THE PILGRIMAGES ORDINANCE.

REGULATIONS approved by the Minister for Home Affairs and Rural Development by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 2 of the Pilgrimages Ordinance (Chapter 133) as modified by the Proclamation under section 88 (1) of the Ceylon (Constitution) Order in Council, 1946, published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,773 of September 24, 1947.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Pilgrimages (Western Province) Regulations 1948.

2. These regulations shall apply to pilgrimages to be made to any of the places specified in the Schedule hereto, and shall in respect of any such place be in force during such period as the Minister may from time to time fix by notification published in the *Gazette*.

3. In these regulations—

“Camp area” in respect of any place specified in the Schedule hereto means the area determined by the Minister and specified in the notification under Regulation 2 by which these regulations are made applicable to that place; and “Government Agent” means the Government Agent of the Western Province and includes the Assistant Government Agents of the Colombo District and the Assistant Government Agent of the Kalutara District.

4. No person shall camp in any part of the camp area which has been set apart for any other purpose by the Government Agent by notice exhibited on the spot.

5. No person shall ease himself within the camp area except at a place provided for the purpose by, or with the approval of, the Government Agent.

6. No person shall deposit any refuse, whether liquid or solid, within the camp area, except in a place or receptacle provided for the purpose by, or with the approval of, the Government Agent.

7. (a) No person shall keep any cattle for any purpose whatsoever in, or in the vicinity of, the camp area except at a place specially appointed as a cattle gala or at a place approved for such use by the Government Agent.

(b) The person in charge of cattle shall cause their droppings to be removed daily from the camp area to the nearest place provided therefor, and he shall at all times keep clean the place occupied by his cattle.

8. No person suffering from any infectious or contagious disease shall enter the camp area, and no person shall bring any person suffering from any such disease into the camp area or aid or abet any such person to enter the camp area.

9. In the event of an epidemic breaking out in the camp area during the festival, it shall be lawful for the Government Agent to direct the pilgrims to leave the camp area and to prescribe the route and the conveyance by which, or the manner in which, the pilgrims shall depart.

10. Every person within the camp area who contracts an infectious or contagious disease, and every person who resides with any other person knowing that such other person has contracted an infectious or contagious disease shall report the case to the Medical Officer in charge of the camp area or to any person authorised by such Medical Officer.

11. When any tank or well within the camp area is set apart for any particular purpose and a notice to that effect is exhibited on the spot, no person shall use the tank or well for any purpose other than that for which it is set apart.

12. No person shall bathe within the camp area except at a place specially provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of, the Government Agent.

13. The Medical Officer in charge of the camp area or any person authorised by such Medical Officer may, if he thinks it necessary, chlorinate any well within the camp area.

14. No person shall keep any bakery, aerated water factory, tea or coffee boutique, eating house or gala, or expose for sale any eatables, within the camp area unless he has obtained a licence in that behalf from the Government Agent. The licence shall be issued free of charge on the recommendation of the Medical Officer in charge of the camp area or any person authorised by such Medical Officer.

15. (1) No person in the camp area shall sell food which has been condemned as unwholesome by the Medical Officer in charge of the camp area or by any person authorised by such Medical Officer.

(2) It shall be lawful for any Police Officer or the Medical Officer in charge of the camp area or any person authorised by such Medical Officer to seize and destroy any food condemned as unwholesome under the provisions of paragraph (1).

16. Every person who exposes any food or drink for sale within the camp area shall—

- (1) keep such food or drink, and all materials used for the preparation thereof in glass cases or other covered containers approved by the Medical Officer in charge of the camp area or any person authorised by such Medical Officer, or wrapped in, or covered with clean paper or cloth so as to protect such food or drink from contamination by flies or dust, and
- (2) keep his premises, furniture and equipment used for the purpose of his trade in a clean and sanitary condition.

17. No person shall without previous sanction of the Government Agent construct any booth, or extend any building within the camp area so as to encroach on any land used or set apart for use as a street or for any other purpose.

18. No person shall sell or expose for sale any commodity of any description at any place within the camp area other than a place approved for the purpose by the Government Agent.

19. No person shall without the previous sanction of the Government Agent discharge fireworks or firearms within the camp area or within a distance of one mile from the boundaries of such area.

20. No person shall slaughter any animals within the camp area except in the place provided for the purpose by, or with the approval of, the Government Agent, and every person slaughtering any animal in such a place shall be responsible for the cleanliness.
