THE following Specifications have been accepted:—

"Improved ceiling boards".

Abstract:—The inventor describes his method of manufacturing ceiling boards as follows: For hard boards 5 parts of fine cor dust, 5 parts coarse dust, 10 parts small fibre boiled for about six hours in a solution of 8 oz. of caustic soda in 5 gallons of water. The resulting pulp is washed with 3 times the quantity of water used for boiling, strained and mixed with calcium hydrate in the proportion of one part hydrate

to six parts pulp. The quantity of soda retained in the pulp is sufficient to create a hydraulic lime finely binding the dust and fibre together. The mixture is ground and pressed in frames at a pressure varying from 125 lb. to 2 tons per square inch according to the density of board required. For medium boards 1 part of saw dust is added and for soft boards 5 parts of fibre.

"A Method of manufacturing crepe rubber sheets and articles with studs and/or ridges".

Abstract.—The inventor claims a method of manufacturing crepe rubber sheets or articles characterised in that particles of spongy crepe rubber or of fully laminated rubber for producing the studs or ridges are enclosed between a fully rolled laminated sheet of crepe rubber and a relatively thinner sheet composed of two or more laces of spongy crepe rubber which are then rolled under pressure to join together the sheets and stud or ridge rubbers.

There are 2 claims.
