"Improvements in or relating to green tea leaf sifters and the like machines".

Abstract.—The invention relates to improvements to green tea leaf sifters which are in the form of polygonal drums rotatable about an inclined axis. The disadvantage of such rollers is that it is not easy to clear the inside of the drum of stacking leaf especially at the corners when sifting is over. The inventor seeks to overcome this difficulty by providing overlapping screening panels for the sides of the polygon. Each leading edge of the polygon overlaps the trailing edge of the previous panel, but a gap is left between for cleaning purposes in such a way that leaf will not fall out of the gap for normal rotation, but will fall out when the direction is reversed.

According to another modification of the invention pivoted panels are used which close the gaps during normal rotation but open out when direction is reversed. Means may be provided to turn the panels on the pivots through 180° so that the inside portions of the screens come on the outside of the drum. With this construction alternative sides of the screen can be used with successive batches of leaf being sifted, the direction of rotation being changed at the same time.

According to another feature of the invention the pivoted panels may be oscillated about the pivots by cam means during the rotation, suitable springs and stops being provided to limit such oscillatory movements.

"Process for the preparation of Agar-Agar".

Abstract.—The inventor states that the extraction of Agar-Agar from Indian seaweed is difficult without the use of acid. Use of acid however has a detrimental effect on the viscosity of the product and also affects the taste and smell so that subsequent purification and decolourisation is necessary. He further states that the difficulty of extraction is due to the fact that the agar-agar is contained in the interior of the elementary fibres (unit fibrils) which are joined together by connective material.

According to the present invention the elementary fibres are freed by thoroughly masticating and grinding the seaweed after soaking. Thereafter the crushed mass is washed in cold water which dissolves the connective tissue and leaves the fibres. Finally the Agar-Agar is extracted by boiling in water, filtering and cooling the extract.

"Process for purifying Agar-Agar".

Abstract.—The object of the invention is to free the agar-agar from the salts which it contains and which prevent it from being easily dissolved after being dried in the sun. According to the invention the agar-agar is divided into small pieces and allowed to remain in cold water for long periods. Due to osmosis the salts in the interior come out of the agar-agar.

"A method for improving the durability of purified and unpurified unvulcanised types of rubber with the aid of nitro-geneous compounds in solutions".

Abstract.—The inventor describes a method of improving the durability of purified or unpurified unvulcanized rubber by means of products containing chemical compounds with one or more primary, secondary and/or tertiary amine groups characterised by the fact that these products in a dissolved state are added either to the latex prior to coagulating the rubber, or are introduced into the crepe, sheet, slabs, flakes and the like rubber products partially dried or not dried by submerging these rubber products in diluted solutions of these nitrogenous compounds so that they are absorbed. The products so added may be—solutions of amino acids or else of hydrolysed products of animal or vegetable proteins such as gelatin, casein, zein, soya proteins, white of egg, yeast protein and the like; solutions of amides such as asparagine, glutamin, urea, guanidine, and the like; completely or partially hydrolyzed solutions of aqueous or alcoholic extracts, evaporated or not evaporated of bran of maize, rice or wheat.

“A process for the preparation of concentrated rubber dispersions”.

Abstract.—The invention relates to creaming of latex. According to the invention, the creaming vessel is divided into a multiplicity of compartments by horizontal, vertical, sloping or conical partitions so that openings are left for the cream to rise from the lower to higher compartments and the serum to move downwards. Examples are given showing the effectiveness of the method in accelerating the creaming process and in producing richer cream.
