THE DEFENCE (CONTROL OF IMPORTS) REGULATIONS.

Notification.

Open General Licence No. 8.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by regulation 5A of the Defence (Control of Imports) Regulations [which in accordance with the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) Order, 1946, has effect by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) Act, 1945, of the Imperial Parliament], I, Herbert Kenneth de Kretser, Acting Controller of Imports, do hereby authorise, until further notice, the importation into Ceylon by any person of such goods of any class or description specified in the Schedule hereto as have been grown, produced or manufactured in any territory or place other than the United Kingdom.

The above Open General Licence is issued subject to the condition that nothing therein shall affect or prejudice, or be deemed or construed to affect or prejudice, the provisions or requirements of any other written law applicable to any goods to which such Open General Licence refers at the time of the importation of any such goods to Ceylon.
