LOCAL GOVERNMENT NOTICES.

Local Government Clerical Service Examination.

Date of Examination.—

A competitive examination for male candidates wishing to enter the clerical grade of the Local Government Service will be held in Colombo, Kandy, Galle and Jaffna on March 29, 1947. The examination will be conducted by the Director of Education.

2. (i) *Salary.*—Successful candidates will be appointed as vacancies occur to the lowest clerical grade of the Local Government Service to serve Local Authorities (other than Village Committees) on the salary of Rs. 840 per annum rising by annual increments of Rs. 72 to Rs. 2,424 per annum. In this scale efficiency bars operate before Rs. 1,488 and Rs. 2,064 per annum. Rent allowance will be payable.

(ii) *Conditions of Service.*—(a) The grant of leave and other conditions will be governed by the by-laws and regulations of the local authority subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, and any regulations framed thereunder.

(b) Successful candidates will be appointed on two years' probation. Those appointed to a Local Authority (other than a Municipal Council) will be liable to transfer within an area specified in the Second Schedule to the above Ordinance, and may be posted to any station within the specified area in Ceylon. They will be required to pass a test in typewriting within one year of the date of appointment and no increment of salary will be given until the test is passed. They will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Transitional Provisions) Ordinance, No. 5 of 1946, any further amendments of Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, and any regulations made thereunder.

(c) Successful candidates with previous continuous service in the Local Government Service or under the Ceylon Government will be allowed incremental credit for such service.

3. The names of successful candidates will be published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette*, and they will be given appointments as suitable vacancies occur.

4. Eligibility.—

- (i.) Candidates must be of good character.
- (ii.) Candidates must be Ceylonese.*
- (iii.) Candidates should have previously passed at least—

- (a) The Cambridge Senior or the London Matriculation, or the Ceylon Senior School Certificate (English) Examination; or
- (b) The Final Examination for the Commercial Certificate of the Ceylon Technical College; or
- (c) One of the following Junior Examinations:—

The Cambridge Junior, the Junior School Certificate (English) Examination of the Education Department, Ceylon, or the Junior School Certificate (English) Examination held by a school approved by the Education Department for the Senior School Certificate (English) Examination.

* For the purpose of this examination a Ceylonese is—

- (a) a British subject who is born in Ceylon, one of whose parents was born in Ceylon; or
- (b) a British subject who is a descendant of a person falling within category (a); or
- (c) a British subject deemed by the Ceylon Government, in view of special circumstances, to be a Ceylonese.

together with either (i.) the Higher Commercial Certificate Examination (either section) of the London Chamber of Commerce or (ii.) the Commercial Certificate Examination (either section) of the London Chamber of Commerce.

- (iv.) Candidates must be within the age limits laid down in paragraph 6 (iv.) except that Service candidates may deduct the period of their service in the last war from their age, if necessary.
- (v.) Candidates should have been resident for at least three years immediately prior to January 1, 1947, within an area specified in the Second Schedule to the Local Government Service Ordinance.

5. Candidates serving a Local Authority will be permitted to sit for the examination irrespective of age provided they possess the educational qualifications prescribed in paragraph 4 (iii.) (a) (b) or (c) above.

6. Applications.—

- (i.) Applications for admission to the examination must be addressed to the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, P. O. Box 530, Colombo, on forms which may be obtained from the office of the Local Government Service Commission, 29 1/5, Gaffoor Building (First Floor), Colombo. Applications must be sent by registered post to reach the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, not later than 2 p.m. on February 10, 1947. Any applications received after that hour will be rejected.
- (ii.) Candidates who are already employed in Government Departments or under Local Authorities, whether in a permanent or temporary capacity, must forward their applications through the Heads of the Departments or the Chairman of the Local Authorities in which they are serving. If any candidate fails to do so, he will be regarded as disqualified.
- (iii.) A crossed money order or postal order to the value of Rs. 10 in favour of the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, must accompany each application.
- (iv.) A certificate of the registration of the candidate's birth showing him to have been born not earlier than January 1, 1924, and not later than January 1, 1931, must be attached to the form of application.

Note.—(a) Certificates of birth issued for the purpose of the Code for Assisted Schools will not be accepted for this examination.

(b) Affidavits will not be accepted as substitutes for birth certificates.

(c) A certified copy of a birth registration entry effected more than one year after the date of the birth, under section 18 (1) (b) of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance (Cap. 94), will be accepted only after consideration of the evidence by which the date of birth was established. Where the name appearing in the birth certificate differs from the name which the candidate ordinarily uses, satisfactory evidence will have to be adduced that the birth certificate is that of the candidate and not that of any other person. Where the candidate is under 21 years of age or is more than 21 years of age and has a parent living, application should be made to the Registrar-Generals' or to the Provincial Registrar's or Assistant Provincial Registrar's Office in the district in which the birth

took place under section 19 of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance for the amendment of the entry in page 2 of the birth registration entry, and in other cases application should be made to the District Court under section 20 for rectification of the entry in page 2.

(v.) A certificate of good character signed by a responsible person to the satisfaction of the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, must also be attached to the form of application. If the candidate has been educated at a Government or Assisted School, the certificate of character must be from the Principal of the last Government or Assisted School which he has attended; otherwise it may be from the candidate's teacher or school-master by preference or a member of the Public Service, a Justice of the Peace, Minister of Religion, Advocate, Proctor or Notary or generally speaking some person whose name is known and to whom reference can be readily made.

(vi.) The Director of Education will issue admission forms to those candidates whose applications are accepted. Candidates presenting themselves for examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination their forms of admission. A candidate not producing such form will be refused admittance to the examination.

Candidates must sit for the examination at the Examination Hall assigned to them. A candidate presenting himself at an Examination Hall other than the one assigned to him will be refused admission to the examination.

A copy of the Time Table and the Rules for the guidance of candidates for the examination will be forwarded together with the admission form. These should be read carefully by candidates. Every candidate presenting himself for the examination must give up his admission form to the Super-
vising Examiner on the day of the examination.

If a candidate does not receive his admission form at least seven days before the day of the examination, he should communicate without delay with the Director of Education (Branch E), Education Department, informing him that he has not received the admission form and giving the following information :—

7. Should any of the particulars furnished by candidates be found to be false within their knowledge, they will, if appointed, be liable to be dismissed. The wilful suppression of any material fact will be similarly penalised.

Withdrawals and Refunds—

8. (a) If a candidate is rejected owing to his not satisfying the conditions for admission to the examination a refund will be made of $\frac{3}{5}$ ths the value of the examination fee of Rs. 10.

(b) If a candidate, who has been admitted to the examination gives notice of his withdrawal to the Director of Education at least 14 days before the date of the examination, a refund will be made of half the value of the examination fee. In case the form of admission to the examination has reached the candidate it should be returned through the Director of Education (Branch E) to the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, for a refund.

(c) A candidate, who has been admitted to the examination and wishes to withdraw on account of illness, should forward notice of his withdrawal together with his admission form to the Director of Education (Branch E), by registered post at least one day before the examination. A refund of the full examination fee will then be made, provided his notice of withdrawal is accompanied by a certificate from a qualified medical practitioner to the effect that he is unfit to sit for the examination.

(d) In no other case will a refund be granted.

Leave to Officers to attend Examination—

9. Heads of Departments and Chairmen of Local Authorities are kindly requested to grant to officers of their Departments and of Local Bodies, whose applications have been approved by the Director of Education, leave to present themselves at the examination.

Sinhalese must be taken by Sinhalese candidates and Tamil by Tamil candidates. Candidates who are neither Sinhalese nor Tamil will be given the option of taking Sinhalese or Tamil or Arabic or a Special Paper in English, but candidates of mixed parentage must offer the language of one of their parents within the group English (Special), Sinhalese, Tamil or Arabic.

(4) *Viva Voce Test*—Candidates are required to produce at the *Viva Voce* test the original certificates granted to them in respect of the examinations they have passed which qualify them for admission to the Local Government Service Clerical Examination .. 100

11. The examination is held in two parts. The written examination is first held and on the results of it candidates are selected competitively to attend the *Viva Voce*. The number to be called at the *Viva Voce* Examination will be fixed by the Local Government Service Commission in consultation with the Director of Education. In all written papers marks will be deducted for bad handwriting and mistakes in spelling. Candidates, whose writing is illegible, are liable to be disqualified. The *Viva Voce* examination will be held in Colombo.

Medical Examination—

12. The successful candidates will be required to pass a medical examination as to their physical fitness for service in any part of the Island.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE.

Post of Sanitary Sub-Inspector, Public Health Department, Municipal Council, Colombo.

APPLICATIONS are invited by the Local Government Service Commission for the above post.

2.
