THE VILLAGE COMMUNITIES ORDINANCE.

BY-LAWS under section 49 of the Village Communities Ordinance (Chapter 198), made by the Village Commuttee of the Pallavarayankaddu village area in the Jaffna District, and approved by the Minister of Health and Local Government by virtue of the powers vested in him by that section as modified by the Proclamation published in Gazette Extraordinary No. 9,773 of September 24, 1947.

By-laws.

Interpretation.

- 1. In these by-laws-
- "Chairman" means the Chairman of the Committee;
- "Committee" means the Village Committee of the village area; and
- "village area" means the Pallavarayankaddu village area.

Offensive and Dangerous Trades.

- 2. (1) The following trades shall be deemed to be offensive trades :-
 - (a) Storing cured or dry fish.
 - (b) Storing and curing conch shells.
- (2) The following trades shall be deemed to be dangerous trades :-
 - (a) Burning or storing lime.
 - (b) Keeping a timber depot.
- (3) The following trade shall be deemed to be an offensive and a dangerous trade :-

Burning bricks and tiles.

- 3. (1) No person shall carry on any offensive or dangerous trade unless he is the holder of a licence issued in that behalf by the Chairman on the recommendation of the Medical Officer of Health.
- (2) Every licence shall, unless it is cancelled under by-law 11, expire on the thirty-first day of December of the year in respect of which it is issued.
- 4. No person shall be entitled to a licence to carry on any offensive or dangerous trade unless-
- , (1) the place at which that trade is to be carried on is approved by the Medical Officer of Health, and
 (2) any building to be used for the purposes of that trade is
- in conformity with the following requirements:
 - (a) the building must be in good repair, well ventilated, well lighted, and provided with adequate drainage and latrine accommodation;
 (b) the roof of the building must be made of some permanent material and the floor must be accounted:
 - cemented;
 (c) the eaves of the building must be not less than
 - six feet from the ground;
 - (d) every room in the building must be provided with windows capable of being opened and the area of such windows when open shall be not less than one fifteenth of the superficial floor space;

- (e) the walls of every room in the building must be not less than seven feet in height and must be
- built of brick; stone, or cabook;

 (f) the internal surface of such walls, to a height cat least four feet from the floor, must be plastered with cement and the rest of the walls must be limeplastered and limewashed; and
- (g) the woodwork of the building must be oil-painted or limewashed.
- 5. (1) If at any time during the period for which a licence has been issued in respect of any offensive or dangerous trade, any building used for the purposes of that trade ceases to be in conformity with the provisions of by-law 4, the Chairman may, on the recommendation of the Medical Officer of Health, cause a notice to be served on the licensee requiring him to do, before a day to be specified in the notice, all things necessary to make such building to be in conformity with such provisions.
- (2) No holder of a licence to carry on any offensive or dangerous trade on whom a notice is served under paragraph (1) of this by-law shall fail to comply with such notice within the time specified therein.
- 6. A notice under by law 5 shall be deemed to have served on the holder of a licence to carry on any offensive or dangerous trade if it is affixed to the premises at which he carries on that trade, or if it is left with any person employed by him in such premises.
- The holder of a licence to carry on any offensive or dangerous trade shall cause
 - (a) the floor of every building used for the purposes of such
 - trade to be swept and cleaned daily;
 (b) the walls of every such building to be limewashed at least once in every twelve months;
 - (c) all apparatus, implements and vessels used in such trade
 - to be kept clean; and

 (d) all refuse, sweepings, scrapings and waste and byproducts which are not to be subjected to further
 trade processes to be removed daily in covered
 receptables from the premises in which such trade is carried on.
- 8. No holder of a licence to carry on any offensive dangerous trade shall contaminate any well or tank or any river, stream, canal, channel, lake or other inland water.
- The holder of a licence to carry on any offensive dangerous trade shall cause any offensive vapours or which are emitted in the course of carrying on such trade—
 - (a) to be discharged into the external air in such a manner and at such a height as to admit of their diffusion without injurious or offensive effects; or
 - (b) to be passed directly through a fire or into a cor apparatus.
- 10. It shall be lawful for the Chairman, the Medical Officer of Health, the Sanitary Assistant or any officer of the Committee authorised in writing by the Chairman, at reasonable times, to enter upon and inspect any premises which any offensive or dangerous trade is being and the licensee or the person in charge thereof shall the inspection to be made.
- 11. It shall be lawful for the Rural Court, in any other punishment that it may impose, to licence of a licensee convicted twice or oftener of any any of these by laws relating to offensive or trades, and the licensee shall not be entitled to in respect of any such cancellation.

Common Pasture Grounds.

- 12. No person shall destroy, damage, or interfere with the use of, any common pasture ground.
- 13. No person shall damage any fence or madam, or obstruct any gateway or befoul or poison any well, tank or pond, situated on any common pasture ground.
- 14. Whenever the Committee by resolution reserves any common pasture ground for the use of the cattle of the inhabitants of any specified village or villages, the Chairman shall give notice of such resolution throughout the village
- When any common pasture ground has been reserved under by-law 14 for the use of the cattle of the inhabitants of any specified village or villages, no person who is not an inhabitant of such village or villages shall tether any cattle in, or permit any of his cattle to stray upon, such pasture ground, without previously obtaining a permit from the Chairman.
- 16. No person shall knowingly or wilfully alter, deface or do any act likely to damage the fence or boundary of any common pasture ground or remove any landmark therefrom.
- 17. No person shall cut or scrape or remove any grass from any common pasture ground.
- 18. No person shall dig out, heap up or remove any clay, earth, metal, cabook or coral stones from any common pasture
- 19. No person shall collect or remove any cow-dung from any common pasture ground for any purpose whatsoever without obtaining a permit from the Chairman.
- 20. The Committee shall have the power to sell, for a period not exceeding one year, the exclusive right of collecting cow-dung from any common pasture ground by calling tenders, or by public auction.
