EXAMINATION FOR APPOINTMENT TO THE ASSISTANT CLERKS' SERVICE

A competitive examination for male candidates wishing to enter the Assistant Clerks' Service which does not form part of the General Clerical Service will be held in Colombo and all Kachcheri stations on September 24, 1949

2 (a) *Salary*—Successful candidates will be appointed to the Assistant Clerks' Service on the salary scale of Rs. 660 per annum rising by 24 annual increments of Rs 42 to Rs 1,668 per annum. In this scale an Efficiency Bar operates before Rs 1,206 per annum

(b) *Incremental Credit*—(i) Successful candidates with previous continuous service under Government may be allowed incremental credit for such service

(ii) Successful candidates who have been full-time serving members of a unit of the Armed Forces and candidates who have been full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire Service or Air Raid Precautions Services will be placed at suitable points in the salary scale so that they will receive some credit for war service if their ages exceed the maximum age in the normal age limit specified in paragraph 4 A (v) below

3. *Conditions of Service*—(a) The Assistant Clerks' Service will not form part of the General Clerical Service. The Grade is pensionable. The grant of leave and other conditions of service will, in the case of a new entrant to the Public Service, be governed by the recommendations in Sessional Paper VIII of 1934 as modified by the recommendations in Sessional Paper VIII of 1946. Rent allowance will be payable

(b) Successful candidates will be appointed on 2 years' probation. The Assistant Clerks' Service is under the general control of the Deputy Secretary to the Treasury and each Revenue District will be regarded as a separate unit. Assistant Clerks may be selected for service in any Government Office in the Revenue District to which they are appointed. They will be liable to transfer within that District but will not, save for special reasons and in exceptional circumstances, be transferred outside

that District. They will be required to pass a test in typewriting within one year from the date of their appointment. They will be subject to the Public Service Regulations, the Financial Regulations, the Regulations of the Manual of Procedure, Departmental Orders and any other Regulations or orders of Government

A preliminary list will be published giving the names of successful candidates. This list may be followed by subsequent supplementary lists if the number of vacancies which become available and the standard attained by the candidates justify further appointments

4 *Eligibility*—A (i) Candidates must be of good character

(ii) Candidates must be Ceylonese *

(iii) Candidates must specify the Revenue District to which they seek to be appointed and must furnish satisfactory proof (certificate on honour) that they or their parents or guardians have been residents of that District for one year immediately preceding July 1, 1949, or are normally so resident

(iv) Candidates should have passed at least one of the following examinations.—

(a) The Junior School Certificate (English) Examination of the Education Department, Ceylon, the Cambridge Junior. The Commercial Certificate Examination, either Certificate or Higher Stage (either Section of the London Chamber of Commerce or Ceylon Chamber of Commerce), or

(b) a Junior School Certificate (English) Examination held by a school approved by the Education Department for the Senior School Certificate (English) Examination, or

(c) a school Examination which is certified by the Principal/Head Teacher as the equivalent to Junior School Certificate (English) in a registered school which also has an approved Senior School Certificate (English) Class, or

(d) hold some higher educational qualifications.

True copies of certificates of educational qualifications must be attached to the application form

(v) Candidates should have been born not earlier than July 1, 1930, or not later than July 1, 1933, or be within the age limits prescribed for their particular category.

A certificate of birth should be attached to the application form

(vi) (i) Candidates who have been full-time serving members of a unit of the Armed Forces and have been honourably discharged will be allowed to deduct the period of their mobilized service with those forces since September 3, 1939, from their ages, and

* For the purpose of this examination a Ceylonese is —

(a) A citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration, and

(b) A person who has applied or intends to apply for citizenship of Ceylon by registration, and is deemed by the Minister of Defence and External Affairs to have a *prima facie* entitlement to such citizenship.

(ii) Candidates who have been full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire or Air Raid Precautions Services, excluding those who had left those Services of their own accord, will be allowed to deduct the period of their continuous service, with those Services since September 3, 1939, from their ages

N.B.—A candidate who while serving in one of these Services was also employed otherwise or who was a student at School at the time cannot claim to have done full-time service

B (I) *Binders*—(a) Bookbinders who were in Government Service prior to August 1, 1935, and who have the right to sit for the Executive Clerical Class Grade II Examination, i.e., (i) Bookbinders whose duties are mainly clerical, who are employed in a temporary or permanent Government Department and paid from votes in the Government Estimates Provided that where such temporary officers are daily-paid they must be continuously and not sporadically employed, (ii) Bookbinders whose duties are mainly clerical employed in any Government Department and paid from recognized and approved fees,

will be allowed to sit for the examination.

(b) Bookbinders who have had one year's continuous satisfactory service under Government as bookbinders immediately prior to July 1, 1949, will be allowed to sit for the examination irrespective of educational qualifications if they are not more than 35 years of age on July 1, 1949

(II) Monthly-paid and daily paid clerks who have been in continuous service under Government since a date preceding April 1, 1944, and who are still in service, will be allowed to sit for this examination irrespective of age or educational qualifications provided that the candidate satisfies conditions (i) to (iii) in paragraph 4A and that the Head of the Department certifies that the candidate has served throughout satisfactorily

Notes.—(a) Any such officer who was eligible to sit for the examination for Assistant Clerks held on June 24, 1944, will be allowed to sit for this examination *only*

(b) Any such officer who was *not* eligible to sit for the examination for the Assistant Clerks' Service held on June 24, 1944, because he had not had one year's continuous service, will be allowed to sit for this examination and for the next examination *only*

(III) Temporary Clerks now employed in Government Departments who have been continuously in Government Service in a clerical capacity and in a clerical post since they attained the age of 18 years and who are not eligible under paragraph 4B (II) will be allowed to sit for this examination irrespective of educational qualifications provided that—

(a) they have completed at least one year's continuous service as Temporary Clerks under Government immediately prior to July 1, 1949

(b) they are not more than twenty five years of age on July 1, 1949

(c) the Heads of their Departments certify that they are fit to be employed in Clerical posts.

(4) Monthly-paid minor employees without clerical experience now employed in Government Departments will be allowed to sit for this examination *only* provided that—

(a) they have had one year's continuous service under Government immediately prior to July 1, 1949

(b) they are not more than twenty-five years of age on July 1, 1949

(c) they have passed the Junior School Certificate (English) or other equivalent or higher examination.

NOTE.—*Employees serving in Departments such as the Railway, Postal, Printing, Customs and Survey which have their own Departmental Clerical Services will not be eligible to take the Examination.* This is applicable to all persons in categories referred to in paragraph 4—B (I), (II), (III), and (IV)

5 *Applications*—(1) Application forms for admission to the examination may be obtained from the Inquiry Office, Education Department, by personal callers and by post from Examinations Branch, Boathouse, Colombo,

up to June 15, 1949. Applications must be sent by registered post only to reach the Director of Education, Examinations Branch, Boathouse, Colombo, on or before July 15, 1949. Any applications received after that date will be rejected. Candidates will be permitted to sit for the examination only within the Revenue District for which they have declared themselves and have been accepted as resident and they will be appointed only to that District

(ii) (a) Candidates who are in Government Service must forward their applications through the Head of the Department in which they are serving

(b) Candidates who claim eligibility as ex-servicemen must forward their applications through the officer Commanding the Unit in which they have served

(iii) The application must bear duly cancelled stamps to the value of Rs 7.50.

(iv) A certificate of residence (see paragraph 4 A (III)) must be appended to the application and countersigned by the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent of the District or by the Chief Headman or the Divisional Revenue Officer of the Division

(v) A birth certificate and a certificate of character (see paragraphs 4 A (i) and (v)) must also be attached to the form of application

Note.—(a) Certificates of birth issued for the purpose of the Code for Assisted Schools will not be accepted for this examination

(b) Affidavits will not be accepted as substitutes for birth certificates

(c) A certified copy of a birth registration entry effected more than one year after the date of birth, under section 18 (i) (b) of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance (Cap 94), will be accepted only after consideration of the evidence by which the date of birth was established. Where the name appearing in the birth certificate differs from the name which the candidate ordinarily uses, satisfactory evidence will have to be adduced that the birth certificate is that of the candidate and not that of any other person. Where the candidate is under 21 years of age or is more than 21 years of age and has a parent living, application should be made to the Registrar-General's or to the Provincial Registrar's or Assistant Provincial Registrar's Office in the District in which the birth took place, under section 19 of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance, for the amendment of the entry in case 2 of the birth registration entry, and in other cases applications should be made to the District Court under section 29 for rectification of the entry in case 2.

The written examination will be held first and those candidates whose performances in the written examination entitle them to further consideration will then be asked to attend a Viva Voce Examination at a time and place which will be notified to them. The Viva Voce examination will be held in each Revenue District

In all written papers marks will be deducted for bad writing and mistakes in spelling. Candidates whose writing is illegible are liable to be disqualified

11. Clerks in the Assistant Clerks Service controlled by the D. S. T. who have been confirmed in their appointments will be permitted to sit for the entrance Examination to the G. C. C. of the General Clerical Service until they reach the age of 35 years, irrespective of Educational Qualifications. They will receive no other concessions

12. *Medical Examination.*—The successful candidates will be required to pass a medical examination.

Import Control Manual

THE Import Control Manual recently issued by the Controller of Imports under the authority of the Ministry of Commerce and Trade contains information on the principles and the procedure relating to Import Control in force at present. The following paragraphs of the Manual are reproduced for general information —

Paragraph 14 Import licences are generally issued on the basis of C.I.F. value in Rupee currency. It is the duty of the importer to ensure that goods are not imported in excess of the value specified in the licensed indent. Goods received in excess of the licence value are liable to forfeiture. Freight and/or insurance paid locally in part or in whole are debited against the value of the licence. Importers must, therefore, take care in such cases that the goods ordered do not exceed the licensed value less the cost of freight and/or insurance paid locally

Paragraph 16 Where a licence is issued against evidence of a firm offer, it is a condition of the issue of the licence that the importer will confirm such offer after securing the import licence. If he is unable to confirm the offer or if the offer has been withdrawn, he must return his licence immediately for cancellation. The Controller of Imports will not allow, except under very exceptional circumstances, any amendments to a licence which has been issued against evidence of a firm offer

Paragraph 18 Importers are warned that they should not arrange to ship any goods to Ceylon until they have obtained a licence, or have ascertained definitely that a licence will be granted or that a separate licence is not required

Paragraph 19 Goods should be imported into Ceylon on or before the date on which the licence expires. Consignments arriving in the country after the expiration of a licence cannot be admitted by the Customs unless the licence is extended. Renewals of licences must not be assumed as automatic, and in all cases importers should apply to the Controller of Imports for the extension of any licence before the goods leave the country of consignment
