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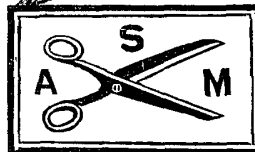

Research Corporation of South Africa (Proprietary) Ltd.

"Improvements in coagulating rubber from latex".

Abstract.—The inventors state that in known methods of coagulating rubber by alternating current, owing to the rectifying action of the electrodes used in effect only direct current flows. The object of this invention is to coagulate the rubber without its being deposited in the electrodes. The method is particularly adapted to obtaining coagulum from the juice of crushed herbaceous rubber containing plants.

According to the invention an alternating current is passed till creaming occurs, and then direct current is superimposed, the alternating current being reduced meanwhile to approximately to one third of its former value. The electrodes are such as not to cause any rectifying action. The direct current is about 10 per cent. of the initial value of the alternating current. The temperature has to be kept below 65°C. The latex should be agitated by compressed air or other means throughout the process.

There are 14 claims.
