THE DEFENCE (FINANCE NO. 3) REGULATIONS.

*Order under Regulations 1 and 7.*

IN pursuance of the powers vested in me by regulations 1 and 7 of the Defence (Finance No. 3) Regulations having effect by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) Act, 1945, of the Imperial Parliament, read with the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) Order, 1946, and modified by the Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,773 of September 24, 1947, I, Junius Richard Jayewardene, Minister of Finance, do by this Order:—

- (1) specify the notes mentioned in the First and Second Schedules hereto as notes to which the Defence (Finance No. 3) Regulations shall apply;
- (2) grant exemption from the aforesaid regulation 1 in respect of the bringing into Ceylon at any one time, by any person travelling to Ceylon in any ship or aircraft (not being a person employed or engaged in any capacity on board the ship or aircraft or a person described in the Third Schedule hereto travelling on official duty) of the notes mentioned in the aforesaid First Schedule, if but only if, the amount of such notes does not exceed five pounds in value;
- (3) grant exemption from the aforesaid regulation 1 in respect of the bringing into Ceylon at any one time, by any person travelling to Ceylon in any ship or aircraft, of the notes mentioned in the aforesaid Second Schedule, if but only if, the amount of such notes does not exceed Rs. 140 in value; and
- (4) revoke the Order (as amended by any subsequent Order) made under the aforesaid regulations 1 and 7 and published in *Gazette* No. 9,708 of May 30, 1947.

#### *First Schedule.*

Bank notes issued by any of the following banks:—

- (1) The Bank of England.
- (2) The following banks in Scotland:—
  - (a) The Bank of Scotland.
  - (b) The Royal Bank of Scotland.
  - (c) The British Linen Bank.

- (d) The Commercial Bank of Scotland.
- (e) The National Bank of Scotland.
- (f) The Union Bank of Scotland.
- (g) The North of Scotland Bank.
- (h) The Clydesdale Bank.

(3) The following banks in Northern Ireland:—

- (a) The Bank of Ireland.
- (b) The Provincial Bank of Ireland.
- (c) The Belfast Banking Co.
- (d) The Northern Bank.
- (e) The Ulster Bank.
- (f) The National Bank.

#### *Second Schedule.*

Currency notes which are or have at any time been legal tender in the following countries:—

1. Ceylon.
2. India.
3. Pakistan.

#### *Third Schedule.*

1. Any male person serving in the Armed Forces of the Crown.
2. Female person serving in any of the following capacities:—
  - (a) Any member of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service or any reserve thereof.
  - (b) Any member of the Women's Royal Naval Service.
  - (c) Any woman medical practitioner serving in the Royal Navy or any naval reserve.
  - (d) Any member of Queen Alexandra's Imperial Military Nursing Service or any reserve thereof.
  - (e) Any member of the Territorial Army Nursing Service or any reserve thereof.
  - (f) Any member of the Auxiliary Territorial Service.
  - (g) Any woman employed with the Royal Army Medical Corps or the Army Dental Corps with relative rank as an officer.
  - (h) Any member of Princess Mary's Royal Air Force Nursing Service or any reserve thereof.
  - (i) Any member of the Women's Auxiliary Air Force.
  - (j) Any woman employed with the Medical Branch or the Dental Branch of the Royal Air Force with relative rank as an officer.
  - (k) Any member of the Voluntary Aid Detachments employed under the Admiralty, Army Council or Air Council.
