THE VILLAGE COMMUNITIES ORDINANCE.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 11 (1) of the Village Communities Ordinance (Chapter 198) as modified by the Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,773 of September 24, 1947, I, Solomon West Ridgeway Dias Bandaranaike, Minister of Health and Local Government, do by this Notification, with effect from July 1, 1949—

- (1) subdivide the village headmen's divisions situated in the Mampe-Kesbewa village area in the Colombo District and specified in Column I of the First Schedule hereto into wards with the limits specified in the corresponding items in Column II of that Schedule; and
- (2) rescind the Notifications specified in the Second Schedule hereto in so far as they relate to that village area.

THE VILLAGE COMMUNITIES ORDINANCE.

Order under section 6.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 6 of the Village Communities Ordinance (Chapter 198) as modified by the Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,773 of September 24, 1947, I, Solomon West Ridgeway Dias Bandaranaike, Minister of Health and Local Government, do by this Order alter and redefine, with effect from the first day of January, 1949, the limits of the Mampe-Kesbewa village area of the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Salpiti korale in the Colombo District of the Western Province by the exclusion from that village area of the area now known as the town of Piliyandala and more fully described in the Schedule hereto.

Schedule.*Limits of the Town of Piliyandala.*

The area situated in the villages of Suwarapola, Kolumuna, Demaladuwa, Mampe and Tumbowila, in Palle pattuwa, Salpiti Korale Divisional Revenue Officer's Division, Colombo District, Western Province, and bounded as follows:—

North: By a line drawn from the point where the western boundary of the Samarakone avenue meets the northern boundary of the Wewala Ferry road eastwards across the Samarakone avenue and along the northern boundary of the Wewala Ferry road till it meets the western boundary of the Colombo-Horana P. W. D. road, thence by a line drawn northwards along the western boundary of the said road as far as a point in line with the southern boundary of Malwattakumbura claimed by L. D. Perera, and thence by a line drawn eastwards across the said road and along the southern boundary of the said land, southwards along the western boundaries of Gonnankumbura claimed by D. D. Pabilis and others, Korianakumbura claimed by D. D. Carolis and others, Kalubowilayakumbura claimed by P. Wickramasinghe and others, Dematahetta claimed by P. Wickramasinghe and others, Kohilawala claimed by D. D. Simon and others, Iravaluismatha claimed by H. D. John Singho and others, southwards and eastwards along the western and southern boundaries of Aswedduma claimed by D. D. Simon Appuhami and others, and south-westwards along the western boundary of Pinhadirama claimed by G. C. Rodrigo till it meets the northern boundary of the V. C. road leading to village, thence by a line drawn eastwards along the northern boundary of the said road to a point in line with the western boundary of Godakadurugahawatta claimed by D. D. Siyadoris and others, and thence by a line drawn southwards across the said V. C. road and along the western boundaries of the said land, Godakadurugahawatta claimed by G. D. Richard, Navasigahawatta claimed by G. M. Elvin and others, and Ganewatta claimed by the Trustees of Mampe Temple and eastwards along the southern boundary of the latter premises till it meets the Ganewatta road, and crossing the said road to its eastern boundary, thence by a line drawn southwards and eastwards along the eastern boundary of the said road and crossing it at the point where the northern boundary of Delgahawatta claimed by A. D. Arnolis Appuhamy meets the opposite edge of the road to the northern boundary of the said land, thence by a straight line drawn eastwards through the said land, Galapaluwawewatta claimed by D. D. Joronis and others, W. Carolis Perera and M. D. Carolis, across the path leading to houses, through Alubogahawatta claimed by P. A. Roseline Nona, Delgahawatta claimed by P. Seethammy and others, Pelawatta claimed by T. D. M. Siriwardhana, across road leading to estate and through Pelawatta claimed by E. W. Kannangara and others and crossing the Mampe-Kottawa road to the eastern boundary of the road where the western boundary of Kapuralageowita claimed by E. W. Kannangara and others meet it.

East: By a line drawn from the last mentioned point southwards along the western boundaries of Kapuralageowita and Mahaowita claimed by E. W. Kannangara and others to the southern boundary of the footpath leading to village, thence by a line drawn south-westwards along the southern boundary of the said footpath and northern boundary of Galwalakottanuwuwa claimed by B. Arnolis Fernando and others, to the village limit between Mampe and Demaladuwa, thence by a line drawn southwards along the said village limit which runs along the western boundaries of the said land and Etulgawatta

claimed by James Fernando and others till it meets the northern boundary of Ridiwitagewatta claimed by D. A. Abeysinghe.

South: By a line drawn from the last mentioned point south-westwards along the village limit between Mampe and Demaladuwa which runs along the northern boundary of Ridiwitagewatta claimed by D. A. Abeysinghe and crossing the Colombo-Horana P. W. D. road near culvert No. 13/4 to its western boundary, thence by a straight line drawn westwards through Delgahawatta claimed by M. C. Perera, Richard de Costa, Batadombagahawatta claimed by W. Enso Perera, A. Charles Dias, D. L. Rajapaksa, K. D. Noris Appuhamy, across path leading to houses, through Delgahawatta claimed by H. D. Selohamy and others, and D. D. Rajapaksa, Laulugahalanda claimed by H. D. A. Abeyssekara, Alubogahawatta claimed by G. D. Pawanis Appuhamy and others, Kongahawatta claimed by S. D. Siyaneris and others, S. T. Kathonis Appu and Simon Samarakoon and crossing the Degalla Ferry road to the southern boundary of the Suwarapola-Kolamune road, thence by a line drawn westwards and north-westwards along the southern boundary of the said road and crossing the road which branches off near the Central School Boarding House to its western boundary, thence by a straight line drawn through Kongahawatta claimed by B. D. Simon Appuhami, Wangasooriyamahawatta claimed by Adeline Dissanayaka and Mrs. D. C. Manatunga, Kahatagahawatta claimed by A. Jayasinghe, Delgahawatta claimed by P. Lenorahamy, across path, through Millagahawatta claimed by A. Caldera and Nitolpitiyawatta claimed by P. D. Coranelis and others and crossing the Lunawa road to its northern boundary at culvert No. 14/2.

West: By a line drawn from last mentioned point north-eastwards through Nitolpitiyawatta claimed by Mrs. C. A. Abeyasekara, Delgahawatta *alias* Alubogahawatta claimed by Martin Singho and S. D. Velun Appuhami, Kahatagahawatta claimed by P. D. Emis Singho and others and P. D. Mendis and others, across cart track leading to houses, Kahatagahawatta claimed by K. D. Kavanis Appuhamy, Gorakagahawatta claimed by M. Martha Perera and others and A. A. C. Dias, Dewatagahawatta claimed by P. Don Heras, W. J. Perera and others and M. J. Appuhamy and crossing the Wewala-Piliyandala road to the western boundary of the Samarakone avenue, thence by a line drawn northwards along the western boundary of the said road and across the Wewala Ferry road to the starting point of the northern limit of the area.

THE URBAN COUNCILS ORDINANCE.

Special Water Rate for 1949.

IT is hereby notified that the Chilaw Urban Council has under section 143 (b) of the Urban Councils Ordinance, No. 61 of 1939, with the sanction of the Minister of Health and Local Government, given by virtue of the powers vested in him by that section as modified by the Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,773 of September 24, 1947, imposed for the year 1949, subject to such limits and exemptions as may be prescribed by by-laws, a special water rate of six per centum on the annual value of all immovable property situated within the town of Chilaw, payable in four equal instalments on March 31, June 30, September 30, and December 31, respectively.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE.

Village Committee Clerical Examination, Grade II.

A competitive examination for male candidates wishing to enter Grade II. of the Village Committee Clerical Service will be held at Colombo, Kandy, Galle, Jaffna, Anuradhapura, Badulla, Ratnapura, Batticaloa and Kurunegala on January 22, 1949.

The examination will be conducted by the Director of Education.

2. (i.) *Salary.*—Successful candidates will be appointed as vacancies occur to serve Village Committees on the salary of Rs. 576 per annum rising by annual increments of Rs. 36 to 936 per annum. An efficiency bar operates before Rs. 792. Rent allowance will be payable.

(ii.) *Conditions of Service.*—(a) The grant of leave and other conditions will be governed by the By-laws of the Village Committee, the Village Committee Rules framed under the Village Communities Ordinance and the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, and any regulations framed thereunder.

(b) Successful candidates will be appointed on two years' trial or probation. They will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, and any Regulations made thereunder.

(c) Successful candidates with previous continuous service in the Local Government Service or under a Local Authority may be allowed incremental credit for such service.

(d) The appointments will be on a Provident Fund basis.

3. The names of successful candidates will be published in Part IX. of the *Ceylon Government Gazette*, and they will be given appointments as suitable vacancies occur.

4. *Eligibility*.—(i.) Candidates must be of good character.

(ii.) Candidates must be Ceylonese*.

(iii.) Candidates should have previously passed at least either—

- (a) The Junior School Certificate (Sinhalese or Tamil) Examination with English as one of the subjects; or
(b) the Junior School Certificate (Sinhalese or Tamil) Examination and the 6th Standard (English) Examination.

(iv.) Candidates must be within the age limits laid down in paragraph 6 (iv.) (a) except that Service candidates may deduct their period of mobilized service in the last War from their age, if necessary.

(v.) Candidates must furnish satisfactory proof that they have been resident within an area specified in the Second Schedule to the L. G. S. Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, for at least three years preceding November 1, 1948.

5. Candidates in the employ of a Local Authority for not less than 5 years will be permitted to sit for the Examination irrespective of age and educational qualifications prescribed above.

6. *Applications*.—(i.) Applications for admission to the examination must be addressed to the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, P. O. Box 530, Colombo, on forms obtainable from the Office of the Local Government Service Commission, 29 1/5, Gaffoor building (First floor), Colombo. Applications must be sent by Registered post to reach the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, not later than December 15, 1948. Any application received after that date will be rejected.

(ii.) Candidates who are already employed in Government Departments or Local Authorities whether in a permanent or temporary capacity must forward their applications through the Heads of the Departments or the Chairmen of the Local Authorities in which they are serving. If any candidate fails to do so he will be disqualified.

(iii.) A crossed Money Order or Postal Order to the value of Rs. 3 in favour of the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, must accompany each application.

(iv.) The following documents must be attached to the form of application :—

- (a) A certificate of registration of the candidate's birth showing him to have been born not earlier than October 1, 1923, and not later than October 1, 1931.

Note.—(1) Affidavits will not ordinarily be accepted as substitutes for Birth Certificates.

- (2) A certified copy of a birth registration entry effected more than one year after the date of birth, under section 18 (1) of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance (Cap. 94) will be accepted only after consideration of the evidence by which the date of birth was established. Where the name appearing in the Birth Certificate differs from the name which the candidate ordinarily uses, satisfactory evidence will have to be adduced that the Birth Certificate is that of the candidate and not that of any other person. Where the candidate is under 21 years of age or is more than 21 years of age and has a parent living, application should be made to the Registrar-General's or to the Provincial Registrar's or Assistant Provincial Registrar's Office, in the district in which the birth took place under section 19 of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance for the amendment of the entry in page 2 of the Birth Registration entry and in other cases application should be made to the District Court under section 20 for rectification of the entry in page 2.

- (b) A certificate of good character signed by a responsible person to the satisfaction of the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission. If the candidate

* For the purpose of this examination a Ceylonese is :—

has been educated at a Government or Assisted school, the certificate of character must be from the Principal of the last Government or Assisted school which he had attended; otherwise it may be from the candidate's teacher or school master by preference or a member of the Public Service, a Justice of the Peace, Minister of Religion, Advocate, Proctor or Notary, or generally speaking some person whose name is known and to whom reference can be readily made.

- (c) A certificate of residence from a Divisional Revenue Officer, Justice of the Peace, Minister of Religion, Proctor or Notary Public—*vide* para. 4 (v.).

(d) Original certificates of educational qualifications.

(v.) The Chairman, Local Government Service Commission will issue admission forms to those candidates whose applications are accepted. Candidates presenting themselves for examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination their forms of admission. A candidate not producing such form will be refused admittance to the examination.

Candidates must sit for the examination at the Examination Hall assigned to them. A candidate presenting himself at an Examination Hall other than the one assigned to him will be refused admission to the Examination.

A copy of the Time Table and the Rules for the guidance of candidates for the examination will be forwarded together with the admission form. These should be read carefully by candidates. Every candidate presenting himself for the examination must give up his admission form to the Supervising Examiner on the date of examination.

If a candidate does not receive his admission form at least seven days before the day of the examination, he should communicate without delay with the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, informing him that he has not received the admission form and giving the following particulars :—

- (1) Name of Examination,
- (2) Full Name,
- (3) Full Postal Address,
- (4) Examination Centre at which candidate applied to take his examination.

7. Should any of the particulars furnished by candidates be found to be false within their knowledge, they will, if appointed, be liable to be dismissed. The wilful suppression of any material fact will be similarly penalised.

8. *Withdrawals and Refunds*.—(a) If a candidate is rejected owing to his not satisfying the conditions, for admission to the examination, a refund will be made of 2/3rds the value of the examination fee of Rs. 3.

(b) If a candidate, who has been admitted to the examination gives notice of his withdrawal to the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, at least 14 days before the date of the examination, a refund will be made of half the value of the examination fee. In case the form of admission to the examination has reached the candidate, it should be returned to the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, for a refund.

(c) A candidate, who has been admitted to the examination and wishes to withdraw on account of illness, should forward notice of his withdrawal together with his admission form to the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, by Registered Post at least one day before the examination. A refund of the full examination fee will then be made, provided his notice of withdrawal is accompanied by a certificate from a qualified Medical Practitioner to the effect that he is unfit to sit for examination.

(d) In no other case will a refund be made.

9. *Leave to Officers, to attend Examination*.—Heads of Departments and Chairmen of Local Authorities are kindly requested to grant the officers of their Departments and of Local Bodies, whose applications have been approved by the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, duty leave to present themselves at the examination.

10. *Subjects*.—The subjects for the examination are as follows :—

(Candidates are required to produce at the *Viva Voce* test the original certificates granted to them in respect of the examinations they have passed which qualify them for admission to this examination).

11. The examination is held in two parts. The written examination is first held and on the results of it, candidates are selected competitively to attend the *Viva Voce*. The number to be called at the *Viva Voce* Examination will be fixed by the Local Government Service Commission in consultation with the Director of Education. In all written papers, marks will be deducted for bad handwriting and mistakes in spelling. Candidates whose writing is illegible, are liable to be disqualified. The *Viva Voce* examination will be held in Colombo.

12. *Medical Examination.*—The successful candidates will be required to pass a medical examination as to their physical fitness for service.

A competitive examination for male candidates wishing to enter the Local Government Assistant Clerks' Service will be held at Colombo, Kandy, Galle, Jaffna, Anuradhapura, Badulla, Ratnapura, Batticaloa and Kurunegala on February 5, 1949.

The examination will be conducted by the Director of Education.

2. (i.) *Salary.*—Successful candidates will be appointed as vacancies occur to serve Local Authorities on the salary of Rs. 660 per annum, rising by annual increments of Rs. 42 to Rs. 1,668 per annum. An efficiency bar operates before Rs. 1,206. Rent allowance will be payable.

(ii.) *Conditions of Service.*—(a) The grant of leave and other conditions will be governed by the by-laws and regulations of the Local Authority, subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, and any regulations framed thereunder.

(b) Successful candidates will be appointed on two years' trial or probation. They will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, and any Regulations made thereunder.

(c) Successful candidates with previous continuous service in the Local Government Service or under a Local Authority may be allowed incremental credit for such service.

Where the candidate is under 21 years of age or is more than 21 years of age and has a parent living, application should be made to the Registrar-General's or the Provincial Registrar's or Assistant Provincial Registrar's Office, in the district in which the birth took place under section 19 of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance, for the amendment of the entry in case 2 of the Birth Registration entry and in other cases application should be made to the District Court under section 20 for the rectification of the entry in case 2.

(b) A certificate of good character signed by a responsible person to the satisfaction of the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission. If the candidate has been educated at a Government or Assisted school, a certificate of character must be from the Principal of the last Government or Assisted school which he had attended; otherwise it may be from the candidate's teacher or school master by preference or a member of the Public Service, a Justice of the Peace, Minister of Religion, Advocate, Proctor or Notary, or generally speaking some person whose name is known and to whom reference can be readily made.

A refund of the full examination fee will then be made, provided his notice of withdrawal is accompanied by a certificate from a qualified medical practitioner to the effect that he is unfit to sit for the examination.

(d) In no other case will a refund be granted.

9. *Leave to Officers to attend Examination.*—Heads of Departments and Chairmen of Local Authorities are kindly requested to grant to officers of their Departments and of Local Bodies, whose applications have been approved by the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, duty leave to present themselves at the examination.



BY-LAWS for the area within the administrative limits of the Wattala-Mabole-Peliyagoda Urban Council, made under section 4 of the Dog Registration Ordinance (Chapter 334) by the proper authority in that behalf, to wit, the Chairman of the Wattala-Mabole-Peliyagoda Urban Council.

By-laws.

1. In these by-laws—

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Wattala-Mabole-Peliyagoda Urban Council;

“the annual registration fee” means the annual registration fee to be charged under section 4 of the Dog Registration Ordinance;

and

“the owner” in relation to a dog, includes the person having custody or possession of that dog.

2. (1) The occupier of any house or premises in which any dog over 6 months of age is kept, shall, on or before March 1, in each year, furnish to the Chairman, a return in the form set out in the Schedule hereto.

(2) Where any person, after March 1 in any year, commences to keep a dog in any house or premises; the occupier of such house or premises shall forthwith furnish to the Chairman an additional return in the form set out in the Schedule hereto.

3. The annual registration fee shall be paid by the owner of each dog—

(a) in the case of a dog in respect of which a return is furnished under by-law 2 (1), on or before April 1 of the year for which the fee is due; or

(b) in the case of a dog in respect of which an additional return is furnished under by-law 2 (2), within fifteen days of the date on which such additional return is furnished.

4. On payment of the annual registration fee, the Chairman shall issue to the owner of the dog—

(i) a certificate of registration, and

(ii) a metal ticket or collar with the number of the certificate stamped thereon.

Provided that the Chairman may require the production of any dog for the registration of which an application is made, and may refuse to issue a certificate of registration and a metal ticket or collar for that dog—

- if that dog is not produced; or
- if that dog is, in the opinion of the Chairman, so maimed or diseased as to be unfit to live or so diseased as to be a source of infection to other dogs; or
- if that dog is habitually ill-treated or neglected by its owner.

5. The Chairman may, after notice to be left at the address of the owner of any dog for which a certificate of registration has been issued, cancel such certificate—

- if that dog becomes, in the opinion of the Chairman, so maimed or diseased as to be unfit to live; or
- if that dog is habitually ill-treated or neglected by its owner; or
- if that dog is permitted by its owner, at a time when it is suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, to associate with any other dog; or
- if that dog is found straying without a metal ticket or collar.

6. (1) The owner of any dog, for which a certificate of registration has been refused under by-law 4 or has been cancelled under by-law 5, shall, on being noticed to do so by the Chairman, produce that dog at such time and place as may be specified in the notice.

(2) Every such dog may be destroyed or otherwise disposed of as the Chairman shall think fit.

7. The owner of any dog for which a metal ticket or collar has been issued shall take all necessary steps to ensure that the metal ticket or collar is fastened securely round the neck of that dog at all times during the period for which the certificate of registration issued in respect of that dog is in force.

8. The Chairman may authorise in writing any person to exercise any or all of the powers, vested in the Chairman by these by-laws.

9. The by-laws relating to the registration of dogs made by certain Sanitary Board towns in the Colombo District and published in *Gazette* No. 8,618 of May 31, 1940, and kept in force under section 246 of the Urban Councils Ordinance, No. 61 of 1939, are hereby rescinded in so far as they apply to the area within the administrative limits of the Wattala-Mabole-Peliyagoda Urban Council.
