## Danger of Rabies, Ambalangoda.

IN terms of section 11 of the Rabies Ordinance (Chapter 333), notice is hereby given that there is danger of Rabies within the administrative limits of the Ambalangoda Urban Council.

Any dog found in any place or road or any place other than a private building, compound or garden within the said limits and not tied up or led, shall be liable to be destroyed forthwith by any person authorized by me in writing.

**By-laws.**

1. A fee determined in accordance with the rates specified in the Schedule hereto shall be payable in respect of the examination and consideration of plans submitted under the provisions of the Housing and Town Improvement Ordinance (Chapter 199) for new buildings or for alterations to existing buildings.

2. (1) The amount of the fee payable under by-law 1 shall be paid by the person making the application for approval or consent within seven days from the date of receipt of a demand from the Municipal Commissioner.

(2) Every person who fails to pay such fee within the period prescribed in the preceding paragraph of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence and shall on conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding one hundred rupees.

3. Notwithstanding anything in section 9 of the Housing and Town Improvement Ordinance, no plan shall be examined and considered until the fee referred to in by-law 1 is paid.
