No irrigation headman shall hold office for a longer period than five years from the date of his election or appointment, but nothing in this rule shall be deemed to prohibit the re-election or reappointment of any such officer, if he is otherwise eligible, for further periods of the like duration.

TRADE DISPUTE—MESSRS. WALKER SONS AND COMPANY,
LIMITED, COLOMBO.

THE Ceylon Labour Union presented a petition to me under section 6 of the Essential Services (Avoidance of Strikes and Lockouts) Order, 1942 with regard to a trade dispute that had arisen between the said Union and Messrs. Walker Sons & Co., Ltd., Colombo. The petition was referred to a Special Tribunal appointed by His Excellency the Governor under the proviso to section 5 of the said Order for adjudication.

2. The following findings and award dated May 8, 1947, made by the Special Tribunal are published for general information in terms of Section 8 (4) of the above-mentioned Order :—

“The petitioner Union has made the demands embodied in its petition. Evidence has been led by both parties regarding the matters in dispute.

Demand (1) : Annual Increments.

This demand relates to the award of annual increments to all the workmen who are daily-paid employees performing skilled, semi-skilled and unskilled work in the Workshops of the respondent Company. It seems to be the case that the respondent Company does give certain increments to its workmen, from time to time. But these increments have not, in the past, been given every year. The Manager of the Respondent Company has expressed his willingness to consider at a fixed period each year, the grant of an increment to employees of the Company. The demand that every employee should be given a fixed annual increment, automatically, has been resisted by the respondent Company, and was not pressed by the petitioner, whose demand now is that there should be a definite system applicable to the consideration of the grant or refusal of increments at stated periods each year. The respondent Company states that it is prepared to consider the grant of an increment to its employees every year. The respondent Company, however, stresses the position taken up by it that a provision for an automatic increment, which is not earned as a result of efficient work, would have the tendency to promote inefficiency among its workmen. I agree that this will be so : at the same time, a workman who has, during the year preceding, done efficient work, without any deterioration in the quality or the quantity of his work, is entitled to be considered as deserving of an increment at the expiry of that year. I have no doubt that the employer will grant, to such of its employees as have merited it, an increment on their wage at the end of each year. The stoppage or deferment of an increment is a necessary and useful expedient, as a warning to a workman that unless he pulls his full weight and improves in his efficiency he will be disentitled to an increment in his wage.

My award regarding this annual increment is—

- (a) The respondent Company should consider the case of each of its employees at a stated period during each year with regard to the grant or refusal of an increment ;
- (b) Such of the employees as have not been given an increment should be specifically informed why the increment has been refused : if the increment is deferred for a shorter period than one year, intimation of that decision should also be conveyed to the employee, so that he may show better result during the period of deferment and thereby earn an increment ;
- (c) The minimum rate of wages payable to all classes of employees should be as fixed by the decision of the Wages Board relating to the Engineering Trade which is applicable to the respondent Company ;
- (d) As regards the amount of the annual increment, I find on an examination of the amount of the increments that have been awarded in the past by the respondent Company to its employees, that those increments compare favourably, and, in some instances are even better than, the scale provided for the workmen working in the Municipal Workshops, as shown in the document “P 1”*. The Tribunal does not therefore propose to lay down a fixed scale fixing the quantum of the annual increment. This is a matter which should be left to the discretion of the employer who, after assessing the merit of its employees in the various categories, will award such increments they are found deserving of,
- (e) Having laid down that increments are not automatic on a time-scale, it follows that the maximum rate of the daily wage cannot also be fixed. The maximum is bound to vary according to the merit and capacity of each employee, particularly, those performing skilled work. The business carried on by an engineering firm is a competitive business, and the maximum rates that are paid by employers will necessarily have a relation to the rates paid by other employers in the Engineering Trade, and similar industry in the district. I therefore, do not fix a maximum rate of pay.

Demand (2) : Establishment of a Provident Fund.

This demand was not pressed. I therefore make no Award regarding the establishment of a Provident Fund for the daily-paid employees of the respondent Company.

Demand (3) : A Day off A Week with Full Pay to Men Working on Sundays.

This demand is worded as follows :—

“A day off a week with full pay to men working on Sundays”.

I find that Sunday is the normal weekly holiday, as prescribed by a decision of the Engineering Wages Board, appointed under the Wages Boards Ordinance. This board has also decided that the weekly holiday shall be without pay. Owing to the stress of some urgent work, the respondent Company finds it necessary to employ some workmen on Sundays. Those so employed are paid one-and-a-half times their normal daily rate of wages, and they are given a substitute holiday within the week following. This substitute holiday is necessarily a holiday without pay. This demand therefore cannot be pressed, as I find that the decision of the Wages Boards governs the matter and is, in my opinion, a fair decision in all the circumstances.

Demand (4) : Workmen presenting themselves for work should be given work, or in the event of there being no work, they should be paid the Full Day's Wages.

This demand raises a difficult question which is related to the problem of unemployment with which most workmen are now faced. During the War years, the respondent Company had an abnormal amount of work on ships that came into the Colombo Harbour. The Company, therefore, employed a very large number of extra hands. This type of work having now considerably decreased, the necessity for reducing the number of workmen who can be provided with work every day has arisen. The system at present adopted by the Company is to lay-off, after previous notice, a certain number of workmen for certain defined periods. If a workman turns up for work he, not having been given previous notice that no work will be available to him, is paid a stand-by wage for that day, and is then laid-off for a short period. At the expiry of that period, when the man returns for work, he is usually provided with work or, if no work is available he is given a stand-by wage for that day and again informed that he is laid-off for a further period. The problem of the want of full employment for all the workmen is a matter entitled to sympathetic consideration. Employers cannot be blamed if, owing to a drop in their volume of work, they are not in a position to employ as many hands as they were able to do when, during the War years, the volume of work was abnormal. In order, however, to reduce the uncertainty of employment among a large body of workmen, as much as possible, I would suggest, for the consideration of the respondent Company, the desirability of formulating a scheme whereby a certain number of hands, selected by them, on account of their long, service, efficiency, and availability of work for them, should be regarded as being more or less entitled to daily employment. The Company should be able to group together the remaining workmen, who might be regarded as “floaters”, into batches who would be able to obtain employment according to a roster arranged by the Managers of the various departments, in consultation with this body of workmen. Although I do not make an award that this system should be adopted, I would strongly commend that this suggestion should be given a trial, as it will have the effect of removing all uncertainty and consequently the discontent that is otherwise bound to arise.

My award accordingly is that the Company should continue to follow the present system with regard to laying-off and the stand-by wage.

Demand (5) : The Contract System should cease.

The reason for this demand would appear to be based on the plea that, when work is given to a workman to be done on the basis of a contract for piece-work, he employs, from amongst the workmen working in the respondent Company's Workshops, a smaller number of workmen than would normally be employed to do that same job of work if that work was by the Company without the interposition of a contractor. It is possibly true that, with a view to earning larger profits which are shared between the contractor and his workmen, these workmen do their work more speedily. The complaint of the respondent Company, during the course of the enquiry, has been that the output of work of the workmen, generally, has fallen considerably. The respondent Company carries on business as a commercial enterprise. If the Company finds that getting their work done on sub-contracts given to their employees is one of the methods necessary to be adopted to combat the slowing down of the workmen, the Company cannot be blamed for adopting the contract system. No sufficient material has been placed before me to show that this contract system works to the prejudice of the workmen, or that it should be stopped, and I therefore refuse to accede to this demand.

Demand (6) : In the event of any workman being retrenched for want of work he should be paid a gratuity of One Month's Pay for each Year of Service.

This demand relates to the grant of one month's pay for each year of service. During the course of the enquiry this demand was modified to be made applicable only to workmen who have had 15 years' or more continuous service. In this modified form the demand is in accordance with the grant of gratuity paid by Government to its daily-paid employees, and also by certain other mercantile employees.

With regard to this demand, the respondent Company placed evidence before me, as embodied in the document "R 10"* to show that varying sums, up to five hundred rupees, have been paid either by way of gratuity, or a compassionate grant, to men who retired after 25 years' service, or to their dependants. This grant has been made on a voluntary basis, and is an *ex gratia* payment at the discretion of the General Manager and a Committee.

It is difficult to lay down by an Award a compulsory scheme for the payment of a gratuity or an old-age pension. The Company may find it difficult to inaugurate a scheme for the payment of old-age pensions without having created sufficient reserves as a permanent fund for this purpose, and possibly, without State aid.

The respondent Company has made *ex gratia* payments in the past, as indicated in the document "R 10"* to workmen who retired after 25 years' service.

The present demand relates to the payment of a gratuity to workmen who have been retrenched. Fifteen years' continuous service is a sufficiently long period to merit recognition by the employer for the grant of a gratuity when such employee is sent away for want of work.

I do not want to lay down any precise formula for the ascertainment of the amount of gratuity which should be paid to a person who is retrenched after 15 years' continuous service. I would, however, state that a workman in those circumstances is also entitled to receive an *ex gratia* payment,

at the discretion of the employer, and I would therefore recommend that the cases of such persons should also be dealt with, at the discretion of the employer.

I therefore make no specific award regarding this demand, beyond making the above recommendation.

Demand (7) : In the event of Retrenchment, the Newest Employees should be the First to go.

The Company accepted the correctness of the principle which would normally be applicable in the case of retrenchment, namely, "last come, first off".

It has, however, been pointed out to me that, during the War years, the Company was forced to employ all types of workmen, good, bad and indifferent, and that some of them would, in normal years, not have secured employment with the Company, and that their employment was largely due to the insufficiency of the availability of labour. In these circumstances, a submission was made, on behalf of the Company, that the normal rule should not be made applicable with regard to workmen who were employed, say, during the last 5 years, and that, when retrenchment became necessary, the Company should have the liberty of picking and choosing the men who should be retained, and the men who should be sent away, regard being had to their relative efficiency, good time-keeping and general behaviour.

I agree that the normal principle cannot be given effect to with regard to this last batch of workmen, and that the Company should have the discretion to choose the men who should be retained and those who should be sent away.

I would make award accordingly.

There is one other matter regarding which I wish to make comment: certain allegations regarding an European employee of this firm, made by certain witnesses, have not been proved to my satisfaction, and those allegations are probably unfounded".

Tenders should quote rates as follows:—

- (b) Transport per cu. ft. of timber per mile—
 - (1) in forest,
 - (2) by road (V. C., D. R. C., P. W. D., &c.)
- II. (a) *Sleepers*—per B. G. stacked at the nearest point on the railway line to be approved by the Railway Department. (N. G. sleepers will be paid for at half the rates for B. G. sleepers).
- (b) *Logs*—per cubic foot for delivery—
 - (i) stacked at the Wayside Depot,
 - (ii) loaded into trucks at the nearest Railway Station.
- (c) *Sawn Timber*—per cubic foot for all sizes (inclusive of reapers, rafters, boards planks, &c.) for delivery—
 - (i) stacked at the Wayside Depot,
 - (ii) loaded into trucks at the nearest Railway Station.
- (d) *Firewood*—per ton (3 cubic yards) for delivery.
 - (i) stacked at the Wayside Depot,
 - (ii) loaded into trucks at the nearest Railway Station.

Specification, sizes, &c., of logs, sleepers, sawn material and firewood are fully described in the special conditions.

2. All tenders should be in sealed cover and should be addressed to the Chairman, Tender Board, General Treasury, P. O. Box 500, Colombo.

3. Tenders should be marked (Tender for supply of Sleepers, Logs and Sawn Timber, &c.) in the left-hand top corner of the envelope and should reach the General Treasury not later than midday on Tuesday, April 1, 1947. Each area shown separately in the annexed schedule should be tendered for separately.

4. Tenders should either be deposited in the tender box in the General Treasury, Room No. 223, Second Floor, Gallo Face Secretariat, Colombo, or be sent through the post preferably under registered cover.

5. Tenders are to be made upon forms which will be supplied upon application at any of the Divisional Forest Offices in Colombo, Jaffna, Batticaloa and Kurunegala, or the Head Office, and no tender will be considered unless it is on the recognized form. One form should be used for each area.

6. All alteration and erasures in tenders must be initialled by the tenderers.

7. A deposit of Rs. 50 must be made for every form either in the office of the Conservator of Forest or in a Kachcheri, and a receipt produced for the same before any form of tender is issued. If a person to whom a tender form has been issued fails for no satisfactory reason to submit his tender within the time fixed in Condition 3 above, his tender form deposit of Rs. 50 will be liable to be forfeited at the discretion of the Conservator of Forests.

8. A tenderer shall before making his tender, examine in the office at which he obtains the tender form a copy of the contract he will be required to execute in the event of his tender being accepted and shall sign and deliver a statement at the time of applying for a tender form to the effect that he has fully acquainted himself with the terms of such contract and that in the event of his tender being accepted he will, within the time fixed by the Conservator of Forests, *vide* Condition 11 below, execute a contract in terms of the specimen contract. As evidence of his having examined the specimen contract the tenderer shall sign his name on it in the space provided for the purpose.

9. A tenderer who *has not previously held a Forest Department contract*, when applying for tender forms, should furnish the officer issuing the forms with a written statement giving his full name and permanent address, stating in which district or districts he owns landed property or other interests. The extent of landed property and the nature and extent of other interest should also be given.

A tenderer who has carried out contracts with the Department, but not in the Division or Districts concerned in the notice calling for tenders, should state in which Division or District or Divisions or Districts he has held contracts.

A tenderer who has carried out Government contracts with any other department should state the name of such department and the District in which the service was rendered, as well as the other information required.

No tender form will be issued to any person or on behalf of any person whose name appears in the list of defaulting contractors.

10. Tenderers should state in their tenders whether they have at their disposal motor vehicles and petrol allotments sufficient to carry out the contract; if not, what permits they will require for (a) vehicles, and (b) petrol, if the contract is awarded to them.

11. No tenderer will be permitted to work in more than two areas. The selection of such areas will be at the discretion of the Conservator of Forests, whose decision will be final and binding on the successful tenderer.

12. No tender will be considered unless the conditions laid down have been complied with.

The Government reserves to itself the right without question to reject any or all offers and to accept any portion of an offer. No offers will be entertained from persons whose names appear on the list of defaulting contractors.

13. The successful tenderer for each area shall within such time as may be fixed by the Conservator of Forests of being informed in writing that his tender has been accepted enter into the necessary contract supplying at his own cost a stamp of the required value to be affixed to the contract and depositing as security $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. of the value of the contract. Should he fail to comply with these requirements his tender form deposit may be forfeited to the Crown; he may render himself liable to be included in the list of defaulting contractors precluded from having any concern in a Government contract in future, and to make good any resultant loss; further the service may be offered to another tenderer in which case no claim for any profit that may accrue to Government by such offer will be entertained. Notice of acceptance of the tender will be deemed to have been received by the tenderer if it has been sent by post addressed to, or left, at the address given by the tenderer. All tender form deposits will be returned upon signature of the contracts.

14. The contract shall be entered into by the successful tenderer (hereinafter called the contractor) with the Divisional Forest Officer within whose jurisdiction the area of operation lies, acting for and on behalf of the Government of Ceylon, and the designation of such officer shall mean and include the officer for the time being holding such office and his successors in office for the time being under the Government of Ceylon.

15. The contract may not be assigned or sublet without the authority of the Tender Board. The Tender Board reserves to itself the right to refuse to recognize a power of attorney issued by the contractor to any person authorising him to carry on the contract on the contractor's behalf.

16. The contractor shall not employ any person whose name is on the list of defaulting contractor. The Divisional Forest Officer may, for reasons which appear to him sufficient, give notice in writing of his objection to the employment by the contractor of any person specified in such notice, and no such person shall be employed by the contractor.

17. The successful tenderer will be required to employ only Ceylonese labourers in carrying out the work tendered for. The employment of only Ceylonese labourers in carrying out the work tendered for will be made a condition of the contract and the failure on the part of the successful tenderer to fulfil this condition will be treated as a breach of the terms of the contract and will render the contract liable to cancellation. Provided, however, that in exceptional circumstances the Head of the Department with whom the contract is entered into may permit the contractor to employ any non-Ceylonese labourers previously approved by him in writing with the concurrence of the Treasury. The employment of non-Ceylonese labourers without such approval in writing and concurrence will be deemed a breach of contract.

The term "Ceylonese" shall mean and include all persons born in Ceylon and no others.

18. Special rules for felling, conversion and removal of material which are to be observed by the contractor are more fully outlined in the Special Conditions given below. Nothing in these Special Conditions will exempt the contractor from liability under the Forest Ordinance (Cap. 311), should be responsible for the commission of a Forest Offence.

Any contractor who personally or through the actions of his agents or workmen becomes responsible for any offence against the provisions of the Forest Ordinance (Cap. 311), or for the contravention of any of the conditions of this contract on more than one occasion during the currency of his contract will be liable to have his name included in the list of persons who are debarred from holding Government contracts.

19. The contractor shall indemnify the Crown against any claim by or in respect of any employee of the contractor under the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance (Cap. 117).
20. The payments to which the contractor may render himself liable under the contract may be deducted by the Divisional Forest Officer concerned from all moneys then due or that may become due to the contractor under this or any other contract he may hold under Government and/or from the security deposited by the contractor and hypothecated to the Crown or be recovered from him by action at law.
21. The Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of ejecting the contractor's employees and of rescinding the contract if the above conditions are not adhered to.
22. In case of any disagreement arising between parties to the contract except where the right of final decision is reserved to the Conservator of Forests, it shall be referred to the Tender Board whose decision in every such case shall be final and binding on the parties to the contract.
23. The contract shall be current for a period of one year from the date it is signed. Extension of time will not be granted under any circumstances whatsoever.
24. All wayside depots should be accessible to lorries and carts and should be established by contractors at their own expense and as directed by the Divisional Forest Officer.
25. No lorry over 1½ tons can be used on a road not specifically included in the P. W. D. road schedule.
26. For any further information, application should be made to the officer issuing tender forms.

Special Conditions.

1. (a) The minimum quantity to be supplied from each area is (i) 500 B. G. Sleepers, (ii) 200 N. G. Sleepers, (iii) 3,000 cu. ft. logs, and (iv) 2,500 cu. ft. sawn timber.
- (b) Sufficient trees will be made available for the conversion of the specified quantities of sleepers, logs and sawn timber from each area. Only trees marked by the Forest Department for felling shall be felled. Control of all such fellings and the Compartments in which such fellings shall take place will be at the discretion of the Divisional Forest Officer and he may issue directions from time to time as regards fellings.
- (c) Climbers on trees to be felled interfering with other growth should be cut according to directions of a Forest Officer prior to the felling of such trees.
- (d) Extraction paths shall be opened by the contractor as directed by the Forest Officer.
- (e) The contractors should satisfy themselves before tendering by inspecting the area personally, the quantity the area would yield, as representations made later regarding insufficiency of trees, &c., will not be considered.
2. Only trees marked by a forest officer may be felled for conversion. Should the contractor or any of his agents or workmen be responsible for the felling or damaging of any trees not so marked, the contractor shall be liable to pay a fine not exceeding double royalty for each trees so felled or damaged.
- If the contractor persists in such unauthorised fellings and/or does unnecessary damage to regeneration and the Forest crop he shall be liable to have his agreement terminated.
3. The supply shall be in the proportion specified against each area in the Schedule to the Agreement and each delivery shall be regarded as complete for purposes of making payment only when the delivery consists of the various categories of supplies—logs, sleepers, sawn timber—strictly in the proportions laid down. Payment will be withheld for any particular delivery not conforming to this conditions.
- Payment will be made only on accepted quantities and measurements. No payment will be made for rejections but the contractor will be given the option of purchasing rejected material at full royalty rates. Should he not choose to exercise this option such material will be sold from time to time by public auction.
4. It may be possible to supply more than the quantities shown against each area in the schedule to the Agreement but no such excess will be paid for until delivery of such excess supplies too is effected in the same proportions laid down for the original quantities in the said Schedule.
5. At any time during the currency of the contract the Conservator of Forests shall have the power to vary the proportions laid down, and may in his discretion call upon the contractor to concentrate on any particular category of supply or even to cease conversion of any other category of supply and the contractor shall carry out the work accordingly.
6. Conversion of logs, sleepers and sawn timber and firewood may take place at the site where tree are felled or at a wayside depot chosen by the contractor with the approval of the Divisional Forest Officer. Converted material or logs for conversion shall not be removed from the felling site to the wayside depot until they are stamped by a Forest Officer with such distinctive hammer work as are approved for the area.
- The removal of material from the forest to the delivery point shall be covered by removal permits or cart-notes issued by the Range Forest Officer in charge of the Forest. The contractor shall be responsible for the safety of the material whether at felling site, or in transit or at delivery point and the contractor shall make good the value of any timber lost or damaged.
7. The contractor shall effect the first delivery not later than three months from the date of his signing the Agreement. In the case of delay the Conservator of Forests shall be entitled to recover from the contractor as liquidated damages a sum of Rs. 50 for every month or part of a month of such delay, until the first delivery is made. Subsequent deliveries should be at intervals of not longer duration than one month and in the case of default the Conservator of Forests shall be entitled to recover from the contractor as liquidated damages a sum of Rs. 100 for each month's delay.
8. The concession of advance payment will be granted to contractors who make regular supplies, keep a steady average and maintain a high standard of production. Should any advance payment represent on final acceptance of material an overpayment such overpayment shall be recovered from sums that subsequently become due to the contractor. The concession will be withdrawn from contractors who fall behind supplies. The grant and withdrawal of the concession will be at the discretion of the Conservator of Forests.
9. The contractor shall at his own cost and charges furnish labour, transport, implements, tools, and any material whatsoever required for carrying on the work under the contract. He shall also supply labour, tools, &c., for enumerating trees, demarcating boundaries and for any other work connected with the contract deemed necessary by the Divisional Forest Officer.
10. If the contractor shall fail to make fair and reasonable progress towards completing the work within the time herein-before specified, it shall be lawful for the Divisional Forest Officer (if it shall appear to him expedient to do so), to take the work into his own hands, after giving one week's notice in writing to the contractor that the said work will be completed by the Divisional Forest Officer and thereupon to employ sufficient workmen, overseers and materials to furnish and complete the same and the contractor shall be liable to pay and make good such sum or sums of money, if any, as may be spent by the Divisional Forest Officer in the completion as aforesaid of the said work over and above what may have been payable to the contractor if he had completed the work within the time specified.
- If however, output before expiry date of contract is double the minimum quantity stipulated in the agreement, contractors will have the option of continuing the adjoining area at the lowest tendered rates for next year's areas. They must however put in a tender themselves to indicate they wish to continue working.
11. The contractor shall not in any manner, do, cause, or procure to be done any act, matter, or thing whatsoever to delay or impede the completion of the said work by the Divisional Forest Officer, under preceding condition (10) or to obstruct the person or persons so employed by the Divisional Forest Officer or to prevent them from using the plant, implement, tools, wire-shoots, and other materials which shall have been or shall be provided for the execution of the said work; and shall not in any way molest, or cause to be molested, the Divisional Forest Officer or any person or persons employed by him.
12. The contractor or his agent or agents, whose names shall be given to the Divisional Forest Officer and the Range Forest Officer in charge of the work, in writing at the commencement of work under the contract and who shall hold a written authority from the contractor shall at all times and without fail be at the working centres to supervise and control workmen and to take orders from inspecting Forest Officers. Should this condition not be complied with the inspecting officer shall have the power to eject such workmen. Further the Divisional Forest Officer shall have the power to reject without question any of the contractor's agents or employees. The contractor will be at liberty to change his agents provided the changes are duly communicated to the Divisional Forest Officer and the Range Forest Officer in writing and provided that each new agent holds a written authority from the contractor to act on his behalf.
13. Damages not exceeding Rs. 100 for any breach of the conditions or for any delinquencies on the part of the contractor in carrying out this contract may be recovered from the contractor with the approval of the Conservator of Forests whose decision shall be final.

14. The supplies of the logs, sleepers and sawn timber should be strictly according to specifications shown in conditions 15-25 below.

15. Logs shall be converted from Satin, Palu, Milla, Ranai, Hulanhik, Halmilla, M1, Kumbuk, Suriyamara, Dawn and also from such other species as may be acceptable from time to time as required by the Divisional Forest Officer. The absolute minimum dimensions of the logs should be 3 ft. mid-girth under bark and 9 ft. in length. It should be noted that these are only minimum dimensions and that all logs should be as long as possible and of as large girths as available.

Logs of minimum dimensions should not however exceed 10 per cent. of the total supplies.

All logs should be trimmed and barked. Logs of Satin should be carefully barked as soon as they are felled. Logs of other species should be barked up to width of 8 in. at the centre. Logs should be straight and sound and should be free from knots and all forms of decay and other defects. Logs that do not conform to the above specifications will be rejected.

16. Sleepers shall be converted only from trees of Satinwood, Palu, Milla, Ranai and Na.

17. Sleepers shall conform to the Railway Department's specification which is reproduced below—

(a) The broad gauge sleepers are for the 5 ft. 6 in. gauge lines and are to be 9 ft. long, 10 in. wide and 5 in. deep, subject to a variation in length of 1 in. The narrow gauge sleepers are for the 2 ft. 6 in. gauge lines and are to be 5 ft. long, 9 in. wide and 4½ in. deep subject to a similar variation in length.

(b) All sleepers shall be cut from well matured trees of the true species of timber. Sleepers must be sawn, and shall be of good sound timber free from heartshake, sapwood (except as provided in (c) dry rot and knot holes and shall be cut square out of winding and straight.

(c) Allowance may be made for small surface sunshakes, endshakes up to 6 in. a few pinholes, but not in groups sound and firm knots up to 2 in. in diameter, sap or wane must not exceed 2 in. on either face and not come under the rail seat.

(d) The sleepers shall not be cut on full quarter and shall be cut with an allowance of ¼ in. in width and ⅜ in. in thickness to allow for shrinkage and no further allowance on account of size, except as provided above for length, shall be made.

18. Sleepers that do not conform to the specifications will be rejected but where the contractor is agreeable the Railway Department will accept as 2nd grade those sleepers that just fail to come up to standard. Payment for 2nd grade sleepers will be at ½ the accepted rates. Rejected B. G. sleepers other than those accepted as 2nd grade sleepers should be converted into N.G. sleepers and offered for inspection if in the opinion of the Railway Department such rejections are suitable for conversion into N.G. All other rejected sleepers suitable for conversion into scantlings should be so converted and delivered to the Forest Department.

19. Sleepers shall be delivered stacked at an agreed point on the Railway lineside or station yard in batches of not less than 100 and as sufficient quantities become available for handing over, the Forest Department will advise the Railway Department to this effect. Each batch of sleepers shall contain a minimum of 25 per cent. N.G. sleepers until the stipulated number of N.G. sleepers has been supplied. A Forest Department representative will pass sleepers for species at the same time that the Railway Department inspecting officer passes them for specification and payment.

20. Sawn Timber shall be converted from trees of species approved for sleepers and log supplies.

21. Scantlings and boards shall be as long as possible but not less than 10 ft. Boards should not be less than 6" in width.

22. The supply shall be subject to the grading rules below—

(i.) Material shall be flat sawn with sides parallel.

(ii.) Payment will be made on volume in cubic feet calculated by multiplying the length by the cross section or on length in cubits for scantlings or area in square feet for boards as the case may be, subject to the following limitations:—

(a) Length will be taken to the nearest and lower half foot, e.g., 10 ft. 4 in., being taken as 10 feet.

(b) In width and thickness a tolerance of ⅛" scant and ¼" full will be accepted. For example, the extreme acceptable limits for a scantling 4" by 4" are 3⅞" by 3⅞" and 4¼" by 4¼" and any of the possible variations between these limits will be acceptable. Measurements for payment in each case will be 4" by 4".

(iii.) Timber showing groups of pinhole borer attack, whether active or old, which in the opinion of the Inspecting Officer will reduce the strength of the timber by 5 per cent. or more will be rejected.

(iv.) All the timber showing signs of active "Powder Post" beetle attack will be rejected.

(v.) Material showing obvious fungal attack, excepting casual blue stain or other superficial discoloration, will be rejected. Severe blue stain will count as a defect under rule (viii.) below.

(vi.) A maximum total length of all end splits of 1/12th of the total length of the board or scantling will be allowed.

(vii.) Not more than 1" of sap either on one side or in total on both sides in boards up to 8" and not more than 1½" boards exceeding 8" in width will be rejected. This is applicable to all species except certain selected dry zone hardwoods. A list of which is available for inspection at any of the Divisional Forest Offices or at the office of the Conservator of Forests.

(viii.) Knots.—No piece of timber may contain more than 3 defects in the form of knots.

These are graded as follows:—

1 knot ⅝" to 1¼" diameter	=	1 defect
1 knot 1¼" to 2¼" "	=	2 defects
1 knot 2¼" to 3½" "	=	3 defects
2 knots under ⅝" "	=	1 defect
3 knots under ⅝" "	=	2 defects

This applies for tight knots only. If decayed or with signs of decay around them the defects are doubled.

(ix.) Wane.—With otherwise clear specimens a limited amount is permissible but if combined with other defects the presence of wane is a serious defect as the combination results in an appreciable reduction in strength and timber showing such defect will be rejected.

23. The supply shall be in such quantities and in such sizes as may be laid down from time to time by the Divisional Forest Officer concerned.

Each delivery shall be strictly in the proportions so stipulated and if this condition is not satisfied payments for supplies delivered shall be liable to be withheld with forfeiture of security.

24. Sawn timber must be properly stacked at all times whether in the forest, wayside depot or railway yard. The necessary strickers (2" by ½" reapers) shall be supplied by the contractor. All stacking shall be as directed by the Divisional Forest Officer or an officer duly authorised by him.

25. Firewood.—(a) Only trees which are not of accepted timber species should be felled for firewood but trees which emit a milky exudation such as *Ficus* species, Kaduru, Lunumidella, Rukkattana, Kapu, Kottan, Erabadu, Dadap, Etdemata, Kekuna, Amba, Gedumba, Walkaduru, Imbul, Del and Pulun shall not be felled for conversion of firewood.

(b) Firewood shall be cut and split into billets 3 ft. in length and not less than 2 in. or more than 9 in. in diameter. Firewood shall be stacked leaving sufficient space between the stacks for inspecting officers to walk round each stack. Stacks should be either 3 ft. 4½ ft. or 6 ft. in height.

(c) The contractor will be liable to pay a sum of Rs. 25 as liquidated damages to the Conservator of Forests should a check stack in re-stacking show a decrease of over 10 per cent.

(d) Provided his work is satisfactory the successful tenderer will at the sole discretion of the Conservator of Forests be granted permission to retail firewood at consuming centres at prices to be approved by the Conservator of Forests.

26. All notices to be served on the contractor shall be deemed to have been served if given to him or his agent personally or left at the address given in the tender.

27. Although tenders have been called for the supply of firewood from all areas appearing in the schedule below, the Conservator of Forests shall have the power to recommend to the Tender Board for consideration only such tenders wherein the rates quoted are economic and are in respect of areas where there is a demand for firewood.
