No fresh loan shall be granted until the previous loan is repaid in full,";

(c) in rule 15, in paragraph (1) of that rule, by the addition, at the end thereof, of the following:—

"The first of such instalments shall be paid on the last day of the calendar month immediately following that in which the loan was taken. Any member who does not pay a monthly instalment on the day on which it becomes due shall be deemed to be in default in respect of that instalment,"; and

(d) in rule 17, by the substitution, for the words "half a month", of the following:—

"half a month. Interest shall be paid on the last day of each calendar month. The first payment of interest shall be made on the last day of the calendar month immediately following that in which the loan was taken. Any member who does not pay the monthly interest on the day on which it becomes due shall be deemed to be in default in respect of the interest due on that day."; and

(2) Under the heading "Chapter III—Provident Fund Rules", by the insertion, immediately after rule 9, of the following new rules:—

"9A. It shall be lawful for the Committee of Management at its discretion to grant to any member, who has completed two years' service as an employee of the Association and who needs financial assistance because of any illness or distress, a loan of such amount not less than thirty rupees as that Committee may determine:

Provided however that where a member applying for a loan has not repaid in full any loan previously granted to him under this rule, the amount which may be granted to him as a loan shall not when added to the amount due as principal and interest on the previous loan exceed three-fourths of the aggregate of his contributions to the Fund and the interest on those contributions calculated up to the last day of the financial year immediately preceding the financial year in which the application for the loan is made.

9B (1) Every loan granted under rule 9A shall be repayable in not more than twenty consecutive monthly instalments, each of which shall not be less than two rupees and fifty cents.

(2) The first of the instalments referred to in paragraph (1) shall be paid on the last day of the month immediately following that in which the loan was taken.

(3) Notwithstanding anything in the aforesaid provisions of this rule, no monthly instalment shall be recoverable in the month of December.

9C (1) The interest payable on loans granted under rule 9A shall be calculated at the rate of 1/8 per centum per mensem on the amount due at the end of each month.

(2) If interest on a loan granted under rule 9A is due in respect of only a portion of any month, that portion shall:—

(a) where it exceeds fifteen days, be reckoned as one month, and

(b) where it does not exceed fifteen days, be reckoned as half a month,

for the purpose of calculating such interest.

(3) Interest shall be paid on the last day of each month, and the first payment of interest shall be made on the last day of the month immediately following that in which the loan was taken.

9D. The instalment payable in any month by a member on account of a loan granted to him under rule 9A and the interest due for that month on that loan shall be deducted from his salary for that month before such salary is paid to him.

9E. Where any member dies while he is in the service of the Association, or retires from, or is dismissed by, the Association, the whole of the amount due by him as principal and interest on any loan granted under rule 9A shall be deducted from the amount standing to his credit as his contributions to the Fund and interest thereon."

2. (1) Any telegram addressed to the premises of a telephone subscriber may, notwithstanding that his telephone number is not set out in the address, be communicated over the telephone to that number, unless—

- (a) the addressee has given any other instructions or made any other arrangements with the office of delivery; or
- (b) the sender has requested delivery to the addressee in person by writing in the space provided on the form the paid service indication "Mains Propres" or "M. P." indicating that the telegram should be delivered into the hands of the addressee himself; or
- (c) the telegraph officer is of opinion that the telegram is of such a nature that it should not be communicated to any person other than the addressee, in cases where the addressee is a visitor or guest or a servant or employee of the subscriber or is a resident of any resthouse or hotel or of a hostel, club or boarding school or other similar institution conducted on the premises.

(2) A copy of every telegram which is communicated over the telephone as hereinbefore provided shall be posted to the addressee with the superscription "Transmitted by telephone".

THE CENSUS OF CEYLON, 1946.

The Physically Infirm.

THE Table published below gives some of the results of the Census of Ceylon, March 19, 1946, as recorded on the special Infirmities Schedules. Detailed tables classifying each category of physically infirm persons by sex, age, race, conjugal condition, and literacy, and by urban and rural areas, have been prepared and will be published in due course in the appropriate volume of Tables.

The Blind Population.—The enumeration was of *totally blind* persons, that is, of persons who could not see to read letters or distinguish or recognize images in the special "eye test" card from a specified distance with or without the aid of glasses. The aggregate number of such persons is recorded as 4,602 for the whole Island—2,431 males, and 2,171 females. These figures do not include 212 persons,—115 males and 97 females,—returned as both blind and deaf, and 69 persons—41 males and 28 females—returned as blind and deaf-mute. The number of totally blind persons as reported at the Census of 1921 was 4,005 (2,361 males, and 1,644 females). The proportion per 10,000 persons enumerated at the Census of 1946 was 7 persons as against 9 persons at the Census of 1921, suggesting a decrease in the incidence of blindness in the Island. Batticaloa District reports the highest proportion of blind persons to the general population enumerated (14 persons per 10,000 persons enumerated).

The Deaf-Mute Population.—This includes every person who has been totally deaf from birth and every person who cannot hear nor talk. The total number of such defectives for the Island is 3,123 persons (1,820 males, 1,303 females) in 1946, as against 2,710 persons (1,562 males, 1,148 females) returned as such in 1921. The proportion per 10,000 persons enumerated is 5 as against 6 in 1921, suggesting a notable decrease. Jaffna District has reported the highest proportion of deaf-mute persons to the general population enumerated (8 persons per 10,000 persons enumerated).

The Crippled Population.—Only persons crippled in *both* legs were enumerated in this category. There were 3,259 persons returned as "crippled"—2,043 males and 1,216 females. A comparison with previous censuses is not possible, as the 1946 Census was the first occasion on which a special enumeration of this class of persons was made. The proportion per 10,000 persons of the general population is 5, and the greatest incidence is in Anuradhapura District (8.5 persons per 10,000 persons). "Unspecified" and "Other" figures record imperfect or erroneous schedules.

2. Every tender must be made on the prescribed form which may be obtained at the Colombo Kachcheri and must be accompanied by a Treasury or Kachcheri receipt acknowledging the deposit of a sum of Rs. 100.

3. Every tender must be placed in a sealed envelope clearly marked on the top left-hand corner thus: "Tender for Foreign Liquor Tavern No. _____ Colombo District, 1948/49", and must reach the Government Agent, Western Province, before 10 A.M., on July 30, 1948. Tenders will close on the date and time specified above.

Tenders should be present at the Kachcheri at the time of closing tenders.

4. The successful tenderer shall immediately on being declared to be the purchaser of the privilege, sign the Conditions of Sale and pay to the Government Agent as security deposit a sum equivalent to two months' rent payable for that privilege.

5. If any tenderer, on being declared the purchaser of the privilege declines to sign the conditions of sale or fails to furnish the required security when called upon to do so, the tender deposit made by him will be declared to be forfeited, and the defaulter will render himself liable to have his name entered in the list of defaulters in respect of all Excise Licences. Subject to this exception the deposits of all tenderers will be returned after the Conditions of Sale have been signed by the successful tenderer or bidder and the aforesaid security given by the successful tenderer or bidder.
