Regulation

The Code of Regulations for Assisted Vernacular and Bilingual Schools published in the *Supplement to Gazette* No. 7,722 of July 12, 1929, is hereby amended in regulation 59 (as amended by regulation published in *Gazette* No. 9,724 of June 27, 1947), by the addition at the end of paragraph (b) (i) thereof of the following:—

“Where a training school is being maintained in two divisions in different localities with the permission of the Minister granted on account of the difficulty of complying with the obligation to give instruction to Sinhalese and Tamil students in Sinhalese and Tamil respectively, each such division shall be deemed to be a separate school solely for the purpose of calculating the number of teachers

Provided, however, that in the case of any such training school one person only may be and be designated Principal, and no person other than the person so designated shall be considered to be Principal for the purposes of the grant payable in respect of such school

The Code of Regulations for Assisted English Schools published in the *Supplement to Gazette* No. 7,728 of August 16, 1929, is hereby amended by the substitution, for regulation 40B (inserted by regulation published in *Gazette* No. 9,159 of August 20, 1943), of the following new regulation:—

“40B If the total period or periods of leave taken by a teacher during any school year, other than sick leave obtained on medical certificates, exceeds twelve weeks, the grant payable in respect of such teacher's salary for that year shall be proportionate to the number of sessions during which he worked in the school in that year.”

REGULATIONS made by the Principal Collector of Customs under section 106 of the Customs Ordinance (Chapter 185)

REGULATIONS

The regulations made by the Principal Collector of Customs under section 106 of the Customs Ordinance (Chapter 185) and published in *Gazette* No. 9,845 of March 24, 1948, are hereby amended by the substitution of the following new regulations —

Passengers' Baggage

1. Passengers' baggage as hereinafter defined is exempt from import duty

2. For the purpose of section 106 of the Customs Ordinance and of these regulations—

“passengers' baggage” means the *bona fide* baggage which a passenger wears or brings with him on his arrival in Ceylon or which is landed in Ceylon within one month before or after his arrival or within such further period as the Principal Collector may in the circumstances of each case deem reasonable but does not include any article which is—

- (a) imported for purposes of sale, or
- (b) the property of any person other than the passenger or member of his family travelling with him, or
- (c) to be given as a gift to any other person;

“*bona fide* baggage” means such wearing apparel and personal effects, as are the property of and in the personal use of the passenger or the members of his family travelling with him, and of reasonable value or quantity according to the condition of life and rank of the passengers and in the case of Ceylon residents the period of their absence from Ceylon

3. Subject to the provisions of regulations 2 and 6, the following articles shall be deemed to fall within the category of “*bona fide* baggage”—

- (i) Uniform cases, trunks, suitcases, fitted dressing cases, if they form reasonable receptacles for other *bona fide* passengers' baggage, one trousers press, and the like
 - (ii) Bedding and travelling rugs (not floor rugs or carpets)
 - (iii) Two woollen blankets
 - (iv) One deck chair.
 - (v) One camp bed
 - (vi) One small folding table
 - (vii) A reasonable amount of provisions for immediate use on arrival
 - (viii) Articles of silver, plated ware or glass ware in purely personal use, e.g., a cigarette case, a lady's silver-backed mirror or a scent bottle, a glass or silver tooth brush case, a dressing case with fittings
 - (ix) One watch and one travelling clock or time-piece.
 - (x) One pair of binoculars or telescope or any other similar article
 - (xi) Jewellery in personal use brought by passengers in reasonable value or quantity according to the condition in life and rank of the passenger, and in the case of Ceylon residents the period of their absence from Ceylon
 - (xii) One sewing machine if brought as part of a lady passenger's baggage
 - (xiii) One perambulator } If brought as part of
 - (xiv) One baby's cot } a child passenger's
 - (xv) Toys and toy carts } baggage.
 - (xvi) One portable musical instrument
 - (xvii) Twenty gramophone records, if brought with a gramophone, or six records without a gramophone
 - (xviii) One radio set (but not a radiogram) per family provided it has been used for at least one year
 - (xix) One used still camera and one used cinema camera
 - (xx) Used instruments, apparatus and appliances for the professional use of the passenger
 - (xxi) One photographic apparatus (other than a camera) with a reasonable quantity of films.
 - (xxii) One set table tennis
 - (xxiii) Two badminton rackets with two presses
 - (xxiv) Two tennis rackets with two presses
 - (xxv) Two cricket bats with bags
 - (xxvi) Two hockey sticks
 - (xxvii) One set of golf clubs
 - (xxviii) Twenty polo sticks
 - (xxix) Two fishing rods including tackle
 - (xxx) Other sports goods up to Rs 50 in value
 - (xxxi) One used typewriter
 - (xxxii) One used bicycle
 - (xxxiii) Two used saddles and two used bridles
 - (xxxiv) One used adding or recording machine
 - (xxxv) Personal effects of a person who has died on the voyage to Ceylon or of a Ceylon resident who has died abroad
4. The following articles on which duty must be paid in all cases shall not be deemed to fall within the category of “*bona fide* baggage”—
- (a) Arms and ammunition;
 - (b) Alcoholic liquor exceeding two quarts and perfumed spirits exceeding one pint;
 - (c) Cigars, cigarettes and beedies exceeding a total of 50, 100, and 100 in number respectively, whether in open or unopened boxes, snuff exceeding four ounces in weight; and other tobacco exceeding 8 ounces in weight;

- (d) Pianos, pianolas, harmoniums, gramophones and phonographs and records therefor (except as laid down in items (xvi) and (xvii) or regulation 3), carriages, motor cars, motor cycles and side cars;
- (e) Articles for household use such as furniture, pictures, carpets, glass ware, crockery, cutlery, cooking utensils, household linen, lamps, house furnishings, curios, foodstuffs, silver and plated ware except such articles (other than lamps, house furnishings, curios and carpets) as shall appear to be required for the personal use of the passenger whilst travelling or immediately upon arrival at his destination

Provided that the following articles shall, if imported for the household use of a passenger coming to Ceylon to reside for the first time or returning after not less than 3 months out of the Island, shall if imported for the use of the passenger's household be passed free of duty up to the limit of value shown against each item

The above free allowances shall be granted only once to each passenger in respect of any one voyage within a period of two years but shall be additional to any goods exempted under regulation 3, as per example those specified in item (viii)

5 Free allowances under regulation 4 shall be granted to each adult passenger provided that where members of one family are travelling together, free allowances shall not be granted to more than two such members unless each member of the family in excess of two proves that he is going to live in a separate establishment, in which case he shall make a separate declaration and claim a separate allowance

6 The concession of exemption from duty authorized under these regulations in respect of certain goods in limited quantities or up to limited total values is not additional to any exemption which may be claimed by a passenger for any articles on proof of its previous importation. For example, if a passenger produces proof of previous importation of one camera, the additional concession will cover only one other camera, if he produces proof of previous importation of two fishing rods, no further concession in respect of fishing rods will be made if he proves previous importation of silver ware valued at (a) Rs 400, (b) Rs 600, (c) Rs 1,200 his additional free allowance under these regulations in respect of any other silver ware imported by him will be respectively (a) Rs 350, (b) Rs 150, (c) nil.

7 Passengers' baggage will be passed after examination by a Customs Officer and subject to the passenger subscribing to a declaration, if so required before examination is made

8 If the baggage is on the ship's manifest, a document of title must be produced before delivery is allowed
