CUSTOMS NOTIFICATION (DUES)

The Customs Ordinance

IT is hereby notified that the following resolution under section 25 of the Customs Ordinance (Chapter 185), as modified by the Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No 9,773 of September 24, 1947, has been passed by the House of Representatives at its public session on the 3rd March, 1949

Resolution

The Hon the Minister of Finance moved.—

That this House resolves under section 25 of the Customs Ordinance (Chapter 185) as modified by the Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,773 of September 24, 1947, that on and after the date succeeding that on which this resolution is notified in the *Gazette*,

port dues shall be levied and paid on ships arriving at or departing from the several ports of this Island and upon cargo imported into or exported from the port of Colombo, as specified in the schedule hereto, increased by 60 per centum, and subject to the conditions, exceptions and provisions prescribed in that Schedule, in lieu of:—

- (a) the port dues leviable and payable, and
- (b) the conditions, exceptions and provisions in force with regard to the charge and payment of such port dues;

on the date of this resolution

Schedule**PORT DUES***General Provisions*

Notwithstanding anything in this resolution—

- (a) where a vessel has paid port dues for entry inwards or for clearance outwards she shall not be liable for additional port dues for goods carried coastwise during the same voyage;
- (b) a vessel leaving port for a period not exceeding twelve hours for the purpose of trying her machinery or of throwing overboard any damaged cargo shall, for the purpose of this resolution, be deemed to be in port, and shall be liable on re-entry to pay only the full pilotage dues chargeable in respect of such vessel for a first entry into port. The period during which such vessel has been out of port shall, for the purpose of reckoning buoy rent, be considered as part of her stay in port, and
- (c) where a native vessel is compelled by stress of weather to re-enter port within twelve hours of her departure therefrom, no further port dues shall be charged if the Master Attendant certifies that the vessel could not have proceeded on her voyage without unnecessary risk.

Provided that—

(i) vessels which, while in harbour, carry out none but the following operations —

- (a) taking in coal or oil for bunkers ;
- (b) taking in water ;
- (c) taking in or transshipping ship's stores ;
- (d) awaiting or receiving orders ;
- (e) taking in or discharging mails ,
- (f) discharging sick persons, their attendants, and families .
- (g) discharging or taking in crews, or ship's officers or seamen under repatriation ;
- (h) discharging or shipping over-carried cargo ;
- (i) unshipping or re-shipping passengers or cargo for the purpose of going into dock or of undergoing repairs or transshipping passengers or cargo to another vessel when the delay or inconvenience caused by such docking or repairs renders such transshipment necessary ,
- (j) extinguishing a fire on board the vessel and unshipping, re-shipping or transshipping passengers or cargo for the purpose of extinguishing such fire , and
- (k) undergoing inspection or deratisation for the purpose of obtaining a Deratisation Certificate or a Deratisation Exemption Certificate ,

shall be charged a special consolidated rate of Rs. 280 only to cover pilotage, entering dues, use of tugs, and bill of health granted day by day ,

- (ii) vessels employed in the steamer service between Colombo and Tuticorn shall be given a rebate of 10 per centum on the entering dues payable by them for the second and every subsequent entrance by the same vessel within a week ;
- (iii) vessels discharging cargo exceeding 100 shipping tons brought from a foreign port for re-shipment to a foreign port shall be given a rebate of 50 per centum on entering dues ;
- (iv) trawlers operating as such from a Ceylon port and duly registered at a port of registry in Ceylon shall be allowed to compound for entering dues at Colombo for twelve months at 70 cents per ton of the registered tonnage ;

(v) vessels halting outside the harbour but within the limits of the port shall be exempted from the payment of entering dues, provided they carry out none but the following operations —

- (a) visual signalling ,
- (b) receiving orders ,
- (c) discharging sick and injured persons, their attendants, and families ; stowaways and persons overcarried ;

(vi) vessels halting outside the harbour but within the limits of the port, which receive passengers on the written authority of the Principal Collector of Customs and after examination by the Port Surgeon, and not otherwise, shall be charged a special consolidated rate of Rs. 280 ,

(vii) vessels re-entering the harbour within 12 hours of their departure to discharge persons who have been overcarried shall be exempted from the payment of entering dues, if they do not moor ,

(viii) Royal Fleet Auxiliary vessels flying the Blue Ensign with Admiralty Badge, Royal Air Force Auxiliary vessels flying the Royal Air Force Ensign, and British Hired Transports, all of which carry no cargo on which freight is paid, and men-of-war, vessels of the Imperial Light Service, troopships, hospital ships and private yachts (not exceeding 50 tons nett) shall be exempt from all entering dues.

Payment of these charges or of the consolidated special rate shall clear a vessel inwards and outwards, if her stay in the port does not exceed 96 hours.

Over-hour and Buoy Rent Charges

2 If any vessel's stay in port exceeds 96 hours and does not exceed 288 hours one-half of the charges shall be added. If it exceeds 288 hours the same rate shall be paid outwards as was paid inwards, and in addition a buoy rent shall be payable on demand by the Principal Collector of Customs, or if not sooner demanded, on clearance outwards, of Rs 27 for every day or part of a day of her stay in port after the expiration of such 288 hours :

Provided that—

(i) buoy rent shall not be payable—

- (a) in respect of any time beyond the said period during which a vessel has stayed in port without discharging or shipping cargo, because she was unable to put to sea without risk, if the Master Attendant is satisfied that such stay was necessary and was not unduly prolonged , or
- (b) in respect of any time during which a vessel is on the slips or in dry dock ; or
- (c) in respect of any time during which any vessel, declared by the Minister by notification in the *Gazette* to be a reserved vessel, is kept in port as a reserve vessel to maintain the regularity of the mail service or for other important public service ;

(ii) buoy rent shall be payable at Rs. 7 only per day or part of a day by sailing vessels and native craft of 300 tons burthen and under ; " native craft " , for the purpose of this Schedule, being taken to mean any vessel owned and manned by Ceylonese, Indians, Burmese or Maldivians and employed in trade between any port in Ceylon and any other port in Ceylon, the Maldive Islands, India or Burma ;

(iii) the vessel bearing the annual tribute from the Maldivian Government shall be exempted from payment of buoy rent for one calendar month reckoned from the date of its entry into the harbour ,

(iv) Royal Fleet Auxiliary vessels flying the Blue Ensign with Admiralty Badge, Royal Air Force Auxiliary vessels flying the Royal Air Force Ensign, and British Hired Transports, all of which carry no cargo on which freight is paid and men-of-war, vessels of the Imperial Light Service, troopships, and hospital ships shall be exempt from all over-hour and buoy rent charges ;

(v) private yachts not exceeding 50 tons nett occupying harbour moorings outside the area allotted to the Royal Colombo Yacht Club shall be exempt from these charges but when the period of occupation exceeds 288 hours shall pay buoy rent in respect of the period in excess at Rs. 14 for each continuous period of seven days or part thereof provided the amount payable in respect of any calendar month shall not exceed Rs. 56

Tonnage Dues

3. The following shall be the rates of the tonnage dues payable by ships discharging or loading cargo.—

(1) twenty cents per ton upon all cargo discharged or loaded by vessels up to 200 tons register, forty cents per ton upon all cargo discharged or loaded by vessels above 200 tons register,

(2) thirty-two cents per ton upon all petroleum or liquid fuel in bulk, or coal or coke which may be discharged, 250 gallons of petroleum or liquid fuel being reckoned as a ton for this purpose :
Provided that—

(i) cargo brought to the port for trans-shipment shall be free of dues under this heading if it is not landed or if being landed it is not entered for duty ;

(ii) vessels of 300 tons and under shall be allowed to land or ship 5 tons of cargo free, and vessels of over 300 tons shall be allowed to land or ship 10 tons of cargo free ,

(iii) Royal Fleet Auxiliary vessels flying the Blue Ensign, with Admiralty badge, Royal Air Force Auxiliary vessels flying the Royal Air Force Ensign, and British Hired Transports, all of which carry no cargo on which freight is paid, and men-of-war, troopships, and hospital ships shall be exempt from tonnage dues in respect of any cargo discharged or loaded which is exempt from duty under section 22 of the Customs Ordinance (Chapter 185).

Note.—Tonnage of cargo shall be reckoned according to scales approved and published by the Principal Collector of Customs.

(2) On payment of the above dues, goods shall be allowed to remain at the Wharf for three clear days, exclusive of Sundays and Customs Holidays. Exemptions—Imported Goods

(b) Goods brought from a foreign port for reshipment to a foreign port shall be free of reshipment harbour dues if reshipped within 30 clear days inclusive of Sundays and Customs Holidays.

(3) Goods intended for reshipment, which are deposited in or removed to a reshipment warehouse but are not reshipped within the period specified in sub-paragraph (2)

of this paragraph shall be liable to a single payment of harbour dues at the rates prescribed in sub-paragraph (1) of this paragraph.

(4) Goods intended for reshipment, which remain in an Import Warehouse beyond the period in sub-paragraph (2) of this paragraph shall be liable to Import Harbour Dues until they are removed to a reshipment warehouse or unless special permission is granted by the Principal Collector of Customs for such goods to remain in the import warehouse; and where such permission has been obtained such goods shall be liable only to the payment of harbour dues provided in sub-paragraph (3) of this paragraph. Unless in the opinion of the Principal Collector of Customs there has been unreasonable delay in removal, the date set out in the application for permission to remove such goods to the reshipment warehouse as that upon which it is desired to remove such goods to a reshipment warehouse shall be taken as the date of the actual removal.

(5) Goods intended for reshipment and deposited in a reshipment warehouse shall, if they are not actually reshipped abroad or coastwise but are cleared for home consumption at the port at which they were so deposited, be liable to the same harbour dues as imported goods and such harbour dues shall be payable from the date of landing of the goods.

(6) Coastwise goods which are brought for transshipment or reshipment and do not come within the category of goods mentioned in sub-paragraph (2) of this paragraph, shall, if they are landed, pay both import and export harbour dues, if they are transhipped without being landed, they shall be liable to export harbour dues only.

(7) If opium intended for reshipment is deposited in the Strong Room and not reshipped on the day on which it is so deposited, any reshipment harbour dues payable thereon shall be deemed to be included in the consolidated rate of fifteen cents per package which shall be charged for each day (including day of landing or deposit, day of removal, Sundays and Customs Holidays), during which it remains in the Strong Room, any period less than a day being reckoned as a complete day for this purpose.

Exemptions—Exported Goods

Coal and liquid fuel for bunkers, Government cargo, military baggage, dhobies' bundles, dubashes' supplies, export cargo shut out and relanded in respect of such uncompleted shipments only, stores for British and foreign men-of-war, and all goods which are exempt from duty under sections 21, 22 and 23 of the Customs Ordinance (Chapter 185).

Passengers' baggage unless shipped as cargo shall be exempted from export harbour dues.

Note.—Cubic content of articles charged by measurement shall be reckoned according to Goodfellow's Case Cube Measurement Reckoner or similar book approved by the Principal Collector of Customs.

II—DUES LEVIABLE AT PORTS OTHER THAN COLOMBO

1. The following shall be the rates of port dues leviable per ton burthen on all ships which do not compound for port dues under section 18 of the Customs Ordinance (Chapter 185) —

On entry inwards with cargo or with passengers exceeding in number the proportion of one person for every two tons of burthen }
On clearance outwards with cargo or with passengers exceeding in number the proportion of one person for every two tons of burthen } 8 cents

Provided that in the case of a Mail Steamer the dues whether inwards or outwards, shall not exceed Rs 50 on any one occasion.

Exemptions

2. No port dues shall be liable—

- (a) on entry inwards of any vessel in ballast or with cargo reported for exportation, or overcarried cargo on which dues have already been paid, if the vessel leaves the port without breaking bulk or landing passengers exceeding in number the proportion of one person for every two tons of burthen;
- (b) on clearance of any vessel in ballast or with the original cargo, if the vessel leaves the port without shipping goods or passengers exceeding in number the proportion of one person for every two tons of burthen;
- (c) On any ship of 250 tons of burthen and upwards, not being a mail steamer, landing cargo not exceeding 10 tons, and shipping cargo not exceeding 10 tons,
- (d) on any mail steamer entering or leaving the port of Talaimannar or on any ferry steamer or dhony run in connection with the Indo-Ceylon train service;
- (e) On Royal Fleet Auxiliary vessels flying the Blue Ensign with Admiralty Badge, Royal Air Force Auxiliary vessels flying with the Royal Air Force Ensign and British Hired Transports, all of which carry no cargo on which freight is paid, and men-of-war, vessels of the Imperial Light Service, troopships, hospital ships and private yachts,
- (f) on any vessel entering or leaving the Port of Trincomalee solely on account of the Lighthouse Services.

- (1) direct that warehouse rents shall be charged, demanded and received under that section at the rates fixed by him and set out in the Schedule hereto, increased in every case by 60 per centum, and under the regulations prescribed by him and set out in that Schedule,
- (2) rescind the notification under section 13 (now section 17) of the Ordinance published in *Gazette* No. 8,269 of January 29, 1937, as amended by any subsequent notification

THE RUBBER (NEW PLANTING) (SPECIAL PROVISIONS) ORDINANCE, No. 59 OF 1946

BY virtue of the powers vested in me under section 2 of the Rubber (New Planting) (Special Provisions) Ordinance, No. 59 of 1946, I Somadeva Casinathan, Rubber Controller, do hereby direct that every permit holder shall carry out the measures, specified hereunder, for the prevention of soil erosion on the land on which new-planting rights are being exercised under that permit.

Measures for the prevention of soil erosion

Every holder of a permit for the exercise of new-planting rights shall take steps to comply with the measures specified hereunder, for the prevention of soil erosion on the lands on which such rights are to be or are being exercised.

2. No land on which new-planting rights are to be or are being exercised shall be planted or replanted with rubber until the measures specified hereunder, for the conservation of the soil of those lands have been adopted.

3. (1) Where the person, to whom a permit for the exercise of new planting rights has been issued before the date of publication of these directions in the *Gazette* is planting his land with rubber, he shall adopt before 30th September, 1949, for the conservation of the soil of that land, the measure specified hereunder.

(2) Where a person, to whom a permit for the exercise of new-planting rights is issued on or after the date of publication of these directions in the *Gazette*, desires to plant his land with rubber he shall adopt, before he commences so to plant, the measures set out hereunder, for the conservation of the soil of that land.

Schedule A

Natural drainage lines and storm water drains for the prevention of soil erosion

1. All main natural drainage lines sited along the lowest points, up and down pronounced undulations in the land shall be maintained as leader drains and lines of water flow. They should not be closed, nor should the flow of water down them be prevented. All lateral drains, contour trenches and contour platforms should be so designed that the surplus storm-water they carry spills into existing natural drainage lines, leader or storm-drains.

2. New or additional leader and storm-drains shall not be constructed unless:—

- (i) they are sited along the lowest points up and down undulations in the land or along minor natural drainage lines;
- (ii) their discharge into either natural drainage lines or other recognised water-conducting channels, not primarily constructed or used for purposes of irrigation, is possible;
- (iii) no natural drainage lines exist either on the land itself or upon any adjoining land owned or occupied by the same landowner or occupier;
- (iv) insufficient natural drainage lines exist to prevent the waterlogging of the land or to prevent soil erosion due to normal surface run-off of either internal or external origin.

3. The flow of water in all natural drainage lines, leader or storm-drains shall be checked or retarded, either by vegetation or by artificial retards, so that scouring of the sides and beds of the drains or drainage lines does not normally take place. Retards maintained for this purpose shall not impede the normal flow to an extent which causes the water to overflow the sides of the channel

Schedule B

Earth or stone work for the prevention of soil erosion

Any one or more of the following works shall be constructed at intervals of distance (measured up and down the slope at right angles to the contours of the land) which do not exceed the distances set out in the following table, according to the average slope of the land:—

Feet	Slope of Land
72	Slopes of 5 per cent. (= 1 in 20 or approximately 3°) and under, including flat land.
48	Slopes between 5 per cent. (= 1 in 20 or approximately 3°) and 25 per cent. (= 1 in 4 or approximately 14½°).
24	Slopes over 25 per cent. (= 1 in 4 or approximately 14½°).

Prescribed soil conservation and drainage works

1. Contour drains—with cross-sectional dimensions averaging not less than 2½ square feet.
2. Contour trenches—either continuous or in echelon throughout the area and with cross-sectional dimensions of not less than 4 square feet.
3. Contour stone terraces—either continuous or in echelon throughout the area and with perpendicular upper sides not less than 1 foot in height above ground level, and with cross sectional dimensions of not less than 1½ square feet.
4. Contour platforms—contour platforms must have a reverse slope of at least 1 in 6 and an average width (back to front) of not less than 4 feet.
5. Graded lateral drains—of a lock-and-spill or silt-pitted type which runs across the slope of the land, have cross-sectional dimensions of not less than 2½ square feet and whose gradient or fall does not exceed 1 in 40 (= a slope of 2½ per cent. or approximately 1½°). The water-retaining capacity of the locks or silt pits of such drains must not be less than 45 cubic feet per chain.

Schedule C

Soil conserving vegetative cover

1. All land on which rubber is to be grown should at all times be kept under vegetation which should not hinder the growth of the rubber. The following will be considered as plants which hinder the growth of rubber:—

Imperata cylindrica Beauv. S. Illuk. T. Warli pillu.
Lantana aculeata Linn. S. Rata Hinguru, Ganadapana.
Eupatorium conyzoides Vahl. S. Lokapalu Gas, Hulan-dessa.

2. The vegetation referred to above should be incorporated with the soil periodically; such incorporation is to be done in strips, of not more than 18 feet wide at a time, so that every other strip always carries some vegetation.

Interpretation

1. Soil erosion means the movement or removal of soil, by water or wind, from the place of its formation or previous deposition.

2. Measures for the prevention of soil erosion means measures for the conservation of soil and for the limitation or retardation of the movement of soil and surface run-off water, by limiting and checking the rate of distance of movement of such water and soil, by increasing the absorptiveness of the soil and the density of the vegetative soil cover.

3. Natural drainage line means the main line into which surface run-off water tends to run and along which it naturally flows down any area of land.

4. Drain means any channel constructed artificially for the collection and conduction of run-off water.

5. Leader drain means an artificially constructed main drain into which lateral drains conduct the run-off water they collect.

6. Lateral drain means an artificially constructed channel, lying across the slope of the land, for the collection, conduction and removal of water.

7. Storm drain means an artificially constructed or naturally existing channel for the collection and removal of storm water which originates either inside or outside the area concerned.

8. Storm water means water due to intensive rainfall, before such water flows into any type of drain or natural drainage line.

9. Contour means an imaginary line on the land surface connecting all points of the same height above mean sea level.

10. Surface run-off water means the water directly due to normal rain, which flows over the surface of the land, before it flows into any type of drain or natural drainage line.

SCHEDULE II**CONDITIONS OF SERVICE**

Candidates for appointment as pupil Midwives will be selected on the results of a competitive examination, which will be of the Junior School Certificate Examination in Sinhalese or Tamil. The examination will be held at the following centres—

Colombo, Galle, Gampaha, Jaffna, Kalutara, Kandy, Negombo, Panadura and Veyangoda. If, however, the number of candidates entered for any of these centres is less than 50, such centre or centres will be cancelled and the candidates concerned will be entered for the nearest centre according to the private address stated in the Entry Form. The place of examination finally assigned to each candidate will be stated on the Admission Card which will be issued to all eligible candidates in due course

2. Candidates must be over 20 and under 30 years of age on October 1, 1949. They must be Ceylonese according to the following definition—

- (a) A citizen of Ceylon by descent or by Registration, and
(b) A person who has applied or intends to apply for citizenship of Ceylon by Registration and is deemed by the Minister of Defence and External Affairs to have a *prima facie* entitlement to such citizenship

3. They must bring evidence of good general education, the minimum qualification required being the Junior School Certificate in English, Sinhalese or Tamil or any other examination of an equal or higher status recognized by the Education Department

4. Eligible candidates will be interviewed by a Selection Board which will select candidates to sit for a competitive examination of the J S C standard. The subjects will be—

- (a) An Essay on a simple subject 45 minutes
(b) Ceylon History 45 minutes
(c) Ceylon Geography .. 45 minutes

The fee for the examination is Rs 2 50

5. Candidates will be admitted to the training class in the order of merit on the results of the competitive examination according to the number of vacancies. Successful candidates will be required to pass a medical test. They will be trained at the De Soysa Maternity Home, Colombo, Ragama Branch Hospital, Kandy Hospital, Kurunegala Hospital, and Inuvil and Mampay Missionary Hospitals, Jaffna. Quarters will be provided except at Kandy and Kurunegala. The course will last one year. At the end of one year's successful training pupils will be trained at a Health Unit for a further period of six months. Pupils found unsatisfactory at any time during the period of training will be discontinued from the class

6. On successful completion of the whole course, pupils will be eligible for registration under section 54 of Ordinance No 26 of 1927. Government will not undertake to provide jobs for all registered midwives but permanent appointment as vacancies occur will be offered to all registered midwives.

Rule

The rules made under section 90 (1) (f) of the State Mortgage Bank Ordinance and published in *Gazette* No. 7,939 of August 12, 1932, as last amended by rule published in *Gazette* No. 9,589 of August 9, 1946, are further amended by the addition of the following rule to be numbered 22.

Rule 22

In the case of deposits made by intending applicants for loans who have thereafter failed to apply for loans and whose identity is unknown and who have also failed to furnish an address, and in the case of deposits made by borrowers in excess of monies due to the Bank on account of loans which have been paid off and which in either case have been unclaimed for a period of 5 years, the Board may treat such deposits as lapsed and thereupon the same shall be credited to Revenue as Profits, provided however that the Board may, if application be made by the parties within 10 years of the date of deposit, refund such monies to the parties concerned.

THE following rule made by the Board of Directors, under section 90 (1) (f) of the Ceylon State Mortgage Bank Ordinance, 1931, is hereby published for general information.

The rules made under section 90 (1) (f) published in the *Gazette* No. 7,939 of August 12, 1932, as last amended by rule published in *Gazette* No. 9,589 of August 9, 1946, are further amended by deleting the present proviso to rule 17 and substituting therefor the following provisos:

Provided however that interest payable on loans which shall be granted on the security of house properties situated within administrative limits of Municipal Councils shall be as follows:—

- (1) 5½ per cent per annum where the amount of the loan is less than Rs. 5,000;
- (2) 5 per cent per annum where the amount of the loan is less than Rs. 10,000 but not less than Rs. 5,000.
- (3) 4½ per cent per annum where the amount of the loan is less than Rs. 50,000 but not less than Rs. 10,000.
- (4) 4 per cent per annum where the amount of the loan is not less than Rs. 50,000.

Provided further that if property other than house property situated within the administrative limits of Municipal Councils is also part of the security offered for a loan the rates of interest payable shall be as under (a), (b), (c) and (d).
