SELECTION OF CANDIDATES FOR APPOINTMENT AS POLICE PROBATIONERS

VACANCIES exist in the Ceylon Police Service in the rank of Probationary Assistant Superintendent to be filled by the appointment of Ceylonese Probationers The posts are permanent and pensionable and appointment will be made on two years' probation

- 2 Three of the vacant posts are reserved for competition among ex-members of His Majesty's Fighting Forces during the last War who are qualified in terms of Note 2 to regulation 6 below These posts will be so filled only if suitable candidates are forthcoming
- 3. Candidates for appointment as Police Probationers will undergo a qualifying literary examination and will thereafter be selected by the Public Service Commission

Candidates will be required to obtain a nomination from the Public Service Commission in terms of sections 5 and 7 of these regulations.

- 4 The qualifying literary examination will be held in Colombo in May or June this year Candidates will be notified of the exact date later
 - Method of application-
 - (a) Candidates who possess the necessary qualifications will on application to the Secretary, Public Service Commission, be supplied with copies of the Regulations and Application Forms of application must be filled in by the applicants on their own handwriting and must reach the Office of the Secretary, Public Service Commission, Post Office Box No. 500, Colombo, on or before April 25, 1949. No application received after that date will be considered
 - (b) On the forms supplied the candidate must fill in tull particulars regarding his career and qualifications He must name on the form two referees who can answer from personal knowledge for his character and ability He must also obtain a certificate from a qualified Medical Practitioner giving his height and chest measurement and minimum eye-sight. Any special remarks as to physical development, &c., should be made in the appropriate cage of the form of application.

 The form when completed should be sent to the

Office of the Secretary, Public Service Commission, accompanied by the following documents (with copies):-

- (i) birth certificate. Certificates of birth issued for the purposes of the Code for Assisted Schools will not be accepted
- (11) the educational certificate required by

section 6 (iii),
(iii) testimonials—not more than four—including those from schools,

(1v) certificates from referees These should not be seen by the candidates and should be enclosed in a sealed envelope. No copies of these certificates are required The testimonials referred to in (iii) above can also be sent in this way if the candidate so desires

The original documents referred to in (111) above will be returned, copies being retained in the Office of the Secretary, Public Service Commission

- (c) Applications from candidates already in Government Service should be forwarded through the Heads of the Departments in which they are serving
- Conditions of Eligibility-
- (1) Every candidate must be a Ceylonese For the purpose of this examination a Ceylonese is-

(a) a male citizen of Ceylon by descent or by

- registration, and

 (b) a male person who has applied or intends to apply for citizenship of Ceylon by registration and is deemed by the Minister of tion, and is deemed by the Minister of Defence and External Affairs to have a prima facie entitlement to such citizenship
- (11) He must have been born not later than January 1, 1927, and not earlier than January 1, 1924

(11i) He must have passed the First Examination in Aits or Science of the University of Ceylon or the Intermediate Examination in Arts or Science of the University of London or an examination deemed to be an equivalent by the Public Service Commission

> Note -This educational qualification is a concession in respect of this year's examination only and would be reviewed in the light of the Police Commission's recommendation before any further examinations are held

- (IV) He must be of good character
- (v) He must be unmarried
- (vi) He must be of a sound constitution and physically fit for service in any part of the Island (vii) His minimum eye-sight must be 6/6 and 6/12 and
- colour vision must be normal
- A candidate who requires the use of glasses will not be eligible
- Note 1 —In the case of a Sub-Inspector or an Inspector in the Ceylon Police, the conditions of eligibility will be as follows -
 - (a) He must have passed the Senior School Certificate Examination with exemption from the London Matriculation or the London Matriculation Examination
 - (b) He must, on January 1, 1949, be not more than 30 years of age, 1 e, he must have been born not earlier than January 1, 1919.
 - (c) He must have had a minimum service of five years in the Police Service on January 1,
- Note 2 -In the case of ex-members of His Majesty's Fighting Forces, the following concessions are
 - (a) He must have passed the Senior School Certificate Examination with exemption from the London Matriculation or the London Matriculation Examination
 - (b) He must, on January 1, 1949, be not less than 22 years and not more than 25 years candidate who is more than 25 years old will be eligible to sit at the evamination provided his present age reduced by the period of mobilized service does not exceed 25.
 - (c) Ex-service candidates must have held commissioned rank if the whole of their war service has been spent in India or Ceylon Applications will, however, be entertained from other ranks who have served in war zones overseas War service means full time service during the last war in any of His Majesty's Fighting Forces, including the Ceylon Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve and the Ceylon Defence Force or the Merchant Navy
- Note 3 -No person will be deemed eligible as a candidate for the examination who has not furnished satisfactory proof that he possesses all the qualifications set forth above
- Permission to sit at the Examination -
- Candidates who have complied with the above instructions will be informed in due course whether they have been granted permission to sit at the exami-

The grant of such permission will be at the absolute discretion of the Public Service Commission which will not be prepared to give reasons for any decision on any application.

- Selection after the Examination —
- Qualification in the literary examination will not in itself imply that the candidate will ultimately be selected for appointment Candidates who have qualified in the literary examination will be required to appear before a Selection Board at their own expense.

Those candidates who appear to the Public Service Commission to be most suitable on grounds of character, personal fitness, general education and subsequent training and experience, if any, will be selected to appear before the Selection Board

The selection of a candidate will be at the absolute discretion of the Public Service Commission which will not be prepared to give reasons for any decision on any application. Any attempt to interview any public servant or any member of the Selection Board on behalf of any candidate will render the candidate liable to disqualification

Medical Examination —

Selected candidates will be required to undergo a medical examination as to physical fitness for service as a Police Officer in any part of the Island. No candidate will be finally selected who does not pass this medical examination

Scheme of Examination ---

The following are the subjects of the qualifying examination

(1) English 200 marks (2) General Knowledge 200 marks

(3) Any one of the following-

Sinhalese Tamil 200 marks Ceylon History and Geography

The test in English will include an essay, a precis and questions to test the candidate's command of the language. The questions in General Knowledge will be designed to test the knowledge and intelligence of candidates-

- (a) in the more important topics of the day,
- (b) in literary, geographical and other general questions

The test in Sinhalese or Tamil will include an essay, translations, and questions to test the candidate's command of the language

The paper on History and Geography will aim at testing ' the knowledge of the candidate in regard to the history and background of the several princepal communities resident in the Island and the standard might be slightly higher than that now approved for the Senior School Certificate Examnation. Geography should cover the whole Island and should have particular reference to Provincial/District Administrative units

The fee for the examination will be Rs 40 which should be paid to the Examination Fund (No 2) Account of the Director of Education. A form for this purpose could be obtained from the Secretary, Public Service Commission. The bank receipt should be annexed to the application form The full fee is returned to candidates who are not granted nomination to sit for the examination A candidate who withdraws or absents himself from the examination for any reason whatsoever at any time after he has been granted a nomination shall not be entitled to a refund of the whole or a portion of the fee. The fee for the Medical Examination is Rs. 10.50. Successful candidates will be notified later of the manner in which this fee should be paid

Note 2—Any Probationer who may fail to pass the prescribed examinations within two years, or may be found unfit for Police duties, will be liable to removal from the service

Note 3 —Before an officer's salary reaches Rs 7,320 per annum and again before it reaches Rs. 11,280 per annum, there is a strict efficiency bar; an officer will not be permitted to draw further increments beyond this bar unless his service is thoroughly satisfactory in every respect, and until he has shown sufficient ability, initiative and promise to justify the expectation that he will be fully capable of carrying out efficiently and will accept the further responsibility of his new rank

IT is hereby notified that the following resolution under section 8 of the Tea Propaganda Ordinance (Chapter 130), as modified by the Proclamation published in Gazette Extraordinary No. 9,773 of September 24, 1947, has been passed by the House of Representatives at its public session on March 17, 1949

Resolution

"That this House resolves under section 8 of the Tea Propaganda Ordinance (Chapter 130) that, in lieu of the export duty now charged, levied and paid in pursuance of the resolution under the said section published in Gazette Extraordinary No. 9,104 of March 30, 1943, there shall be charged, levied and paid, on and after the first day of April, 1949, a duty of one rupee per one hundred pounds of tea exported from the Island, and so in proportion for any less weight."
