stations and Goods Offices.*—Stations, Booking Offices, Parcels Offices and Goods Offices will be open for public business only between such hours as may from time to time be prescribed by the General Manager for each such station, booking office, parcels office or goods office. A notice or notices showing the hours of public business prescribed for each such station or office shall be exhibited at such station or office."

and

(2) by the omission of rule 4.

II. Under the heading "Conveyance of Goods Traffic"—

(1) by the omission of rule 14;

(2) in rule 21, by the omission of the following sentence occurring in the first paragraph:—

“If the goods arrive at the station of delivery between 5 P.M. and 7 A.M. the latter hour will, for the calculation of the 24 hours, be considered the hour of arrival.”;

(3) in rule 22:—

(a) in paragraph (a)—

(i) in the second line, by the substitution, for the words and figure “beyond 20 working hours”, of the words and figure “beyond 48 hours”, and

(ii) in sub-paragraph (1) of that paragraph, by the substitution, for the words and figure “for 30 working hours”, of the words and figure “for 72 hours”,

and

(iii) in sub-paragraph (2) of that paragraph, by the substitution, for the words and figure “for 40 working hours”, of the words and figure “for 96 hours”;

(b) by the substitution, for paragraph (c), of the following new paragraph:—

“(c) In computing warehouse rent, Sundays, Good Friday, Hindu New Year's Day, the full moon day of the Sinhalese month Wesak, King's Birthday, Christmas Day and the first week-day next following will be considered as *dies non.*”;

(4) in rule 23:—

(a) in each of the paragraphs (a), (b) and (c), by the substitution, for the words and figures “within 9 working hours in Colombo, or 10 working hours at any other station”, wherever they occur collectively in those paragraphs, of the words and figure “within 24 hours”;

(b) by the substitution, for paragraph (g) of the following new paragraph:—

“(g) In computing demurrage charges, Sundays, Good Friday, Hindu New Year's Day, the full moon day of the Sinhalese month Wesak, King's Birthday, Christmas Day and the first week-day next following will be considered as *dies non.*”; and

(5) in rule 24, in the sixth line, by the substitution, for the words and figure “within 20 working hours”, of the words and figure “within 48 hours”.

III. Under the heading “Alphabetical Classification of Goods” as last amended by rule published in *Gazette* No. 9,412 of June 1, 1945, by the addition of the following new item:—

Every tender shall be made on the prescribed form and be accompanied by a Kachcheri receipt for Rs. 50 in respect of each tender form for each tavern and for Rs. 100 in respect of each tender form for the two taverns grouped together. The number and date of the receipt must be entered on the face of the tender form.

3. Tenders should be addressed to the Government Agent, Eastern Province, Batticaloa. Every tender must be placed in a sealed envelope clearly marked on the top left-hand corner with the name of the tavern in respect of which the tender is made and the number on the list of sanctioned taverns. The envelope shall be—
