EXAMINATION FOR INTERPRETERS.

APPLICATIONS are invited from officers of the General Clerical Service holding appointments as Interpreters in Courts and from officers in Grade II. of the Executive Clerical Class and of the General Clerical Class of the General Clerical Service who wish to sit for an examination in both Sinhalese and Tamil with a view to qualifying for appointment as Court Interpreters. The examination will be held in Colombo on April 23, 1949.

2. Applications should be forwarded through the Heads of the Departments concerned to reach the Director of Education not later than March 3, 1949, and should be sent under registered cover only.

3. Batta and travelling expenses will be paid to outstation candidates who obtain the following minimum marks at the examination:—

- 30 per cent. in English.
- 30 per cent. of the aggregate marks in Sinhalese.
- 30 per cent. of the aggregate marks in Tamil.

4. The syllabus of the examination will be as follows:—

Written Examination.

A. English Language (one paper of 2 hours).
Questions will be set to test the candidates' (a) power of expression, (b) comprehension of passages of average difficulty (selected from newspapers, official publications, or books by modern authors), and (c) knowledge of idioms of the language.

(N.B.—No questions in grammar will be included)

- B. (i) Translations from English into Sinhalese (one paper of 1½ hours).
- (ii) Translations from English into Tamil (one paper of 1½ hours).

Candidates will be required to translate one or more of the following:—

A judgment in a Magistrate's Court or District Court case, an extract from an Ordinance, by-law, Gazette Notification or Hansard or other Government publication.

Candidates will also be required to translate English idiomatic phrases.

- C. (i.) Translation from Sinhalese into English (one paper of 1½ hours).
- (ii.) Translation from Tamil into English (one paper of 1½ hours).

Candidates will be required to translate into English—

- (i.) An article from a newspaper or modern prose book ;
- (ii.) A letter, petition, deed or report of average difficulty.

Questions will also be set to test the candidates' ability to idiomatically express into correct idiomatic English.

Notes.—All parts of the question paper under this section be in manuscript.

Oral Examination.

Candidates will be further tested by an oral examination following will receive attention—

Translation of ordinary technical terms in current use ;
of expressions in both languages ; pronunciations,
of idioms and idiomatic phrases in both English
the vernacular.

Candidates will be expected to dictate off-hand the
contents of an English letter, report, or other official
put into their hands for the first time.

5. To obtain a pass in the examination a candidate must

English	40 per cent.
Sinhalese	40 per cent. of aggregate marks and not less than 30 per cent. in each subject.
Tamil	40 per cent. of aggregate marks and not less than 30 per cent. in each subject.

7. The rules relating to the payment of allowances to
Interpreters are as follows :—

- (1) An allowance of Rs. 10 per mensem will be paid to
officers of the General Clerical Service other than
members of the Special Grade of that Service, who
pass examinations in both Sinhalese and Tamil and
who are employed as Court Interpreters. Officers
employed as Additional Interpreters will not,
however, be eligible to draw the allowance.
- (2) The payment of the allowance will be subject to the
following conditions :—
 - (a) no Interpreter shall draw the allowance until
he has passed the examination to be held by
the Education Department in both Sinhalese
and Tamil ;
 - (b) he shall have interpreted to the satisfaction of the
Judge during a period of three months. If
he does not satisfy the judge he shall not
draw the Interpreter's allowance even though
he passed the examination. Failure to
satisfy the Judge will generally mean transfer
to some other post in the Clerical Service but
not necessarily ;
 - (c) if an officer who has passed the examination and
drawn the allowance is transferred and
employed on other work he may on being
re-transferred to an Interpreter's post, be
paid the allowance without further examina-
tion provided that his absence from a post
of Court Interpreter is less than one year.
If the period of absence is over one year he
must interpret to the satisfaction of the Judge
during a period of three months before the
allowance can be paid ;
 - (d) the allowance shall be paid from the date of
passing the examination or the date of appoint-
ment to a post of Interpreter, whichever
is the later ;
 - (e) the allowance in question will not be paid during
the period of three months referred to in (b).
If the Interpreter satisfies the Judge, he will
draw the allowance retrospectively as from the
date laid down in (d).
- (3) Officers now employed as Interpreters will be required
to take the examination before they can draw the
allowance.
- (4) Absence on the days taken up by the examination will
be regarded as on duty.

RULES GOVERNING THE PROCEDURE RELATING TO THE POSTPONEMENT OF EXECUTION OF SENTENCES OF DEATH UPON APPLICATION FOR SPECIAL LEAVE TO APPEAL TO THE PRIVY COUNCIL.

THE Rules set out below which have been approved by the Hon. the Prime Minister are published for general information.

Rules governing the Procedure relating to the Postponement of Execution of Sentences of Death upon Application for Special Leave to appeal to the Privy Council.

1. The execution of a sentence of death will not ordinarily be postponed to enable the condemned prisoner to apply to the Privy Council for special leave to appeal unless an Advocate acting for the prisoner certifies in writing to the Governor-General that in his opinion there are reasonable grounds for an appeal in that there has been a disregard of the forms of legal process or some violation of the principles of natural justice or that otherwise substantial and grave injustice has been done.

2. If intimation is received by the Governor-General from or on behalf of a convict that it is intended to apply to the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council for special leave to appeal, and such intimation is accompanied by the certificate referred to in paragraph 1, the execution of the sentence will be postponed and a date, four weeks later, will be fixed before which proof must be furnished to the Governor-General that the necessary instructions and funds have been sent by air mail to a solicitor or firm of solicitors in London and the necessary papers by registered ordinary mail. The convict and his adviser will be informed of the date so fixed, and they will be informed at the same time that unless the application for special leave is lodged in the Privy Council Office before a further date fixed by the High Commissioner for Ceylon in London and communicated to the London solicitors, the execution will not be further postponed.

3. If sentences of death have been passed on more than one person in the same case and if intimation is received from, or on behalf of, only one or more but not all of them of an intention to apply for leave to appeal to the Privy Council, and such intimation is accompanied by the certificate referred to in paragraph 1, the execution of the sentence will be postponed not only in the case of the person or persons from whom, or on whose behalf, such intimation has been received, but also in the case of the other person or persons from whom, or on whose behalf, no such intimation has been received.

4. Whenever an intimation is received of the intention of a person condemned to death to apply to the Privy Council for leave to appeal, a statement of the case with copies of all necessary documents (all in triplicate) will be prepared in the Attorney-General's Department and forwarded at the earliest opportunity to the High Commissioner for Ceylon in London.

5. If proof is not furnished before the date fixed that the necessary papers, instructions and funds have been sent to a solicitor or firm of solicitors in London, the execution will not be further postponed unless the Governor-General is satisfied that the delay is due to no fault of the convict or his adviser. If in any special case, the Governor-General for this reason allows an extension of the date for furnishing of proof, the further date within which proof must be furnished will be intimated to the convict or his adviser.

6. If proof is furnished before the date fixed, the convict or his adviser will be required to intimate the name of the solicitor or firm of solicitors to whom the papers, instructions and funds have been sent and the registered numbers of the packages containing such papers, instructions and funds; and the name of the solicitor or firm of solicitors, the date of despatch of the papers, &c. and the registered numbers of the packages will be communicated to the High Commissioner for Ceylon in London by telegram.

7. After proof is furnished that the necessary papers, instructions and funds have been sent to a solicitor or firm of solicitors in London, the execution will be postponed from time to time until intimation is received by the Government from the High Commissioner that the application for special leave has not been lodged in the Privy Council Office by the date fixed, or by such further date as may have been fixed by the High Commissioner, or that the application has been dismissed by the Judicial Committee.

8. On receipt of the telegram referred to in paragraph 6, the High Commissioner will inquire from the prisoner's London solicitors whether they are prepared to proceed with the case, and on receipt of a reply that they will proceed, the High Commissioner will fix a date by which the application must be lodged in the Privy Council Office. This date will be communicated to the prisoner's London solicitors and telegraphed to the Government. If the solicitors do not reply that they will proceed, the Government will be informed by telegram and the execution will not be further delayed.

9. When a petition has been lodged in the Privy Council Office, the High Commissioner will inform the Government of the fact by telegram.

10. The High Commissioner will inform the Government of developments in the Privy Council in any case which presents unusual features.

11. The High Commissioner will communicate to the Government by telegram the result of an application to the Privy Council for special leave to appeal, and will also forward in due course a copy of the Order in Council.

12. In every case where the High Commissioner has been informed of the postponement of execution of a sentence owing to the convict's intention to apply to the Privy Council for special leave to appeal, the High Commissioner will also be informed in due course by telegram that the sentence has been carried out or has been commuted, as the case may be.

Scholarships in Forestry.

THE question of awarding three scholarships tenable for a period of 2 years from April 1, 1949, at an Indian Forest College, is under consideration. Applications, in the form prescribed below, will be received up to February 5, 1949, by the undersigned from those willing to be considered.

2. The course of study is designed for the training of Staff Grade Forest Officers.

- (e) before final selection, pass a medical examination designed to test his physical fitness to undergo a course of study and to serve as a forest officer in Ceylon.

5. A candidate selected for an award must enter into a bond with the Conservator of Forests in such amount as may be prescribed undertaking to repay to the Government the amount expended on his scholarship in the event of his failing to complete the course, obtaining the Diploma of the Indian Forest College, or on completion of the course failing to take up appointment in the Forest Department, Ceylon, or after taking up appointment failing to serve for a period of not less than 5 years.

6. Selected candidates may be required to undergo a preliminary training in the Ceylon Forest Department before proceeding to India. No salary or allowance will be paid during this period.
