Conditions of Service—Hospital Nursing Service

1. Candidates for appointment as Pupil Nurses will be selected on the results of a competitive examination, which will be held in Colombo. The date of examination will be notified to all eligible candidates by letter in due course.

2. Method of application:—

- (a) Application for admission to the examination must be made as per specimen form shown above.
- (b) Stamps to the value of Rs. 5 must be affixed to each application and cancelled by the applicant's signature on them.

(c) The form when completed should be sent to the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services, Colombo, to reach him not later than February 25, 1949, and should be accompanied by—

- (i) A copy of the birth certificate (certificate of birth issued for purposes of the Code for Assisted Schools will not be accepted.)
- (ii) Copies of educational certificates required by section (iii) below.
- (iii) Copies of two testimonials of good character, one of which must be from the Principal of the School or College which the candidate last attended.

3. Conditions of eligibility:—

(i) Every candidate must be a Ceylonese. For the purpose of this examination a Ceylonese is—

- (a) A citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration and
- (b) A person who has applied or intends to apply for citizenship of Ceylon by registration, and is deemed by the Minister of Defence and External Affairs to have a *prima facie* entitlement to such citizenship.

(ii) She must be over 17 and under 25 years of age on March 19, 1949.

(iii) She must have passed the Cambridge Junior Certificate Examination or the Junior Domestic Science Certificate Examination (1st or 2nd Division) or possess higher educational qualifications.

(iv) She must be of good character

(v) She must be of sound constitution and physically fit to serve in any part of the Island.

(vi) She must be at least 4 ft 8 inches in height.

4. Rejection of applications:

Applications that do not conform to the above requirements will not be considered

5. Refund of the value of stamps.

6. Subjects of examination.

The *viva voce* test will be conducted by a Board appointed by the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services. The date, time, and place of the test will be notified to the candidates. The originals of certificates referred to in section 2 (c) (i), (ii) and (iii) should be produced by the candidate at the *viva voce* test.

* Other candidates will be given the option of offering Sinhalese, or Tamil, or Arabic, or a Special paper in English.

7. Medical examination

Selected candidates will be required to undergo a medical examination as to physical fitness to serve as a nurse in any part of the Island. No candidate will be finally selected who does not pass the medical examination.

8. Admission to the Nurses' Training School, Colombo

Candidates will be admitted to the Training School in their order of merit in the examination according to the number of vacancies for pupil nurses. They will be trained at the school where furnished quarters will be provided. The course of training will last three years. Pupils found unsatisfactory at any time during the period of training will be discontinued from the school.

9. Provident Fund:

The posts are non-pensionable, but candidates will be expected to contribute to the Public Service Provident Fund a sum of money equivalent to 5 per cent. of their salary, the Government contributing 7½ per cent. Candidates will, however, be brought into the fund only after they are appointed as qualified nurses.
