WHEREAS a resolution authorising a sum of Rs. 10,000,000 to be borrowed within Ceylon by the issue of savings certificates under the Savings Certificates Ordinance, No. 7 of 1946, as modified by the Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,773 of September 24, 1947, has been passed by the House of Representatives under section 3 of the Ordinance and has been published in *Gazette* No. 9,938 of January 13, 1949:

## SCHOLARSHIPS FOR STUDIES IN ACCOUNTANCY

A competitive examination for recruitment of Underguards in the Ceylon Government Railway will be held in Colombo on April 9, 1949.
