#### THE HOUSING AND TOWN IMPROVEMENT ORDINANCE.

THE following resolution passed by the State Council at a meeting held on May 15, 1947, is published for general information:—

This Council resolves under the provisions of section 3 (b) of the Housing and Town Improvement Ordinance (Chapter 199), that from the first day of June 1947, the aforesaid Ordinance shall be in force within each of the areas described in the Schedule hereto.

#### Schedule.

1. All that area of land situated in Nugawela village in Pannil Pattuwa of Atakalan Korale in the Ratnapura District forming part of the Pannil Pattu Village area, and bounded as follows:—

North by a line drawn from the centre of the confluence of Wey Ganga and Panawenna Ela eastwards along the centre of Wey Ganga as far as a point east of the north-eastern corner of lot Y3 in Final Village Plan 4.

East by a line drawn from the last-mentioned point southwards along the centre of Wey Ganga and Atakalan Ela as far as a point in line with the northern boundary of lot 14 in Final Village Plan 4.

South by a line drawn from the last-mentioned point southwards along the centre of Atakalan Ela as far as a point in line with the northern boundary of Walapotukumbura in lot J3 in Final Village Plan 4, thence by a line drawn westwards across the said Ela and along the northern boundary of the said Walapotukumbura and crossing the Pelmadulla-Rakwana P. W. D. road at the 72½ mile post and through lot K3 in Final Village Plan 4 to the right bank of Yodawella.

West by a line drawn from the last-mentioned point northwards along the right bank of Yodawella which runs through lots K3 and J3 and along the eastern boundaries of lots J3 and B3 in Final Village Plan 4 to the north-eastern corner of the said lot B3, thence by a line drawn northwards through lot W3 in Final Village Plan 4 and through Wey Ganga to the starting point of the northern limit of the area.

2. All that area of land situated in Kahawatta village in Uda Pattuwa of Nawadun Korale in the Ratnapura District forming part of the Uda Pattu village area, and bounded as follows:—

North by a line drawn from the centre of Panawenna Ela at the confluence with the Irrigation Channel (Lot 132) in Final Village Plan 183 eastwards across the Panawenna Ela to the right bank of the said Irrigation Channel, thence by a line drawn south-eastwards along the right bank of the said channel till it meets the western boundary of the Pelmadulla-Rakwana road, thence by a line eastwards across the said road to the right bank of the Irrigation Channel (Lot 142), thence by a line drawn north-eastwards and eastwards along the right bank of the said Irrigation Channel (Lot 142) till it meets a point in line with the northern boundary of Lot 145.

East by a line drawn from the last-mentioned point southwards, eastwards and again southwards along the right bank of the Irrigation Channel (Lot 142) in Final Village Plan 183 and of the Irrigation Channel east of Lot 8 and crossing the Gansabhawa road (Lot 20) eastwards along the right bank of the

Irrigation Channel, north of Lots 7, 12, 13, 14, 17 and 19 till it meets the right bank of the Irrigation Channel (Lot 30), thence by a line drawn eastwards along the right bank of the Irrigation Channel (Lots 30 and 33) till it meets the stream (Lot 198), thence by a line drawn southwards along the right bank of the said stream till it meets the centre of the Wey Ganga.

South by a line drawn from the last-mentioned point westwards along the centre of the Wey Ganga till it meets the centre line of Panawenna Ela.

West by a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-westwards along the centre of Panawenna Ela to the starting of the northern limit of the area.

3. All that area of land situated in Wagapanaha Pallesiya Pattuwa of the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Matale North in Matale District, forming part of the Wagapanaha Pallesiya Pattuwa village area, and bounded as follows:—

North by a straight line drawn from culvert No. 2 on the Kurunegala road to the 45th milestone on the Anuradhapura road, thence in a straight line to a landmark 100 yards northeast of the 25th milestone.

East by a straight line from the last-mentioned landmark to the junction of Tammana and Aswedduma elas, thence along the Aswedduma ela to a landmark at the south-west corner of the Aswedduma paddy fields, thence in a straight line to a landmark 16 yards east of the north-east corner of Dambulla Resthouse premises, and thence in a straight line crossing the Gansabhawa road to Eraula to a landmark on the dry stream 100 yards east of the bridge situated 75 yards north of the 44th milestone on the Matale Anuradhapura road.

South by the dry stream passing under the last-mentioned bridge.

West from the landmark on the dry stream 150 yards west of the last-mentioned bridge to a landmark on the south-east corner of Dambulla tank, thence along the southern edge of the tank, thence along the bund, and thence to culvert No. 2 on the Kurunegala road.

4. All that area of land situated in the villages of Kendan-gamuwa Ihalagama (Part) and Yakudegoda Gammandiya (Part) in Palle Pattuwa of the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Kuruwiti Korale in the Ratnapura District, forming part of the Palle Pattu village area, and bounded as follows:—

North by a line drawn from the land mark at the north-western corner of lot 1 in V. P. 691 eastwards and south eastwards along the land marked northern and eastern boundaries of the said lot 1, eastern boundary of lot 2 northern and eastern boundaries of lots 3 and 9 and northern boundary of lot 10 to the land mark on the western boundary of lot 19 (road to Dehiowita) in V. P. 691, thence by a line drawn north-eastwards along the land marked western boundary of the said lot 19 as far as the land mark on the said boundary where the district boundary between Ratnapura and Kegalla Districts crosses it.

East by a line drawn from the last-mentioned point southwards, south-eastwards, north-eastwards and again south-eastwards along the district boundary between Ratnapura and Kegalla Districts (which district boundary runs across lot 19—road to Dehiowita), along eastern boundary of lot 20, across lot 72 (road), along eastern boundary of lot 22, northern and eastern boundaries of lot 23, eastern boundaries of lots 24, 25 and 27 (Colombo-Ratnapura road),

across said lot 27, along eastern boundary of lot 33, across lot 34 (Railway land), along eastern boundaries of lots 39 and 41, across lot 106 (Gansabhawa road) along eastern boundaries of lots 42 and 43, northern boundary of lot 44, across lots 47 (Hospital premises) 48 (Road) and 49 (Hospital premises), along eastern boundaries of lots 54, 55 and 153 northern boundary of lot 155, western and northern boundaries of lot 58, across lot 141 (Path), along northern boundary of lot 59, across lot 34 (Railway land) along northern and eastern boundaries of lot 66, eastern boundaries of lots 67 and 68 and northern boundary of lot 69, (Biso Dola) in V. P. 691 to the north-eastern corner of the said lot 69, thence by a line drawn southwards along the eastern and southern boundaries of the said lot 69, southern boundary of lot 34 (Railway land) and eastern and southern boundaries of lot 65 to the land mark at the southern most corner of the said lot 65 in V. P. 691.

South by a line drawn from the last-mentioned point westwards, northwards and again westwards along the land marked southern boundary of lot 65, eastern and southern boundaries of lot 62, southern boundary of lot 63 (Path) western boundaries of lots 62 and 61 southern boundaries of lots 155, 56, 53, 52, 51 and 50 in V. P. 691 to the centre of the Gansabhawa road (lot 45) leading from Idangoda.

West by a line drawn from the last-mentioned point northwards along the centre of the Gansabhawa road (lot 45 in V. P. 691) leading from Idangoda to the centre of the junction with the Gansabhawa road (lot 106) leading from Kiriella, thence by a line drawn south-westwards along the centre of the latter road (lot 106) to the centre of the junction with the Gansabhawa road (lot 40) thence by a line drawn northwards along the centre of the latter road (lot 40) till it meets the western boundary of lot 34 (Railway land) thence by a line drawn north-westwards and north-eastwards along the western and northern boundaries of the said lot 34, north-eastwards along the western boundary of lot 4 and northern boundary of lot 27 (Colombo-Ratnapura road) and northwards along the western boundary of lot 1 in V. P. 691 to the starting point of the northern limit of the area.

5. All that area of land situated in Matale Pallesiya Pattuwa of the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Matale East in the Matale District, forming part of the Matale Pallesiya pattuwa village area, and bounded as follows:—

North by a straight line running eastwards from the landmark 100 yards west of the culvert on Matale Gammaduwa road which is 195 yards north of the junction of the Matale Gammaduwa road and Matale-Nikoloya road, crossing the said road at the culvert and along the drain forming the northern boundary of Bulugahamullawatta, thence in a straight line through Bulugahamullakumbura (paddy field) to a landmark by the edge of the paddy field in Hompolatennawatta and thence along the edge of the paddy field to where it meets Sodikotuwe-ela.

East along the Sodikotuwe-ela to culvert No. 24/12 on the road to Nichola-oya estate.

South from the last-mentioned culvert by a straight line drawn in a westerly direction through Wanna Ranne estate touching a rock landmark in the northern corner of lot 1 in Preliminary Plan No. 6,862, and through Dehigasipityawatte to a landmark on the northern corner of lot 2 in Preliminary Plan No. 6,862, thence in a south-westerly direction through Deh-welpityawatta to a landmark in the western corner of lot 2 in Preliminary Plan No. 6,862, and thence in a straight line through Spring Hill estate and Polangalagalagahawahena to a landmark by the ela in the north-western corner of lot 11 in Preliminary Plan No. 6,862, thence along the ela passing through Karandagolla and Egodagedera paddy fields to culvert No. 76 on the Matale-Nicholoya estate road, and thence in a north-westerly direction 166 yards to a landmark by the edge of the paddy fields between Udawela and Siriwedagahaweka.

West from the said landmark which is 166 yards north-west of culvert No. 76 on Matale-Nicholoya road in a north-westerly direction to the landmark which is the western extremity of the northern boundary.

6. All that area of land situated in the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Uda Bulatgama in the Kandy District, forming part of the Ambagamuwa korale village area, and bounded as follows:—

North by a line from the landmark on the north-western corner of lot 1 in Town Survey P. Plan No. 10 approximately 33 yards west of the new bridge over the Norwood-Campion road, running through Kotiyagala estate, north-eastwards along the right bank

of the Bridwell-oya to the point where it meets the northern boundary of lot 2 in the same plan, approximately due east of the 7½ milestone on the aforesaid road.

East by a line drawn from the last-mentioned point eastwards and south-eastwards along the northern boundaries of lots 2 and 3 and the eastern boundaries of lots 3 and 6 in Town Survey P. Plan No. 10 and crossing the road to Killarney, to the landmark on its southern boundary, thence north-eastwards along the southern boundaries of the said road to the northern boundary (fence) of the C. M. S. School Premises, thence eastwards and southwards along the northern and eastern boundaries (fence) of the said school premises to the landmark on the north-eastern corner of lot 12 in Town Survey Plan No. 10, thence southwards along the eastern boundary of the said lot 12 to the northern boundary of lot 1 (cooly lines) in P. Plan No. 7,375, thence eastwards, southwards and westwards along the northern, eastern and southern boundaries of the said lot 1 to the eastern boundary of lot 20 in Town Survey P. Plan No. 10, thence south-eastwards along the eastern boundary of the said lot 20 to the northern boundary of lot 21 (burial ground) in the same plan, thence eastwards and southwards along the northern and eastern boundaries of the said lot 21, thence southwards and south-westwards along the eastern and southern boundaries of the estate masons' dwelling house premises (including the cattle shed) to a point on the eastern boundary of the Norwood-Campion road, 173 feet to the south-east of the 7½ milestone, thence in a straight line across the said road to its western boundary, thence south-eastwards along the western boundary of the said road to a point 363 feet from the 7½ milestone.

South by a straight line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-westwards to a distance of 112 feet so that it would touch the south-eastern wall of the Post Office, thence north-westwards for a distance of 305 feet (so as to include the Post Office, estate dispensary, and the new Police Station), to a point 94 feet to the south-west from the western boundary of the Norwood-Campion road, thence south-westwards to a distance of 148 feet thereof (so as to include the D. M. O.'s quarters), thence north-westwards to the P. W. D. boundary stone on the southernmost corner of lot 17 (Government Dispensary) in Town Survey P. Plan No. 10.

West by a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-westwards, northwards and thence north-westwards along the western boundaries of lots 17 and 16, southern and western boundaries of lot 10, western boundary of lot 9 and western boundaries of lots 8 (estate roadway) and 1 in Town Survey P. Plan No. 10 to the starting point of the northern limit of the town.

7. All that area of land situated in the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Uda Bulatgama in the Kandy District, forming part of the Ambagamuwa korale village area, and bounded as follows:—

North—A line drawn from a point 100 yards due north-west of the Sanitary Board limit stone on the Maskeliya-Laxapana main road and opposite the Ambalam on Brownlow estate, north-eastwards and eastwards and running parallel to the Maskeliya-Laxapana and Maskeliya-Hatton main roads up to a point due north of the Sanitary Board limit stone at culvert No. 33/8 on the Maskeliya-Hatton main road.

East—A line drawn from the last-mentioned point due southwards passing the Sanitary Board limit stone at culvert No. 33/8 on the Maskeliya-Hatton main road to a point 100 yards south of the southern edge of the said road.

South—A line drawn from the last-mentioned point. Westwards and running parallel to the above-mentioned roads to a point due south-east of the Sanitary Board limit stone on the Maskeliya-Laxapana main road and opposite the Ambalam on Brownlow estate.

West—A line drawn from the last-mentioned point due north-westwards to the starting point of the northern limit.

THE HOUSING AND TOWN IMPROVEMENT ORDINANCE:

THE following resolution passed by the State Council at a meeting held on May 15, 1947, is published for general information:—

This Council resolves under the provisions of section 3 (b) of the Housing and Town Improvement Ordinance (Chapter

199), that from the first day of July 1947, the aforesaid Ordinance shall be in force within the area defined in the Schedule hereto.

*Schedule.*

All that area of land situated in the villages of Kalpitiya, Sinnakudirippu, Periyakudirippu, Wannumundal, Mandalakuda, Kunjimatotam, Tillaiyadu and Anavasal in Thotakadu in Kalpitiya Udaiyar's Division of Kalpitiya Division in the Puttalam District, forming part of the Kalpitiya village area, and bounded as follows:—

**North:** By a line drawn from a point on the eastern boundary of the lagoon in the Strait of Anavasal where the cart road starts from the ferry to Kalpitiya north-eastwards along the eastern boundary of the said lagoon up to the wire fence in Lorengipulletotam claimed by Lorengipulle, thence by a line drawn south-eastwards along the said wire fence through the said land and through Sammatitotam claimed by M. Saliyu Marikar to the western boundary of Semmankudatotam claimed by M. Tambi-Naina Marikar and others, thence by a line drawn south-westwards and south-eastwards along the western boundary of the said Semmankudatotam till it meets the cart road leading to Kalpitiya, thence by a line drawn eastwards crossing the said cart road and through the said Semmankudatotam to the eastern boundary of Talavaditotam claimed by M. Ibrahim Naina Marikkar.

**East:** By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-eastwards through Talayaditotam claimed by M. Ibrahim Nama Marikkar, Kelavitotam claimed by A. M. Madar Marikkar, across cart road, and through Kunikalam (Crown) till it meets a point on the western boundary of the Kalpitiya lagoon 4 chains north-east of T. P. 37,540, thence by a line drawn southwards along the western boundary of the Kalpitiya lagoon as far as a point 28 chains south of the Wannumundal Trig. Station.

**South:** By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-westwards and north-westwards along the western boundary of the Kalpitiya lagoon to a distance of 48 chains.

**West:** By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-westwards along the western boundary of the Kalpitiya lagoon till it meets the northern boundary of Tattavahiterave, thence by a line drawn north-westwards along the northern boundary of the said land and crossing the Palavi-Kalpitiya P. W. D. road at the 23½ mile-stone to the northern boundary of T. P. 71,563, thence by a line drawn westwards along the northern boundary of the said T. P. 71,563, north-westwards along the eastern boundaries of Meeramohideentotam claimed by Meera Mohideen Sinnaannentotam claimed by U. M. Omarhatta Marikkar, Mundraditotam claimed by M. Sinna Marikkar and another, and of lot 7 in preliminary plan A 528 to the landmark at the north-eastern corner of the said lot 7, thence by a line drawn north-eastwards through Pachchaturaitotam claimed by M. J. Fernando and others to the landmark at the south-eastern corner of lot 1 in preliminary plan A 528, thence by a line drawn north-westwards along the eastern boundary of the said lot 1, across the V. C. road leading from Kandakuli, and along the eastern boundary of Tetavitotam claimed by U. M. Omarhatta Marikkar, and crossing the cart road leading from Kandakuli to its western boundary, thence by a line drawn north-eastwards and north-westwards along the western boundary of the said cart road till it meets the eastern boundary of Marikkaruduvulutotam claimed by K. P. M. Casim Marikkar, thence by a straight line drawn north-westwards along the eastern boundary of the said Marikkaruduvulutotam, through Marikkarvudutotam claimed by K. P. M. Casim Marikkar, Sinnavaputotam claimed by U. M. Omarhatta Marikkar and others, across stream, and through Mariyatotam claimed by A. Ravuther Marikkar to a point on the eastern boundary of the lagoon in the Strait of Anavasal 33 links west of the indi tree and 97 links east of the tilla tree, thence by a line drawn north-eastwards along the eastern boundary of the lagoon to the starting point of the northern limit of the area.
