REGULATIONS under section 25 of the above Act made by the Minister of Defence and External Affairs and approved by the Senate and the House of Representatives.

Regulations

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Citizenship Regulations, 1948.

2. Application for registration of birth under section 5 (2) of the Act shall be made by the father or mother of the child whose birth is to be registered.

Provided that where the parents of the child are dead, or are unable to make such application within one year as required by the Act, by reason of their illness, absence from the country of birth or other good cause in the opinion of the Permanent Secretary or a consular officer, the application may be made by any other person having a personal knowledge of the facts.

3. (1) Where there is in the country of birth a consular officer, the application referred to in regulation 2 shall be sent in duplicate to such officer, who shall cause one copy to be led in his office, and the other copy together with his report hereon to be sent to the Permanent Secretary.

(2) Before a consular officer sends the report, referred to in paragraph (1), on the application for registration, he shall satisfy himself as to the accuracy of the statements made in that application and he may require the applicant to supply such evidence including the production of birth certificates, as such officer may deem necessary for the purpose.

4. Where there is no consular officer in the country of birth, the application referred to in regulation 2 shall be sent in duplicate direct to the Permanent Secretary, and such application shall, wherever possible, be accompanied by a certificate of birth.

5. On receiving any application under regulation 3 or regulation 4, the Permanent Secretary may make such inquiry and require such further evidence, as he may consider necessary, to verify the accuracy of the particulars stated in the application.

6. After the Permanent Secretary has considered an application sent under regulation 3, he shall—

- (a) make a written order directing the consular officer to register the birth in the appropriate register;
- (b) request such officer to supply such further evidence as the Permanent Secretary may require; or
- (c) order the consular officer to refuse the application for registration.

Provided that where the Permanent Secretary makes the request referred to in clause (b), he shall, after considering the further evidence supplied, make an order in terms of clause (a) or clause (c).

7 (1) Where the Permanent Secretary makes an order under regulation 6 directing the registration of a birth, on receipt of that order at the office of the consular officer, he or any person authorised by him in that behalf shall forthwith make such registration.

(2) As soon as a birth has been registered under paragraph (1), the consular officer or a person authorised by him in that behalf shall forthwith inform the Permanent Secretary of the fact of registration.

8 After the Permanent Secretary has considered an application under regulation 4, he shall—

- (a) at the office of his Minister, register the birth in the appropriate register or direct an officer authorised by him in that behalf so to do at such office, or
- (b) refuse such application.

9 (1) Where the Permanent Secretary has been informed under regulation 7 (2) that a birth has been registered, and where a birth has been registered under regulation 8, he shall cause to be issued in each case a certificate of registration which shall as far as possible be in accordance with Form A set out in the Schedule hereto.

(2) The certificate of registration issued under paragraph (1) shall be sent by registered post, to the applicant through the consular officer in case the registration was made at the office of such officer, and to the applicant direct in case the registration was made at the office of the Minister.

(3) The certificate of registration issued under paragraph (1) shall, for the purposes of section 5 (2) of the Act, be conclusive proof of registration.

10 There shall be maintained at the Ministry and at the office of each consular officer a Register of Births in a form approved by the Minister.

11. (1) An application for a certificate under section 6 of the Act shall be sent to the Permanent Secretary, and the statements in that application shall be supported by an affidavit.

(2) The application referred to in paragraph (1) shall, wherever possible, be accompanied by any documentary evidence available to prove the facts set out in the application and material to a decision of the entitlement of citizenship by descent.

(3) The application referred to in paragraph (1) shall be supported by three persons each of whom must be—

- (a) a citizen of Ceylon by descent,
- (b) intimately acquainted with and having a personal knowledge of the applicant and his family, and
- (c) able from his personal knowledge and belief to vouch for the truth of the statements made by the applicant.

12 Before the Minister grants the certificate of citizenship referred to in section 6 of the Act, he may require an applicant for such certificate to supply such further information and proof as the Minister may think necessary.

13. A certificate of citizenship granted under section 6 of the Act shall as far as possible be in accordance with Form B set out in the Schedule hereto, and such certificate shall not be issued until a fee of one rupee is paid.

14 (1) The statements in any application for registration under section 11 or section 12 of the Act shall be supported by an affidavit.

(2) An application for registration under the aforesaid section 11 shall, wherever possible, be accompanied by any documentary evidence available to prove the facts set out in the application.

(3) Before the Minister allows an application for registration under the aforesaid section 11 or section 12, he may require the applicant to furnish such information and proof as the Minister may think necessary.

(4) An application for registration under the aforesaid section 11 shall be supported by three persons, each of whom must be—

- (a) a citizen of Ceylon by descent;
- (b) intimately acquainted with and having a personal knowledge of the applicant and his family, and
- (c) able from his personal knowledge and belief to vouch for the truth of the statements made by the applicant.

15. (1) A certificate of registration issued to a person registered under section 11 of the Act shall as far as possible be in accordance with Form C set out in the Schedule hereto, and such certificate shall not be issued unless a fee of two rupees is paid

(2) A certificate of registration issued to a person registered under section 12 of the Act shall as far as possible be in accordance with Form D set out in the Schedule hereto, and such certificate shall not be issued unless a fee of fifty rupees is paid

Provided that the Minister may in his discretion in any particular case waive the aforesaid fee

16. Where a request is made by letter, for the inclusion of the name of a minor child in any certificate of registration granted under section 11 or section 12 of the Act, such letter shall contain the name and date of birth of such child, and the statements therein shall be supported by an affidavit

17. The oath or affirmation of allegiance and the oath or affirmation of citizenship shall be made within one calendar month from the date of the grant of the certificate of registration, or within such extended time as the Minister in special circumstances may direct.

18. The oaths or affirmations referred to in regulation 17 shall be administered by the Permanent Secretary, a Government Agent, or an Assistant Government Agent.

19. Where a person is unable to read or write in English, before the oath or affirmation is administered it shall be explained to him by the officer administering it

20. The oaths and affirmations referred to in regulation 17 shall as far as possible be in accordance with the Forms E, F, G and H set out in the Schedule hereto

21. A register of persons granted citizenship by registration shall be maintained in the office of the Minister, and shall as far as possible be in accordance with Form I set out in the Schedule hereto.

22. (1) A declaration of renunciation of citizenship, under section 18 of the Act, shall as far as possible be in accordance with Form J set out in the Schedule hereto, and shall be sent to the Minister.

(2) The declaration referred to in paragraph (1) shall be supported by an affidavit.

23. (1) A declaration of retention of citizenship under section 20 (1) of the Act shall, as far as possible, be in accordance with Form K set out in the Schedule hereto, and shall be sent to the Minister.

(2) The declaration referred to in paragraph (1) shall be supported by an affidavit.

24. (1) A declaration of resumption of citizenship under section 20 (2) of the Act shall, as far as possible, be in accordance with Form L set out in the Schedule hereto, and shall be sent to the Minister.

(2) The declaration referred to in paragraph (1) shall be supported by an affidavit.

25. Every applicant for registration under section 5 (2), for a certificate under section 6, or for registration under section 11 or section 12, of the Act, shall apply on the appropriate form, obtained from the Ministry of Defence and External Affairs or from the office of a consular officer.

26. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—

“Act” means the Citizenship Act, No. 18 of 1948,

“consular officer” means consular officer of Ceylon,

“Minister” means the Minister of Defence and External Affairs, and

“Permanent Secretary” means the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Defence and External Affairs

RULES made by the Post and Telegraph Benefit Association under section 11 of the Post and Telegraph Benefit Association (Incorporation) Ordinance, No 14 of 1947, and confirmed by the Minister of Finance by virtue of the powers vested in him by that section as modified by the Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,773 of September 24, 1947.

Rules.

1 In these rules, unless the context Interpretation.
otherwise requires—

“Committee” means the Committee of Management,

“Corporation” means the Post and Telegraph Benefit Association; and

“Post Office” means the Ceylon Post and Telegraph Department.

2 The Committee shall consist of— Committee of Management.

(1) the following ex-officio members, namely,

(a) the President of the Corporation (hereinafter referred to as the “President.”),

(b) the Honorary Secretary of the Corporation (hereinafter referred to as the “Secretary”), and

(c) the Honorary Treasurer of the Corporation (hereinafter referred to as the “Treasurer.”), and

(2) twelve other members.

3. (1) The members of the Committee shall be elected each year at the annual general meeting of the Corporation by the members of the Corporation present at such meeting from among the members of the Corporation. Provided however that any member who is not employed in Colombo shall not be elected as an ex-officio or other member of the Committee. And provided further that no member of the Corporation who is not a staff officer or an officer with less than 20 years service shall be elected as the President. Election of Committee.

(2) The members of the Committee, and the Auditor shall be elected by a secret ballot. The name of each person seeking election as a member of the Committee or as an Auditor, duly proposed and seconded in writing by two or more members of the Corporation, shall be received by the President at least 10 days before the annual general meeting together with the written consent of the person seeking election.

(3) The Secretary shall at least seven days before the annual general meeting announce by special notices in the buildings of the Head Quarters Offices in Colombo and the Post and Telegraph Library, the nominations received together with the names of the proposers and seconders

4 (1) Meetings for the transaction of the business of the Committee shall be held at least once a month Committee meetings and Emergency Committee Meetings

(2) The Secretary shall, on the written requisition of two members of the Committee, summon a meeting of the Committee at any time for the transaction of such business as mentioned in the requisition.

5 (1) The President shall, whenever present, preside at all meetings of the Committee, and in his absence, the members present shall elect a Chairman *pro tem*.

(2) The President, or the Chairman *pro tem*, shall have a casting vote in addition to his original vote. Who shall preside at Committee Meetings, and Quorum necessary

(3) Seven members of the Committee shall form a quorum at any meeting thereof.

6. The Postmaster-General shall be the ex-officio Patron of the Corporation. Patron.

Membership and Application therefor.

7. (1) Every male officer of the Post Office who is not more than 30 years of age and who holds a pensionable appointment shall be eligible for admission as a member of the Corporation.

(2) Every application for membership shall be in such form as may from time to time be prescribed by the Committee, and shall be addressed to the Secretary who shall submit the same to the Committee for consideration.

(3) The Committee may decide to accept or reject any application for membership without assigning reasons for so doing, and such decision shall be final.

(4) Membership of every member admitted under these rules shall commence from the first day of the month to which his first contribution is credited in the Corporation's books, and the name of such person shall be inscribed in the Register of Members as from that date.

(5) Any member who has made an incorrect statement in his application for membership shall forfeit all monies paid by him into the Corporation and shall cease to be a member unless he satisfies the Committee that such incorrect statement was not wilfully made.

Pass Book

8. (1) Every member shall be supplied with a Pass Book by the Treasurer at the time of admission as member.

(2) A member shall ordinarily retain possession of the Pass Book, but shall forward it once a year at the beginning of the month of January to the Treasurer. The Treasurer shall make therein all entries necessary to show the amount standing to the credit of the member in the books of the Corporation at the conclusion of the financial year, and shall return the Pass Book to the member as soon as possible.

(3) The Treasurer may also, whenever necessary, require any member to forward to him the Pass Book supplied to such member, and such request shall be complied with by the member. The Pass Book shall be returned to the member as soon as possible.

(4) No member shall make any entry in any Pass Book supplied to him.

Contributions.

9. (1) Every member shall pay to the funds of the Corporation a monthly contribution of Rs. 2, Rs. 4, Rs. 6, Rs. 8, Rs. 10, Rs. 15 or Rs. 20. The amount which a member wishes to contribute monthly shall be stated in his application form.

(2) Every member shall pay an admission fee of Re. 1.50 with his first monthly contribution.

(3) Each monthly contribution shall be payable on or before the last day of the month in respect of which such contribution is due.

(4) Any member may, after giving at least two months notice in writing to the Secretary, vary, with effect from the first day of any financial year, the amount of his monthly contribution payable under paragraph (1).

Retirement from Public Service.

10. On the retirement of any member of the Corporation from the public service, he shall cease to be a member of the Corporation from the date of retirement, and the amount standing to his credit in the books of the Corporation shall, after deducting therefrom any sum due by him to the Corporation, be paid to him within three months from the date of his satisfying the Committee (if necessary by production of a letter from the head of the Department in which he was employed at the time of retirement) of his retirement.

Payment on Death.

11. (1) On the death of a member of the Corporation while employed in the public service—

(a) the amount standing to his credit in the books of the Corporation at the time of his death after deducting therefrom any sum due by him to the Corporation, and

(b) if his name has been in such books for a period of one year or more prior to his death, a donation from all members of the Corporation who are liable at the time of his death to pay such donation, computed at the rate of fifty cents from each such member,

shall be paid to the person or persons entitled under paragraph (2) to receive such amount and donation, if any, within three months from the date of such person or persons satisfying the Committee of the death of the member.

(2) The persons or person entitled to receive the sums of money payable under paragraph (1) shall be—

(a) the person or persons nominated by the deceased member of the Corporation, or

(b) if no nomination has been made—

(i.) where such member left a widow and children, the widow and children, the widow being entitled to receive half a share of such sums of money and the children the other half share, or

(ii.) where such member left only a widow, the widow, or

(iii.) where such member left only children, the children, or

(iv.) where such member left no widow or children, his lawful heirs.

(3) For the purposes of paragraph (2) (a), a member of the Corporation may nominate his wife or children (if he has no children any adopted child) and where he has no wife or children, one or more of his relations. The name of every person nominated by a member of the Corporation shall be entered in the register kept for the purpose by the Corporation as well as in the Pass Book of that member. No nomination shall be valid unless such nomination has been made and registered at least one month prior to the date of his death. Upon the marriage of any member of the Corporation, any nomination made by him prior to the date of his marriage shall be invalid unless and until such member has nominated some other person in place of the person previously nominated.

(4) If any person entitled to receive the whole or any part of the sums of money payable under paragraph (1) is a minor, the whole or such part thereof shall be deposited in the Ceylon Savings Bank for the benefit of the minor and be subject to the rules of that Bank in regard to such deposits.

Liability to Contribute to Donations

12. (1) All members of the Corporation other than members whose names have been in the Register of Members for less than one year at the date of the death of a member of the Corporation shall be liable to contribute to donations payable in respect of that member.

(2) Any donation payable under rule 11 shall be recovered from the members liable to pay such donation by a special call and credited to the funds of the Corporation.

Protection of Committee

13. If upon the death of any member of the Corporation, any payment is made under rule 10 or rule 11 to any person or persons who at the time appear to the Committee to be entitled to the same, such payment shall be valid and effectual against any demand made upon the Corporation or the Committee by any other person or persons in respect of the sum of money payable in respect of that member.

Resignation or Dismissal from Public Service

14. Any member who resigns or who is dismissed from the public service shall *ipso facto* cease to be a member of the Corporation, and shall be entitled to be paid, within three months from the date of his satisfying the Committee of such resignation or dismissal, the amount standing to his credit in the books of the Corporation, after deducting therefrom any sum due by him to the Corporation.

15 (1) Any member who desires to resign from the Corporation while still in the public service shall give one calendar year's notice in writing to the Secretary. Upon the expiry of such period, he shall cease to be a member and shall be entitled to be paid within three months from the date of his resignation, the amount standing to his credit in the books of the Corporation after deducting therefrom any sum due by him to the Corporation.

(2) A notice of resignation under paragraph (1) shall not be accepted from any member of the Corporation who is in default in payment of any instalment of principal or interest on any loan granted to him by the Corporation under rule 17 or in arrears of any monthly contribution or death donation.

(3) No loan shall be granted to any member of the Corporation who has given notice of resignation under paragraph (1).

16 (1) Any member of the Corporation who is transferred from the Post Office to any other Government Department shall pay his monthly contributions and any other sum that may be due from him to the Corporation to the Treasurer in the manner approved by the Committee.

(2) If any member of the Corporation, who is transferred from the Post Office, decides within six months from the date of his transfer to resign from the Corporation he shall, notwithstanding anything in the provisions of rule 15, be entitled to be paid within three months of the receipt of his letter of resignation, the amount standing to his credit in the books of the Corporation, after deducting therefrom any sum due by him to the Corporation.

17. (1) It shall be lawful for any two of the ex-officio members of the Committee, one of whom shall be the President, to grant a loan, which shall bear interest, to any member of the Corporation. Provided however that the amount of such loan together with the maximum interest thereon shall not exceed ninety per cent of the sum standing to the credit of such member in the books of the Corporation. And provided further that no loan shall be granted to any member who is in arrears of, or fails to pay, any monthly contribution or special call or any instalment of the principal or interest on any loan previously granted to him.

(2) Not more than forty per centum of the liquid assets of the Corporation shall be used for the purpose of granting loans under this rule.

18. (1) Every loan granted under rule 17 shall be repayable in consecutive monthly instalments each of which shall not be less than one-fortieth the amount of the loan or less than five rupees.

(2) Repayment of any loan shall commence from the month following that in which the loan was granted.

(3) Any member who desires to repay a loan in a fewer number of instalments than the maximum number allowed by this rule, shall indicate the number of such instalments in his application for the loan.

(4) Nothing herein contained in paragraph (1) of this rule shall prevent the earlier repayment of a loan.

(5) Interest on a loan shall be payable from the date of the grant of the loan and shall be calculated at the rate of half per centum per mensem on the amount outstanding during any calendar month.

(6) For the purposes of this rule a fractional part of a month shall be reckoned as a whole month.

(7) Notwithstanding anything in the aforesaid provisions of this rule, no monthly instalment shall be recoverable in the month of December.

19. (1) The amount payable by a member of the Corporation in any month as a contribution or a special call or an instalment on account of a loan or interest thereon, shall be deducted from the salary of that member for that month and handed over to the Treasurer, who shall credit such amount to the funds of the Corporation, but

Resignation.

the responsibility of seeing that any such amount is duly deducted and handed over shall nevertheless rest on that member.

(2) If any amount payable by a member as a monthly contribution or as a special call or as an instalment on account of a loan or as interest thereon is not properly deducted and handed over as aforesaid, or if it is not remitted to the Treasurer by a member of the Corporation liable to pay the same within fifteen days after the date on which it falls due, such member shall for every such default pay a fine of such amount, not exceeding one quarter of his monthly contribution, as the Committee may determine. Every such fine shall be credited to the funds of the Corporation.

(3) If any member of the Corporation is in default of any sum payable by him for a period of three months or if the member neglects to pay any fine under paragraph (2), he shall *ipso facto* cease to be a member of the Corporation and shall at the end of one year be entitled to be paid the amount standing to his credit in the books of the Corporation after deducting therefrom any sum due by him to the Corporation.

(4) In the case of any member of the Corporation who is away from the Island on leave and has been in default of any sum payable by him for a period not exceeding one year, such member shall, notwithstanding anything in paragraph (3), continue to be a member of the Corporation if he pays his arrears within one month from the date of his return to the Island.

20. Where the monthly contribution made by any member of the Corporation is in excess of the minimum contribution of Rs. 2, the Corporation may, at the request of such member, refund to him at intervals of not less than five years, the amount he has contributed for that period in excess of the minimum contribution if such amount is not less than Rs 500. The amount so refunded shall be debited to the account of that member.

21. On satisfactory proof of the death of any member of the Corporation, whose nominee, widow, children or lawful heirs are entitled to a donation under rule 11, being furnished to the ex-officio members of the Committee, it shall be lawful for any two ex-officio members, one of whom shall be the President, to grant, upon application made in that behalf, an advance not exceeding Rs 200 (on which no interest shall be charged) from the funds of the Corporation, to the nominee, widow, children or lawful heirs, as the case may be, to meet the funeral and other expenses. Any advance so granted shall be deducted from the sums of money payable in respect of the deceased member under rule 11.

22. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to—

- (a) receive all sums of money payable to the Corporation,
- (b) pay subject to the provisions of these rules all claims, loans, advances and expenses authorised by the Committee, and
- (c) to prepare and submit monthly to the Committee an account of the transactions of the Committee.

23. All cheques and orders against the funds of the Corporation shall be signed by the President and either the Secretary or the Treasurer. Provided however that where the President has intimated in writing that he cannot sign cheques for a period of over a week owing to sickness or absence from Colombo, another member of the Committee duly appointed by the Committee may sign in place of the President only such cheques as are in respect of urgent loans or funeral expenses referred to in rule 21. Papers in connection with all such cheques together with the relevant cheque counterfoils shall be presented to the President on his return for his information.

25. Any member may, on giving seven days' notice to the Secretary in writing, inspect the books and accounts of the Corporation.

Financial Year.

26. The financial year of the Corporation shall commence on the first day of October in any one year and shall end on the thirtieth day of September in the following year.

Division of profits.

27. The profits accruing to the funds of the Corporation, which are declared by the dividend decided upon at the annual general meeting, shall be placed annually to the credit of the members in the books of the Corporation in proportion to the amount standing to the credit of each member at the close of the preceding financial year.

Winding up of Corporation.

28. The Corporation shall not be wound up voluntarily except with the consent of at least three-fourths of the members of the Corporation. If the Corporation is wound up, the funds of the Corporation shall, after payment of all claims, be divided among the members in proportion to the amount standing to the credit of each member in the books of the Corporation.

1. The regulations relating to the Post Office Savings Bank published in *Gazette* No. 5,264 of December 29, 1939, and therein referred to as "rules and regulations", as amended

(2) A depositor may deposit any sum which is a multiple of twenty-five cents in the Post Office Savings Bank by affixing to a stamp booklet or stamp card savings stamp of a value equal to that sum and by surrendering such booklet or card to any Post Office transacting business of that Bank.

In this paragraph—

“Savings Stamps” means savings stamps of the value of ten cents, twenty-five cents, fifty cents, or one rupee issued under any law in force relating to savings certificates, and

“stamp booklet” or “stamp card” means a booklet or card, as the case may be, which is used for affixing savings stamps and which is issued for the purposes of this paragraph at any post office transacting business of the Post Office Savings Bank.

2. Notwithstanding anything in the aforesaid regulations as amended by regulation 1 of these regulations, stamp forms which could hitherto be used by depositors of the Post Office Savings Bank for the purpose of making deposits in that Bank by affixing to such forms unused five cents stamps of a value equal to the amount of the deposits, may be used for that purpose subject to the condition that the amount of a deposit made by the surrender of such forms on any one occasion shall not be less than one rupee and the number of unused five cents stamps affixed to each such form surrendered for making the deposit shall not be less than ten.

Savings stamps perforated with initials or marks or in any way defaced shall not be accepted.”;

(3) in regulation 5 (1), by the substitution in sub-paragraph (a), for the words “of a Savings Certificate of any denomination”, of the words “of a five-years Savings Certificate or a twelve-years Savings Certificate of any denomination”

2. Notwithstanding anything in the aforesaid regulations as amended by regulation 1 of these regulations, a stamp card which could hitherto be used for the purpose of purchasing a five-rupees Savings Certificate may, if it has affixed thereto unused postage stamps which are of the denominations indicated on such card and which have a total value equal to the purchase price of a five-rupees Savings Certificate, be accepted at any Post Office as payment for such Savings Certificate.
