2. Candidates must have passed the Cambridge Senior School Certificate or the Senior School Certificate (English) or London Matriculation or equivalent examination or higher examination, and preference will be given to those who have passed in Mathematics, Physics, Mechanics, and (or) Chemistry.

Satisfactory proof must be furnished—

- (a) That the applicant is a Ceylonese*.
- (b) That he is not less than 17 nor more than 22 years old.

Demobilized Ceylonese members of the armed forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions and Civil Defence Services whether officers or other ranks who joined such Services before August 15, 1945, (excluding those who had left those services of their own accord) and who are more than 22 years of age, will however be eligible provided their age reduced by the period of their mobilized service does not exceed 22 and provided also that they fulfil the other conditions of this notice.

- (c) That he is of good moral character.

3. Candidates should be of sound constitution, possessed of good eye-sight and otherwise physically qualified for the appointment. They will be required to undergo a medical examination, the fee of which will be Rs. 5.

* For this purpose a Ceylonese is—

- (i) A British subject who is born in Ceylon, one of whose parents was born in Ceylon; or
- (ii) A British subject who is a descendant of a person falling within category (i); or
- (iii) A British subject deemed by the Minister, in view of special circumstances, to be a Ceylonese.

† Certificates of birth issued for the purpose of the Education Code will not be accepted.

Affidavits will in no circumstances be accepted as substitutes for birth certificates.

In the case of candidates who submit certificates of registration in the register of past births, the certificates will only be accepted after consideration of the evidence by which the dates of birth were established. If the name appearing in the birth register differs, either by alteration or addition, from the name by which a candidate is known—(a) the parent or guardian, in the case of a candidate under the age of 21 years, should, before obtaining a certificate apply to the Registrar-General or his Assistant for such alteration in the manner set forth in section 19 of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance (Chapter 94), and (b) in the case of a candidate over the age of 21 years, he should produce evidence that the certificate of birth forwarded applies to him.

9. The hours of duty during the training in Government Technical College will be as decided by the Director of the Government Technical College. During the practical training they will work according to the duty hours in force in the Engineering Branch and will also conform to all the Departmental regulations regarding discipline, &c. The grant of leave and other conditions of service will be as laid down by Government from time to time.

10. An Inspector-in-Training whose progress or conduct has been found unsatisfactory at any stage will be liable to be discontinued on the orders of the Postmaster-General, whose decision will be final.

11. Candidates selected for training will be required to furnish an initial security of Rs. 50 and enter into a bond with two sureties in the sum of Rs. 3,000 for the due performance and fulfilment by them of the conditions set out in the Scheme of recruitment and training. 12. Any Inspector-in-Training who is discontinued under Clause 10 above will forfeit the security furnished by him. If he leaves either during training or within five years of completion of the training he shall refund all sums of money paid or incurred by the Post and Telecommunication Department in respect of his training up to the time of leaving and the value of any property lost or damaged due to his neglect or carelessness.

13. Those Inspectors-in-Training who have satisfied the Chief Telecommunication Engineer as to fitness in every respect, and who have obtained the certificates mentioned above will be eligible, in order of merit, for appointment to the Inspectors' grade, Class III., alternately with qualified departmental Overseers, as vacancies occur. The appointment will be on two years probation and the present salary scale for Rs. 1,680—2,520.

Inspectors Class III. is $\frac{\quad}{7 \text{ of } 120}$ Those who reach

the maximum of the scale are eligible to be placed in the next $\frac{2,520-3,480}{8 \text{ of } 120}$ grade, which is the Class II. scale Rs. $\frac{\quad}{8 \text{ of } 120}$, provided

they have passed the efficiency bar and their progress and conduct have been satisfactory. Promotions beyond the grade of Inspector Class II. will depend upon the vacancies in the higher grades, technical qualifications and officer's work and conduct. The salary scales and conditions of service, promotions, &c., are subject to variation.

14. Those who do not satisfy the Chief Telecommunication Engineer that they have reached the standard required in every respect will have no claim for appointment to the Inspectorate. They may, however, be employed as Minor

Supervisors Grade I. (present salary scale Rs. $\frac{1,200-1,992}{11 \text{ of } 72}$ or

Grade II. Rs. $\frac{840-1,560}{10 \text{ of } 72}$ at the discretion of the Chief Tele-

communication Engineer provided they are suitable. The salary scales are subject to variation.

15. On appointment to the permanent establishment, an officer will be required to furnish a declaration of freedom from debt and also undergo a medical examination as regards physical suitability for such appointment. If the officer is found to be in debt or physically unsuitable, the provisional appointment will be cancelled. Officers are required to serve in any part of the Island and will be subject to the Public Service, Financial and other standing regulations of the Government and the Post and Telecommunication Department.

16. The duties of the Inspectors in the Engineering Branch of the Post Office include the maintenance and fitting of all classes of Telephone, Telegraph, Radio, Railway electric safety apparatus. Lines and cables in any part of the Island, with or without assistance according to the nature of the work. They are required to carry their own tools and apparatus when

the work they have to perform is of a kind which can reasonably be done by one man, and generally to conform to all the rules of the Department in force at the time of their appointment or subsequently introduced.
