POST OF DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION, CEYLON

APPLICATIONS are invited for the post of Director of Education, Ceylon. An educationist of high academic attainments and wide administrative experience is required

2. The duties of the post are—

- (a) Control of the State administrative machinery affecting education as determined by local Education Ordinances and regulations and by instructions from the Ministry of Education,

- (b) Participation in the framing of educational policy through advice tendered direct to the Ministry of Education and through membership of such organizations as the Board of Education, the Research Council, the Examinations Council, &c.

The Director has to perform his duties subject to the supervision and control of the Ministry of Education.

3 The salary scale attached to the post is as follows.—

- (a) Rs 18,600—900—20,400 for new entrants,
(b) £1,600—50—1,750 for non-new entrants to the Public Service,

but candidates with special qualifications and experience may be considered for a higher salary.

4 Rent allowance is payable at 7½ per cent. of salary if single and 15 per cent. if married, subject to certain maxima. Cost of living allowance based on the cost of living index is payable at present at Government rates. Travelling allowance and leave will be granted in accordance with Government regulations

5 The appointment will be made on agreement for four years in the first instance with the option of renewal for another four years, the salary being fixed by mutual agreement. Proposals for a different period of service will also be considered.

6. 2. (1) Save as otherwise provided in paragraph 3 of this Order, no person shall fell, lop, or kill or cause or permit the felling, lopping, or killing of any scheduled tree on any land in Ceylon, other than Crown land, unless the felling, lopping, or killing of such tree has been authorised by a licence granted by the Land Commissioner or any other officer acting under his authority

(2) Any licence granted under sub-paragraph (1) may contain such conditions as the Land Commissioner or officer by whom the licence is granted may consider it expedient to impose, and no person shall fell, lop, or kill or cause or permit the felling, lopping, or killing of a scheduled tree under the authority of any such licence except in accordance with such conditions as may be contained in the licence

3 Nothing in paragraph 2 shall be deemed to prohibit—

- (a) the felling or lopping of any dead tree . or
- (b) the felling or lopping of any tree in pursuance of the powers conferred upon any officer of a local authority by any other written law , or
- (c) the felling or lopping of any tree in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 15 of the Telecommunications Ordinance, No 50 of 1944, or by section 52 of the Thoroughfares Ordinance (Chapter 148) ; or

(d) the felling, lopping, or killing of any tree which has been certified under the hand of the proper officer to be a tree which is dangerous to life or property

4. The Land Commissioner may from time to time, by Notification published in the *Gazette*, amend the Schedule to this Order by the addition of any tree or trees of any description set out in such Notification.

5 In this Order—

"proper officer" means any Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent, and includes any other officer or person authorised by any Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent to be a proper officer for the purposes of this Order

Examination for Recruitment of Clerks and Post and Telegraph Learners

Date of Examination

1. A competitive examination for recruitment to the General Class of the Postal Clerical Service and of Post and Telegraph Learners will be held in Colombo by the Director of Education on May 28, 1949. The Examination is open only to male candidates.

Applications

2 Applications for admission to the examination must be addressed to the Postmaster-General on forms which may be obtained from his office up to April 21, 1949.

3 (i) Completed entry forms, together with all original certificates, should be sent to reach the Postmaster-General not later than 2 p.m. on April 27, 1949. Any applications received after that hour will be rejected.

(ii) Candidates who are already employed in Government Departments, whether in a permanent or temporary capacity, must forward their applications through the Heads of the Departments in which they are serving. If any candidate fails to do so, he will be regarded as disqualified.

4 The Postmaster-General will return those applications which are approved to the candidates concerned. Such applications will constitute the candidates' tickets of admission to the examination. Candidates presenting themselves for examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination their forms of application approved by the Postmaster-General. A candidate not producing such form will be refused admittance to the examination.

Eligibility

5 (i) Candidates must be of good character.

(ii) Candidates must be Ceylonese*.

6 When forwarding their applications, candidates must attach original certificates or furnish proof showing that they have previously passed at least—

- (a) The Cambridge Senior or the London Matriculation, or the Ceylon Senior School Certificate (English) Examination; or
- (b) The Final Examination for the Commercial Certificate of the Ceylon Technical College; or
- (c) The Cambridge Junior or the Junior School Certificate (English) Examination of the Education Department, Ceylon, or the Junior School Certificate (English) Examination held by a school approved by the Education Department for the Senior School Certificate (English) Examination together with either
 - (i) the Higher Commercial Certificate Examination (either section) of the London Chamber of Commerce or
 - (ii) the Commercial Certificate Examination (either section) of the London Chamber of Commerce

Their applications must also bear duly cancelled stamps to the value of Rs 10.

7 (i) A certificate of the registration of the candidate's birth showing him to be born not earlier than April 1, 1927, and not later than April 1, 1932, and a certificate of good character signed by a responsible person, to the satisfaction of the Postmaster-General, must be attached to the form of application.

(ii) Certificates of birth issued for the purpose of the Code for Assisted Schools will not be accepted for this examination.

(iii) Affidavits will in no circumstances be accepted as substitutes for birth certificates.

(iv) A certified copy of a birth registration entry effected more than one year after the date of birth, under section 18 (1) (b) of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance (Cap 94), will be accepted only after

* For the purpose of this examination a Ceylonese is—

- (a) A citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration; and
- (b) A person who has applied or intends to apply for citizenship of Ceylon by registration, and is deemed by the Minister of Defence and External Affairs to have a *prima facie* entitlement to such citizenship.

consideration of the evidence by which the date of birth was established. Where the name appearing in the birth certificate differs from the name which the candidate ordinarily uses, satisfactory evidence will have to be adduced that the birth certificate is that of the candidate and not that of any other person. Where the candidate is under 21 years of age or is more than 21 years of age and has a parent living, application should be made to the Registrar-General's or to the Provincial Registrar's or Assistant Provincial Registrar's Office in the district in which the birth took place under section 19 of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance, for the amendment of the entry in case 2 of the birth registration entry, and in other cases application should be made to the District Court under section 20 for rectification of the entry in case 2.

(v) If the candidate has been educated at a Government or Assisted school, the certificate of character must be from the Principal of the last Government or Assisted school which he has attended, otherwise it may be from the candidate's teacher or schoolmaster by preference or a member of the Public Service, a Justice of Peace, Minister of Religion, Advocate, Proctor or Notary, or generally speaking, some person who is known and to whom reference can be readily made.

8 (i) The following persons will also be eligible to take this examination provided they have passed at least the Cambridge Junior or the Junior School Certificate (English) Examination of the Education Department, Ceylon, or the Junior School Certificate (English) Examination held by a school approved by the Education Department for the Senior School Certificate (English) Examination or the Higher Commercial Certificate Examination (either section) of the London Chamber of Commerce or the Commercial Certificate Examination (either section) of the London Chamber of Commerce.

Notes—The original certificate of educational qualifications should be attached to the application form.

(A) Persons who are now employed as temporary clerks in the Post and Telecommunications Department who have completed at least one year's continuous service as temporary clerks in the Department on April 1, 1949, and whose service has been satisfactory throughout will be allowed to compete for the vacancies in the Postal Clerical Service.

(B) Persons who have been full-time serving members of a unit of the fighting forces for any length of time during the period September 3, 1939, to August 15, 1945, inclusive.

(C) Persons who have been full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions or Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left those services of their own accord) for any length of time during the period September 3, 1939, to August 15, 1945.

Note—(a) A person who while serving in one of these services was employed otherwise will not be considered to have done full-time service.

(b) Civil Defence Services will be held to include only those services the members of which were enrolled under Defence Regulations.

(D) Persons who have been employed as Civilian Clerks in Service Departments, whose service commenced from a date prior to August 15, 1945, and who have at least one year's continuous satisfactory service certified by the Head of the Department concerned.

(ii) In computing age for the purpose of the age limit prescribed in paragraph 7 (i) the following rules will be observed:—

(a) Candidates referred to in paragraph 8 (i) (A) will be allowed to deduct the period of continuous service as temporary clerks in the Post and Telecommunications Department from the date of appointment to April 1, 1949, from their ages.

(b) Candidates referred to in paragraph 8 (i) (B) will be allowed to deduct the period of their mobilized service between September 3, 1939, and April 1, 1949, from their ages.

(c) Candidates referred to in paragraph 8 (i) (C) will be allowed to deduct the period of their continuous full-time service with those services between September 3, 1939, and April 1, 1949, from their ages.

(d) Candidates referred to in paragraph 8 (i) (D) will be allowed to deduct the period of their service in those Departments between September 3, 1939, and April 1, 1949, from their ages. If the period of service is not continuous each separate period must be supported by a certificate of satisfactory service from the Head of the Department concerned.

9 Postal Assistant Clerks will be permitted to sit for the examination provided they are not more than 30 years of age on April 1, 1949, and provided they possess the educational qualifications prescribed in paragraph 6 (a), (b) or (c) above.

10 (i) Candidates referred to in paragraph 8 (i) (A) must forward their applications through the Heads of Branches in which they serve. The application must be accompanied by a certificate of satisfactory service.

(ii) Candidates referred to in paragraph 8 (i) (B) should annex to their applications a certificate signed by the Officer Commanding the Unit in which they are serving or have served, showing the full period of service and certifying that such service has been throughout satisfactory.

(iii) Candidates referred to in paragraph 8 (i) (C) should annex to their applications a certificate from the Head of their Services certifying that they were full-time members of that Service, that they have performed not less than six hours duty per day, that they did not leave that Service of their own accord and that their service has been throughout satisfactory. The period of service and the A.R.P. post at which the duties were performed should also be shown in this certificate. Head of Services for this purpose will include local A.R.P. Controllers.

(iv) Candidates referred to in paragraph 8 (i) (D) should annex to their applications a certificate of satisfactory service from the Head of the Department concerned. The period of service should also be shown in this certificate.

Withdrawals and Refunds

11. (a) If a candidate is rejected owing to his not satisfying the conditions for admission to the examination no refund of the value of stamps affixed to his application will be made.

(b) If a candidate, who has applied for admission to the examination, gives notice of his withdrawal to the Postmaster-General at least 14 days before the date of the examination, a refund will be made of half the value of stamps affixed to his application.

(c) A candidate, who has been admitted to the examination and wishes to withdraw on account of illness, should forward notice of his withdrawal to reach the Postmaster-General at least one day before the date of the examination. A refund of the full value of stamps affixed to his application will then be made, provided his notice of withdrawal is accompanied by a certificate from a qualified medical officer to the effect that he is unfit to sit for the examination.

(d) In no other case will a refund be granted.

*Candidates, both of whose parents are Sinhalese or both Tamil, must take Sinhalese or Tamil, whichever language they prefer. Other candidates will be given the option of offering Sinhalese, or Tamil, or Arabic, or a special paper in English.

13. The examination is held in two parts. The written examination is first held and on the results of it candidates are selected competitively to attend the *viva voce*. The number to be called for the *viva voce* examination will be fixed by the Postmaster-General. In all written papers marks will be deducted for bad handwriting and mistakes in spelling. Candidates whose writing is illegible are liable to be disqualified. The *viva voce* examination will be held in Colombo.

Medical Examination

14. The successful candidates will be required to pass a medical examination as to their physical fitness for service in any part of the Island. Any candidate admitted to the service or for training before the medical examination and found to be unsuitable after the medical examination will be rejected.

Postal Clerical Service—Conditions of Appointment

15 (i) The Department does not undertake to provide the successful candidates with posts immediately, but appointments will be given as vacancies occur. The appointments will be on two years' probation.

(ii) Candidates selected for employment in the Post and Telecommunications Department will not be permitted to sit for an examination for entrance to any other Government Department or apply for or accept an appointment in any other Government Department during the first three years of their service in the Postal Department.

(iii) They will be subject to the Public Service, Financial or other standing regulations of the Government and of the Post and Telecommunications Department.

(iv) They will be liable for duty, without additional remuneration, on all Government holidays other than Post Office holidays. They will be liable to transfer to any station in Ceylon.

(v) They will be required to pass a test in typewriting within one year of the date of appointment and no increment of salary will be given until the test is passed.

Post and Telegraph Learners—Conditions of Appointment

16 (i) Candidates must (a) not be less than five feet in height, (b) possess good sight and hearing, (c) not stammer or have any other defect of utterance which would prevent them from efficiently carrying out telegraph and telephone duties, (d) be capable of writing legibly and they should be able to take down to dictation at 22 words per minute.

(ii) They will be required to undergo a course of training at the Post and Telegraph School and at a Post Office for a period of about six months not including vacations. During the period of training candidates will be trained as Telegraphists, Tele-typists and Telephone Operators, and also for counter duties, which involve cash transactions. They will not be required to pay any fees or deposit. They will be given a subsistence allowance of Rs 50 a month, plus any war allowance payable during that period, subject to a proportionate deduction during vacations or absence from any cause whatever, but the payment of the allowance is contingent on satisfactory behaviour and progress. Any candidate who does not satisfy the Superintendent, Telecommunication Traffic, as regards progress in his studies and good behaviour is liable to summary rejection at any time during the period of training, and forfeiture of his allowance, and any candidate so rejected will, for the future be ineligible for service in the Post and Telecommunications Department.

(iii) At the end of the period of tuition, candidates will be examined in the subjects in which they have been trained. Those who pass will be appointed to the Postmasters and Signallers' Service, as vacancies occur on probation for two years. Subject to the provisions of condition 16 (iv) those candidates who are rejected at this examination will be ineligible for service in the Post and Telecommunications Department.

(iv) The Postmaster-General may, on the recommendation of the Superintendent, Telecommunication Traffic, permit a candidate in exceptional cases to remain at the school at his own expense for such further period as may be considered desirable. Any such candidate will be specially examined at the close of that period.

(v) A Post and Telegraph Learner who resigns at his own request before completing his entire course of instruction at the Telegraph School or within three years of appointment to the Postmasters and Signallers' Service shall be required to refund all allowances drawn by him while attending the Telegraph School.

(vi) Candidates selected for employment in the Post and Telecommunications Department will not be permitted to sit for an examination for entrance to any other Government Department or apply for or accept an appointment in any other Government Department during the first three years of their service in the Postal Department.

(vii) Appointments to the Postmasters and Signallers Service will be on two years' probation. Appointments are pensionable.

(viii) Postmasters and Signallers are liable for duty on all days, including Sundays, and holidays. They will not be entitled to any additional remuneration for duty on holidays other than Post Office holidays. They are required to attend for periods of duty which may begin or end at any time of the day or night. They are liable for transfer and may be posted to any station in Ceylon.

(ix) Postmasters and Signallers are required to furnish security in the sum of Rs 1,000. Security will be deducted in monthly instalments from the salary at Rs 6 per mensem, where the annual salary does not exceed Rs 1,000 or Rs 7 50 per mensem where the annual salary exceeds Rs 1,000.

Each tender must be enclosed in a separate cover and so marked.

6 Every tenderer should enclose a Kachcheri receipt for the sum of Rs 50 for the fulfilment of the sale conditions. All such deposits should be made in the name of the Assistant Government Agent, Vavuniya, and will be liable for forfeiture if the successful tenderer fails to sign the sale conditions immediately he is declared the purchaser.

7 The Assistant Government Agent reserves to himself the right of rejecting any or all tenders or bids without assigning any reasons therefor. Any tender that contains an unauthenticated alteration will be rejected.

8 The Assistant Government Agent reserves to himself the right of rejecting any or all tenders and putting up the rents immediately to public auction, if satisfactory tenders have not been received.

PART IV

Overtime rate

In respect of each hour of work in excess of the normal working day, the minimum overtime rate shall be the minimum hourly rate (ascertained by dividing the minimum daily rate by 8) increased by 25 per cent of such minimum hourly rate.

PART V

Weekly holiday (section 24)

Every employer shall allow each Sunday as the weekly holiday to all workers employed under him. Provided, however, that an employer may employ any worker on a Sunday, subject to the conditions—

- (1) that a day within the six days next succeeding such Sunday shall be allowed to that worker as a holiday,
- (2) that in respect of work done on a Sunday—
 - (a) a worker who has worked for nine hours (inclusive of one hour for a meal), or for any period that falls short of nine hours by reason of the failure of the employer to provide him with work, shall be paid at one and a half times the minimum rate of wages for a normal working day,
 - (b) a worker who has worked for less than nine hours (inclusive of one hour for a meal) by reason of his unwillingness to work, shall, for each hour that he has worked, be paid at one and a half times the hourly rate (ascertained by dividing the minimum rate of wages for a normal working day by eight), and
- (3) that no worker shall be employed on such Sunday for more than nine hours (inclusive of one hour for a meal)

The remuneration due to a worker for work done on the weekly holiday during any period shall be paid along with the wages payable for that period.

Annual Holidays (section 25)

1. (a) If a male worker, not under 18 years of age, has been in continuous employment and has worked under the same employer for more than 228 days in any year (hereinafter called the "qualifying year"), he shall be allowed in the next succeeding year a holiday or holidays calculated at the rate of one holiday for each unit of five days by which the number of days on which the worker has worked exceeds 228. Provided, however, that it shall not be obligatory on an employer to allow any such holiday in respect of any period of work in excess of 288 days.

(b) If a female worker or a worker (irrespective of sex) under 18 years of age has been in continuous employment and has worked under the same employer for more than 204 days in any year (hereinafter called the "qualifying year"), such worker shall be allowed in the next succeeding year a holiday or holidays calculated at the rate of one holiday for each unit of five days by which the number of days on which the worker has worked exceeds 204. Provided, however, that it shall not be obligatory on an employer to allow any such holiday in respect of any period of work in excess of 264 days.

(c) If a male worker, not under 18 years of age has been in continuous employment and has hackled and tied for the same employer more than 9,576 pounds of bristle fibre in any year (hereinafter called the "qualifying year"), he shall be allowed in the next succeeding year a holiday or holidays calculated at the rate of one holiday for each unit of 210 pounds by which the number of pounds of bristle fibre hackled and tied by the worker exceeds 9,576 pounds.

Provided, however, that it shall not be obligatory on an employer to allow any such holiday in respect of any quantity of bristle fibre hackled and tied in excess of 12,096 pounds.

(d) If a female worker, or a worker (irrespective of sex) under 18 years of age, has been in continuous employment and has hackled and tied for the same employer more than 8,568 pounds of bristle fibre in any year (hereinafter called the "qualifying year"), such worker shall be allowed in the next succeeding year a holiday or holidays calculated at the rate of one holiday for each unit of 210 pounds by which the number of pounds of bristle fibre hackled and tied by the worker exceeds 8,568 pounds.

Provided, however, that it shall not be obligatory on an employer to allow any such holiday in respect of any quantity of bristle fibre hackled and tied in excess of 11,088 pounds.

In sub-paragraphs (a) and (b) of this paragraph "days on which the worker has worked" includes—

- (a) every holiday allowed by the employer to the worker under section 25 at any earlier time in any year under consideration;
- (b) every day of absence on any grounds approved by the employer;
- (c) every day of absence due to any injury to the worker caused by an accident arising out of and in the course of his employment;
- (d) every day of absence due to any occupational disease specified in Schedule III of the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance (Cap. 117);
- (e) every day on which the employer fails to provide work for the worker;
- (f) every day of absence due to a strike or lockout that is not illegal provided such days do not in the aggregate exceed 30 days a year; and
- (g) every holiday or day of absence from work to which a worker is entitled by or under the provisions of any written law other than the Wages Boards Ordinance

but shall not include the day fixed as the weekly holiday under section 24

For the purposes of sub-paragraphs (c) and (d) of this paragraph, a worker shall be deemed to have hackled and tied 42 pounds of bristle fibre on—

- (a) every day allowed as a holiday by the employer to the worker under section 25 of the Wages Boards Ordinance, No 27 of 1941, in any year under consideration;
- (b) every day on which the worker is absent on any grounds approved by the employer;
- (c) every day on which the worker is absent on account of any injury caused by an accident arising out of and in the course of his employment;
- (d) every day on which the worker is absent on account of any occupational disease specified in Schedule III of the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance (Chapter 117);
- (e) every day on which the employer is unable or fails to supply raw materials sufficient for the worker to hackle and tie 42 pounds of bristle fibre;
- (f) every day on which the worker is absent on account of a strike or lockout that is not illegal, the number of such days not exceeding thirty;
- (g) every day of absence from work to which the worker is entitled by or under the provisions of any written law other than the Wages Boards Ordinance;

but not on the day fixed as the weekly holiday under section 24 of the Wages Boards Ordinance, No. 27 of 1941.

2. A worker shall be allowed his holiday or holidays on a day or days to be mutually agreed upon between him and his employer

3. The remuneration for each holiday shall be the average daily wage of the worker obtained by dividing the total wage (excluding overtime) earned by the worker for the days on which he has actually worked in the last six months of the qualifying year by the number of such days.

4. Payment for the holiday or holidays shall be made before the commencement of such holiday or holidays.

5. Where a worker intends to leave his employment of his own accord, or is to be discontinued or dismissed from employment, on any date, he shall be entitled to take and shall take before that date—

- (a) every holiday which he was entitled to in respect of the last preceding year and which he has not already taken ; and
- (b) where the worker has during the current year complied with the provisions relating to employment and work set out in paragraph 1, every holiday which, but for the termination of his employment, he would be entitled to in the next succeeding year ,

and he shall be remunerated for such holidays in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 3 of these decisions

6. In these paragraphs " year " means a continuous period of 12 months.

7. The foregoing decisions shall not apply in respect of employment at any time more than 12 months prior to the date on which the decisions come into force

Objections to the proposed decisions will be received by the Chairman of the Board until 12 noon on April 23, 1949. Every such objection must be made in writing and must contain a statement of the grounds upon which such objection is taken.

PART IV

Overtime rate

In respect of each hour of work in excess of the normal working day, the minimum overtime rate shall be the minimum hourly rate (ascertained by dividing the minimum daily rate by 8) increased by 25 per cent of such minimum hourly rate.

PART V

Weekly holidays (section 24)

Every employer shall allow each Sunday as the weekly holiday to all workers employed under him. Provided, however, that an employer may employ any worker on a Sunday, subject to the conditions—

- (1) that a day within the six days next succeeding such Sunday shall be allowed to that worker as a holiday;
- (2) that in respect of work done on a Sunday—
 - (a) a worker who has worked for nine hours (inclusive of one hour for a meal), or for any period that falls short of nine hours by reason of the failure of the employer to provide him with work, shall be paid at one and a half times the minimum rate of wages for a normal working day;
 - (b) a worker who has worked for less than nine hours (inclusive of one hour for a meal) by reason of his unwillingness to work, shall, for each hour that he has worked, be paid at one and a half times the hourly rate (ascertained by dividing the minimum rate of wages for a normal working day by eight), and
- (3) that no worker shall be employed on such Sunday for more than nine hours (inclusive of one hour for a meal)

The remuneration due to a worker for work done on the weekly holiday during any period shall be paid also with the wages payable for that period

Annual holidays (section 25)

1. (a) If a male worker, not under 18 years of age, has been in continuous employment and has worked under the same employer for more than 228 days in any year (hereinafter called the "qualifying year"), he shall be allowed in the next succeeding year a holiday or holidays calculated at the rate of one holiday for each unit of five days by which the number of days on which the worker has worked exceeds 228. Provided, however, that it shall not be obligatory on an employer to allow any such holiday in respect of any period of work in excess of 288 days

(b) If a female worker or a worker (irrespective of sex) under 18 years of age has been in continuous employment and has worked under the same employer for more than 204 days in any year (hereinafter called the "qualifying year") such worker shall be allowed in the next succeeding year a holiday or holidays calculated at the rate of one holiday for each unit of five days by which the number of days on which the worker has worked exceeds 204. Provided, however, that it shall not be obligatory on an employer to allow any such holiday in respect of any period of work in excess of 264 days.

In this paragraph, "days on which the worker has worked" includes—

- (a) every holiday allowed by the employer to the worker under section 25 at any earlier time in any year under consideration,
- (b) every day of absence on any grounds approved by the employer,
- (c) every day of absence due to any injury to the worker caused by an accident arising out of and in the course of his employment,
- (d) every day of absence due to any occupational disease specified in Schedule III of the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance (Cap 117);
- (e) every day on which the employer fails to provide work for the worker,
- (f) every day of absence due to a strike or lockout that is not illegal provided such days do not in the aggregate exceed 30 days a year; and
- (g) every holiday or day of absence from work to which a worker is entitled by or under the provisions of any written law other than the Wages Boards Ordinance,

but shall not include the day fixed as the weekly holiday under section 24.

and he shall be remunerated for such holidays in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 3 of these decisions.

6. In these paragraphs " year " means a continuous period of 12 months

7. The foregoing decisions shall not apply in respect of employment at any time more than 12 months prior to the date on which the decisions come into force
