THE ENTERTAINMENT TAX ORDINANCE, No. 12 of 1946.

THE following resolution, passed by the Tangalla Urban Council under sub-section (1) of section 2 of the Entertainment Tax Ordinance, No. 12 of 1946, has been approved by the Executive Committee of Local Administration and is published in terms of sub-section (2) of that section :-

Resolution.

"This Council under sub-section (1) of section 2 of the Entertainment Tax Ordinance, No. 12 of 1946, hereby imposes and levies, with effect from the first day of July, 1947, a tax at the rates set out hereunder on payments for admission to entertainment (as defined in the Ordinance) held in the area within the administrative limits of the Council.
