MINISTRY OF FINANCE—POST OF EDIPHONIST

APPLICATIONS are invited from male and female candidates for the post of Ediphonist.

2 *Salary, Allowance and Conditions of Service.* Salary scale Rs 1,200 to Rs 2,424 per annum by 17 annual increments of Rs 72. Cost of living and rent allowances will be paid at the usual Government rates. The selected candidate will be subject to the Public Service Commission Rules, the Financial Regulations, the Regulations of the Manual of Procedure, Departmental Orders or Regulations, and any other Orders or Regulations of Government in force from time to time.

3 *Terms of Engagement.* The selected candidate will be on trial for two years. The post is non-pensionable, but the successful candidate will be required to contribute 5 per cent of his/her salary to the Public Service Provident Fund and will be allowed at his/her option to contribute a further 5 per cent. The Government contribution will in either case be equal to 7½ per cent. of salary paid in at the close of each financial year. The selected candidate will be required to pass a medical examination as to physical fitness.

4 (a) *Qualifications required.* Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that—

(i) he/she is a citizen of Ceylon.

(ii) he/she is not less than 19 years and not more than 30 years on May 1, 1949

(iii) he/she is of good character

(b) Candidates for this appointment should have passed the Senior School Certificate (English) and have a good knowledge of typewriting with a speed of not less than 30 words per minute

(c) If a Service candidate is selected, he will be placed at a suitable point on the salary scale so that he will receive some credit for war service, unless his age does not exceed the maximum age, i.e., 24 years. If he has special qualifications, skill or experience, he will be placed at a point in the salary scale consistent with such qualifications, skill or experience

(d) Twenty per cent of the vacancies will be reserved for ex-servicemen provided suitable candidates are available

Note —(i) The concessions referred to above do not apply to civilian employees in Service Departments and temporary employees in Government Departments

(ii) Civil Defence Services will be held to include only those Services the members of which were enrolled under the Defence Regulations

(iii) Ex-servicemen should in addition forward their original discharge certificates

PUBLIC HEALTH NURSING

Conditions of Service

1 Candidates should be qualified in general nursing and below 35 years of age on June 4, 1949. They must be Ceylonese according to the following definitions —

- (a) A citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration, and
- (b) A person who has applied or intends to apply for citizenship of Ceylon by registration and is deemed by the Minister of Defence and External Affairs to have a *prima facie* entitlement to such citizenship.

2 Eligible candidates will be interviewed by a selection board which will select suitable candidates for training. A competitive examination may be held.

3 Successful candidates will be required to pass a medical test.

4 On being selected they will undergo training in Public Health Nursing for six months and in Midwifery for 12 months if they have not had the training in the latter already. At the end of each course they will be required to pass an examination in the subjects studied.

5 The period of training as well as one year afterwards will be on probation.

6 The Director of Medical and Sanitary Services reserves to himself the right of discontinuing at any time during the probationary period the services of nurses who are found to be unsuitable.

7 Uniforms to be worn while on duty will be provided free of charge.

8 During the period of training Nurses will be paid Rs 1,488 per annum as salary without diet in addition to the following allowances:—

Washing	Rs 5 per month, except when at the De Soysa Maternity Hospital when the amount is Rs 2 50 per month
House	Rs 30 per mensem when furnished quarters are not provided (if not a new entrant to Government Service)

Travelling Rs 20 for a rickshaw and Rs 40 for a buggy per month whichever conveyance is considered suitable by the Department.

9 During the period of training in Midwifery where quarters are supplied at the De Soysa Maternity Hospital, house and travelling allowances will not be paid.

10 On satisfactory completion of the training, salary will be paid at Rs 1,920 per year rising by increments of Rs 120 after each completed year of satisfactory service to Rs 2,880 per year.

11 Candidates must be able to speak Sinhalese and Tamil and to read Sinhalese or Tamil before the granting of the first increment.

12 Candidates will be required to sign a bond to serve the Department for a period of three years on satisfactory completion of training.

Post of Guide Lecturer—National Museums Department

9.
