Rabies—Badulla.

WHEREAS there is danger of rabies within the Urban Council area of Badulla, it is hereby notified under section 11, of the Rabies Ordinance (Chapter 33) that any dog found in any public place or road or any place other than a private building, compound or garden and not tied up or led, shall be liable to be destroyed forthwith.

This proclamation shall take effect from January 1, 1947, up to June 30, 1947.
