**EXAMINATION FOR STENOGRAPHERS (LOWER GRADE),
SPECIAL, 1948.**

A competitive examination for male and female candidates wishing to enter the Stenographers' Service will be held in Colombo by the Director of Education on September 11, 1948.

2. (i.) Successful candidates will be appointed to the Lower Grade of the Transferable Stenographers' Service on the salary of Rs. 1,440 per annum rising by annual increments of Rs. 120 to Rs. 3,480 per annum.

(ii.) The posts are pensionable but confirmation after two years' service is dependent on the passing of an Efficiency Bar for which a test is prescribed. There will also be an

Efficiency Bar before Rs. 2,640 per annum, the passing of which is dependent on satisfactory work and conduct and the passing of a test.

(iii.) Successful candidates who may have previous pensionable, non-pensionable or quasi-government service will not be given incremental credit for such service.

3. *Conditions of Service.*—(1.) The grant of leave and other conditions of service will, in the case of a new entrant to the Public Service, be governed by the recommendations in Sessional Paper VIII. of 1934, as modified by the recommendations in Sessional Paper VIII of 1946. Rent allowance will be payable.

(ii.) Successful candidates will be appointed on 2 years' probation. They will be liable to transfer and may be posted to any station in Ceylon.

(iii.) They will be subject to the Public Service, Financial, Administrative and other Standing Regulations of the Government.

4. The names of successful candidates will be published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* and they will be given appointments as suitable vacancies occur.

5. *Eligibility.*

(i.) Candidates must be of good character;

(ii.) Candidates must be Ceylonese*.
Women are eligible as candidates.

(iii.) Candidates should have previously passed at least—

(a) The Cambridge Senior or the London Matriculation or the Ceylon Senior School Certificate (English) Examination; or

(b) The final examination for the Commercial Certificate of the Ceylon Technical College; or

(c) The Cambridge Junior, the Junior School Certificate (English) Examination of the Education Department, Ceylon, or the Junior School Certificate (English) Examination held by a School approved by the Education Department for the Senior School Certificate (English) Examination together with either—

(i.) the Higher Commercial Certificate Examination (either section) of the London Chamber of Commerce, or

(ii.) the Commercial Certificate Examination (either section) of the London Chamber of Commerce, or

(iii.) the Ceylon Chamber of Commerce Examination.

Note.—The original certificates of educational qualifications should be attached to the application form.

(iv.) Candidates who are not already on the permanent establishment of a Government Department must be between the ages of 17 and 30 years inclusive on August 18, 1948.

6. Full-time members of a unit of the Armed Forces, who joined such units before August 15, 1945, and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions and Civil Defence Services who joined such services before August 15, 1945 (excluding those who had left these services of their own accord, will be eligible provided they have passed at least one of the examinations referred to at paragraph 5 (ii) (c) above).

They will also be allowed to deduct the period of their service between September 3, 1939, and August 18, 1948, from their ages in computing the age for the purpose of the age limit. Certificates of service must be attached to the application form.

Note.—Civil Defence Services will be held to include only those Services the members of which were enrolled under the Defence Regulations.

7. Temporary Stenographers who are now employed in Government Departments will be eligible to take the examination irrespective of the educational qualifications provided—

(a) they are not more than 40 years of age on August 18, 1948.

(b) they have completed at least two years' continuous satisfactory service under Government on August 18, 1948.

Note.—For all future examinations the age limits and the educational qualifications will be as laid down in the Minute on the Stenographers' Transferable Service published in *Government Gazette Extraordinary* of April 1, 1948. No concessions will be allowed.

8. *Applications.*—(i.) Application forms for admission to the examination may be obtained from the Education Department Inquiry Office by personal callers or from the Examinations Branch (Boathouse), by those applying by post, up to August 9, 1948.

* For the purpose of this examination a Ceylonese is—

(a) a British Subject who is born in Ceylon; or

(b) a British Subject who is a descendant of a person falling within category (a); or

(c) a British Subject deemed by the Minister of Defence and External Affairs in view of special circumstances to be a Ceylonese.

Applications must be sent by registered post to reach the Director of Education, Examinations Branch, Boathouse, Colombo, not later than 2 P.M. on August 18, 1948. Any applications received after that hour will be rejected.

(ii.) The application must bear duly cancelled stamps to the value of Rs. 10.

(iii.) Candidates who are already employed in Government Departments whether in a permanent or temporary capacity must forward their applications through the Heads of the Departments in which they are serving. If any candidate fails to do so, he will be regarded as disqualified.

(iv.) A certificate of registration of the candidate's birth must be attached to the form of application.

Note.—(a) Certificates of birth issued for the purposes of the Code for Assisted Schools will not be accepted for this examination.

(b) Affidavits will not be accepted as substitutes for birth certificates.

(v.) Candidates who are not in the *permanent* service of Government must attach two certificates of character signed by responsible persons to the satisfaction of the Director of Education to the form of application.

(vi.) Should any of the particulars furnished by the candidates be found to be false within their knowledge, they will, if appointed be liable to be dismissed. The wilful suppression of any material fact will be similarly penalised.

9. *Withdrawals and refunds.*—(i.) If a candidate's application is not accepted owing to his not satisfying the conditions for admission to the examination no refund of the value of stamps affixed to his application or part thereof will be made.

(ii.) If a candidate who has been admitted to the examination gives notice of his withdrawal to the Director of Education at least 14 days before the date of the examination, a refund will be made of half the value of stamps affixed to his application. In case the form of admission to the examination has reached the candidate it should be returned to the Director of Education, Examinations Branch, Boathouse, Colombo, for the refund to be made.

(iii.) A candidate who has been admitted to the examination and wishes to withdraw on account of illness, should forward notice of his withdrawal together with his admission form to the Director of Education, Examinations Branch, Boathouse, Colombo, by registered post at least one day before the examination. A refund of the full value of stamps affixed to his application will then be made, provided his notice of withdrawal is accompanied by a certificate from a qualified medical practitioner to the effect that he is unfit to sit for the examination.

TEXTILE CONTROL NOTICE No. 347.

Removal of Price Control.

IT is notified for the information of the public and the trade that the Textile Control Information Bureau, the Price Marking Office and all outstation offices will be closed with effect from July 31, 1948.

Price Control is lifted with effect from July 24, 1948, and as from that date, dealers will be entitled to sell their goods immediately on clearance from the Customs. No Release Orders will be required.

Textile Control Order No. 36 will be suspended as from July 24, 1948, and no registers and schedules need be maintained thereafter. But all Bills and Invoices relating to the purchase or sales of textiles, should be properly maintained and made available for inspection.

Subject to the above modification, all Textile Regulations will continue to be in force.

In particular, all regulations pertaining to licensing, change of premises, and export of Textiles, will continue to be enforced, and a Dealer can deal only in terms of his licence. No trading in Regulated Textiles without a licence, issued by me is permitted. Dealers, and others, may communicate with the Assistant Controller of Textiles, Colombo, 104, 2nd Cross street, Pettah on matters relating to the above.

The above arrangement represent, a very substantial modification and relaxation of the Control by Administrative Act, in the light of existing circumstances. The Regulations, however, are liable to be enforced again in full, if it is found necessary to do so in the public interest.

Report on the Vital Statistics of Indian Labourers on Scheduled Estates for 1947.

The term estate in this report means an estate in which labourers are employed, having ten acres of land actually cultivated in tea, rubber, cocoa, cardamoms, coca, camphor, pepper, or cinchona.

POPULATION STATISTICS—BIRTHS AND DEATHS.

Population.—The mean Indian labour population on estates was about 721,000 in 1947 as against 693,000 in 1946. At the beginning of 1947, this population was 716,712 (212,979 men, 207,144 women, and 296,589 children); in the middle of the year it was 709,243 (210,047 men, 204,940 women, and 294,256 children); and at the end of the year it was 735,716 (216,684 men, 212,086 women, and 306,946 children). The estate records, therefore, show a net increase of 19,004 in the Indian labourer population between the beginning and the end of the year.

Births.—29,110 births (14,785 boys and 14,325 girls) were registered in 1947 as against 28,799 registered in 1946, the percentage of increase being 1.1. The birth rate for 1947 is 40.4 per 1,000 (approximately) of the mean population in 1947, as compared with the birth rate for 1946 of 41.6 per 1,000 (approximately) of the mean population in 1946. The birth rate for 1947 is slightly higher than that for the whole Island for 1947, which was 39.4 per 1,000 of the population.

Columns 2 to 10 of Table I show the births among Indian estate labourers registered in each district by sex and race. In nine out of the eleven districts there were increases over 1946 in the number of births registered, the percentages of increase ranging from 3.2 in the Ratnapura District to 90.4 in the Kurunegala District. In the remaining two districts, Kandy and Badulla, there was a fall in the number of births registered, the percentages of decrease being 6.0 and 3.8 respectively.

Deaths.—9,345 deaths (4,600 males and 4,745 females) were registered in 1947, as against 11,718 registered in 1946, the percentage of decrease being 20.3. The death rate for 1947 is 13.0 (approximately) per 1,000 of the mean population, as against a death rate of 16.9 per 1,000 of the mean population for 1946. The death rate for the whole Island for 1947 was 14.3 per 1,000 of the population.

Columns 11 to 19 of Table I show the incidence of mortality by sex and race in each district. In all the districts except Matara, the numbers of deaths registered in 1947 were less than the numbers registered in the several districts in 1946, the percentages of decrease ranging from 66.9 in the Kurunegala District to 3.8 in the Colombo District. In the Matara District there was an increase in the number of deaths registered, the percentage of increase being 1.5.

Infant Mortality.—3,177 deaths of infants under one year of age (1,743 males and 1,434 females) were registered in 1947, as against a total of 3,870 such deaths registered in 1946. The mortality rate is 109 per 1,000 live births, as against an infant mortality rate of 134 per 1,000 live births for 1946. This estate Indian infant mortality rate for 1947 is higher than that for the whole Island for 1947, which was 101 per 1,000 live births.

Columns 20 to 22 of Table I give the figures of infant deaths in, and the infant mortality rate for each district. The highest rate for the year is that for the Matara District, 136 per 1,000 live births, and the lowest is that for the Kurunegala District, 81 per 1,000 live births.

The table inserted below shows the infant deaths from the principal causes, and the death rate of each such cause. The highest rates are as in previous years, those for debility, prematurity and convulsions.

CAUSES OF DEATH.

Table II shows the deaths among Indian labourers on estates from the principal causes in the years 1946 and 1947. The observations appended are confined to the more noteworthy causes:

Pneumonia and Bronchitis.—The number of registered deaths assigned to pneumonia and broncho-pneumonia in 1947 was 1,114 as against 1,220 deaths assigned to these causes in 1946. The death rate for these causes for 1947 was 155 per 100,000 of the mean population, as against a corresponding rate of 176 per 100,000 of the mean population for 1946. There were 393 deaths from bronchitis in 1947, with a death rate of 55 per 100,000. In 1946 there were 603 deaths from this cause with a death rate of 87 per 100,000.

Dysentery.—The number of deaths from dysentery in 1947 was 116 as against 321 deaths from this cause in 1946. The corresponding death rates are 16 per 100,000 for 1947 and 46 per 100,000 for 1946.

Diarrhoea and Enteritis.—The number of deaths from diarrhoea and enteritis registered in 1947 was 631, as against 899 deaths from these causes in 1946.

Ankylostomiasis.—371 deaths from ankylostomiasis were registered in 1947 as against 484 deaths from this cause registered in 1946. As in previous years, there were more deaths from this cause among females than among males.

The Puerperal State.—185 deaths in 1947 were classified under puerperal causes. The number of deaths registered in 1947 was much less than the number of deaths—311 registered in 1946. The resulting death rates are 6.4 per 1,000 live births for 1947 and 10.8 per 1,000 live births for 1946. The corresponding rate for the whole Island for 1947 was 10.6 per 1,000 live births.

Malaria and Malarial Cachexia.—There was a remarkable decrease in the number of deaths from these causes registered in 1947—namely, 137—as compared with the number 765—registered in 1946.

Phthisis.—143 deaths were registered during 1947 as due to phthisis, as against 221 deaths in 1946. The death rates are 20 per 100,000 in 1947 and 32 per 100,000 in 1946. The death rate from phthisis for the whole Island for 1947 was 51 per 100,000.

Influenza.—135 deaths were registered in 1947 as due to influenza, as against 191 deaths registered as due to this cause in 1946.

Smallpox, Cholera and Plague.—There were no deaths from these causes registered in 1947.

Violent and Accidental deaths.—There were 39 cases of suicide in 1947 as against 61 in 1946. The number of cases of homicide was 11 in 1947, as against 17 in 1946. There were no judicial executions of Indian estate labourers in 1947. Of the 130 accidental deaths registered during 1947, 37 were due to burns, 35 were due to accidental drowning, 17 were due to landslides, 7 were due to snake-bites, and 1 was due to hunger or thirst.
