TRADE DISPUTE—MESSRS. MILLERS LIMITED, COLOMBO, AND MESSRS. CARGILLS (CEYLON) LIMITED, COLOMBO.

MESSRS. Millers Ltd., Colombo, and Messrs. Cargills (Ceylon) Ltd., Colombo, jointly presented to me a petition dated March 31, 1947, under section 6 (i.) of the Essential Services (Avoidance of Strikes and Lockouts) Order, 1942, with regard to a trade dispute that had arisen between the said Companies and the Ceylon General Workers' Union, Shorts road, Colombo. The petition was referred to a Special Tribunal appointed by His Excellency the Governor under the proviso to section 5 of the said Order for adjudication.

The following findings and award dated May 26, 1947, made by the Special Tribunal are published for general information in terms of section 8 (4) of the above-mentioned Order.

Findings and Award.

The petitioners have presented a petition for the settlement of a trade dispute which has arisen between them and their employees in regard to certain demands made by the employees inter alia regarding their minimum basic salaries and the grant of annual increments.

Demand I. is in the following terms: -" This Union demands that no workers be dismissed without consulting the Union And in the event of the agreed discontinuance, workers should be paid a gratuity at the rate of one month's wages per year of service.

With regard to the first part of the demand, it is not practicable to fetter the freedom of action of an employer by laying down an inflexible rule that in no case should an employee down an innexible rule that in no case should an employee be dismissed without prior consultation with the Union of which he is a member. Wherever possible, it is desirable that a report should be made to the responsible official of the Union in regard to any complaint against a workman which can be remedied in consultation and with the advice of that official. Where such prior consultation is not feasible, the employer no doubt has the right to terminate for good cause the services of his employee upon the usual terms as to notice or otherwise. If at the stage when the employer after a full investigation of the complaints made against the workman, has made a decision to terminate the services of a workman, the Union brings evidence or urges reasons to doubt the justification for the dismissal, any representations on those lines must be received and considered, if necessary, in consultation with the Union. The Chairman, General Importers and Distributors Association, has by his letter dated February 3, 1947, (P. 9)* agreed to concede the demand to the extent indicated above. Save as indicated above the demand of the Union in the form in which it is made cannot be granted.

With regard to the second part of the demand, viz., the workers should be paid a gratuity of one month's wages per year of service, in the event of agreed discontinuance, it is difficult to postulate that a gratuity should be paid except in cases of retirement. In the case of retirement after fifteen years of continuous service a workman, no doubt, is entitled to considerate treatment. It is not possible for this Tribunal to lay down a specific scheme for the payment of gratuities. I find that there is now a Provident Fund Scheme in operation for the benefit of all employees in these two Companies. The practice has obtained in the past whereby the employer makes an ex gratia payment by way of gratuity such sum as is decided upon by the employer to a workman who retires after 15 years of service. I have no doubt that the Companies will continue to make such ex gratia payments in the future also.

Demand II.—This demand relates to the following minimum basic wages :-

With regard to the demand that a higher salary should be paid to Wharf and despatch workers at Rs. 60 a month this identical demand was dealt with by an award of a Special Tribunal on April 12, 1946, which held that the type of work done by them was in no way more difficult than that of the workman in other departments.

Likewise, with regard to the carpenters, a similar demand was made and was also not granted. These workmen are engaged ordinarily in packing goods in deal-wood boxes, which work is not comparable to the work of a skilled carpenter. I have therefore decided to fix one uniform scale of salary for all workmen employed by the two Companies. A special Tribunal which dealt with the demand that a monthly salary of Rs. 30 be fixed for all ordinary workers who were then in receipt of a minimum basic wage of Rs. 18 72 fixed their

monthly salary at Rs. 20 by agreement between the parties.

Later an award of a Special Tribunal dated April 12, 1946, fixed the minimum basic wage at Rs. 26. This was fixed after agreements had been arrived at between the President of the Ceylon Mercantile Union and Messrs. Cargills (Ceylon) Ltd., with regard to the grading of the various employees and other conditions relating to their employment. Since that award was made the wages and salaries of daily-paid employees employed by Government has been increased. The basic minimum wage for an unskilled worker in any employment is now fixed at Re. 1.24 per diem. Reckoned at this rate for 26 working days the minimum salary now paid by these two companies is lower than what an unskilled daily-paid worker is capable of earning. In fixing a monthly salary for a workman of this class, his potential capacity to earn an income during the month, if he attends regularly, and not his average carnings resulting from irregular attendance should be the measure. At the same time salaried employment on a monthly basis carries with it certain privileges and greater advantages than a daily-paid worker has. In all the circumstances my award is that the minimum basic wage payable to all employees in these two Companies be fixed at Rs. 30 a month. I find from the document P 12* furnished by Messrs. Cargills Ltd., and another document dated May 6, 1947, furnished by Messrs. Millers Ltd., that a certain number of employees in these two Companies received salaries above Ps. 30 while others received salaries above Ps. 30 below Rs. 30 while others received salaries above Rs. 30. Those in receipt of these higher salaries will continue to receive those salaries while all others will begin to receive as from June 1, 1947, monthly salaries at the rate of Rs. 30 a month. It transpired during the inquiry that van porters are now paid from the 1st of March Rs. 45 a month in terms of certain decisions of the Wages Board relating to Motor Workers and they will continue to be so paid.

Demand III.—This demand relates to fixed annual increments of Rs. 2 a year. It has transpired before me that these Companies are willing to award annual increments to all their workers as a rule and that only workmen who are mefficient, slack or irregular in attendance will lose their increment.

The document P 12* shows that an annual increment has been awarded this year to a large majority of the workmen. My award therefore is that:

- (1) The case of each workman should be reviewed during a fixed period each year with a view to a decision being made with regard to the grant or refusal of an increment to him.
- (2) Any workman to whom an increment is not granted should be informed in writing the reasons for such
- (3) It is desirable to have a fixed amount as the annual increment payable to each workman. It is difficult to fix different rates of annual increment for the different classes of workmen employed in these Companies. The annual increment is therefore fixed by me at Re. 1.50 per year.

Demand IV. makes the demand that the wage increases be given retrospective effect from December 1, 1946. I am unable to accede to this demand and make order that this award do take effect from June 1, 1947.

My award in respect of the four demands is as set out above. The workmen will continue to receive payment of the temporary allowance at Government rates as at present.
